FOUNTAIN VALLEY— The second half of the 2005-06 Denny's PBA Tour season begins next week, and if the first half was any indication, the upcoming months will have plenty of tension and excitement as the race to claim exemptions con-

With 13 events remaining this season, there are still many questions yet to be answered.

Who will win the 2006 PBA Player of the Year award?

Mike Scroggins, leading the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings, is the front-runner for the PBA Player of the Year award. He'll look to continue a career year in which he's already earned a career-high \$136,000 and leads the Tour with a 229.94 average.

The 2006 West Virginia Classic features the Scorpion oil pattern and could be a big week for the left-hander. Scroggins has finished in the top-10 in four of the last five standard events featuring the Scorpion, including a 9th place finish in the 2005 Chicago Classic and a 4th place finish in the 2005 Empire State Classic.

In addition, Scroggins has fared well in recent major events, advancing to the televised finals in two of the last three Denny's PBA Tour majors. He reached the semifinals of the 2005 Denny's World Championship last season before winning this year's 2005 United States Bowling Congress (USBC)

Challenging Scroggins for Player of the Year honors will be a bevy of talented bowlers including 22-time Tour title winner and 2005 Masters runner-up, Norm Duke. Duke registered six top-10 finishes over the Tour's first seven events (including 2nd in the Dydo Japan Cup 2005), before tailing off in the final two events of the first half. A victory in the second half would put him squarely in the middle of the Player of the Year race.

Tommy Jones' incredible start to the 2005-06 Tour season has laid the foundation for a possible Player of the Year run. Coming off four wins last season. Jones wasted no time, winning the season-opening Dydo Japan Cup 2005 and following that up with a title in the 2005 Tulsa Championship.

His back-to-back wins to start this season made Jones just the fourth bowler to start a season with two straight wins and the first since PBA Hall of Famer David Ozio accomplished the feat in 1991.

Another "young gun" that could be considered in Player of the Year voting is Wes Malott, who also enjoyed a scorching start to the season. The four-season veteran advanced to the televised final rounds in each of the first four Tour events this season. After finishing 9th in the Dydo Japan Cup 2005 and 2nd in the Tulsa Championship, Malott won his first career title in the 2005 Mile High Classic.

All told, Malott had six top-15 finishes in the first half. Another victory in the second half would force voters to seriously consider the Austin, Texas native for the prestigious award.

Of course, other bowlers could throw their hats into the Player of the Year race with a strong second half. The defending PBA Player of the Year Patrick Allen won the 2005 Keystone State Championship and advanced to three telecasts in the first half. Jason Couch and Pete Weber both have titles this season, and if either one wins another, they'd be right in the thick of things.

Who will be the top non-exempt bowler at season's end?

Eric Forkel has the lead in the race for the 2006-07 Tour exemption given to the top nonexempt bowler on the points list. Forkel, a left-hander from Las Vegas with five career Tour titles, is 47th in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings with 33,645 points.

Two spots behind Forkel is another lefty, Dennis Horan Jr, who is currently 49th with

30,927. Horan has four Denny's PBA Tour titles and sits well above the third place non-exempt bowler, Jim Tomek Jr., who is 58th on the points list with 25,930.50.

The key to this race may come down to the two Denny's PBA Tour major events open to all members – the 63rd U.S. Open and the 2006 Denny's World Championship. Horan earned almost 21,000 of his season points total in the 2005 USBC Masters, where he finished 6th. With extra points awarded for majors, a breakout performance by Forkel, Horan or Tomek could put someone well ahead of the other two.

To be eligible for the nonexempt bowler exemption at the end of the 2005-06 Denny's PBA Tour season, non-exempt bowlers must have appeared in at least eight Denny's PBA Tour Qualifying Rounds.

Which veterans will have a tough time climbing the points

With four bowlers locked for next season (Chris Barnes, Steve Jaros, Tony Reyes and Danny Wiseman) but below 40th place in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings, the current cut line for bowlers to earn an exemption from the points list is 36th. Randy Weiss holds 36th place with 39,797.33 points.

With two major events counting toward points remaining, there's still time for bowlers to make their move up the list. However, no one wants their future to come down to one event, one round or even one

Veterans Rick Steelsmith and Dave D'Entremont, respectively sitting 52nd and 53rd on the points list, both have their work cut out for them. The two had a rough first half, combining for just three match play appearances.

Jason Hurd, who won his first career singles title in last season's 2004 Pepsi Open, is currently 44th in points, but has four top-20 performances to

carry some momentum into the second half.

A few veterans like Tim Criss and David Traber, 41st and 42nd on the points list, need strong performances in the second half to clinch their spot on next season's roster. The situation for these two is far from dire, as they sit just over 2,000 points away from Weiss in 36th place.

Will Walter Ray Williams Jr. win this season?

What other bowlers would consider a relatively successful first half, Williams would most likely consider a disappointment. He sits comfortably in 22nd place in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings, but has yet to advance to a televised final this season and has appeared in just one round of 8.

If anyone can right the ship, it's Williams, who also had a slow start to his 2003-04 Tour season. After trudging through the first half of that season with an average 41st place finish, Williams caught fire in the second half, advancing to five televised final rounds and winning

Of course, Williams is motivated to tie Earl Anthony's Tour record of 41 career Tour titles, but there are other records on the line as well. Williams is looking to win a title for the 13th straight season (Anthony holds the record with a title in 14 straight seasons). In addition, Williams is looking to earn over \$100,000 for the 16th time in his career, which would extend his











fig. 1: "the fist pump" a finishing technique as taught by Brian Voss
