EJ Tackett, Liz Johnson Win World Bowling Tour Men's, Women's Titles

ARLINGTON, TX - It took EJ Tackett a goldmedal performance in the 2018 World Bowling Men's Championships just to sneak into the World Bowling Tour Men's Finals, and then it took a clutch 10th-frame strike to locked up a one-pin victory over top qualifier Anthony Simonsen at the International Training and Research Center.

The WBT Men's and Women's Finals, presented by the PBA, aired Sunday on FS1, concluding a yearlong global competition. Liz Johnson of Palatine, Ill., won the women's title, defeating top qualifier Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, N.Y., 246-223, for her first WBT Finals win in

liams in another single-pin thriller, 243-242, before spoiling Simonsen's 22nd birthday, 233-232, in the title match.

The WBT Finals again used World Bowling's ex-




Indonesia has a long and impressive history with the Bowling World Cup, having participated 34 times. Last year's tournament in Las Vegas, saw both Indonesian players make the top 8 with Ryan Leonard Lalisang finishing in 8th place. Nadia Pramanik Nuramalina recorded the highest ever finish for Indonesia, when she made third place after leading the qualifying and the top 8 rounds of the women's division.

This was Nadia Pramanik Nuramalina's first World Cup although Ryan Leonard Lalisang has participated eight times in the tournament and made the top 10 on four occasions.

Other high Indonesian World Cup finishers are Indra Gondokusumo, AM Ismael, Lily Go, Putty Insavilla Armein and Sharon Limansantoso.

When the tournament was held in Jakarta in 1980, the great Paeng Nepomuceno of the Philippines won the men's event for the second time, while Jean Gordon of Canada carried off the women's title.

Palembang, situated on the banks of the Musi river, is a city of over 1.6 million people, with an interesting history dating back at least as far as the 7th century. It is known for its landmark Ampera Bridge. It also has its own particular dish, known as pempek, a savoury fishcake delicacy – a must for Bowling World Cup visitors to try!



DUKE, TACKETT, SIMONSEN FORTIFY PBA PLAYOFFS POINTS POSITIONS

While Australia's Jason Belmonte took a break from PBA Tour competition to spend time with his family before the start of the PBA World Series of Bowling X, EJ Tackett and Anthony Simonsen joined Norm Duke in fortifying their positions among the top eight players in the race to qualify for first-round byes in the inaugural PBA Playoffs.

Belmonte was solidly in the lead in PBA Playoffs points after his win in the PBA Tournament of Champions followed by back-to-back second-place finishes in the PBA Players Championship and Go Bowling! PBA Indianapolis Open with 18,550 points and Tackett retained second place on the basis of his third straight top five finish in Jonesboro with 13,890 points. Duke, with back-to-back titles in Indy and Jonesboro, advanced from 31st to third (13,565) while Simonsen (13,200) has advanced from 35th prior to the TOC to fourth, in great part thanks to his win in the PBA Players Championship.

Rounding out the top eight after Jonesboro are Sean Rash (12,640), Jakob Butturff (11,475), Marshall Kent (9,595) and Tom Daugherty (9,250). Heading into the WSOB X, Wes Malott (8,260) and Kyle Troup (8,150) sat in ninth and 10th places, respectively.

The race for the 24th-and-final berth in the PBA Playoffs currently involves Brad Miller and Nick Pate in a tie for 24th with Tom Smallwood and Stuart Williams right behind as the Tour heads toward the April 1 cutoff date.


Under the new PBA competition points structure in play this season, a win in a Tier 1 (major championship) event is worth 7,500 points, a Tier 2 (standard PBA Tour tournament) title is worth 5,000 points and a Tier 3 (limited entry and/or modified format tournament) title is worth 2,500 points. In the upcoming WSOB X, the Cheetah, Chameleon and Scorpion Championships will be Tier 3 events; the PBA World Championship will be the season's third Tier 1 event.

