O'Neill Claims First Major In 10 Years At Players

COLUMBUS, Ohio – It took a decade but Bill O'Neill is a major champion once again.

In the closest championship match of the season, O'Neill took down EJ Tackett, 233-232, to win his second major title at the 2020 PBA Players Championship on Saturday at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl.

O'Neill delivered when it mattered most in the final frame after Tackett gave him an opportunity to win. O'Neill tossed two strikes he deemed afterwards as "perfect" and followed it up with just enough count to win his first major since the U.S. Open in February 2010.

"The fill ball was a little left," said O'Neill, who left a high four pin on his final

shot. "I popped up on it a little bit. I didn't stay down on it. I didn't get through it as clean. I was pretty fortunate. Sometimes it's just your day."

Tackett was in control down the stretch, leading by 19 pins with two frames to go but wasn't able to hold on. In the ninth frame, he sent a wicked messenger across toward the 10 but it didn't take it down.

In the final frame, he needed a pair of strikes and two pins to secure his third career major title but left a seven pin on his first shot, giving O'Neill a chance at the come-from-behind victory.

"You'd rather put the match away before that in a perfect world," said O'Neill, who earned \$75,000 for the win. "But

the feeling afterwards of knowing what you did in that moment to win a major, it hasn't hit me yet, I'm sure it will later, but it's pretty unbelievable."

Belmonte, 236-185, to advance to the championship.

The match was even at the commercial break after Belmonte tossed a double in the fifth and sixth frames. On his next shot after the break, Belmonte left a seven pin to fall behind and would never recover.

In his past four championship round appearances dating back to last year's U.S. Open in October, Belmonte is now 0-4 and averaging just 179.75 on television.

O'Neill was able to advance through the second match of the stepladder with a 215-194 win over last week's PBA Tournament of Champions winner Kris Prather.

Prather trailed by just one pin when he went high and left the 6-10 in the ninth frame. He chopped the spare, however, and that allowed O'Neill to step up and finish him off.

O'Neill left and converted a 10 pin in the ninth and then, needing a mark, buried the pocket for a strike and the victory.

The stepladder finals opened with a tense and emotional match as Prather defeated Marshall Kent, 187-184, to advance.

Prather needed to fill 17 pins in the final frame to win. He left a 10 pin, converted it and struck on the fill for the win.

The loss was an emotional one for Prather. continued on page 5

CBS Sports Network To Televis PWBA, Collegiate & Youth in 2020

ARLINGTON, Texas – Live coverage of a Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour event finals that will take place at the Hammer Junior Gold Championships is one of the many highlights of the 17 bowling shows CBS Sports Network will televise in 2020.

The live finals of the PWBA Las Vegas Open, scheduled as part of the Junior Gold Opening Ceremony at The Orleans Arena, is set for July 12 at 6 p.m. Located in The

Orleans Hotel and Casino, the arena will seat approximately 9,000 spectators for the show. The 1995 U.S. Open set the attendance record for a bowling event at 7,212.

CBS Sports Network will have live coverage of seven PWBA stepladder finals in 2020, including all majors, plus four shows from the Intercollegiate Team and Singles Championships, the finals of all four divisions of the Junior Gold Championships, and the two title matches at

the USA Bowling National Championships.

Las Vegas also will host the stepladder finals of the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Queens, on Tuesday, May 19 at 5 p.m. at the South Point Bowling Plaza. It is the first of the four PWBA majors that will be televised live. Dasha Kovalova of Ukraine won her first career PWBA Tour title and major championship at last year's event.

ACROSS THE COUNTRY – Fifteen collegiate events took place across the country last weekend, highlighted by wins from the Bowling Green State men and Alma women at the Alma Scotty Classic in Jackson, Michigan.

The tournament was held at JAX 60, bringing

together 19 men's varsity teams and 18 women's varsity programs. The event featured four traditional games and 16 Baker games, with total pinfall determining the winner in each division.

