The Board members will vote first at 10am, followed by a Delegates meeting of each organization at 1pm also to vote on the Agreement of Merger.

If all three organizations approve the merger, then an open membership Organizational Meeting will be held at **1:45 pm** to vote on the proposed Bylaws and the Election of Officers. The following positions are up for election: President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, 3rd Vice President (*Youth only aged 18 and older*), Sergeant at Arms, and 16 Directors. For PBA Hall of Famer Brian Voss, "24" Was Sunday's Key Number

TRUSSVILLE, AL—Voss, in his 24th season on the Denny's PBA Tour, snapped a 24-event winless streak and earned his 24th career title with a 237-190 win over Steve Wilson in the title match of the 2006 Jackson Hewitt Tax Service Classic at Lightning Strikes.

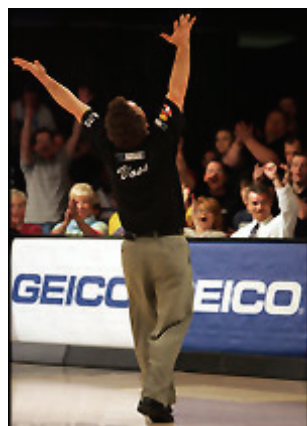
The 47-year-old from Alpharetta, Ga., clinched the victory and the \$40,000 top prize with strikes in frames 7-9 after converting two single pin spares in frames 5 and 6.

"Well, I know my math and that's one [win] per year. If I bowl six more years that means 30 titles," said Voss, whose 24 Tour titles ranks 9th in PBA history. "I'm in this for the long haul."

Wilson had jumped out to an early lead, striking on his first three shots. After a strike in the 5th, he lost his shot and failed to strike the rest of the way.

Voss, who used an Elite R47 strike ball Sunday, advanced to the title match by defeating the 2005 PBA Player of the Year Patrick Allen in the semifinals, 258-198. Voss closed out the match with eight straight strikes while Allen left a 6-7-10 split in the 5th and 4-7-10 split in the 8th.

Wilson beat Chris Barnes, looking for his seventh career Tour title, 246-236, in their semi-

final. The setback for Barnes makes him 1-11 in his last 12 televised matches.

Wilson earned \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish while Barnes (Flower Mound, Texas) and Allen (Tarrytown, N.Y.) earned \$10,000 apiece for 3rd and 4th, respectively.

The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Norcross, Ga., for the 2006 Bayer Atlanta Classic, Feb. 1-5 at Brunswick Zone Norcross.

The finals take place Sunday, Feb. 5 at 2 p.m. EST, with the tape-delayed ESPN telecast beginning at 5 p.m. The winner will take home the \$40,000 top prize and an exemption for the 2006-07 season.

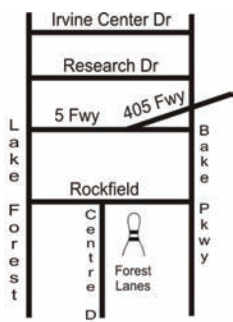



Gil Romero Wins ABTA Las Vegas Open!

ABTA League at Valley View

LAS VEGAS—Gil Romero of Agoura Hills won the second ABTA Las Vegas Open at the Orleans with a consistent performance. He won six straight matches in the Top 32 single Elim finals. Finally edging the top seed John Mason of Upland in the final frame in a very exciting match to take home a Sweet \$7,550 top prize. Gil topped a great turnout of 530 entrants, and 112 Semi-finalists at the Orleans which was a four day Thursday thru Sunday Event. Which produced great/huge payoffs for the bowlers.

Each day was a separate qualifying board taking 1 in 5 ½ bowlers to the Semifinals which in my opinion is the only fair way to run a multi day event. The lanes were tough but fair taking Thursday Men +54-Ladies +41, Friday Men +57- Ladies +34, Saturday Men +20-Ladies +23 and Sunday Mornings Big Squad took Men +6-Ladies -5. All in all 112 bowlers advanced to the Semis including the Super Seniors-Avito Advan, Sam Reyes, Pete Van Ash, Imee Ahorro, and Beth Wilcutts.

The Semifinals took to the floor at Noon. This fine field of 112 would all cash and have aspirations of making the top 32 single elims of which there are 7 women minimum.

The scoring was contentious in the semis. John Mason, an ABTA regular, shot lights out and led the way with a fine +102 to be top seed, sit out, and bowl for the title. In second place was a tie at +90 Julian “Iron Man” Conwi and Robert Gonzales. The Iron Man won a 9-10 frame roll off to get a bye in round one of the single elims. He would receive a first round bye and enter in round 2 of the Single Elim Finals.

It took a nice +29 for the men and a +13 for the ladies to make the top 32 Single Elim finals which had 7 guaranteed ladies.

The first round of the Finals took the floor. Losing in round one had Sam Reyes, Cris Romero, Demetruis Cash, Jun Tumacay, Arnaldo Concepcion, Shed Smith, Ibn Cason, Freddie Ringor, Imee Ahorro, Tessie Sanicolas, Chaweewan Arnu-wan, Avito

Advan, Oliver Esmejarda, John Lubrin, and Beth Borci. They finished in 18-32nd places and \$200 each.

