Littlerock's Danielle Schilling needed to strike out to defeat Royal in game one, 248-247. In game two, Royal jumped out to an early lead and won 247-217. Game three Littlerock returned the favor with an early lead and won, 215-178. Game four became a strike fest with Royal edging Littlerock, 258-257. The fifth and final game became an easy win for Littlerock as the three girls, one boy team continued to throw strikes and won the deciding fifth game, 258-180.

The top eight schools to make the finals were represented by: Oxnard High School, Oxnard, CA; West Valley High School, Hemet, CA; Littlerock High School, Littlerock, CA; Santa Paula High School, Santa Paula, CA; St. Vincent High School, Petaluma, CA; Villa Park High School, Orange, CA; Green Valley High School, Henderson, NV; Royal High School, Simi Valley, CA.

A total of \$7,576 in scholarships were awarded with Littlerock High School capturing the first place award of \$1,500.

During this event, the tournament committee decided to change the date of this event to October 7th and 8th, 2006. We will actually have two events this year. Participation increased from 14 teams last year to 21 teams this year including the Graduate Division. We surveyed the parents and the participants of this event, and it was decided to continue our rapid growth potential it would be very beneficial to link the tournament with a Monday holiday so it would not have an adverse effect on high school schedules. This would also eliminate conflicting dates for the Graduate Division.

Additionally, it has been decided to have two High School Divisions and a Graduate Division. The two High School Divisions would be "Varsity Division" and a "Junior Varsity Division". This will enable more teams to compete on level of ability. The Graduate Division shall remain the same.

## Kent is Super in Geico Classic

CHEEKTOWAGA, NY - New York native Doug Kent captured his second career Denny's PBA Tour title in his home state, as he defeated Norm Duke, 222-201, in the title match of the 2006 GEICO Classic at AMF Thruway Lanes.

Kent, from nearby Newark, N.Y., won his 7th career Tour title and his first since the 2002 Empire State Classic in Latham, N.Y.

"It's been a long year and a half for me," said Kent, who earned \$40,000 and an exemption for the 2006-07 Tour season. "I feel like I've been bowling well but just haven't been winning matches. It's the best feeling to do it in front of my friends and family."

After starting the title match with spares in the three of the first four frames, Kent strung together four straight strikes while Duke opened in the 2nd and 7th frames.

Duke needed to strike out in the 10th to force Kent to get eight on his first ball of the 10th, but the 22-time titlist struck and spared to give Kent the win.

Kent advanced to the title match with a 227-213 win over his brother-in-law, PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III. After three consecutive strikes in frames 7-9, Kent only needed a mark and eight pins in the 10th frame to shut out Bohn. A spare and a strike gave him his first berth in a title match since 2004. Bohn fell to 0-4 on television this season.

In the second semifinal, both Duke and Edwards started the match with six straight strikes. Duke took a one-pin lead in the 7th frame as Edwards had an eight-spare and Duke had a nine-spare. Duke then struck on his next five shots, locking out Edwards by striking out in the 10th frame to win the match, 279-265.

Duke earned \$20,000 for 2nd, his third runner-up finish of the season. Edwards (Tulsa, Okla.) and Bohn (Jackson, N.J.)

**Doug Kent**

took home \$10,000 apiece for the 3rd and 4th place finishes, respectively.

The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Fairlawn, Ohio, for the 2006 Pepsi Championship, March 1-5 at AMF Riviera Lanes. The live ESPN finals take place Sunday, March 5 at 12:30 p.m. EST, with the winner taking home the \$40,000 top prize and an exemption for the 2006-07 Tour season .

**Notes:** Kent used a Hammer Road Hog in the first match and a Hammer Vibe in the second.

## He Bests 286 Entrants in (4) squads at West Covina Cruz, and Asuncion Split \$1,062 Match Series

In round two being eliminated were Gibin Kim, Tess Cruz, Tiffany Morita, and Jordan Simkin. They cashed in 6-9th places and \$132.50. each.