In the men's division, Bowling Green State finished the traditional block

with games of 1,163 and 1,112 to take the lead by nearly 200 pins over Lourdes. The Falcons maintained their advantage throughout the Baker round, claiming the victory with a 7,436 total. Concordia rallied from sixth to second in Baker play, finishing the traditional block continued on page 7

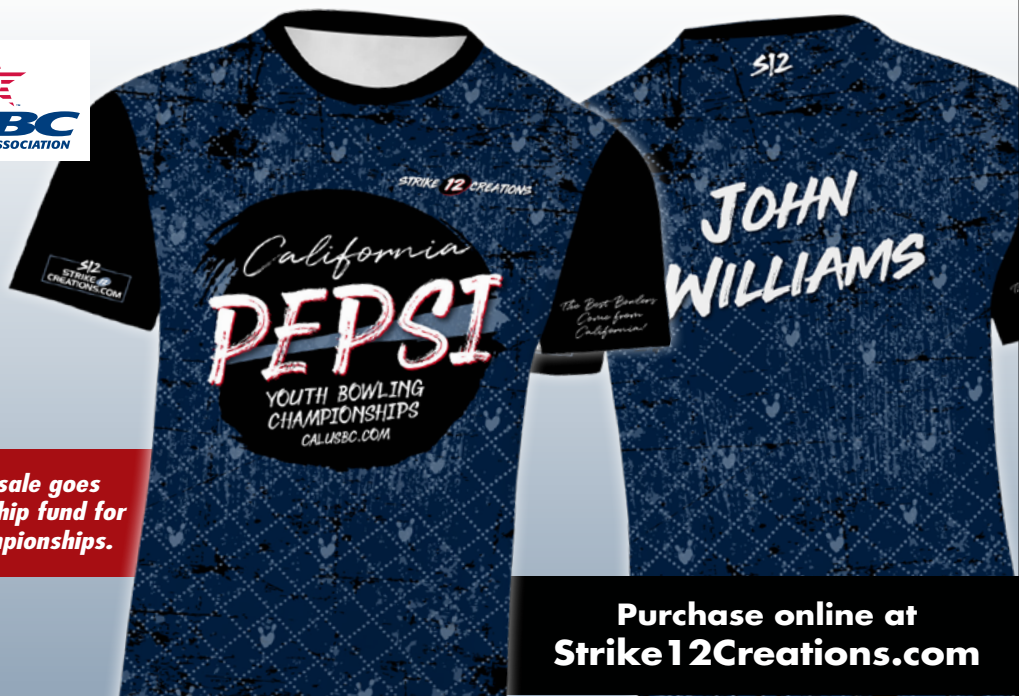

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: ROOKIE WINS FIRST TITLE IN FLORIDA

- New PBA member Anthony Marino of Henrico, Va., defeated Matt Gasn of Clarksville, Tenn., 435-398, in a two-game match to win the PBA Break Point Alley Challenge in Tavares, Fla., for his first PBA title and a \$2,000 first prize Sunday.
In the PBA50 portion of the PBA South Region doubleheader, non-member Doug Nairn of DeBary, Fla., defeated Joe Scarborough of Charlotte, N.C., 424-335, in the final match to collect the \$1,500 top prize. Nairn’s win doesn’t include a title, however, because he was not a PBA member at the time he won.
- Regional competition over the Feb. 21-23 weekend includes the PBA50 Dave Edwards Toyota South Open at Paradise Lanes in Spartanburg, S.C., and a pair of tournaments at South Point in Las Vegas – the Southpoint West Challenge for non-titlists and a Southpoint Member/Non-Member Doubles Tournament.

PBA TOC TELECAST ON FOX REACHES NEARLY 1.5 MILLION VIEWERS

FOX Sports has announced Sunday’s live coverage of the PBA Tournament of Champions finals on FOX was the most-watched non-NFL adjacent telecast since 2010 with 1,464,000 viewers. The “non-NFL adjacent” reference means a standalone telecast that neither preceded or followed an NFL game on FOX.

With that exceptional audience, FOX Sports telecasts (FOX and FS1) are up 29 percent over 2019 and through five events, including the PBA Clash to kick off the season, viewership is up 45 percent over the 2019 season which also were the highest in years.

MATCHROOM SPORT, PBA TEAM UP AGAIN FOR 2020 WEBER CUP

Matchroom Sport and the PBA will again team up for the 2020 BetVictor Weber Cup, a Ryder Cup-style competition that will pit five American PBA stars against five European PBA members in a team, doubles and singles competition for bragging rights and shares of a \$75,000 prize fund.

The competition, which was held in the U.S. for the first time in 2019, returns to England in 2020 where it will be contested in Morningside Arena in Leicester, June 5-7.