Players finishing in the top 24 in points as of April 1 qualify for a berth in the Playoffs. Finishing in the top 40 is required for eligibility to enter the 2019 PBA League Draft. PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: BRIAN KRETZER WINS 12TH PBA50 TITLE IN CANTON

- Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio defeated Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y. by 48 pins to win the PBA50 Strike Zone Lanes Central Classic presented by Radical at Strike Zone Lanes in Canton, Ohio, Sunday. Kretzer finished with an 8-4 match play record and a total of 4,991 pins for 20 games, including match play bonus pins. The title was Kretzer's third of the year in the PBA Central Region and his 12th career PBA50 Regional title. He also earned \$1,600.
- Robby Porter of Rancho Cordova, Calif. defeated Michael Pixley of Modesto, Calif., 268-217, to win the PBA West Region's Jackson Rancheria Casino Resort Championship at Gold Country Lanes in Sutter Creek, Calif., on Sunday. This was Porter's third PBA Regional title and earned him \$2,000. Pixley earned \$1,500 for second place. In the semifinal round, Porter defeated Wayne Garber of Modesto, Calif., 258-206, and Pixley defeated Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Ariz., 279-228, to set up the championship match. Garber and Blanchard each earned \$1,000 as semifinal round losers.

JASON BELMONTE ON THE BRINK OF JOINING ELITE PBA TOUR 20 TITLES CLUB

With his next Go Bowling! PBA Tour victory, Australia's Jason Belmonte will become the 15th player in PBA history to win 20 PBA Tour titles. Belmonte will join PBA Hall of Famers Dick Ritger, Wayne Webb and Amleto Monacelli on the 20 titles list.

Belmonte, 35, joined the PBA in 2008 and won his first PBA Tour title in the 2009 Bowling Foundation Long Island Classic, leading to his selection as Harry Golden PBA Rookie of the Year for the 2008-09 season. He became title-eligible for PBA Hall of Fame consideration when he won the first of his four USBC Masters titles in 2013, but he won't be eligible for election until the Class of 2028 when he completes his 20th year of PBA membership.

In the meantime, Belmonte continues to add impressive accomplishments to his portfolio. Most recently:

- He qualified No. 1 in all three Go Bowling! PBA Tour events in February: the PBA Tournament of Champions (which he won); the PBA Players Championship (where he finished second) and the Go Bowling! PBA Indianapolis Open (where he also finished second).
- Belmonte, Marshall Kent and Wes Malott were the only players who qualified for match play rounds in all three of those events. All three bowled 126 games in those three events. Belmonte's pinfall total, including match play bonus pins, was 30,407. Kent had 28,979 (1,428 behind Belmo) and Malott had a 28,500 total (1,907 behind the Australian star).

Belmonte's actual average for those three events was 229.65, almost 10 pins ahead of Kent (219.77) and more than 11 pins ahead of Malott (218.21).

• Because Belmonte bypassed the Jonesboro Open in order to spend a week at home in Australia with his family before the PBA World Series of Bowling X, he'll not be able to break his record-tying streak of being top qualifier for three consecutive television finals.

USBC OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS TO ADJUST SQUAD SCHEDULES STARTING IN 2020

ARLINGTON, Texas – Starting with the 2020 event, the United States Bowling Congress will adjust the number of squads for the Open Championships to provide competitors with additional options for Doubles/Singles

At the 2020 Open Championships, only four bowlers will compete on each pair during Doubles/Singles (D/S) squads. The change will reduce the time needed to complete a squad, allowing the Open Championships to have four D/S squads, instead of the current three.

In addition to starting (7 a.m.) and ending the day (11:45 p.m.), D/S squads also will take place at 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. under the new schedule. Team squads will be at 1 p.m. and 8 p.m., starting with the 2020 event.

The change is in response to the results of an Open Championships survey, in which more than 53 percent of the bowlers said having to bowl an early or late D/S squad was a significant problem for their team. The current schedule has just one D/S squad (2:30 p.m.) that is deemed a desirable timeslot, and it quickly fills up.