Round three had Michael Simkin fall to Ian Benavides 207-

196. Mamerto Jablan bested Shaun Morgan 223-17. So Michael, and Shaun were 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> at Cal and \$150 each with Mamerto and Ian to meet for the chance to bowl Maria Bacos for the title.

Ian got a big double and edged Mamerto in a good one 216-205 and would advance to the title game with the likable Jablan finishing third at West Covina and a \$240 paycheck. Nice bowling Mamerto!

The title game was on and Ms Bacos elected to lead off. She was clean through the 8<sup>th</sup> frame with a double and Ian had but one open in the 3<sup>rd</sup> with a double and a handicap advantage held a 18 pin edge. Ian needing just a mark in the 10<sup>th</sup> for victory got it and barely won as the pretty lady was striking out. Final Score 230-225 Handicap included! Great bowling by a nice young man!! Ian and many his family are all members of the ABTA and are very respected. Great bowling Ian and You are most deserving, and title #2 is in your future.! Congrats!

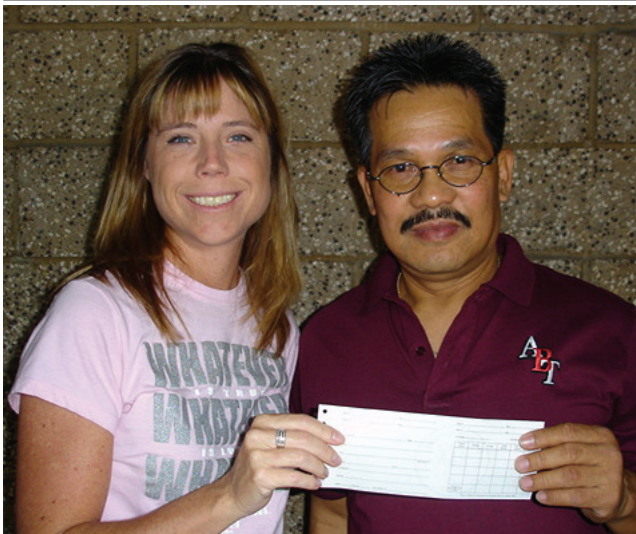

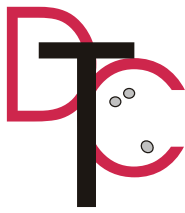

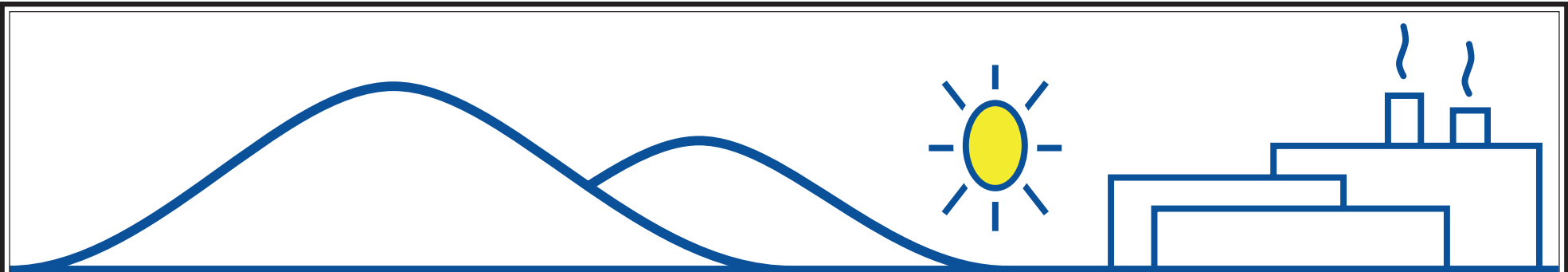

LAS VEGAS—Jeanette Robinson’s baby is about to turn 16 years old. No, not *that* baby. This one is the 16<sup>th</sup> annual National Golden Ladies Classic, scheduled for next week (March 6-9) at the Orleans Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

It was in 1991 when Jeanette, a WIBC/USBC Hall of Famer, staged her first Golden Ladies Classic at the old Showboat. After the famed 106-lane center closed, Jeanette eventually moved her baby to The Orleans seven years ago.

