Shocking Ending Gives Allen Title at National Bowling Stadium

RENO — Patrick Allen stumbled as he approached the finish line, but a colossal bad break for Walter Ray Williams Jr., the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour's all-time titles leader, handed Allen the National Bowling Stadium Championship on Sunday.

Allen defeated Williams, 225-223, when Williams left a pocket 8-10 split on his second shot in the 10th frame of the title match. A fourth consecutive strike would have meant victory for the 45-time PBA champion after spares by Allen in the ninth and 10th frames gave Williams a chance for a come-from-behind victory.

"After Walter Ray labeled the first one in the 10th, I was just praying for a rolloff," Allen said. "He is the all-time titles leader because he performs when he needs to. The second shot looked good off his hand. Having that happen to win is something you can't even imagine."

Allen, who picked up his 11th career title and first of the 2008-09 season, earned \$25,000 and locked up an exemption for the 2009-2010 season. Williams won \$13,000 for second place.

"I drifted a hair left on the second ball and didn't get it to the right spot, seeing the 8-pin standing was like somebody shot me," Williams said. "I got a few good breaks this week, I just needed one more.'

The tournament was the first in PBA Tour history to employ different lane conditioning patterns on each lane during the match play and ESPN-televised championship rounds. The left lane was conditioned with the PBA's 44foot-long Shark pattern, while the right lane featured a 36foot Cheetah pattern, forcing the players to make separate bowling ball and angle-of-attack choices for each lane.

"I knew if I could get lined up right, I would be all right," Allen said. "Bowling on the mixed patterns against O'Neill, Barnes, Malott and Walter Ray could be the biggest challenge

In the opening stepladder match, Allen ended 2006 PBA Rookie of the Year Bill O'Neill's bid for his first title, 218-200. O'Neill, a former Saginaw Valley State collegiate All-American from Levittown, Pa., earned \$5,000 for fifth place. Leaving and failing to convert the 1-2-4-6-10 washout in the fourth frame proved to be O'Neill's undo-

Allen then eliminated reigning PBA Player of the Year Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 267-236. The key shot in the match was Barnes missed 7 pin spare attempt in the ninth frame after he had rallied to take a one-pin lead. Barnes, a 10-time PBA champion, earned \$5,500 for fourth place.

The 38-year-old left-hander advanced to the title match against Williams after a 268-215 romp past red-hot Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas. Malott, the 2008-09 Player of the Year points leader, was never a factor after Allen started the match with seven strikes. Malott earned \$6,500 for third place.

The next stop on the 2008-09 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour will be the Bayer Earl Anthony Classic at Lava Lanes in Medford, Ore., starting Tuesday. The tournament will be contested on a new, specially-designed Earl Anthony lane condition and it will include the final PBA Women's Series tournament of the season. ESPN will televise the women's and PBA Exempt Tour finals Sunday at 1 p.m. Eastern Time



Important Reminders Techniques Many Bowlers Know But Forget About


During my years of teaching, coaching and writing, I have learned that many bowlers with league averages in the low or mid 100s or thereabouts, sincerely want to improve. And in their quest, while learning new techniques, they quite often seem to forget the ones that got them to where they are now. While it is certainly necessary to replace bad habits with good ones, we must keep in mind that it is also important to add to the techniques that improved us in the first place...not to replace them.


Therefore, I thought it would be a good idea to do an article consisting of quick versions of some of the lesson material covered in past issues about which you have asked. After all, what better way to be of help than to address your needs as you yourself identify them? So what we'll do here is do some "machine gun" versions of what you consider important to your improvement.

"Solid" At The Line

"Traffic Lights, Tripods and Balance" was the title of a long past article, in which we discussed the importance of balance at the line while delivering the shot. That seems to be one of those techniques many of us learn...and then forget about...to our detriment. So here's a quick recap of the three important parts to this:

First, take the last step of you're approach at an angle, slanting it inward, so that heel ends up in front of the other foot, instead of next to it. (You long sliders can use your slide to accomplish this). That places the arch of that foot directly under your body's center of balance, instead of next to it. And that, in turn, helps eliminate the problem of "falling off the ball", which is that sideways loss of balance created by the increased ball gravity during the moment of release. Use





Second, it helps if you keep your back foot touching the floor (heel "collapsed" outward and downward) so that the back foot sort of rides on the outer edge of the sole of your shoe.