Team Europe and Team USA will each line-up with five players for the 2020 BetVictor Weber Cup with two members of each team to earn automatic selection via the PBA Tour Points List. New to the program in 2020 will be a competition points qualifying system for two berths on each team using the PBA’s points system for 10 tournaments ending with the USBC Masters in March.

PBA Hall of Famer Chris Barnes will return as captain of the U.S. team while England’s Dom Barrett will again captain the European squad. The captains will select the final two members of their respective teams. The American team won the 2019 Cup at Mandalay Bay in Las Vegas, 18-14.

“We’re thrilled to be partnering with the BetVictor Weber Cup for a second consecutive year and to be giving our PBA players the kind of international exposure they deserve,” said PBA Chief Executive Officer Colie Edison. “The BetVictor Weber Cup—much like the Ryder Cup in golf—is a transatlantic rivalry that ups the ante for the sport and gives our fans even more reason to root for their favorite players.”

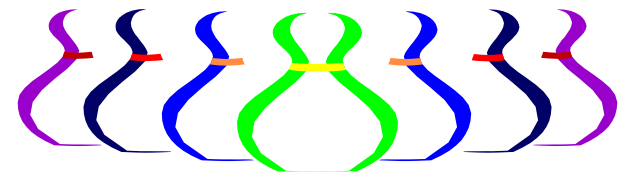

USBC’S TIERED CENTER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Reported by Terry Bigham at Bowl.com, USBC will implement a center certification program featuring tiered levels of certification and a national staff of lane inspectors over the next five years. Details will be announced at the 2021 USBC Convention.

The USBC Equipment and Specifications Committee has delegated authority to make changes to equipment specifications. It was also determined that USBC will not require local associations to perform annual lane inspections.

This decision means that all bowling centers will be certified until the national staff begins center certifications in 2022.



KRIS PRATHER CLAIMS PBA PLAYOFFS POINTS LEAD AFTER TOC WIN

Kris Prather of Plainfield, Ill., the winner of the inaugural PBA Playoffs in 2019, jumped into the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour points lead after winning the PBA Tournament of Champions Sunday in Fairlawn, Ohio. The TOC was the first major championship of the 2020 season, and a Tier 1 tournament in the PBA’s classification system, awarding 7,500 points to the winner.

With his big win in the fourth of 13 tournaments in the 2020 PBA Playoffs points race, Prather moved past PBA Oklahoma Open winner Sean Rash who led the points standings after the season’s first three tournaments. PBA Jonesboro Open titlist Kyle Troup dropped one spot to third.

Fans can expect another shakeup in the points race after this week’s PBA Players Championship, the second Tier 1 event of the season. Points are awarded according to each tournament is classified in the three-tier points structure. Tier 1 (major championship) tournaments reward winners with 7,500 points. Tier 2 (standard PBA Tour) tournaments award 5,000 points to the winner. A Tier 3 tournament (limited field and/or restricted format) awards 2,500 points to the winner. Points also are awarded to all other players in a declining scale based upon where they finish.

The top 24 in 2020 competition points will qualify to bowl in the PBA Playoffs in April and May. Points standings will be finalized at the conclusion of the USBC Masters on March 29 in Reno, Nev. Below are the top 30 points standings after three events:

Open stepladder finals are June 30 at 5 p.m. at USA Bowl in Dallas, the PWBA Players Championship finals are Aug. 23, 2 p.m. at Seminole Lanes in Seminole, Florida, while the PWBA Tour Championship will be announced at a later date.

The finals of college bowling’s major events, the Intercollegiate Team and Singles Championships that will be held at the Spectrum Entertainment Complex in Wyoming, Michigan, to kick off the action. The ISC women’s finals will air Tuesday, April 21, at 5 p.m., and the ISC men’s singles will be televised April 28 at 8 p.m.

The ITC women’s title match will be televised May 5 at 5 p.m. and the men’s final will air May 12 at 8 p.m.

Six TV shows will be taped for broadcast when the Junior Gold Championships and USA Bowling National Championships are held in Las Vegas in July.

The boys and girls finals in each of the four divisions of the Junior Gold Championships will air on four consecutive Tuesdays starting July 21 with the 12-and-under finals, followed by the U15 (July 28), U17 (Aug. 4) and U20 (Aug. 11) divisions. All finals will air at 5 p.m.