The winner (and there’ll be a new one this year) is guaranteed \$2,000. Florida’s Shirley Levens is the defending champion, but the 2006 BWAA (Bowling Writers Assn. Of America) Senior Woman Bowler of the Year is facing an operation for a leg problem.

“Shirley was devastated,” Jeanette said, “and was almost in tears when she called to say she was going to have to withdraw from the tournament. Shirley said that she’d definitely be back next year.”

Jeanette added that she now expects 72 bowlers to compete in the Golden Ladies Classic. It’ll be 73 if Jeanette can recover from the injuries she suffered in an auto accident last January. And don’t bet against the indomitable 77-year-old righthander, who has competed in all of the previous 15 Golden Ladies Classic events. Besides, she has overcome greater obstacles in her long career and has always bounced back.

According to Hall of Fame writer Dick Evans, Jeanette “has won three pro titles, coached thousands of players, served 10 years as president of the (women’s) pro tour, and writes a monthly bowling column for the TenPin Alley publication.”

**Living in Santa Paula**, a relatively small agricultural community 15 miles east of Ventura, can have some unexpected advantages.

On successive weekends recently, *Tenpin Slants* was able to take in the WWPB (Western Women Pro Bowlers) Open at nearby Harley’s Camarillo Bowl and the National High School Open Bowling Championships at Buena Lanes in Ventura.

The prep tournament offered a total of \$10,000 in scholarships to the winners, according to Dan Mueller, the genial GM of Buena Lanes who introduced the innovative event a year ago. The tournament features an open division and a division for recent high school graduates.

“We had only 14 teams (of foursomes) last year,” Mueller said, “but 21 teams entered this year, an increase of 50 percent. That’s encouraging.”

Mueller, who has been battling for years to make bowling a recognized high school sport, thinks his tournament will continue to grow. He plans to move the event to October, possibly over the Columbus Day holiday weekend. “It’s a better time of the year for the tournament,” Mueller said, and it will also help us to avoid going against a collegiate bowling event which is going on this same weekend in Camarillo. That tournament conflicted with our high school graduates division; otherwise, we would’ve had even more teams.”

As expected at Buena Lanes, there was a lot of cheering, yelling, screaming and plenty of high fives. There were also plenty of fine young bowlers, girls and boys, who, in addition to the team titles, were competing for individual honors and trophies.

The winning team was Littlerock (Calif.) High School, which earned \$1,500 in scholarships, or \$375 per member—three of whom were girls. Comprising the winning foursome were Danielle Schilling, Sam Hitchcock, Samantha Jimenez and Alyse McGinnes.

“The tournament could not have gone any better,” Mueller said when it was all over. “I had some nice comments from several parents. We (Buena Lanes) made a DVD of the tournament action, which we will use to try and influence the CIF (California Interscholastic Federation) into making bowling a legitimate varsity sport.”

*Tenpin Slants* hopes Dan Mueller succeeds in his noble endeavor. After all, everyone can be a bowler, whereas height is an advantage in playing basketball and you’re more likely to make it in football if you weigh over 200 pounds.

**The Harley’s Camarillo WWPB Open** was an extremely high-scoring tournament. The winner was Dede Davidson of Buellton who went undefeated in the finals (10 matches). What’s just as amazing is the fact that this was Davidson’s 19<sup>th</sup> WWPB title., which was worth \$1,000.

Several spectators thought Michelle Silver of West Los Angeles might be a factor in the finals, having fired a record 2507 in the 10-game qualifying round. Yep, that’s a 250.7 average. The old record was 2489 set by Fullerton’s Missy Bellinder in 2002 at Palos Verdes Bowl in Torrance.

