## Fagan, Parkin on top of WBT point lists

ARLINGTON — Team USA members Mike Fagan and Missy Parkin lead the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Bowling Tour points list after the recently concluded United States Bowling Congress Masters.

The World Bowling Tour is made up of various events around the world and players earn points based on how they finish in each event. The current points system is based on a continuous two-year cycle, so points include some events from 2011 and all events from 2012.

Although Fagan did not earn any points at the USBC Masters, which awarded double points as a major, he leads with 444 points. Sean Rash of the United States picked up 24 points at the Masters and is

second with 437 points, while Mika Koivuniemi of Finland is third with 428 points.

Jason Belmonte of Australia went undefeated in match play to win the Masters and earn the maximum 100 points. He now sits in fourth place overall with 411 points.

Parkin was the top finisher among the women at the Masters, earning 100 points to boost her total to 506. Kelly Kulick of the United States is second with 484 points, while Liz Johnson of the United States is third with 365 points.

The next event on the World Bowling Tour schedule is the Kuwait Open. The event will take place March 13-17 at Cozmo Bowling Center in Kuwait City, Kuwait.

## Georgia's Sterner Rolls 299 to Win First Title in PBA Don Carter Classic

*10 pin on final ball prevents bid for place in PBA history*

ALLEN PARK, Mich. — Jason Sterner of McDonough, Ga., who had never finished higher than seventh place in a Professional Bowlers Association Tour event before the 2012-13 season, won his first PBA Tour title in the Don Carter Classic with a nearly-perfect 299-235 victory over top qualifier Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, at Thunderbowl Lanes.

The Don Carter Classic and PBA League Carter team finals aired Sunday on ESPN.

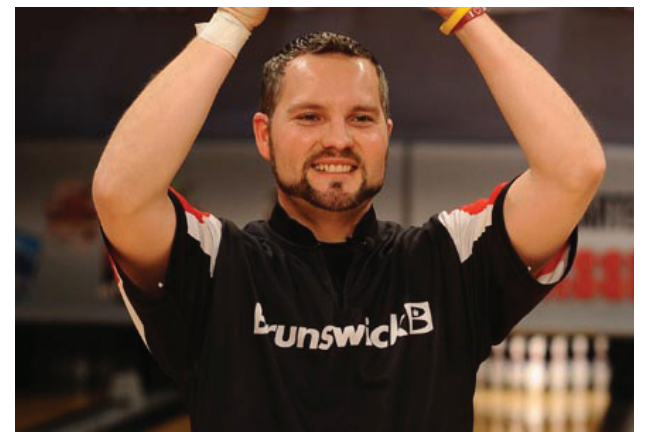
Sterner, who lost a 199-177 decision to eventual champion Tom Daugherty in his only previous PBA television appearance in the Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championship during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling earlier in the season, lost his chance at the 23rd nationally-televised 300 game in PBA history when he left a solid 10 pin on his final shot.

He also lost a bid to join Bob Benoit of Topeka, Kan., as only the second player to win his first PBA Tour title with a 300 game. Benoit won the 1988 Quaker State Open in Grand Prairie, Texas, for his first title in his first PBA television appearance.

"The biggest thing I learned from my first show was getting rid of the nerves, and to trust your decisions," Sterner said. "It's a little added pressure to bowl on TV, but once you get comfortable, and trust your decisions, it's a lot easier."

"I felt very confident," he added. "I had the right ball, I knew what moves I needed to make and it was just a matter of going through my routine and believing in it. After the first couple of shots, I could see how the lanes were changing, and it just came easy. It was definitely a great feeling."

"When I realized the match was done, I realized I had a

shot at 300, and the pins just kept falling," Sterner continued. "I don't think I've ever bowled that good of a game under pressure, ever."

"The last shot, I liked. I thought it was a great shot, but at that point I was so ready to celebrate the win, the 300 game wasn't even important."

With his first title, Sterner

also earned his first opportunity to compete in the Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions, March 26-31 at Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis.