The U15 title match of the USA Bowling National Championships will air Aug. 18, and the U12 final will be on CBS Sports Network on Aug. 25, with both starting at 5 p.m.

PBA PLAYER’S PERSPECTIVE: NORM DUKE REFLECTS ON WINNING TITLE NO. 39

PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke etched his name in PBA history in 2019, becoming the third player in PBA Tour history to win 40 career titles. He began his trek to that milestone with victory No. 39 in the Go Bowling Indianapolis Open. KRIS PRATHER BECOMES MOST SUCCESSFUL TELEVISION PLAYER IN PBA HISTORY

With his four match wins in the PBA Tournament of Champions stepladder finals, Kris Prather became the most successful player in PBA history in terms of winning percentage for a minimum of 10 television appearances. His TOC performance improved his match record to 17-5 in 13 television appearances for a 77.27 percent success rate, surpassing Jim Pencak who won 73.33% of his TV matches (22-8 in 12 appearances) dating back to the late 1980s.

Tommy Jones, with two wins and one loss in his three matches on TV in 2020, has advanced from 15th on the list to 12th with a 62.20 success percentage in 82 matches bowled in 48 TV appearances (51 wins, 31 losses).

1994 – PART 5

Part 5 will be scrapped together from the pages of September through December. Bowls were re-opening after the earthquake damages were repaired. Some didn't. A loss to the communities. Winter leagues were under-way and the fight to get bowling into the Olympics continued. Again, I will not print all 300 games ... unless I like the name!