Silver’s qualifying record was highlighted by an 836 series (300-279-257) in Games 3-4-5 and a 299 in Game 9. Tammy Sibley of Tehachapi also fired a 300, while Cindy Stuard of Ventura had a 298.

In the finals, Silver didn’t have the pin carry she had in qualifying and finished in fifth place. The runner-up was Laura Hardeman of Chula Vista, who, just the week before with Steven Smith, won the inaugural MoRich Mixed Doubles National Championship in Las Vegas.

A spectator commented to Scott Poddig, the managing partner of Harley’s Camarillo Bowl, that he had put down “a nice shot for the ladies.” Poddig, a former bowling coach at Cal State Fullerton, said he didn’t want “a tough USBC Sports Shot.”

Poddig added that he “enjoys hosting the WWPB” and thinks the tournament is a good attraction for his house bowlers and the local community. It sounds as if there’ll be another WWPB tournament in Camarillo in 2007.

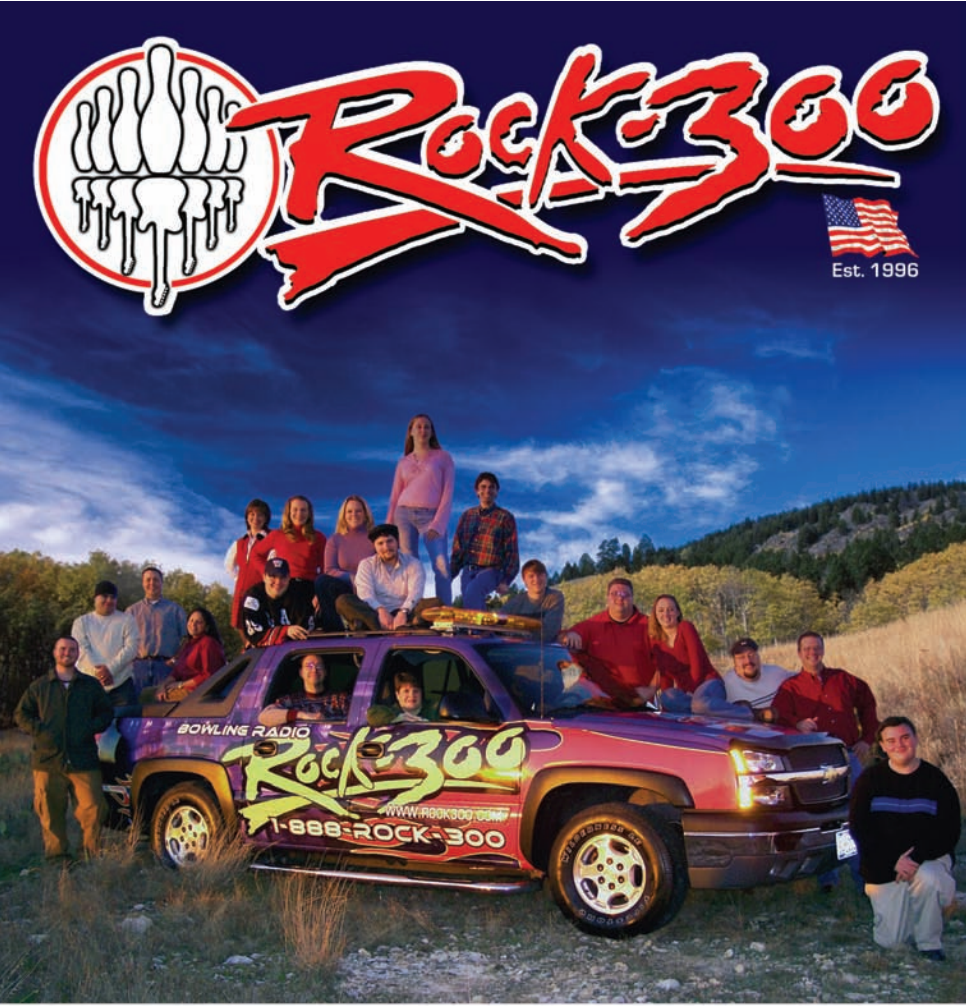

## NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

### Results of 22nd SN-CDBA Deaf Eliminations at Texas Station Bob Jones Finally Wins “A Big One” The Deaf Eliminations

LAS VEGAS... Two years ago in the prestigious SN-CDBA Deaf Eliminations at Texas Station Hotel Bowling Center Robert G. Jones qualified at the top with a record 1019 total including handicap. The Chatsworth lefthander stayed through match plays to get the top seed, only to lose in the championship finals to woman from Glendale, AR Kathleen Ferguson. As the 6th seed, Ferguson with her huge handicap, bowled over her average plowing through 4 men and beat Jones in the title finals.

This year in the 22nd annual event at the same bowling center, Bob Jones was in a different and bizarre scenario. On Saturday's Qualifying Round, after a bad first game 150, Jones finished with 181-201-193 for 725 plus 118 handicap for 843 to find himself in a tie with 2 others for the 56th last place. The two others were Chris Romero, Riverside and Kathy Seymour, Cypress. As required a one game roll-off was needed on Sunday for the highest to be the 56th qualifying bowler.

The event drew 93 bowlers and Rudy Martinez Jr., Glendale, AR broke Jones' two-year's record with 1041 total to lead the pack. Martinez Jr. carried 154 average and rolled 222-199-188-189 for 798 plus 243 handicap for his total. Another lefty Bruce Tan, Jr., Chud Vista shot the round's high game 276 and series 903 (225-201-276-201) to place 2nd with 1011.