In round two we had Anita Smith, Robert Gonzales, Man-ny Loria, Julian Conwi, Jose Borromeo, Romy Bautista, Robert Oakes, and Carl Nixon get erased from competition. They collected checks of \$245 finishing in 10th-17th place.

In round three we had Marv Crowder Sr. down Cynde Forniss, Ping Romero edged Lucinda Barragan, Gil Romero got to Dave Cabalero, and Raul Aldaz bested Phil Lebaquin. The losers were 6th-9th places and \$305 each.

Round 4 had Gil down Raul 190-182. Ping got to Marvin in a match of ABTA league bowlers 188-149. Raul and Marv were 4th and 5th with a nice show and \$400 each, with Ping to bowl none other than his nephew Gil for the right to meet Mason for the title. The sure bet of the weekend in Vegas was that a Romero would win this match and it was Gil who up ended his uncle in a 201-189 count. Ping was third, and \$1,000 with Gil on to the title game vs John Mason.

The title game was on. Mason elected to have Gil lead off. After four frames both bowlers were clean. But Gil had a double for the lead in frames 1-2. Both opened in frame 6 and Gil had a 14 pin lead including hcp. Mason again opened in frame 6 but Gil also opened in the 7th. After a strike in the 9th Mason doubled with the first in the 10th and another would make Gil also have to double for the win. John came up a bit high and finished 179/205. So Gil would have to mark and get count for the title. He appeared nervous and missed the head pin to the left leaving a tough 3-6-10 which he needed for the win or lose. He got the spare and got the count and the coveted title 182/212 and a tidy \$7,550. Great bowling by a fine Young man who came through in the end. It is heartwarming to see Gil win as he has been a very dedicated member for 2 ½ years and had his ups and downs. He is our latest Champion and deservedly

so. Great bowling Gil!! The Bowling Romeros strike again! Great family!

John Mason bowled so well, and could have been the champion. I am sure he would like to take that final shot again. Great bowling John, You could have been the winner!

ABTA Notes: Tourney Hi Qualifiers were Jack “the Ripper” Lindquist. Men +152, and Beth Borci led the ladies +78. They get paid entries into any regular ABTA event for the fine bowling.

The Optional doubles were taken by Roland Suase, and Jose Borromeo. Their nice 1376 got them \$300. We paid 15 places in the doubles.

The 3-6-9 was worth a huge \$2,500. Dino Cantoria was the survivor in the roll off but missed on shot #2 got a \$100 consolation. We will go for \$2,600 in the 3-6-9 this Saturday at Premiere Lanes..

The Match Series worth \$1,088 was drawn by top qualifier Lindquist. It was not matched due to a 702 that was not hit at the Orleans. We estimate the series to go for \$1,500 at Premiere Saturday for only \$2.00 to enter.

The Match Game 3 worth \$3,500 drawn by John Mason was matched by 8 of our finest, Lito Dizon, Claudio Puglisi, Jason Choi, Darrow Tiongo, Don R Johnson, Larry Spires, Robert J. Alverado, and Norris Montague. They got \$437 each for their fine 173 game. With the carryover of \$1,065, the Match Game should go for \$2,400 this Saturday at Premiere.

The weekly winner of the Columbia “300” Ball was pretty Cynde Forniss who loves the Columbia products. She thanks Columbia 300 and the ABTA. She opts for the fine Action Ball!

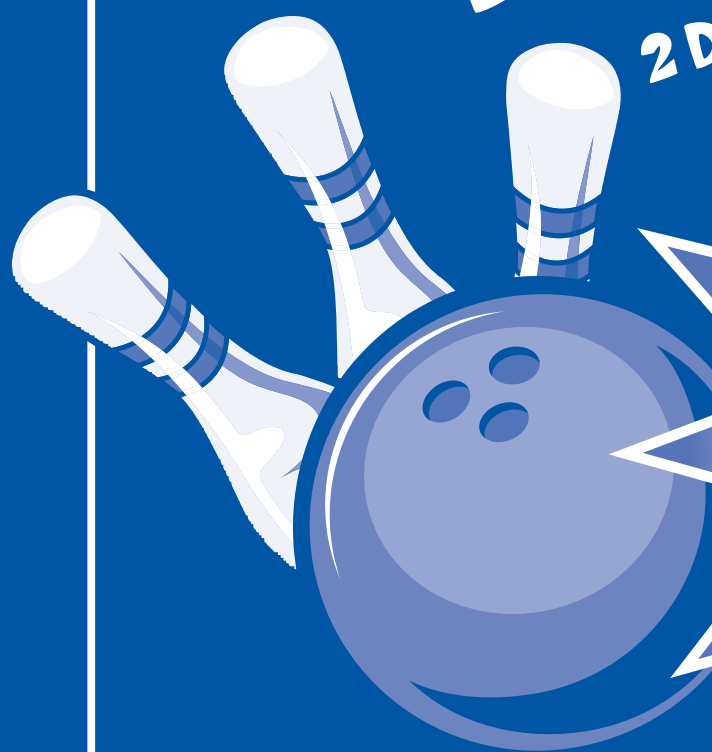