By the way, don't let that back foot swing past 7 o'clock behind you as you finish your approach (left handers, not past 5 o'clock). That will keep your back leg from forcing your body to turn out of position during the release. Many a gutter ball can be eliminated by this procedure.

Third, keep all your weight over the middle (arch) of the front foot! That will improve your overall balance enough so that consistency (and scores) should definitely improve!

Killing The Chicken

"The Lever, the Stump and the Fan" was the title of another past article. There we covered a technique for eliminating the all too common destructive habit of chicken winging. Part of this technique involves a kind of gimmicky way of keeping the arm straight longer through the release, by imagining a bowler with no forearm.

Well with no forearm, the hand would now be attached to the upper arm...in other words, the "stump". So the extension of the follow through is done with that stump, not the forearm. Since only the upper arm, the stump, is used for this motion, the forearm is not involved, so the elbow remains straight. It never needs to bend on the way.

I've taught many students to self-talk, "Finger release, stump follow through", just before the shot, with much success in increasing accuracy and pin action, by avoiding elbow bending at the wrong time.

The "Fan"

As well as that works however, one problem often remains... that when the elbow finally does bend, it bends inward across the body. Bad news! Instead, that elbow should be kept in line with your bowling shoulder. That's where your arm is attached to the body, right? So here comes the second corrective technique, referred to as a "fan". This is done only at the very finish of the follow through. It consists of a small "flicking" or "snapping" twist of the wrist to the right (left for left handers)...just barely enough to turn the thumb very slightly outward (like from 12 to 1 o'clock, for example; or12 to 11 for left handers.) Think of it as sort of a "hitch-hiking" motion, which may be easier to remember.

This tiny, easy to learn wrist action, when properly done, virtually eliminates overturning (topping) the ball. More important, it makes chicken winging a thing of the past!

Actually, the fan and the stump fit together and eventually feel like just one correct motion...but it does take practice.

Avoiding The "Late Adjustment" Disease

This is a worse plague than you may realize...a problem which actually afflicts huge numbers of bowlers, including professionals, yet is ridiculously easy to fix. It's what I call the "I finally found my line halfway through the last game" disease. Ask yourself whose fault it is when that happens to you? Is it the lane conditions? Are they breaking down too fast? Is it the wrong ball? Sticky approaches maybe? What do you think? Is there even the slightest chance you couldn't find your line because maybe you didn't adjust soon enough, far enough or often enough?

The point that may be hard to swallow here, but is definitely true is that if you found a line at all, no matter how late, you could have found it sooner!

Think about it, bowlers...can you remember even a single time in your bowling life when you ruined a game by adjusting too soon...or too often? Remember back; will you agree that that almost never happens? Good! Because in truth, the vast majority of bowlers either wait too long to adjust or make too few adjustments when they finally do adjust! Do yourself a favor and read that last sentence again.

O.K...if you ask yourself why it takes so long before you make an adjustment, your honest answer has to be, "because I'm so close; I'm afraid if I adjust too soon, or it's a wrong adjustment, I might blow the shot...possibly the frame." That's the problem...fear. Well, once you've admitted that to yourself, you're on the road to recovery. The answer is embarrassingly simple and it happens to be one of my favorite slogans: "You'll never find your correct line sooner by adjusting later."


Another score killing monster, of which far too many bowlers are guilty is adjusting too little at a time, for the same reason... fear! Fear of adjusting too far and wasting a shot. So O.K., another slogan: "Over-adjust and risk the frame, Under-adjust and lose the game!"

The important thing to consider, then, is simple; would you rather over adjust a bit and risk a shot on purpose to find out whether the adjustment will work, or pussyfoot around with meaningless little moves which almost always wind up failing? After all, if you adjust a bit too far, at least you've found it out right now, rather than after wasting frames and blowing the game with splits, weak hits, etc.

So if you've adjusted too far, why not just back off a notch to make it right? Did Moses come down with some 11th commandment saying, "Once thou hast adjusted, thou shalt not go back?" Of course not!