- Bill Doehrman competed in 71 ABC Tournaments. Joe Norris rolled his 65th in Mobile and was convinced he could break Bill's record. Will watch as the years roll by.
 - A mistake in the ABC rulebook: officers in a mixed league did NOT have to be mixed. Rule 102a had to be revised.
 - President Bill Clinton declared Dec. 4-10 to be "National Ladies Pro Bowlers Week."
 - Who was the owner of the world's largest bowling center chain? The U.S. government! There were 500 centers on military bases worldwide. Tax dollars did not support them. They were self sufficient.
 - For Sale: ladies Linds shoes, size 9. For right hander. Call...
 - Another dumb idea from Michigan: "Car bowling!" Place an unoccupied junk car on a runway of a private airport. Fly over at about 90 mph. at an altitude of 30 feet, and attempt to hit the car with a bowling ball. It will never replace "midget," "chicken," or "turkey" bowling.
 - Bill Taylor and Ed Williamson (local pro shop guru) teamed up to educate the bowlers looking to improve their game. Ed used Taylor's method of teaching: timing, swing, foot-work and finish. (Ed had his pro shop inside BOWLING SQUARE until the bowl closed last year. But still available!)
 - Dick Steinbaugh, Executive of the Bowling Proprietors, died in Oct. 1994. He never met a stranger and was a true leader.
 - Roger Carns ruled the roost at MIDTOWN BOWL. When he smiled for a photo, you didn't need a flash bulb.
 - GRANADA BOWL never survived the earthquake. Remember when the police raided the ladies daytime leagues? They were accused of "gambling." These dangerous side-pots, card games and saving stamps – a menace!
 - Yvette Jones De Cohen was considered to be one of the best ball drillers in Southern California. Her pro shop was located inside MIDTOWN BOWL. Her apron was a trademark.
 - Jon Diso (current manager at FOREST LANES) was top seed in JAT tourney at WEST-BROOK. Won top scholarship bucks, \$95. Mary Davis was top teen for the same \$95.
 - Oct. 13, 1994 issue: nine centers had weekly junior tournaments plus clubs. Kept parents and kids busy all weekend. Question? DID YOU EVER KNOW A JUNIOR BOWLER THAT WENT TO JAIL?
 - The LA City Council presented MATADOR BOWL a proclamation. It read, "happiness is Brunswick MATADOR BOWL." Their comeback from the earthquake was appreciated. The bowl was leveled, lanes warped, machines rusting from water damage and EVERYTHING just junk. Bowlers stood and cried at the sight of it all.
 - The California Women's State Tournament was voted to be held in Orange County in 1995. FOUNTAIN BOWL and TUSTIN LANES won the bid to host the events.
 - The lowest sanctioned game, by a sanctioned bowler was a 2. Today? Who knows!
 - John Jowdy was promoting an idea to help raise the prize funds for the pro bowlers! More beer commercials? No! More ball ads? No! Charge more to watch the shows? No! Raise the entry fee? No! Simple quick fix ... Raise the price of a sanction card by \$2. That would raise \$12 million for the touring pros.
 - Robin Romeo was inducted into the WIBC Hall of Fame for superior performance. Robin was a 6-time WIBC All American and held 13 pro titles. (She added more titles in the year following).
 - SAM'S TOWN hosted the "National 9-pin No Tap". Entry fee: \$99. Everyone got an Ebonite Nitro Ball. PLUS a cocktail party and hors d'oeuvres. Sign me up!
 - "Day at the Races" on Breeder's Cup day. The San Gabriel Valley WBA special event at the Santa Anita race track. Lunch in the infield, special betting windows, lots of prizes and bowling friends picking "winners." It was special!
 - GIANT 2 PAGE AD! Super Grand Opening of Tilton's Bowling Supply inside MATADOR BOWL. His special for kids – get a starter lightweight ball, when the kid grows out of it, trade it in for a heavier one! "Ball Wall" was their name for bumper bowling. Remember "day care" for the ladies leagues? They had it!
 - The battle over "smoke or no smoke" continued. The beer drinking, cigarette smoking, hairy-armed bowler in commercials wasn't helping the "image." Bowlers didn't fit the "Olympic image" either!
 - Billy Myers Jr. was burning up the lanes. He averaged 254 for his 4th PCB title win this year. He and Larry Stephens both rolled 300s in the Palm Springs Open.
 - Remember those size 9 ladies shoes that were for sale a few months ago? In November they are still for sale. Ad costs must have eaten up the profit six months later!
 - After a worldwide vote, the favorite name for a center was "Ten Pin Alley." The Montana bowl became famous overnight.
 - The California WBA's "Stars of Tomorrow" award was great! Every year, one boy and one girl (bowlers) were honored for their bowling, academic endeavors and leadership qualities. Each received a \$1,000 scholarship for their college education.
 - Cal State 600 Club, Cal State 500 Club, Cal State 700 Club, BVL, Cal State Seniors Yearly State Tournament. We HAD to enter!
 - Eric Forkel won \$45,000 for his BRN World Open title. Uncle Harry Grant was all smiles.
 - Coming soon –moving into the 90s!! MISSION HILLS BOWL gets automatic scoring. Bowlers and scorekeepers protested.
 - Betty Neely of Anaheim (in 1960-61) bowled in 14 leagues a week! Arcadia's Bill O'Brien bowled in 14, mostly at VILLAGE LANES. (Side note: Bill worked on the highway to Las Vegas and was there when the off-ramp Zzyzx was named.)
 - Tish was the main dish at SAM'S TOWN. In Nov. 1994 she won her third LPBT SAM'S TOWN title of \$18,000. Tish Johnson still on the lanes in 2020.
 - HIGHLAND BOWL in Moline, Ill. was a 48-lane center, which had 87 sanctioned leagues in 1991! That was over 12 leagues per day.
 - Rumor: Michael Keaton was signed to star in the movie "Kingpin." Woody Harrelson (with rubber hand) ended up with the part.
 - The Del Conte family reclaimed SOUTHWEST BOWL (they had leased it out and the leaser let it rot!) They had to remodel the coffee shop, lanes, lighting, restrooms, carpet, lounge and scoring. Ken Del Conte (son) took over the helm until it closed a few years later. The Del Conte family purchased SADDLEBACK LANES the same year.
 - The ARC centers were giving away 1995 Ford Aspire autos.
 - The Bowling News issue was 32 pages weekly. Average 300's receiving congratulations was 28. Want ads: seven. Tournaments: 22. If you were looking for action – big or small, somebody was running something!
 - Scheduled at the AC Delco Classic at CAL BOWL was Walter Ray Williams, Jr., Brian Voss, Pete Weber, Norm Duke, Amleto Monacelli & Mike Aulby. The spectators loved it!
 - CHAPARRAL LANES' "Boot Scootin'" New Year's Eve Party was great! Everyone in Western wear and spent the night "horsin' around!"
- We end the year 1994 with congrats, condolences, columns and characters. Hope you enjoyed the trip. Your comments and memories are always welcome. Call any Monday and we can swap stories.

ishing with 7,239, and Lourdes was third with 7,221.

