# INDIANA BOWLER ROLLS 900 SERIES

ARLINGTON, Texas – Bob Kammer Jr. of Crown Point, Ind., rolled a perfect 900 series Saturday night. The series is still pending formal approval by the United States Bowling Congress.

Kammer, who would be the 18th bowler in history to roll a USBC-approved 900 series, tossed 36 consecutive strikes in the Saturday Invitational League at Stardust Bowl II in Merrillville, Ind. He would be the first bowler from the state of Indiana to record a certified 900 series.

"It was unbelievable, and I was nervous," said Kammer, a 41-year-old right-hander. "It's not something that happens every day."

Competing on lanes one and two, Kammer said the rest of the league stopped play to watch him after the seventh frame of his third game.

"I was just thinking, please carry," Kammer said in describing his final strike. "I was taking deep breaths and trying to get the ball clean off my

hand,

Kammer works for Ford Motor Company and may be a local celebrity when he returns to work.

"My phone has been blowing up," Kammer said. "I am having my 15 minutes of fame and it's fun."

Kammer's 900 series would be the 19th USBC-approved in history. The first USBCapproved 900 occurred Feb. 2, 1997 when Jeremy Sonnenfeld rolled three consecutive perfect games in Lincoln, Neb. There has never been a 900 on Sport Bowling lane conditions.

Record prize fund: The \$1 million prize fund and \$250,000 first prize are the richest prizes ever paid for in a professional bowling event.

The PBA returns to ABC Television: The Tournament of Champions finals will return to ABC on Saturday, Jan. 22, at 2:30 p.m. Eastern, for the first time since 1997. The Pro Bowlers Tour aired for 36 consecutive years on ABC as a lead-in to the old Wide World of Sports telecasts. The 2011 TOC telecast will be the first PBA event ever to air in high-definition.

Hall of Famer Nelson Burton Jr. to help celebrate return to ABC: PBA Hall of Famer Nelson Burton Jr., who teamed

Jason Couch to try for record fourth Tournament of Champions title: Jason Couch of Clermont, Fla., is the only bowler to win the Tournament of Champions in three consecutive years (1999, 2000 and 2002; the event was not conducted in 2001). The only other bowler to win the classic three times is retired PBA Hall of Famer Mike Durbin who won in 1972, 1982 and 1984.

# Donna Zimmerman, USBC Hall of Famer, dies at age 77

THOUSAND PALMS—Donna Zimmerman, a United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer, passed away Dec. 23, 2010 in Thousand Palms, Calif. She was 77.

She was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1982 in the Superior Performance category. Zimmerman's best season came in 1965, when she captured the all events title at the Women's International Bowling Congress (now USBC) Championships and led her team to a second-place finish at the tournament. She also won the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America doubles crown with Janet Harmon.

For the 1965 season, Zimmerman was named to the Bowlers Journal International All-American team and finished second to Betty Kuczynski for Bowler of the Year honors. She was named Southern California Woman Bowler of the Year.

Zimmerman was a charter member of the Professional Women's Bowling Association. She earned one professional title, the PWBA Oxnard Open in 1964, and took second in three other events. She was inducted into the PWBA Hall of Fame in 1996.

She began her bowling career in her hometown of Akron, Ohio. In 1952, at age 19, she became the 27th woman in bowling history to roll a perfect game. It was the only 300 game the WIBC recorded during the 1952-53 season.

One of her more interesting moments in bowling occurred at the 1959 BPAA All-Star Tournament in Buffalo, N.Y. A severe snowstorm left her without transportation, so Zimmerman and Buzz Fazio decided to run to the center. She described how they ran through the snow and managed to arrive at the center moments before the squad went to the floor.

"The officials already had the alternates dressed to take our place," Zimmerman said. "I bowled with cold air in my lungs all evening and was thankful to finish second to Marion Ladewig."

That season, she also finished second at the World Invitational. She also is a member of the California WBA, Southern California Bowling Writers, Tri-County, Ohio, and Summit County, Ohio, Halls of Fame.

