Jason Belmonte Wins Columbia 300 **Mini-Eliminator** At Texas Station

LAS VEGAS, NV-Jason Belmonte, one of the premier international bowlers, earned another prestigious title by winning the 2008 Columbia 300 Mini-Eliminator Amateur Only Classic at Texas Station in Las Vegas. Jason rolled a 255 in the Shootout Round to earn the \$20,000 top prize.

Jason, who is only 24 years old and resides in Orange, Australia, needed a little luck in the finals to capture the title. His road to the finals started typically as Jason rolled a 751 series on Thursday to lead the day and earn one bye. Jason breezed through the early rounds in the finals with games of 245, 237, and 238. But in Round 5 Jason only shot a 216 game and needed an open in the 10th frame from one of his competitors to advance. Jason's fortunes in Round 6 were even greater as he needed a double in the 10th to advance. His first shot went extremely high and briefly left the 4-10 split standing. Amazingly both pins fell and he threw a perfect 2nd strike to advance to the Shootout Round.

In the Shootout Jason took immediate control with 6 consecutive strikes. His opponents, Pete Thomas from Oklahoma City, OK (46 and over champion) and Sol Cericos from Arcadia, CA (210 and under champion) both had early opens and no doubles through 5 frames. With a 50+ pin lead in the 5th frame Jason cruised to victory with a 255 game. In 2nd place, with a 215, was Pete who earned \$10,000. Sol took

Mike Scroggins moved up to fourth in the PBA Player of the Year race with his second win this season.

OMAHA, Neb. — Mike Scroggins probably had a feeling in the first frame Sunday, when the normally automatic Walter Ray Williams Jr. missed a single-pin conversion, things would go his way.

That was certainly the case as Scroggins got all the breaks Sunday, coupled with some smart decisions, to defeat Williams, 214-194, in the 2008 Pepsi Championship at Thunder-Alley, winning his fifth career Denny's PBA Tour title and his second of the season.

The Tour veteran has finally figured out how to win on TV. Prior to his win in January in the 2008 Motel 6 Dick Weber Open, Scroggins was just 9-22 in televised matches and was riding an eight-game losing streak. He broke the streak in a big way, winning four matches as the No. 5 seed to win his fourth title.

Scroggins' path to victory was much shorter this Sunday as he earned the No. 1 seed for the stepladder finals, giving him an automatic berth in the title match. He had the tall task of facing the Tour's all-time titles leader, who was looking for his third title of the season and 45th of his career.

Instead, Williams missed a 10-pin in the first frame and had trouble carrying the rest of the way, leaving three 10-pins, two 7-pins and a stone 8-pin in the match.

Scroggins, using a different ball on each lane, struck in four of the first five frames and overcame an open in the seventh by striking in the eighth and ninth to all but seal the deal.

With the two other lefthanded bowlers in the finals -Billy Oatman and Rhino Page - going by the wayside, Scroggins new he had to make some changes in the title match.

Seeing the lefties struggle in the first couple matches, I was definitely thinking hard about things," Scroggins (Amarillo, Texas) said. "Billy started with three opens and Rhino threw it good in the second match but then he was totally lost in the next match. Both lanes were completely different. I had to use two different balls, stand in two different places and look at two different targets.

"Luckily, Walter Ray struggled to carry the 10-pin and I was able carry it."

Scroggins, who also beat Williams for his second career title in 2004, is enjoying the finest season of his 17-year career, winning two titles in a season for the first time With the win, he moved up to fourth in the 2007-08 PBA Player of





Problem Solving Short Cuts Part II

Short cuts can be dangerous. Had Little Red Riding Hood taken a short cut to grandma's house, the wolf may have eaten her instead!

Cute...but without the wolf we might never have heard of Little Red Riding Hood...so maybe short cuts have some value after all.

Short cuts come in two categories:

- 1 Simply shorten an already familiar procedure by eliminating some of its parts.
- 2 Use a totally different, but quicker method of arriving at the desired result. The following short cuts will involve both

The Outside Gutter-ball Shortcut

As we all know, current computerized lane oiling machines, synthetic lanes, modern balls, etc. have revolutionized our game. The old lacquer or water base sealed wood lanes, oiled by hand, have gone the way of the dinosaurs. During those past years, lane conditions sometimes required far outside shot lines, using targets only 2 or 3 boards from the gutter. Developing such shots without guttering was one reason for the deadly accuracy of better bowlers of those days. They seldom guttered those shots because of their deadly accuracy.