The Don Carter Classic was the third of four PBA Tour events held during the PBA Detroit Winter Swing. The Earl Anthony PBA Play- *continued on page 2*

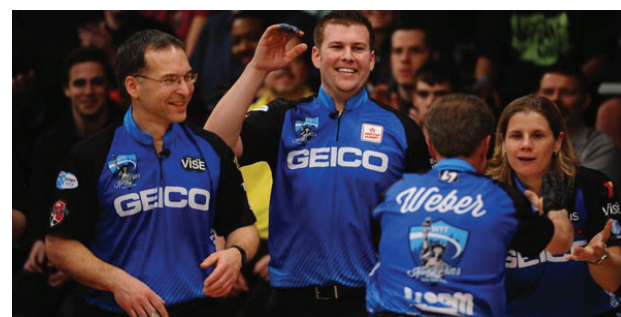
## New York City WTT KingPins Go on Strike Binge to Win PBA League Don Carter Round

*Billie Jean King's team clinches berth in inaugural Elias Cup Finals in Indianapolis*

ALLEN PARK, Mich. — The New York City WTT KingPins' Tommy Jones, Jack Jurek, Pete Weber, Scott Norton and John Szczerbinski struck on eight of their first nine shots to run away from Jesse Williams' BROOKLYN STYLES, 243-199, in the title match of the PBA League Don Carter round at Thunderbowl Lanes.

The PBA League Carter round finals, and the championship match of the Don Carter Classic, aired Sunday on ESPN.

The KingPins, owned by women's sports legend Billie Jean King, clinched a berth in the inaugural PBA League Elias Cup Finals with their win in the Carter round. The top four of eight PBA League teams, based upon points earned in five preliminary rounds, will compete for the first PBA League championship on Sunday, March 31, at



Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis as part of Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions week. The Elias Cup Finals will air on ESPN on April 7 at 1 p.m. ET.

"I think I'm liking my team a lot," KingPins franchise player Pete Weber beamed after making a surprise lineup change that worked to his team's advantage. He moved Norton, a left-hander who had been a dominant player in previous PBA League rounds, to the No. 4 position in the lineup and he placed Team USA

member and former Wichita State collegiate star John Szczerbinski in the anchor position.

"I know Scott was bowling well (in the anchor position), but Szczerbinski averaged 257 on the Don Carter lane condition in qualifying, so I talked it over with the team and they all agreed to make the change and have John bowl anchor," Weber said. "It isn't me; this is our whole team agreeing to what we're doing. After every shot we communicate and try to help each other."

"I have all the confidence in the world in all of my players. We got a few breaks, but without breaks you don't win. Tomorrow we might not get them, but today we did and we took advantage of them."

In the semifinal match between the KingPins, who won the Salvino round earlier in the PBA League series, and the Roth round-winning Motown Muscle, neither team put together consecutive strikes until the KingPins started a string of seven strikes in the sixth frame to run away with a 249-192 win.

In the opening match, owner Jerome Bettis' Motown team got a string of four strikes from Tom Smallwood, Mike Scroggins, Ronnie Russell and Mike Fagan to take the lead, and they held on for a 210-199 victory over Chris Hardwick's Silver Lake Atom Splitters when Silver Lake an- *continued on page 4*

**IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS**

... It is amazing that people find it difficult to understand why the merger that created the United States Bowling Congress has run into some sharp pebbles in soothing the road. You can't take more than 100 years of habits and experiences, millions of bowlers, hundreds of paid workers, hundreds of thousands of volunteer workers, a changing sport and business, and expect all the pieces to fit together as quickly as a first grader's puzzle. Patience not only is needed, it is a must from all involved.

... Bowling balls are expensive, but they always were. Back in 1907 the newest rubber bowling balls sold for \$15. For many, that was more than a week's pay. And those good looking high top bowling shoes set you back anywhere from two to five bucks, but they lasted for years and years.

... An old newspaper clipping, dated Oct. 25, 1897, reported that Detroit had four bowling leagues that year. In three of them "palm" balls were used, and in a newly formed six team circuit the new "finger" balls were used. And here we are, 110 year later, and the rage in some areas is two handed palm bowling.

... Watch the great instructors in action. They not only teach, they inspire.

... A very little boy told me about the match he had against one of his friends. It was close all the way until he knocked down a pin in the seventh frame to win out, 1-0.

... Good guys never finish last, not if they are good enough.

... A true handicap system works only when those given handicaps are handicapped on their true ability, and not on their often fictitious averages. There always should be a minimum unless the bowler is handicapped in some way. If a bowler is not interested enough in the sport to at least attain the average of all league bowlers then they should accept minimum average requirements or not be allowed to win anything more than praise. Sometimes, in the quest for as many entries as possible, too much consideration in the area of free pins is the easy way out.