So the last slogan is: "You can never be sure of your limit until you've gone past it!"

The whole idea we must get used to is to deliberately adjust sooner and/or farther than we think necessary...to make a personal policy out of overdoing it on purpose, because it's the best way to get our answers early, rather than after losing the game! You'll win many a game against better bowlers because of your policy to challenge yourself...to be willing to risk any shot necessary in favor of the ultimate win! (See illustration 2).



Oh and remember: the word "adjustment" means more than just changing your line. It may also include changes in speed, equipment, hand release position, break point adjustments as the lanes break down, matching revs to ball speed, the ball's axis tilt, etc. You have to have courage...the courage to make experimental decisions now! Not 3 or 4 frames down the road when it'll probably be too late to win!

it."

Petraglia, also a Brooklyn native, is a 14-time PBA champion and one of five players in PBA history to complete the Triple Crown. After winning his first PBA title at age 19, Petraglia won the Firestone Tournament of Champions in 1971, U.S. Open in 1977 and the PBA National Championship in 1980. Billy Hardwick, Pete Weber, Mike Aulby and Norm Duke are the only others in the "Triple Crown Club." Petraglia also was part of two teams that won American Bowling Congress Classic Team titles before the Classic Division was terminated, and he owns six PBA Senior Tour titles. He is the only PBA bowler to win three consecutive televised tournament titles, one of three who have won PBA titles in five different decades, and one of 17 who have bowled nationally-televised 300 games.

"I was very, very surprised. It was a shock, but it was wonderful news," Petraglia said. "I thought it would take two or three years at least. It's pretty special to be recognized alongside guys like Andy Varipapa and Dick Weber and all the great players who are in the hall." Petraglia and Roth were both pleased to be elected in the same year.

"Mark and I basically grew up together, even though I'm four years older," Petraglia said. "Mark and I won a Paramus league one year, and the Met Classic league another year. We were good bowlers when we were young, but you never know how things are going to turn out. Looking back, it's a big surprise to see what we've accomplished."

Macpherson, a 20-time Professional Women's Bowling Association champion, made her presence known on the women's scene as an 18-year-old amateur when she won the Women's U.S. Open for her first title. Since then she became the youngest woman to win the tour's Triple Crown, captured three USBC Queens titles, was selected Woman Bowler of the Year four times and became the all-time earnings leader in women's professional bowling with \$1.2 million in 2003 when the PWBA ceased operations. "It was a great way to begin the New Year," Macpherson said. "I'm honored. It's very, very exciting."

Macpherson also is the only woman to win a USBC Open Championships title, firing an 812 series to win the 2006 Regular Singles crown in Corpus Christi, Texas.

"I think it's a combination of all the fabulous years and the many years, 20 years, that represents your career," she said. "I did a little bit of reminiscing of how wonderful bowling has been to me over the years, how much I've enjoyed it and been blessed to be able to do it for so many years and am still doing it."

She was the leading vote-getter among the 12 candidates considered by USBC's panel of veteran bowling writers and hall of famers, named on 146 of 158 ballots cast for 92.41 percent to easily exceed the 70 percent majority needed for election. Roth received 130 votes (82.28 percent) while Petraglia received 117 votes (74.05).

Other men's candidates were: Marshall Holman, Medford, Ore., 105 votes (66.46); Del Ballard Jr., Keller, Texas, 59 votes (37.34); Dave Husted, Milwaukie, Ore., 27 votes (17.09), and Amleto Monacelli, Barquisimeto, Venezuela, 16 votes (10.13).

Other women's candidates were: Shirley Levens, Titusville, Fla., 79 votes (50); Dede Davidson, Buellton, Calif., 65 votes (41.14); Cheryl Robinson, Oceanside, Calif., 51 votes (32.28); and Jackie Mitskavitch, DuBois, Pa., and Michelle Mullen, Farmington Hills, Mich., each with 20 votes (12.66).

The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the former ABC and Women's International Bowling Congress Halls of Fame. With the three new inductees selected by the committee, there are now 375 members of the USBC Hall of Fame - 246 in Performance, 110 in Meritorious Service and 19 Pioneers.