CATS machine tests reveal, that even today's 220 plus average bowlers have an accuracy quotient of no better than 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches in the target (arrow) area. Even some of today's pros can't match the champions of the past in accuracy. This gets worse when far outside target lines are attempted. Many bowlers, when asked to deliver a ball to a first arrow (5 board) board target, end up pulling the ball, hitting the 9, 10 or 11 board instead, due to a subconscious fear of the gutter.

Of course it's possible to overcome this habit by endlessly practicing outside shots. But the following short cut will often create more accurate outside shots within just a few minutes.

Guttering The Ball On Purpose

- 1 Choose a far outside target, such as a 3 or 4 board.
- 2 Deliberately stand too far inside...deep enough so that hitting that target board *will deliberately force the ball into the gutter*;
- 3 Just before starting, tell yourself, "I'm going to throw my strike shot into the gutter on purpose, but I won't consider it a successful shot unless the ball goes over the 3 board!" Then throw that deliberate gutter shot 4 or 5 times.
- 4 Next, adjust your feet far enough outside so that when you now hit your 3 or 4 board target, the ball will stay on the lane and find the pocket. All you're trying to prove to yourself is *that you can accurately hit the extreme outside area of the lane whenever oil conditions demand such a shot!*

Why Does This Work?

Simple...Normally, the subconscious (our little "Inner Voice") has a tendency to visualize what we *don't* want as well as what we do want. So if I tell you, "Don't think of a pink elephant", that's the first thing that comes to mind, right? Therefore that outside target, being so close to the gutter, carries with it an automatic desire to stay away from that gutter. So our subconscious deals with this problem by visualizing a safer target farther away from the gutter...causing the pulled shot.

However (and this is important) when you tell yourself to throw a gutter ball on purpose, that same subconscious visualizes the gutter and allows you to throw it there. So once our subconscious has accepted that gutter balls are no longer dangerous, it allows a more accurate outside shot without pulling.

Now all that information won't do us any good at all...unless we go to the lanes and deliberately go through that "Gutter ball on purpose" routine for a few games.

The Straight Spare Ball Shortcut

As the game has continued to evolve, constantly changing lane conditions have created the need for a super straight spare shot. Yet many better bowlers still can't straighten the ball enough. Ball manufactureres cash in on this shortcoming by manufacturing hard plastic spare balls. But in the long run this is counterproductive, because it fools the bowler into believing it unnecessary to develop a true straight ball release. Then, in super dry lanes, even that spare ball will hook just enough to miss that much needed spare, often turning a potential win into a loss.

Here's a short cut solution:

- 1 Execute a backswing during which the hand opens up so that at the top, the ball faces away from the body.
- 2 On the downswing, go with the heel of your palm leading. This keeps that hand "open" all the way down.
- 3 Maintaining this hand position as much as possible, release the ball. That will tend to bring the fingers around the opposite side of the ball, creating a back-up (reverse hook) type shot. Practice this for a few shots, keeping the hand in that position all the way to the finish of the follow through. That will convince you that you can repeat this back-up shot at will.
- 4—Once you've mastered that back-up release, you will want to slightly reduce that back-up result into what you really want...that frozen rope straight ball. So...now, simply reduce the amount that the hand stays open at the follow through...just barely enough to kill the back-up rotation. Presto! There's your true straight ball!

Think of your straight ball as being an "Almost back-up ball". There's a short cut that really works!

The "Rubber Forefinger" Shortcut

All better bowlers know the value of the "Spread" fore-finger to help increase revs. Even though there's no hole for that finger, assisting forefinger friction against the ball surface helps increase those revs.

How? Well, a very effective tool is that little rubber fingertip you can buy in any office supply store, normally used for page turning or money counting. Such finger-to-ball friction enhancers last a fairly long time and really work. Keep some in your little tool pouch. They come in various sizes, so be sure to get a size just tight enough to stay on your finger during the release. You may be surprised to see how well this works to strengthen your hook shots.

"Hit" The Ball

All professionals and most high level amateurs know what is meant by the expression, "hitting the ball".

Imagine a cotton bowling ball floating in mid-air like magic, a few inches behind the foul line...right about at your release point. Then do a dry run approach and imagine actually hitting that ball into the lane with just your hand. Notice when you do this, that virtually all the force applied to that ball is with the hand only...and at the bottom of the swing only...NOT during the downswing!