... Almost every bowler throws away at least one point in average each year by not fully concentrating on the fill ball in the final frame.

... If another bowler does it you call it an error or a mistake. If you do it, it is called practical experimentation that failed.

... My nomination for the most articulate person in the world remains the bowling instructor who can give expert advice—without taking his or her hands out of the pocket.

... The fact that the USBC team tournaments, formerly ABC and WIBC, draw more than 10,000 five player teams each year, no matter where they are contested, speaks volumes about the sport, because no sport can match the long history of such dedicated participation. Try them if you haven't already, and you'll discover the lure of the tournament lanes.

... W.C. Fields once said, "Start every day off with a smile and get it over with." Do the same with every game you bowl.

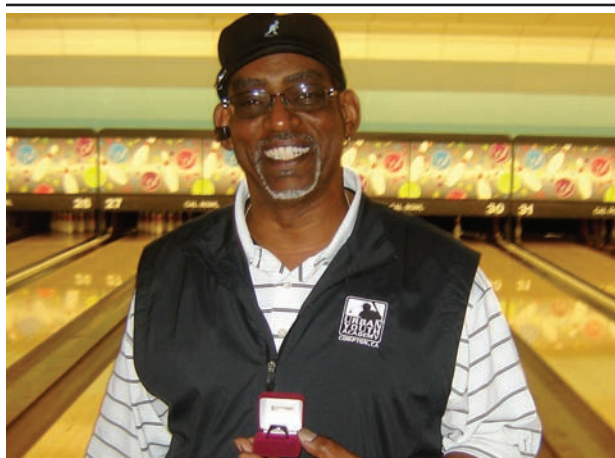

## League Bowler Invents First Warm-up Device for Bowlers -- and raises his average by 25 pins --

DENVER — Like every other halfway serious bowler out there, Rex Byron wanted to improve his game.

"I would have paid a hundred bucks just not to hurt on my first throw," says Byron, an avid league bowler from Denver, CO. "Every other sport has a way to warm-up and practice besides actually playing the game. Why not bowling?" Byron puzzled over a way to mimic the throwing motion without using a heavy ball, and finally started swinging an old flip flop sandal with a three-pound weight duct-taped to the bottom. But the shoe was awkward and, "Let's face it," Byron admits, "it didn't smell too good either."

It wasn't long before Byron, a former landscaper, had the inspiration that became Eileen's Bowling Buddy. "I molded some rubber into the shape of a bowling pin and put finger holes in the top and weights in the bottom. It was heavy enough to swing but light and flexible enough to be safe."

After practicing with the first Bowling Buddy at home, Byron noticed his soreness at the lanes went away—and his game improved. "I had a 189 average," he says. "My friends, who were 200+ bowlers, would spot me pins when we bet, but my losses always turned out to be their beer money," Byron chuckles. "They thought it was a fluke when I began to beat them with ease. Then they started wondering what I was doing differently."

What had changed was the way Byron practices. He swings the Bowling Buddy for five minutes everyday in his living room. "It's like bowling two or three games," says Byron. As he repeats the motion, his body tones up and becomes more disciplined—and at the lanes, his swing has become more consistent, his accuracy has improved, and his scores have gone up. "Now that I can bring my 'A' game to the first frame, I've brought my average up to 215!"

Wanting to give back to the sport and the people that have given him so much, Byron started manufacturing Bowling Buddies out of a small shop near his home. "We now make them in four sizes and all kinds of colors. Each one is a small work of art." Byron says the smallest Bowling Buddy can help juniors learn proper form. Seniors can use one of the larger sizes to warm-up safely, and every bowler can find the right size to help strengthen their bowling muscles, warm-up without pain, and make their swing more fluid and consistent.

Other bowlers report game-improving results as well. "It's amazing what a difference training makes and how much fun it is to be loose and ready for the first game," says a league player from Prospect, Kentucky. "In two weeks of using the Bowling Buddy I've returned to using a sixteen-pound ball and increased my first game average by 37 pins."

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were William Garrett and Greg Kokanour with a 1490 for \$140. Finishing in second was William Garrett and Steve Brode with a 1477 for \$120. There was a total of \$2,160 paid out in doubles and 34 paid spots with low to cash of 1346.