"Moving to four D/S squads, with four bowlers on each pair, will allow more competitors to bowl a D/S squad at a more desirable time," Open Championships Tournament Director Duane Hagen said. "This will help for better scheduling, as teams can match their early or late team competition date with an early or late D/S date, and should help in the management of the tournament overall."

With the change, USBC will be able to offer more than half of the competitors a midday D/S timeslot. Currently, only about one-third of the bowlers are able to compete midday. Despite the fact the last D/S squad of the day will have a later start in 2020, the squad is expected to finish at an earlier time since there are fewer bowlers on each pair.

The new schedule also should assist in keeping squads on time, as there will be additional time between squads for lane conditioning, squad announcements and the



Tim's Plan proved successful. The Code Red was the right ball for the Tournament and his mindset led him to victory even after a poor start. Tim was "THE MAN WITH A PLAN" and rode that Plan to victory. Tim won the Citrus Belt BVL Tournament, Classic Division.

The winning scratch series rolled by Tim was 671 (176-216-279). His score was fifty-four pins higher than the second place score of 617.

Tackett, who led Simonsen by 11 pins after eight frames, left the 4-6-10 split and opened in the ninth to open the door for the young Texas two-hander, who bowled the match using a reverse-hook technique from the left side of the lane. Simonsen, who won the 2018 PBA Xtra Frame Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic in Delaware using the "backup ball" technique, converted the 8 pin for a spare in the ninth to close to within a single pin. The Little Elm, Texas resident then struck in the 10th frame to force Tackett to also strike for the win. "This format is interesting because when you get to the 10th frame, you know you only have one shot," Tackett said. "You have one chance to do it right, and fortunately, I threw a good shot. It's absolutely another nice title to have on my resumé."

Johnson, who made the women's finals for the sixth time in the event's eight-year history, eliminated Poland's Daria Pajak in the first match, 242-235, and threw six strikes in 10 frames in denving McEwan a third women's title. "Every title is special. This was my sixth WBT show, but this is my first win," the 24-time PWBA titlist said. "Two years ago I had a chance (in the title match against McEwan), but I threw a pocket 7-10 in the 10th and lost by three pins, so that's the closest I've been to winning.

"To qualify for the finals again, I really wanted to try my best," she added. "This is not an easy format. I knew I only needed eight pins in the 10th to win, but I wanted to get as many as I could (she struck). The scoring system is different, but it's an honor to be part of it."

Holman, Monacelli **To Coach USA Vs. The World Match**

With a pair of PBA Hall of Famers guiding them, the USA vs. The World team match will return to the 10th anniversary PBA World Series of Bowling as the fifth consecutive night of WSOB coverage on FOX Sports' FS1 channel. The team match will air on Friday, March 22 at 5 p.m. from the historic Thunderbowl Lanes arena in Allen Park. Mich. It will be broadcast on FloBowling for international audiences at the same time it airs on FS1.

Back to manage the two-time defending champion USA team will be PBA Hall of Famer Marshall Holman. Under Holman's guidance, the USA won the two most recent matches in 2016 and 2017. The World will be managed for the first time by fellow PBA Hall of Famer and Venezuela native Amleto Monacelli, who bowled as a member of the international team when it won the first two matches in 2010 and 2013.

Players from the United States and the international contingent will qualify for their respective teams based on 30-game qualifying pinfall totals for the Cheetah, Chameleon and Scorpion Championships held earlier in the WSOB. The best-of-three-game Baker format team match will conclude FOX Sports' WSOB coverage that will begin with live telecasts of the Cheetah Championship on Monday, March 18; Chameleon Championship on Tuesday, March 19; Scorpion Championship on Wednesday, March 20, and PBA World Championship on Thursday, March 21. All five shows will air at 5 p.m.