This is the way balls are hit in sports such as golf, baseball, handball, tennis, etc...in which the armswing power is slightly delayed to avoid wasting force and speed...and saved until the wrist/hand can snap into action in the "hitting" area. So, in a really correct bowling downswing, all downward force is eliminated, allowing the downswing to be executed with an almost free floating arm. That actually saves the power until the hand reaches that "hitting area" where the ball can best react.

In such a swing you should notice that any force is felt traveling from the hand up the arm, rather than from the shoulder downward! Look for that "feel" and notice the increase in pin action.

To short cut the process even further, apply the old A/B technique...one dry run approach, followed by one with the ball...in rapid repetition several times. The difference in torque, control, accuracy and pin action should turn virtually all flame throwers into believers.

This hit the ball short cut really works!

The Ring Finger Lead Plus "Hitch-Hike" Process

Two common errors made by a great number of bowlers are 1), Turning the hand too early and 2), Turning it too much ("Topping" the ball.) Very often the two go together.

The short cut correction for that has two parts: 1), On the downswing, lead with the ring finger all the way to the bottom. That correctly keeps the hand behind the ball. (Hall of Fame coach John Jowdy gets credit for that one). 2), As the hand reaches the finish of the follow through, do a slight outward turning wrist snap, as if hith hiking on the highway...just enough to bring the thumb to 1 o'clock (11 o'clock for left handers).

These take a bit of practice, but they really work!

Never Allow An Opponent to "Get Inside" Your Helmet!

This is a major rule of football. It's just a cute way of saying, "Don't let your opponents psych you out! This effort to intimidate opponents often works. Why not? There's no rule against it, is there?

So, instead of falling victim to such tactics, BE HERE NOW!

What does that mean? Do two simple things: 1), Instead of trying to block out that negative, just allow it to be there, like you do with all the other bowling center distractions you've gotten used to. Instead, focus on execution as usual and 2) turn the tables on that opponent...get into his or her helmet instead!

How? Simple. Go about your business showing no outward emotion at all. Let that opponent see that nothing flusters you, by telling yourself to bowl exactly as you do in practice...quietly and unemotionally. There's nothing that bothers a psych-out artist more than seeing that it isn't bothering you. While wondering about that, they get bothered and distracted! This short cut can make you the winner!

Although many fingers had a part in creating the information that is in the display, it was Mary Lynly, Barbara Metzinger, Joan Romeo and Jackie Wyckoff who tackled the final job on behalf of the California Bowling Writers.

As in all things – there were challenges. Two beautiful lighted display cases stood ready to be filled and right off the bat we realized that 52 Hall of Fame plaques would just not go into the cases and allow anything else to be displayed. They are now beautifully displayed in order of induction on Boards that will sit on top of the display cases – Meritorious Service on top and Superior Performance plaques neatly displayed on the large pillar along side the cases. 

Tenpin Slants

It was reported here recently that USBC Hall of Famers Robin Romeo (Newhall, Calif.) and Jeanne Naccarato (Tacoma, Wash.) will be making their debut in the 2008 National Golden Ladies Classic (NGLC), to be held March 10-13 at the Orleans Hotel/ Casino/Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

The NGLC, or simply the Golden Ladies, was founded by Jeanette Robinson, also a USBC Hall of Famer, at the old Showboat Bowling Center in 1991. Since then, the tournament--open to women who are 50 and older--has not only grown in stature but it has gained international fame.

The addition of Romeo and Naccarato can only add to that reputation. Together, they have 27 PWBA (Professional Women's Bowling Assn.) titles—17 for Romeo and 10 for Naccarato.

Both are former PWBA Players of the Year—Romeo in 1989 and Naccarato in 1986. And for most of their 20-plus years on the PWBA Tour, they were roommates, so it's fitting that they will be making their debut together in the Golden Ladies.

There's more good news. Tenpin Slants has just learned that still another USBC Hall of Famer, Vesma Grinfelds of San Francisco, will be competing for the first time in the NGLC, often referred to as "Jeanette's baby."

Grinfelds, after retiring from the PWBA Tour with 10 titles, did not touch a bowling ball for more than eight years. Then, in May of 2006, I e-mailed Vesma and suggested that she come out of retirement and compete in the Golden Ladies.

"It's such a fun tournament," I wrote. "Besides, Virginia (Norton, also a USBC Hall of Famer who is Vesma's closest friend) is bowling in it."

This was the answer I got back from Grinfelds: "Don't tell anyone, I actually started to throw, roll (whatever) the ball again after eight years. I'm bowling in an adult-junior league with my son (who is totally into bowling).

