Only 4 Weeks Until Tri-Senates \$15K Tournament at Cal Bowl

Ralph Collier (HI) who just won the Doubles and All-Events titles, dominated all the way from leading the 40 entrants 4 games Qualifying Round and Match play Rounds in winning the 30th annual Deaf Eliminations. Collier with 196 average does not need his handicap in beating Tim Brown, Jr. () who has 173 average, 233 to Brown's 183 in the Championship finale.

AT 88 JACK SICKINGER FINALLY WINS SN-CDBA DEAF SENIOR ELIMINATIONS LAS VEGAS

VEGAS — It took a long time for Jack Sickinger after countless entries in deaf seniors tournaments. After coming short few years ago as a runner-up in the Deaf Senior Bowlers of America Match Play Eliminations and two years ago the Riverside right-hander watched his own wife, Mary Sickinger became the oldest deaf woman to win the woman's part of DSBA Eliminations at The Orleans Hotel and Casino Bowling Center.

Last February 15-16 at SunCoast Hotel and Casino Bowling Center Jack Sickinger placed 8th as one of 25 entrants in the 30th annual Southern Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association tournament's Deaf Senior Citizen Eliminations in all-events with handicapped 1989 total. Andy Lorenzo (CA) led with 2113 with handicap total. The top 18 seniors with handicap all-events scores qualified for the next day's Match Plays Eliminations.

In the handicap match plays the winner gets 30 bonus points. After winning two games in first round two games match play Sickinger moved up to third place with Bob Taylor (CA) in first place, Andy Lorenzo in 2nd and the eventual runner-up Patricia Morford (CA) in 4th. Ron Loader (NV)in 5th and Andy Lorenzo's wife Anita Lorenzo in 6th.

With cut-off to 8 seniors for the one game match play to determine the top 6 positions for the quarterfinals, Taylor lost with his 175 + 47 handicap 222 but retained his No.1 position with 1454. Andy Lorenzo won 30 bonus pins with his 173 + 42 handicap 215 for 1427 to stay in 2nd ahead of charging Loader. With his winning 204 + 42 handicap 246 Loader moved up to 3rd with 1414 and Anita Lorenzo did as well with her 193 + 52 hcp for a total of 1413 for 4th place. Although Sickinger lost but his total of 1375 put him in 5th and Morford also lost but her total of 1369 made it in 6th.





USBC to change adult high score awards in 2014-2015





ARLINGTON - Starting August 1, 2014, the high score awards given to United States Bowling Congress adult members for a 300 game, 800 series or 900 series will become once-in-alifetime awards. This change comes as part of USBC's strategy to focus resources on national governing body services.

As part of the change to the high score awards program, any USBC member who received an award in one of the high score achievement categories as an adult prior to August 1, 2014, will not receive an award for that achievement again.

"With this change, USBC takes another meaningful step toward our vision of redefining the organization," USBC president Andrew Cain said. "I want to clearly emphasize that cost savings was only a small factor in the board's decision-making process approving the change. This is primarily about a philosophical shift to make USBC membership about supporting and protect-


'The board believes this adjustment to the high score awards program provides a good balance of preserving an organizational tradition while moving toward USBC's vision for the future."

The 11-in-a-row award also will be eliminated as part of the changes. All 300 games and 800 series at the USBC Open and Women's Championships will continue to be recognized and are not considered part of the once-in-a-lifetime policy.

"Given that more than 50,000 certified perfect games are rolled in a typical season, the board agrees it is unnecessary for the national governing body to provide awards for near perfection with the 11-in-a-row," Cain said. "We also believe special recognition is appropriate at USBC Championships, since these prestigious events are conducted in special venues on uniquely challenging conditions.'

Associations still will be required to submit 300 game, 800 series or 900 series achievements so the bowler's record can be updated with each accomplishment. The 11-in-a-row achievement will not be recognized at the national level effective August

Members who already have received once-in-a-lifetime recognition for a high score will have the ability to purchase additional awards for subsequent high score achievements. Sport Bowling awards will remain unchanged for the 2014-2015 season, with the exception of the elimination of the 11-in-a-row award.








Keystone's JAT Sport Juniors Have More Reasons to Celebrate