Sunday was a different day for a determined Bob Jones. After a 622 series in the morning team event, Jones said he rolled a 240 game plus 29 for 269 to win the roll-off by one pin over Ms. Seymour and several pins over Chris Romero.

In the first round three games match play with the winner getting 30 bonus points, Jones did an amazing striking show, hitting 246-289-215 in his three matches for 750 and 90 points to make a gigantic leap from 56th to 2nd place. Tan Jr. did well with 651 winning 90 points to move to 1st place while Martinez Jr. hit 475 and won only one match, dropped down to 7th.

With the field cut to 28 bowlers for the 2nd round two one games match plays, a hot Tan Jr. rolled 489 winning both matches to retain 1st. Jones dropped to third by losing both the matches with 239 and 179 his first game of the day under 200 losing to a woman, Sharon Caldwell, N. Hollywood. Martinez Jr. with 351 winning two matches moved back to 2nd place.

Again the field was cut to top 14 bowlers for the two more one game matches, Tan Jr. scored 440 and winning his two matches for the highest total score of 2990 which was way ahead and seeded him first for the 6 bowlers stepladder finals. Bobby Thompson, a 120 ave, Las Vegas bowler with a huge 80 handicap, moved up to 2nd top step with 330 and winning two matches for 2793 total.

Although he lost once again to another woman, Theresa Gutierrez, Los Angeles, Jones retained 3rd top step with 443 and winning one match for 2774 total. Martinez, Jr. had 2727 total for 4th step and Eric Mendez, Las Vegas scored 2721 to move up to 5th step. The last step (6th) of the stepladder finals field was made by Bert DeLoss, Phoenix with his 2676 total.

The stepladder finals was just one game match with handicap with the winner advancing upward. Mendez beat DeLoss 231 to 203 and moved up to beat Martinez Jr. in a close one 207 to 206. Another step up, Mendez was no match with his 147+44/191 running into a hot shooting Jones' 254+29/283. Jones moved up into semi-finals encounter with Thompson and beat him 204+29/233 to 143+80/223.

In the Championship finals, both high scoring Tan Jr. and Jones faced each other for the first time and Tan Jr. lost his line, hitting a 154+27/181 while Jones continued his good scoring with 227+29/256. This is Bob Jones' first career major deaf championship plaque and he will receive \$1100.00 prize. Tan Jr. is consoled with a \$550 check.