Individually, Michigan's Tevon Hastings claimed the top spot in the men's field, posting games of 255, 237, 223 and 225 for a 940 total (a 235 average). Madonna's Antar Howard was second with 930, while Bowling Green State's Tyler Lowenstein (925) and Steven Kocher (892) and Lourdes' Ian Friesner (863) finished in the top five.

On the women's side, Alma found itself in third place after the traditional block, trailing Lourdes by 94 pins. The Scots bounced back after putting together the top Baker performance, taking the win with a 6,767 total. Lourdes was second with 6,714, and Concordia finished third with 6,631.

Notre Dame-Ohio's Alisha Noon earned the top individual spot with an 824 total (a 206 average). Lourdes' Serena Nichols was second with 818, while Notre Dame-Ohio's Alexandria Dick (810) and Alma's Sarah Gadde (809) followed in the standings. Rochester's Tamera Robinson and Siena Heights' Tryna Gladstone tied for fifth with 801.

In other USBC Collegiate action over the weekend:

- At the CHC Baker Classic in Sinking Springs, Pennsylvania, the Fairleigh Dickinson women claimed the top spot.
- At the Wildcat Classic in Orlando, Florida, the Stephen F. Austin women led the way in total pinfall.
- At the Southwest Intercollegiate Bowling Conference Championships in Shawnee, Oklahoma, the Kansas Wesleyan men and West Texas A&M women recorded the bracket wins.
- At the McKendree Baker Challenge in Fairview Heights, Illinois, the Wichita State women and Webber International men went undefeated in bracket play to collect wins.
- At the Great Lakes Bowling Conference No. 4 in Milwaukee, the Wisconsin-Milwaukee women stayed ahead of the field, while the Wisconsin-Whitewater men cruised to the top spot.
- At the Tony Reyes Memorial Collegiate Classic No. 1 and No. 2 in San Jose, California, the UNLV men and San Jose State women toppled the most pins.
- At the MSC Indianapolis Collegiate Classic in Indianapolis, the Pikeville women led the field by 774 pins, while the Marian men recorded a wire-to-wire victory.
- At the Cedar Valley Hawkeye Open and Cedar Valley Wartburg Open in Waterloo, Iowa, the Mount Mercy men and women swept the top spots.
- At the Suffolk Tournament in Babylon, New York, the Molloy women and Stevens Institute of Technology men rolled to big wins.
- At the Muskie Mash in Lancaster, Ohio, the Ohio State men and Morehead State women paced their respective fields.
- At the Arizona Cup in Glendale, Arizona, the Grand Canyon women and Arizona State men finished at the top of the standings.
- At the Eastern Intercollegiate Bowling Conference No. 3 in Manalapan, New Jersey, the St. John's men bounced back during Baker competition to take the top spot.

Bowlers faced the 2019 USBC Championships Team Event pattern. With 9’ less oil than last round’s pattern there was definitely friction if you were in the right zone.

Overall league-leaders **Forest Lanes** were sitting with 72 wins but still looking for a round win to put them in the play-offs. The faced 2nd round winner **Cal Bowl** who was two back with 70 wins. Forest Lanes came out strong and dominated the first two, but Cal Bowl came back to take game 3 and salvage one point. Stephanie Zavala lit them up for Forest with a 663 set while Ramon Torres managed 588 for Cal Bowl.

First-round winner **DV8** took on **Tito’s Vodka** with both teams sitting at 65 wins. Tito’s Vodka took games 1-3 and totals for a 4-1 decision, dropping only a very close 773-769 game 2. Sub Ray Minter paced DV8 with a 530 set while Edward Estrada led Tito’s Vodka with a 573 set.

3 Olives Vodka also banked 57 wins this season taking on **Kingpin Pro Shop** who was 3 ½ back of them at 53 ½ wins. Kingpin took game one, but it was all 3 Olives after that as they ran to a 4-1 win. Sub Kyler Kolb led 3 Olives with a 583 set while Steve Gurrieri paced Kingpin with a 589 set.

Captain Morgan and **Buddy’s Bowling Supply** were matched up in the 11-12 pairing. Captain Morgan took the first two games huge but Buddy’s fought back for a big 123-pin third game win but it still wasn’t enough for totals as they dropped a 4-1 decision.