After our holiday break, we returned to action in our first tournament of 2011 at Oak Tree. We had 228 entries this week. Cut scores were a +33 for the men and +10 for the women. This week, our three Super Seniors added to the board were Vic Paolucci (+27) and Ely Cruz(+31) for the men and Bobbie Nakunz (+5) for the women. That would give us 52 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, we had 4 people miss on the last shot so no one would go for the \$2,500, they would all share the \$50 consolation. We will add another \$100 at West Covina Lanes for total of

In the doubles this week, we had 127 groups get into the doubles, with 16 spots paid out. The top prize this week went to Jerry Chang and Don Chung with a 1354 for \$160. In 2nd place, it was Don Chung and Giang Huynh with a 1324 for \$140. The low to cash was 1275, we paid out \$1270 in doubles.

In the semis this week we saw David Quon lead the semis from start to finish with a +138 to sit out and bowl for the title. Tony Tang came in second at +126 and would sit out the first round. It took a +26 for the men and a +6 for the women to make the top 16.

This week, our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$1,505 and he drew a 174. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had 3 people hit it during qualifying and 1 hit it during semis for a total of 4 people. They were Jonathan Barraca, Shaun Suase, Jhun Tan, and Greg Franke, they will each get \$376. We will estimate the pot to be \$1,700 at West Covina. This week we had 7 new bowlers join us. This would bring us to our Match Play finals now. Bowling for Soup to provide TOC "Halftime Entertainment:" The Tournament of Champions will have its version of "Super Bowl" halftime entertainment when Grammy-nominated rock band Bowling For Soup performs during the Jan. 22 ABC finals telecast. Musical entertainment has been a part of many of bowling's major events over the years. Jazz great Pete Fountain once played during a TOC telecast in the 1970s.

PBA Hall of Fame induction ceremonies to cap the week: Following the ABC finals of the TOC on Saturday afternoon, the PBA and Red Rock Resort will host the 2011 PBA Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. Thirteen-time PBA Tour winner and current ESPN color analyst Randy Pedersen, 11-time PBA Senior Tour winner Dale Eagle, and PBA lane maintenance innovator Len Nicholson will be inducted.

Largest field of PBA champions to compete: The 2011 Tournament of Champions will feature the largest field of PBA title-winners ever. More than 170 men and women who have won PBA National Tour, Senior Tour, PBA Regional or PBA Women's Series titles have been invited to participate in the historic event.



# **BOYLE, PLUHOWSKY TAKE** TEAM USA TRIALS TITLES

HENDERSON — Scott Boyle of Salida, Calif., and Shannon Pluhowsky of Kettering, Ohio, pulled away for victories Friday at the 2011 United States Bowling Congress Team USA Trials.

Boyle led the men's field with a 36-game total of 8,180, an average of 227.2, while Pluhowsky shot 7,933, an average of 220.3, at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center in suburban Las Vegas.

There wasn't much drama in either of the two left-handers victories. Boyle won by a 150-pin margin over Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., while Pluhowsky topped Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., by 103 pins.

This means the world to me because everything I have ever worked for - all the hard work and practice - have finally paid off," said the 19-year-old Boyle, who attends Modesto Community College. "I was able to get off to a good start today and just stayed mentally focused. This is surreal.

Boyle lurked near the top of the standings all week but had trailed Mike Fagan of Patchogue, N.Y., who led each of the first three rounds. Boyle finally pulled into the lead by shooting 2,064 on the 38-foot Atlanta lane pattern Friday.

Pluhowsky, meanwhile, had the highest total in Friday's final round, finishing with 2,019 to jump into the lead and take home

"This week was really a chance for me to learn a lot about the new equipment I'm throwing and to get some practice on the patterns that we see throughout the year at Team USA events," Pluhowsky said. "I felt like everything was pretty good physically, and every day I got a little better.

The top three men and top three women in the final standings who were not already selected to be on Team USA earned automatic spots on the 2011 Team USA roster. Williams, Pluhowsky and Johnson all were selected in November, so they were not eligible for the automatic spots.

