Barnes Sixth Player in PBA History to Complete PBA's Triple Crown

LAS VEGAS — Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, exorcised his television demons Sunday, upsetting top qualifier Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., 267-237, to win the Professional Bowlers Association World Championship at South Point Bowling Center and become the sixth player in PBA history to complete the sport's Triple Crown.

Along with his 13th career title, the 40-year-old Barnes won a \$50,000 first prize. He previously had won the 2005 U.S. Open and the 2006 PBA Tournament of Champions, the other two legs in the PBA Triple Crown. The only other Triple Crown winners are Billy Hardwick, Johnny Petraglia, Pete Weber, Mike Aulby and Norm Duke – all PBA Hall of Famers.

Barnes, the No. 4 qualifier, came into the PBA World Championship with a 7-14 record on television in major championships, but he won four consecutive matches for

the title to improve his record to 11-14. He defeated Michael Haugen Jr. of Carefree, Ariz., in Saturday night's elimination round, 243-172, to reach Sunday's finals where he eliminated Finland's Osku Palermaa, 246-176, and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., 237-161, for the chance to meet O'Neill for the title.

In the title match, Barnes started with six strikes to build a 31-pin lead after seven frames, but O'Neill refused to back down, finishing with a string of four strikes to force Barnes to mark in the 10th frame. Barnes' strike on his first shot in the clinched the title.

"I feel bad for Bill," Barnes said. "He was the best bowler in the PBA World Series to get here, but I've been in his shoes a few times and I'm not going to give the trophy back.

"There are a lot of guys who have won the PBA World Championship, but it's a short and distinguished list of guys

who have won the Triple Crown," he added. "Right after I won, Billy Hardwick called my wife and told her to welcome me to the club."

"I'm not unhappy with my performance," O'Neill said. "I threw all but one shot on line. When I needed shots to make Chris show up in 10th, they were all good. That's something I've struggled with out here. I think it's a good sign of things to come."

The Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour immediately moved to Red Rock Lanes in north-

west Las Vegas later Sunday for the opening qualifying round for the Champions Field in the \$1 million PBA Tournament of Champions. Following a second qualifying round Monday morning, half of the Champions Field will join the elite field for the duration of the Tournament of Champi-

The richest tournament in PBA history concludes Saturday when a record \$250,000 first prize will be decided live on ABC at 2:30 p.m. Eastern.

KULICK NAMED WORLD BOWLING WRITERS WOMEN'S BOWLER OF THE YEAR

ARLINGTON — After a year filled with major victories, Team USA's Kelly Kulick has been named the 2010 World Bowling Writers Women's Bowler of the Year.

The seven-time Team USA member became the first woman to win a Lumber Liquidators Professional Bowlers Association Tour title last January. She defeated Chris Barnes, 265-190, to win the Tournament of Champions.

"I'm thrilled by all the accolades I've received for last year's performances, and to be named the best bowler in the world is a tremendous accomplishment," Kulick said. "It's like 2010 hasn't ended yet for me. I'm constantly reminded of what I accomplished."

Kulick also won both women's bowling majors in 2010. She claimed the United States Bowling Congress Queens title in April and the U.S. Women's Open in May. She was the first woman to win both events in the same year.

In her only Team USA

event in 2010, Kulick earned gold medals in doubles and team, a silver medal in allevents and bronze medals in singles and trios at the Pan American Bowling Confederation Women's Championships

Kulick also traveled to Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, in March and won the women's division at the Malaysian International Open.

England's Dominic Barrett was named the World Bowling Writers Men's Bowler of the Year for the third consecutive year. He topped the 2010 European Bowling Tour rankings with three titles and 12 finishes in the top five. Barrett also won a bronze medal in singles at the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Men's Championships.

The World Bowling Writers also announced that two players were elected to its Hall of Fame. England's Kristen Penny and Finland's Mika Koivuniemi will be inducted later this year.

ENTRY DEADLINES EXTENDED FOR 2011 USBC WOMEN'S AND OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

ARLINGTON—Tournament season is right around the corner, and it's not too late to be part of the action at the 2011 United States Bowling Congress Women's and Open Championships.

The entry deadline for the USBC Women's Championships has been extended to March 1, while USBC Open Championships competitors now will have until March 4 to submit their entries.

The 2011 Open Championships will be the first to kick off this year as it begins its 122-day run March 4. Bowlers from all 50 states and several foreign countries will converge on the one-of-a-kind, 78-lane National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., before the tournament concludes on July 3.

More than 12,000 fiveplayer teams already are headed for "The Biggest Little City in the World," but there's still plenty of room available for bowlers interested in trying to earn a share of the \$5 million prize fund. This year, the Women's Championships will return to New York state for the first time since 1996 and settle into Syracuse's Oncenter Complex, where 48 specially-constructed lanes and custom-built, state-of-the-art scoreboards will await more than 30,000 bowlers. The event gets underway April 7 and will run for 88 days, also concluding on July 3

The Women's Championships received a successful makeover in 2010 and now features three average-based divisions that use a 100-percent handicap format. Between the new look of the venue and the new format, the Women's Championships is a can't-miss opportunity for women of all ages and skill levels.

"We take great pride in our championship events, and we don't want anyone to miss out on the opportunity to compete on bowling's biggest stages," said Brian Lewis, USBC Managing Director of Tournaments.