For his 12 games in this Deaf Eliminations, Tan Jr. who carries a 196 book, averaged 219.75. Jones with a 193 book ave, averaged 217.40 for his 15 games including the roll-off game.

Next year's 23rd annual SN-CDBA tournament will be in Riverside with Riverside Silent Bowlers as the host.

California Team Raises The Bar At USBC Open Championships

CORPUS CHRISTI—Last year, Tennelle Milligan of Costa Mesa, Calif., won one of the most prestigious women’s titles in bowling. Now, she’s looking to add a United States Bowling Congress Open Championships title to her resume.

Milligan, who won the Women’s International Bowling Congress Queens (now USBC Queens) last May, led Champions Bowling of Sacramento, Calif., into the Regular Team lead with 3,319 on Sunday night at the American Bank Center Exhibit Hall.

The team opened with games of 1,074 and 1,101 before closing with 1,144, the highest team game of this year’s event, to take over the top spot from Team 11834 of Waterville, Minn., which led with 3,117.

“We have good team chemistry,” said Milligan, who won the Professional Women’s Bowling Association Players Championship and U.S. Open in 2000. “We

work well together and move off each other. If somebody is struggling we turn around and pick them right back up.”

Champions Bowling became the second team to eclipse the 3,300 mark at the Open Championships (formerly the American Bowling Congress Championships Tournament) since 2002, and the effort was the highest team score recorded since all teams began bowling on fresh oil in 2003. KR Strikeforce of Decatur, Ill., owns the other 3,300, shooting 3,302 to claim the Regular Team title last year in Baton Rouge, La.

Robby Porter led the way for Champions Bowling with 734, followed by Doug Wilcox (706), Tennelle Milligan (657), Robby Callan (627) and Jason Milligan (595).

Milligan, a Team USA member in 1999, added 714 in doubles and 660 in singles to move into sixth place in Regular All-Events with 2,031. The rest of her Champions Bowling team will make a run at the Team All-Events lead late Monday night.

“We all grew up in junior bowling together,” Milligan said. “But now we’re a little spread out over California, so it’s even more special when we all come together to bowl in this tourney.

ALLISON FIRST?

Ohio Kegler Posts 8th Sanctioned 900 Series

LAKE FOREST — Major news groups reported February 13, 2006 a 24-year-old Ohio kegler rolled the eighth “sanctioned” 900 series here at Colerain Township Lanes. Even the next morning Lonnie Billiter was in shock, just like Orange County’s Glenn Allison was in after he rolled the first (July 2, 1982) 900 at La Habra “300” Bowl—but Glenn’s was turned down by the ABC.

Since Allison’s 36-striker, the first ABC sanctioned Jerry Sonnenfeld, February 2, 1997; the Tony Roventini, November 9, 1998; So-Cal’s Vince Wood, September 29, 1999; Robby Portalatin, December 28, 2000; James Hylton, May 2, 2001; Jeff Campbell, June 12, 2004; Darren Ponije, December 9, 2004 and now Billiter’s.

It’s possible the 9th 900 could be by a woman bowler. Liz Johnson on P.B.A. tour or better, Fullerton’s Missy Bellinder recognized by John Jowdy, United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer and bowling coach as a coming super pin-star—she’s a natural.

Allison’s 900 was turned down by the American Bowling Congress and O.C.B.A. Allison admits the turn-down triggered worldwide media attention, more banners than athletes get when they are caught gambling.

Organized bowling has been strict about their rules, specifications and conduct. Over 4-million dues paying members you might not think were sensitive an honor score had value.

Probably under current rules Allison’s 900 would be recognized as an honor score. His Anchor Girl Trio League, Orange County Bowling Association, Cal-State Men’s Association, A.B.C. and W.I.B.C. recognized the score. He received his league awards, prize money, calculated all 900 pins into his official average. He was one of our first A.B.C. Hall of Fame and Ambassador members.

It would be nice if Orange County’s Missy Bellinder rolled the first women’s 900 series and let Allison make the presentation.