"After week 1, my reaction is: the lanes must be awfully easy; after not bowling so long, I can't be that good. (Author's note: A couple of weeks later, Grinfelds rolled a 300 game in

'The best part was walking in with a single-ball bag and having bowling shoes that still fit, after opening the laces a little wider.

"Hope you are laughing," she wrote. It is obvious Vesma hasn't lost her sense of humor.

Norton failed in her attempt to persuade Grinfelds to bowl in the Golden Ladies last year. So Norton enlisted the aid of fellow Hall of Famer Pam Buckner, who just happens to be Ebonite's ace western regional sales rep.

Buckner made a deal with Grinfelds. "If I drill up a couple of new balls for you, will you bowl in the Golden Ladies with us? Buckner asked Grinfelds, who finally gave in, but only after Norton convinced Vesma how much fun she would have.

Postscript: Vesma Grinfelds' son is named Dzintars. He is 18 now and a freshman at UC Santa Cruz. Vesma currently bowls in a league with Virginia Norton's son, Scott, a very talented left-handed bowler who is attending law school at UC Hastings in San Francisco.

NGLC Update: Jeanette Robinson, the teaching pro at The Orleans, reports she has received 68 entries so far—"which is good for this time of the year. I'm looking for about 80," she said.

The defending champion is Joan Reilly of Wilmington, N.C. Reilly was a surprise winner, defeating 2006 champion Char Hammel in the title match, 246-225.

Florida's Shirley Levens, a three-time winner, is expected back after missing the past two years because of back and leg surgeries.

Also expected to compete are bowlers from England and Scotland who make the annual journey "just for the fun and camaraderie," These adventurous women look forward to the Golden Ladies each year, even though they rarely cash.

What puzzles me is, why do so many women who are eligible fail to enter the Golden Ladies? Like USBC Hall of Famers Dana Miller-Mackie and Cindy Coburn-Carroll. Both are former touring pros with multiple PWBA titles.

Every cent of the \$150 entry fee goes into the prize fund-PLUS there is added monies from The Orleans, tournament cosponsor Storm Products, and others. Last year, Storm donated \$1,500 to the prize fund along with a new bowling ball for "most pins over average," after the 15-game qualifying round.

There are many, many ways to cash in the Golden Ladies. In addition to the main prize fund, there is a Second-Chance Sweeper (for those not making the cut to the match play), a separate Super Senior event (for those 70 and up), and of course brackets and

Anyone wishing to reserve a spot in the Golden Ladies can call Jeanette Robinson at 1-888-365-7111, Ext. 6442. The original dates for the 2008 NGLC were March 3-6, but had to be changed to March 10-13 because of a conflict with the annual Las Vegas 500-mile race at the local motor speedway. "The NASCAR people grabbed up most of the rooms here," Jeanette explained, "so we had to move our tournament back one week."

I had an interesting conversation with Nick Papanos at the recent H&R Block Tournament of Champions at the new Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas. Nick is the justifiably proud husband of Wendy Macpherson, a four-time PWBA Player of the Year. Nick said that Wendy recently won a big tournament in Japan, where she competes on a regular basis as a member of the Japan Professional Bowlers Assn. "She's been doing great in Japan," Nick said.

Nick added that Wendy plans to compete in West Coast Senior Tour events, "now that she's eligible."

WCST tournaments are open to men from ages 45-59 and women 40-49. There's also a Super Seniors division for men 60-plus and women 50-plus.

Macpherson is eligible because she just turned 40 on Jan. 28. "Wendy's going to bowl the WCST Ebonite All-Star Doubles (March 8-9 at Rancho Bowl in Santa Maria, Calif.)," Nick said. 'She's going to bowl with Tennelle Milligan (former USBC Queens champion), because WCST members can bowl doubles with a 'junior' (or younger person)."

According to WCST Tournament Director Dick Sanders, "The All-Star Doubles event is all filled up (with 48 teams), and if

anyone wants to be put on the stand-by list, call the WCST office

By the way, Macpherson, who is a native of San Diego and now makes her home in the Vegas suburb of Henderson, has her own website (www.wendy-macpherson.com). Check out the website if you'd like to know more about Wendy and her brilliant career record.

FINAL ITEM: John Jowdy, the irrepressible USBC Hall of Famer from El Cajon, Calif., is going to miss the 2008 National Golden Ladies Classic for the first time in several years. Jowdy is having knee replacement surgery on Feb. 28, and says it'll take about six weeks of therapy after that for the leg to heal.