Joining Boyle on the men's team was third-place finisher EJ Tackett of Huntington, Calif., and Fagan, who finished fourth. On the women's side, Brenda Padilla of Mansfield, Texas, Brittni Hamilton of Webster, N.Y., and Kim Yioulos of Rochester, N.Y., all earned the automatic spots by finishing third through fifth, respectively.

The National Selection Committee picked Diandra Asbaty of Chicago, Bryanna Caldwell of Tucson, Ariz., Jarret Mizo of Honolulu and Steve Smith of San Diego to round out the final roster for Team USA in 2011.

Heading into the Team USA Trials, 13 players had already secured spots by virtue of their selection in November. Williams, Chris Barnes, Wes Malott, Tommy Jones, Patrick Allen and Bill O'Neill make up the remainder of the men's team. On the women's side, Stefanie Nation, Shannon O'Keefe, Pluhowsky, Johnson, Kelly Kulick, Tennelle Milligan and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard

The top two boys and top two girls finishers who are 20 years or younger before Jan. 1, 2011 also earned automatic spots on Junior Team USA. Boyle, Tackett and Yioulos all earned spots on both Team USA and Junior Team USA. Elise Bolton of Merritt Island, Fla., took the second girls spot.

The National Selection Committee polished off the Junior Team USA 2011 roster by adding Tyler Herrman of Harrisburg, Pa., TJ Baral of Palm City, Fla., Samantha Kelly of Hoffman Estates, Ill., and Jessica Earnest of Vandalia, Ill., to the team.

At the USBC Junior Gold Championships in Indianapolis last July, 12 players earned spots on Junior Team USA. The boys group includes Marshall Kent, Matt Gasn, Chris Via, Jacob Kent, Kyle King and Andrew Koff, while the girls team includes Hamilton, Addileen Pointer, Kristie Petravich, Kaitlin Quinn, Danielle McEwan and Liz Seibel.

Members of Team USA and Junior Team USA will compete in international competitions through 2011, including the World Women's Championships, Pan American Bowling Confederation Men's Championships, the Pan American Games, QubicaAMF World Cup, PABCON Youth Championships and Tournament of Americas.

The members of the team also receive world-class coaching and use of the International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas. The top two finishers at the Team USA Trials also have the option to receive free health insurance from the United States Olympic Committee for 2011.

#### NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS DEGROFF FINALLY WINS SO. CALIF. DEAF CLASSIC WITH 955

CERRITOS...Finally Ken DeGroff (Sunland) had done it but it took 5 years for him to win a prestigious deaf individual tournament in California. During his vagabond years before he settled in Southern California, DeGroff had traveled to other cities to participated in their deaf Classics or tournaments, he had won some of them, even bowled a honor score 300 or 800 in them.

For example, once while living here, Ken traveled out to Baton Rouge, LA to bowl in its prestigious deaf classic, rolled a 300 there and returned home with the title. Ken wanted to win the prestigious So. California Deaf Bowlers Classic not only because it is the longest running (48 years) deaf classic out West, just because it is the only deaf handicap tournament in US that allows entries of elite high average bowlers and even also PBA members who are deaf or hearing-impaired. Most other deaf classics and tournaments forbids entry of PBA members and limited high average deaf bowlers to 210 or 220 and less.

Ken received zero handicap because of his 237 average but after the 2nd and 3rd squad completed, his top 955 score stood for the \$350.00 first place prize

Robert Audette (Chino Hills), one of the several brave entrants who challenged thee elite bowlers was rewarded with 2nd prize \$170.00 with his 789 plus 147 handicap (for his 174 average) for

936. (This writer regretted not having his game scores.) Third place \$90.00 went to Dan Flores (Sunland) for his score of 211-241-227-214 plus 40 handicap 933 total.

Another brave entrant Bob Bergan (Whittier) had a 209 in his 761 plus 156 handicap for 917 for 4th place \$75.00. Also another one Jeff Stansell (South Gate) had 915 (sorry no series and handicap totals) for 5th place \$65.00. Francisco Navarro ( ) had a good start with 246-212 but went down to finish with 792 plus 108 handicap for 900 good for 6th place \$45.00.
