Andres Gomez Wins Back-to-Back PBA Carmen Salvino Classic Titles Native Colombian denies Archer's bid for first PBA Tour title

ALLEN PARK - Colombia native Andres Gomez, who won his first Professional **Bowlers Association Tour title** in the 2012 Carmen Salvino Classic at age 38, successfully defended his title with a 246-197 victory over top qualifier D.J. Archer of Friendswood, Texas, at Thunderbowl Lanes.

The Salvino Classic, conducted during the PBA Detroit Winter Swing, aired Sunday

Gomez, a long-time international competitor before deciding to become a full-time PBA Tour competitor, started the title match with six strikes and was never seriously challenged in winning his second career PBA Tour title.

"It's incredible," Gomez said. "I knew it was going to be a tough match, but I started striking and that was it.

"I don't know if the second title feels better than the first," he added. "Everyone says winning the first title is the toughest. I bowled against one of the best in the world (Wes Malott) to win the first time, but this

one – because there were only two spots just to get to the TV shows – was very tough as well." Archer, who made his second career television

appearance, has never won a PBA Tour title. His best previous finish was fourth in the 2004 United States Bowling Congress Masters.



National Notary Association Names Local Businesswoman A Finalist For Its Prestigious 2013 Notary of the Year Award



Enrico, a 9 years old student at California School for Deaf at Riverside, had bowled high games in 180s and a couple of 163s.

It will be a good experience for young Enrico to bowl in this tournament and we wish him good luck in it. Also we hope his father Edwin who averages in 210's, will wisely guide Enrico to average higher in future and enter him in junior tournaments of his peers.

For example, Mark Fisser, in his youth in Buena Park had good guidance in youth leagues and junior tournaments. That as a result, was honored as the first deaf ABC Star of Tomorrow. Also hearing impaired Lindsay Coulles, Centerville, Ohio in her teens, a star bowler on Morehead University's bowling team was as first hearing impaired WIBC Star of Tomorrow. There were other good deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers who could follow them but unfortunately did not get that good guidance in their youth.

In 2000 one young Rhode Island deaf bowler Rai Doblmeier was 11 years old with a 147 average came with his mother to Rochester, NY for the Deaf Team USA Tryouts I was conducting there at AMF Olympic Bowl. The tryouts are for men bowlers with 170 and over averages and women with 150 and over average. For that reason I had to regretfully turn down his entry. His mother understood but not Rai as he argued that he hit some 200s and averaged 170 in practice.

Frankly I felt bad turning him down because they came to the tryouts for nothing. After his mother told me Rai loved to practice ten games a day, so I made an agreement with AMF Olympic Lanes general manager to let him bowl free on a vacant lane all day.

Four years later I was surprised that the same Rai Doblmeier as 15 years old made the Deaf Team USA in the Tryouts under Ed Abakunoff's direction and participated in the Deaflympics in Australia. Not only that, on the two years I followed up Lindsay Coulles' bowling for Junior Team USA in USBC Trails at Reno, I was surprised that Rai Doblmeier also participated in it. Lindsay made the team and Rai did not. So I figured that Lindsay had good guidance and Rai probably did not.



NORWALK — There are many steps bowlers can use walking on the approach up to the foul line-three, four, five, six. Most of the new bowlers use the four step approach as this is the one that feels most comfortable. The three step is where the ball swings out before the walk. This creates an unconventional (and off timing) walk with bowling ball on the approach. The whole concept of number of steps is walking on the approach, swing synchronize with the steps, create a pendulum swing, and delivery of the ball down the lane.

Beginning bowlers have a hard time putting all the components together in number of steps to be used walking down the approach together. For beginners- the four step is the easiest to learn. Question is where to start on the approach. The best way is go to the foul line and walk four steps in opposite direction from the foul line.

On the initial step- you will push the ball at the same time- right leg with right arm. On the second step, its important to remember use the ball as a pendulum swing, then move to a swing-and-slide approach, and ultimately a full approach.

The five-step approach is basically the same as the four-step approach. The difference is that the first step starts with the left foot and theres a slight "pause" before actually starting the four step approach. The ball is not pushed away until the start of the forward movement of the right foot, as in the four-step approach. This extra step prior to the push away is done to can be a relaxing motion.

Recap: its important to learn how to do each step before proceeding to the next part. First steppush away. Push the ball forward as the right foot steps straight ahead. The ball is over the forward foot at the end of this step. Second step- left foot walking, and the ball arm begins the swing down and back while the opposite arm extends to the side for balance. At the end of this step, the ball is on its way back - visualize this as the pendulum swing. The third step - the ball-side foot steps forward (right). At the end of the third step, the ball is at the height of the back swing. Fourth step- as the left foot slides forward, the ball descends from the back swing and is released over the foul line.

Until next time- high scoring and keep on striking!

HAPPY VALENTINE'S DAY TO ALL!



One of the greatest feats in bowling history unfolded more than 50 years ago.

It was the TV winning streak piled up by the late Lou Campi of Dumont, NJ, a member of the ABC Hall of Fame and half a dozen other Halls. Campi rolled with the top teams, won the national doubles with Andy Varipapa, and again with Lindy Faragalli, and more than 100 assorted titles. He gained special attention as "Wrongfoot Lou" because he finished on his right foot even though he was a righty, and according to the books, that's the wrong foot.

A mason by trade, Campi was strong physically, but even stronger mentally, and early acquired the reputation as one of the best clutch bowlers in the game. That, and his pride and confidence in his ability, made him an almost perfect performer for TV. Prior to the streak he had established himself as an outstanding TV performer, winning a couple of cars, pretty fair cash for the times, and all kinds of merchandise. He made constant TV appearances across the country.

No score or record bothered him, and he never worried about how high scores might be. He often said, "If a man bowled it, a man can beat it."

The TV shows were aired live from New York City when Campi was 52. Two years later Campi made history when he won the first official tourney conducted by the PBA.

The show was called, "East Vs. West" and was scheduled for 13 weeks. The format was simple. A list of bowlers from the East and another of bowlers from the West were compiled, and when a bowler lost he would be replaced the following week by the next man on the list. The winner would return.

Campi didn't give his fellow Easterners a chance to bowl. He won all 13 scheduled matches.

In order he defeated Therm Gibson, Johnny King, Bill Lillard, Tom Hennessey, Ed Lubanski, Ned Day, Dick Weber, Don Carter, Steve Nagy, Ed Kawolics, Buzz Fazio, Dick Hoover and Joe Wilman.

That completed the 13 week run. But the producer and announcer, Lou Marks, the owner of the host center, Nick Gianos of Bowlmor Recreation, and the main sponsor, Kitchens of Sara Lee, all knew they had a big hit, and extended the show. Campi beat Buddy Bomar, and an additional week was added, the 15th, when Campi lost to Lillard, 665 to 662.

The Bowlmor Lanes were known as the most difficult around, and the best in the East struggled to average close to 200. Campi averaged 232 plus for his 45 games, and only four were under 200. He made a number of last game comebacks in the three game tests, and thrice threatened 300 games, for which a bonus prize of \$100,000 had been posted.

If the names of the bowlers seem familiar, they should. All were elected to the ABC Hall except King. Kitchens of Sara Lee, now a giant firm involved with dozens of products, featured just cheese cake and coffee cake.

Pat McDonough, then the statistical genius and bowling writer on the sports staff of the New York World Telegram, figured the odds against Campi winning 14 straight matches were 16,383 to 1.

Sadly, no film or tape of any portion of the shows were

preserved, because in those days the tape was erased, and used over again. Some recordings and home movies do pop up now and then.