Duke, who had proclaimed earlier in the season that he fully intended to win another title despite his age and a seven-year dry spell since his last singles victory, also noted the new PBA Playoffs have provided him with a renewed drive to win, especially after sitting in 31st place – on the outside looking in – heading into the Indianapolis

"I know what it takes," he said after his win in Indv not only moved him into the top 24 who will qualify for the PBA Playoffs, but all the way to seventh place in the points race. His win in Arkansas moved him into third place, comfortably (for now) within the top eight who will earn a first-round by when the Playoffs begin.

"Everything I've done the last three months has been with the Playoffs in mind. It's everyone's goal," Duke said. "Everyone wants to win that \$100,000 (Playoffs first prize) and you can't win it if you don't get there.

"It's a tall order, but to this point, everything I've done in my life has been a tall order," the 5-foot-6 Duke said as a point of emphasis. Duke also addressed the PBA's dual, or mixed, pattern scoring environments he conquered in both of his Indianapolis and Jonesboro victories. It's a challenging test of skill and patience the PBA has employed, applying dramatically different oiling patterns on the left and right lanes in both events.

"I think they're a tremendous requirement to make you better than you thought you'd needed to be," Duke said. "Every pattern changes. Every day they change. You have to be smart enough to deal with the patterns and physically strong enough to get all that extra equipment across the center, because you're using different balls on each lane.

"It's ridiculously hard, but for those of us who have been out here a long time, it's an advantage if you're prepared for it." To further endear himself to his adoring fans, Duke has created what may be a new tradition by handing his championship trophy to the fans to pass around, kind of like NHL players sharing the Stanley Cup with their fans. That might not be the end of it. "The next time, I might just jump into the crowd myself," Duke said with a laugh.



Wilkins Settling Into First Full-Time Season On Tour

As a kid growing up in Canada, Zach Wilkins bowled on lanes that didn't have oil and only had five pins. In fact, before taking up tenpin bowling, he didn't even realize lanes were supposed to have oil on them.

Wilkins, 26, one of the rising two-handed stars on



the PBA Tour, spent his time growing up playing five-pin bowling, a variation of the sport in Canada, using a two-handed back-up ball in a center where his parents worked.

When he made the switch to tenpin at age 14, it was a rough transition.

"I knew I wanted to be a professional bowler and had to convert at some point because five-pin is only a Canadian sport," said Wilkins, who will compete in the PBA World Series of Bowling next week live on FloBowling. "I converted at the age of 14, and I didn't see anyone throwing two-handed in the sport of tenpin, so at that time I thought I had to go one-handed."

The transition to a one-handed style with a much heavier ball proved to be difficult for Wilkins. So, he decided to chart his own path, like many other two-handers.

"My first year the ball was so heavy compared to the five-pin bowling ball that my forearm would hurt and my wrist would hurt," Wilkins said. "I decided to just throw it like I wanted to throw it, so that's how I developed my two-handed style."

Wilkins quickly developed and perfected his two-handed style and went on to compete collegiately at Urbana University before returning home to work as a full-time house painter for several years.

After bowling part time on the PBA Tour, Wilkins made the decision to leave his job as a painter and give professional bowling a try as a full-time job.

"It's 100 percent tough because everyone's goal is the same," Wilkins said. "Everyone wants to win out here, and the raw talent out here is just crazy. I think the tour is heading in the right direction where we can all make a living out here now. I'm hopeful that whatever they are doing it's going to benefit us bowlers in the long run."

Wilkins already achieved one milestone in his first full year on the PBA Tour, advancing to his first championship round appearance earlier this season in the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship with fellow Canadian Patrick Girard. The pair finished in fourth place.

He hopes to make his second show in the coming weeks at the World Series of Bowling in Allen Park, Michigan, but realizes the challenges ahead.

"You have to be mentally strong, and if you had one bad tournament there's always the next one right after it," Wilkins said. "One bad tournament is one bad tournament. We all have them. You just have to get back out there and do your thing."

Live coverage of the World Series of Bowling begins Tuesday on FloBowling with the first round of qualifying for the Cheetah Championship.
