## Tom Hess Wins First Lumber Liquidators PBA Title in Bayer USBC Masters

RENO, Nev. - Tom Hess of Urbandale, Iowa, thrust his hands to the sky, jumped into the air and relished his place in bowling history as he claimed the title at the 2011 Bayer United States Bowling Congress Masters on Sunday at the National Bowling Stadium.

Hess defeated top seed Jack Jurek of Lackawanna, N.Y., 225-214, to win his first career Lumber Liquidators Professional Bowlers Association Tour title.

"I can't put into words right now what this means, this is just a lifelong dream realized," said Hess, who defeated Mika Koivuniemi of Finland, 254-219, for the right to bowl Jurek. "I am a PBA champion now. It's something I've wanted to do since I was very little."

Jurek opened up the championship match in strong fashion, striking on six of his first seven shots and taking a 22-pin lead after seven frames, but disaster struck for the top seed. Jurek left back-to-back splits for open frames in the eighth and ninth.

"All I was thinking was to keep the pressure on him," said Hess, whose only open in the title match came in the first frame when he failed to convert a 4-9 split. "That's why we bowl 10 frames. I caught my bad break early in the game and was able to come back from it."

After Hess struck on his first shot in the 10th frame, he needed just a handful of pins on his final two shots to win, when Jurek approached him and gave Hess some words of advice.

"He actually came up to me and said congratulations, get your emotions together and make a good shot," Hess said. "He's a true gentleman. I almost feel bad that I took his title away from him, but I earned it."

Jurek finished second at the 2006 Masters to Doug Kent, losing as the top seed in that event as well. He said he felt comfortable and was content knowing he made good shots.

"I wasn't the most relaxed that I've been on television, but I wasn't bad," said Jurek,

a two-time winner on the PBA Tour. "I felt like I made a lot of quality shots. The two open frames I had in the eighth and ninth, that's part of bowling. Those were two shots where I didn't feel nervous or anxiety."

When Jurek stepped up in the final frame of the championship match, he trailed by one pin. He delivered a clutch strike on his first shot, but left a pocket 7-10 split on his second shot and got one pin.

"Even a spare there forces him to go spare, strike to win and for your first title and a

major title, that's not the easiest thing to do," Jurek said. "Throwing the second strike in the 10th and forcing him to double to win would have put a whole new emphasis on things. It was a huge shot."

In the semifinal, Hess and Koivuniemi both started with five consecutive strikes before Koivuniemi opened in the sixth frame. Hess went on to throw two more strikes to run his string to seven in a row before leaving the 3-6 in the eighth frame. Hess converted spares in the final three frames

## FOR JAROS, LOSING "LOWEST GAME ON TV" RECORD IS BITTERSWEET

LAS VEGAS — While Tom Daugherty was struggling to shoot 100 during his PBA Tournament of Champions semifinal match against Mika Koivuniemi on ABC on Jan. 22, Steve Jaros was watching the telecast with interest at a friend's home in Las Vegas.

"It's kinda weird," the Yorkville, Ill., resident said. "From the fifth frame on, I don't remember ever getting that many text messages."

The reason: Jaros was the holder of the PBA record for lowest game ever on national television, a 129 he bowled in losing to Mike Edwards' 201 in the first match of the 1992 Brunswick Memorial World Open finals in Lake Zurich, Ill., and he was in danger of losing his record.

"Some people thought I'd be relieved, but actually, I had both ends of the record — the

Then Don Blatchford, made a big jump from game 6 to 8, by rolling 278-288-299 for 865, and to a 100 pin lead with 2 games to go. Don ran into trouble in Game #9, rolling a 158 game. To start the Position Round, with Don in 1st Place leading, 2nd Place Dave, by 36 pins, 3rd Place, Mike Rausch, by 39 pins and 4th Place, Stan Caswell, by 40 pins. Don won his match over Dave, but because of the strong finish by Mike Rausch (Costa Mesa), winning the tournament, when he went off the sheet from the 6th frame of his match to bowl a 254 game, Don on the 11th frame needed a strike to win, made a great shot to the pocket, with a solid 9 pin standing, giving Mike the win by 4 pins. \$4,955.00 paid out for 38 bowlers entered. 12 checks paid out. Top 4: 1st, Mike Rausch, \$800.00, 2nd, Don Blatchford (Santa Monica) \$675.00, 3rd Place (Dave Smith (Las Vegas), \$565.00, and 4th to Stan Caswell (Pine Valley), \$450.00.

# NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

**SUB LORENZO BLASTS 257-895, JONES 880 IN DEAF TRAVEL AT JEWEL CITY**  
GLENDALE—In So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League’s 2nd half season trip to Jewel City Bowl, the league leader S. F. Valley did better than its first half scoring at the same center. Valley with all left-handed bowlers Bob Jones’ 880, Bob Bergan’s 767 and Emad Aranki’s 679 scored steady team games of 590-573-579-584 for the season high team series 2326. The new high replaces LA City’s 2251 made last October.

After 4 past so-so sessions as a sub, Andy Lorenzo suddenly became a super-sub and the day’s honor roll leader by blasting out all twos set. 200-222-216, closing with 257 for the day’s high 895 series. Incidentally in this scratch match points league, Lorenzo was matched and won 4 points against Jones whose 880 consisted of game s 237-193-214-236 as his season high. The only other 800 of the day was made by Ed Abakumoff who had a great series of 686 going before running into a 4 splits plagued 157, ending up with a 843.

Like Abakumoff, Pablo Yoma had a great set going with 206-200-211 and hit a bump with 182 to end up with 799 one pin short of the day’s 4th 800. Also matched against Yoma, Gardy Rodgers had a good chance starting with 206 and a big 253 but hit double bumps 157-159 to end up with 775. Bergan’s 767 consisted of 188-214-173-192 and Don Millwee made the list with his 200 as his 699 was one pin short.

In the league standings, Lorenzo with 4 points subbing on third place Chino prevented a near sweep limiting Jones’ leading S. F. Valley to just a 15-5 win. Despite losing 3 games and team series by 8 pins to Abakumoff’s Riverside, 2nd place LA City with Bob Taylor and Glenn Cissna sweeping 5 points each managed to make a 12-8 win. Abakumoff with 4 points had half of Riverside’s 8 points. After winning only one and half points in first two games, 5th place Yoma’s Lake Elsinore rallied to upset 4th place Rodgers’ Mid City by taking the next 2 games and series for a 12.5 to 7.5 win. Lake Elsinore moved into 4th place and Mid City dropped t 5th.

The league thanked Jewel City management and staff for the good scoring conditions as the league averaged well over its team average on the day. The league’s next week Feb. 13 travel date was cancelled because Cerritos Bowl found that it had no lanes available for the day and is rescheduled for Feb. 27. Feb. 20 date is impossible because most of the league bowlers are committed to bowl in So. Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association tournament at Lake Elsinore that weekend.


## DEGROFF IS BACK WITH HIS 825 AT JEWEL CITY BOWL



lowest and highest games bowled on TV - so I was actually a little disappointed. But what are you going to do?"

Jaros was the 13th player in PBA history to bowl a nationally-televised 300 when he got his share of the “highest game on TV” record in Chattanooga, Tenn., in 1999.

Record or not, Jaros understood better than anyone else what Daugherty was going through.

“I know first-hand how a game like that can go,” the seven-time PBA Tour titlist said. “You get on a run when nothing goes right. The thing is, when I had my game, I was on a 140 pace and I wasn’t out of the match. I was trying to figure out how to throw a double and get back in it. But Tom was so far down by the fifth frame, there was no way for him. “Those games on TV go by pretty fast anyway,” Jaros continued. “Tom was a good sport about it. Mika was working on a 300 and Tom was just trying to get out of his way. I thought he did a really good job with it.”