Jowdy, a world-renowned bowling coach, spent a career as the top sales rep for Columbia 300. After he retired, Jowdy continued to represent Columbia as he became the first manufacturer's rep on the Denny's PBA Tour. He also put together the Columbia Pro Staff, which now includes Chris Barnes as its ace.

When Ebonite took over Columbia a couple of years ago, Jowdy was kept on as their Tour representative. Jowdy used to make every pro stop but now that he is nearing his 88th birthday (in April), he limits his trips mostly to the four majors.

Jowdy, who attended the recent Tournament of Champions in Las Vegas, will be leaving Feb.18 for the Denny's PBA World Championship in Indianapolis. He will return on Feb. 25, three days before his knee surgery. He hopes to have better luck after he gets back from World Championship than he had after the T

Rash, a Wichita, Kan., resident and Anchorage, Alaska, native, is a four-time Denny's PBA Tour titlist and the 2007 USBC Masters champion. He also is one of five members of the USBC Board of Directors elected by fellow athletes.

AUSTRALIAN TWO-HANDED STAR EAGERLY AWAITS INTERNATIONAL COACH/INSTRUCTOR TRAINING SEMINAR

GREENDALE, Wis. - Even at the young age of 24, two-handed phenom Jason Belmonte of Australia is well-versed knowing the importance of having elite bowling coaches scattered throughout the world.

"We need more coaches in the world that are of a higher level," said Belmonte, the reigning World Tenpin Masters champion and runner-up at the 2007 QubicaAMF World Cup. "There just aren't enough people getting the correct information about how to become better bowlers."

Belmonte and nearly 20 notable names in bowling from around the world will descend upon United States Bowling Congress Headquarters in suburban Milwaukee for an International Coach/Instructor Training seminar on Feb. 12-16.

This seminar is a continuation of USBC's effort to assist in the creation of an international coach training program and enhance the strength of federations within bowling's world governing body, the Federation Internationale des Quilleurs.

The newly trained coaches will certify USBC coaches in their home countries and regions who in turn will develop more high-level bowlers. Those athletes will increase the level of bowling competition around the world, which will help reach the ultimate goal of securing a place for bowling in the Olympic Games.

As it gains popularity throughout the world. Belmonte also hopes to lend some insight to the two-handed delivery - keeping two hands on the ball throughout the swing until the release, at which point being able to create a considerable amount of revolutions - and how to coach it, rather than discourage it.

"Most who don't understand it, don't like it and that's cool. I can understand the traditionalist way of thinking," said Belmonte, who also will be joined at the seminar by another successful two-hander, Team USA 2007 member Cassidy Schaub. "All I want for people who do decide to bowl two-handed is that they have the option of talking to a coach who 'understands' the style, so they can help them. Two-handed bowling will never take over, but it may keep a few more kids in our sport for longer."

The five-day event, portions of which will be conducted inside the eight-lane USBC Testing Facility, will feature a Silver coach certification program with USBC Gold coach, Master Instructor and Junior Team USA head coach Rod Ross followed by a Bronze Instructor session, where the attending coaches will learn how to teach the USBC Bronze certification conference and certify coaches in their home countries.

Coaches in attendance also will have access to exclusive new coaching technologies being developed by USBC.

Other notables confirmed to participate include former PBA Tour player Andres Gomez of Colombia, 2007 Pan American Games singles silver medalist Daniel Falconi of Mexico and long-time Sweden national team head coach Magnus Johnsson as well as representatives from Argentina, Austria, Brazil, Denmark, England, Germany, Malaysia, Mexico, Hong Kong, Singapore and Thailand.

Also in attendance will be left-handed Philippine bowling legend Rafael "Paeng" Nepomuceno, a USBC Level I coach and Bronze Instructor who has certified numerous coaches throughout Asia since teaming up with USBC in early 2007. Nepomuceno, a four-time World Cup champion, will receive Silver Instructor training at the event.

"Better coaches equal better bowlers, and good bowlers can motivate more people to bowl," said Falconi, who won the Masters gold medal at the 2005 American Zone Championships in Costa Rica. "It will help to change bowling's perception from a game to a sport. Having successful coaches in this clinic to share some information will make this experience more complete."

The USBC Coaching program, which professionally trains and certifies coaches to teach the sport of bowling, currently has tremendous respect as it is the only coaching program for bowling recognized by the United States Olympic Committee. As part of its international strategy, USBC is developing more online coach training with the overall goal to expand USBC's reach globally through information and education.