After bowling the semi-finals, finishing in first was

William Garrett again?? Wow and with a +139. Finishing in second was Tres Catalasan at a +108. So he would sit out the first round of the single elims. ## Van Rijsbergen Captures First Open Title Wesley Low Jr. Blasts 300/805

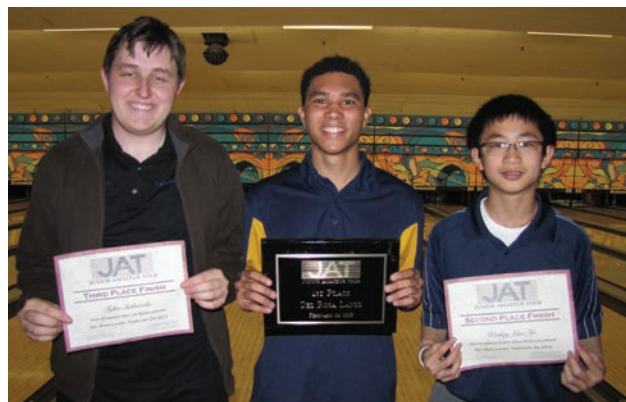

For all the experts out their, I want to know if a scratch 301 game is possible? What do you think? A few years ago I wrote about PBA Regional Champion GUY CLEAR rolling a 309 scratch game! Guy bowled his 309 game in a sanctioned league about thirty years ago. He did it by knocking down NINETEEN PINS with the twelfth shot of his second game. You ask: how can anyone knock down nineteen pins with one shot? Guy did it when his twelfth ball sent a pin flying from his lane onto an adjacent lane, knocking down nine pins on that lane. Those nine pins were in addition to the ten he knocked down on his lane. So did Guy bowl 309? Could Howard have bowled 301? Read below

for the ruling issued by the AMERICAN BOWLING CONGRESS.

Anyway, Howard has competed in the ELK'S Tournament since 1973. He has eight decades of life experience under his belt and looks forward to many more years of Elk's competition. Who knows, maybe a decade from now he will be bowling in his 50 Elk's tourney. Heck, he would only be 90 years old.

Howard used "OLD RELIABLE" to earn his check. His maroon Columbia 300 Titanium Messenger has been accompanying him to Vegas for more years than he can remember. It is a ball that has earned Howard's trust and confidence.

Howard knows how this ball will react under all circumstances. Wet or dry "old reliable" moves smoothly and predictably in a concentric arc from the corner into the pocket. You would think Howard was a resurrected right handed EARL ANTHONY, if you saw him roll "old reliable."

Mr. Corbett would like to thank the BOWLING NEWS for recognizing his achievement and doubles partner PATTY TRAST for bowling with him.

Now back to the American Bowling Congress (ABC) and Guy's 309 game.

Guess what, the ABC ruled that while Guy may have knocked down 309 pins he only scored 300! WHAT? ABC officials explained that the nine pins knocked down on the adjacent lane were out side the "field of play" and did not count towards Guy's score. A bowling lane is our field of play, just like the field of play for a football game is within the chalk lines surrounding the gridiron and endzones. So while you may knock down as many as 320 pins, you will only be credited with 300. The highest possible one game score is 300.

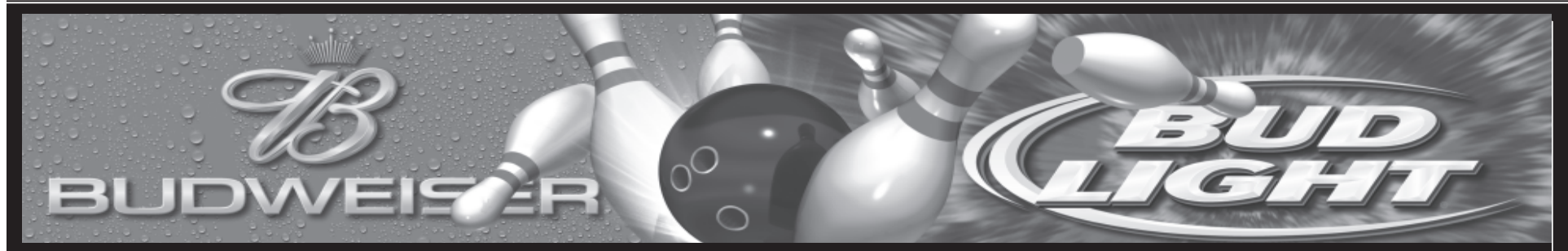
