Former PWBA Star Makes First USBC Open Championships Appearance

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas - Last year, Leanne Barrette of Elk Grove, Calif., rewrote the record books on the way to two titles at the Women's International Bowling Congress Championship Tournament (now the United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships).

This weekend, Barrette was in Corpus Christi, Texas, looking to achieve similar success in her first USBC Open Championships appearance.

The 26-time Professional Women's Bowling Association titlist shot 718 in singles, 688 in doubles and 563 in team for a 1,969 all-events total at the American Bank Center Exhibit Hall on Friday and Saturday, and although she didn't break any records, she was just glad to be competing again.

"Without the PWBA, we have very few opportunities to bowl," said Barrette, who claimed the Classic Singles and Classic All-Events titles at last year's WIBC Championship Tournament with 774 and 2,231, respectively. "It was great to get out there and bowl again and nice to see that I still have a bit of competitiveness in me."

Since the PWBA folded in 2003, Barrette has been working full-time doing sales and pro shop visits for Steve Cook's Bowling Supply in Sacramento, Calif., as well as bowling when she can. Life after the Tour has shown her that there is much more to enjoy than just bowling though.

"My life is still so much about bowling and I enjoy being able to bowl when I can, but now I am getting a chance to do everything I never had time to do before," said the recently-engaged Barrette. "Even though I wasn't ready to quit bowling when the Tour ended, my life is great right now, and that makes it a little easier to not be out there competing every week."

Overall Barrette was pleased with her first Open Champion-

ships performance, and battled her nerves with help from former PWBA standout Kim Terrell, who made her second trip to the Open Championships. Their group also included 1992 U.S. Amateur champion Anthony Chapman of Upper Marlboro, Md., and William Ripley of Lumberton, N.J., who rolled the ninth perfect game of this year's event.

"I knew I was coming here with some good friends and I was excited, but it was still my first time, so I was pretty nervous," said Barrette, who also won the all-events crown at the 1987 WIBC Tournament and the 1999 WIBC Queens. "I always have realistic expectations and never set them too high. I just wanted to have a good time and a good experience out here and hopefully bowl well."

It Was Unanimous: SLAC/USBC/ASS'N Is Officially Merged

NORWALK — They, S L A C B A / L A W B A / SEDYABA/So-Cal Center Owners, merged officially on a rainy, 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Sunday, March 12, 2006 here at Keystone Lanes. As advertised in the Western/California Bowling News, following rules of order set by the parent group United States Bowling Congress, they merged, 145-0; adopted USBC mandatory by-laws, 90-0; voted to continue \$8 and \$8 dues structure, 86-3 with \$1 from the local portion going to recently merged Cal-State BA.

Yes, even with a bit of quiet gripping, there seemed to be a unanimous feeling the merged will work. The retiring officers picked a knowledgeable hard working transition committee.

Glenn Hizer, SLACBA Executive Director, worried that the meeting place would be too small; volunteers had to bring in more chairs. Glenn said, "I guess the ads, personal contacts and notices brought our members out".

As advertised, Gary Kowarsch, Cal Bowl center manager, chaired the nominating committee which was well controlled. First voting in the new president Paul Reynolds, then Craig Ball as vice-president.

All candidates had to file nomination papers, even those nominated from the floor—by the members.

Taking time was the election of directors. There was competition, challenges, nine nominees for seven two-year positions. To win the candidates must receive a majority vote. Eva Mason, Vera Klabnikin and Judy Neilson were the top vote getters; other four winners: Glenn Hizer, James Knox, D. M'Andre and Gene Hammons.

One year term directors: Robert Stickney, Elbert Yount, Janet Polk, David Green, Faye Edmond, Artie Jones and Eugene McCown.

After the last vote was counted, Hizer went to work fielding questions. He answered: rules and by-laws are the same as is the bonding, averages, certification, few award changes, supplies, fewer gender problems. He finished, "the kids did a great job counting ballots. I think I'll put them to work. You got problems, just call me, 562-925-0417".

Opening Ceremonies Will Usher In 2006 Women's Championships

GREENDALE, Wis.—For the fifth time in its nearly 90-year history the world's largest participatory sporting event for women will kick off in Reno, Nev., next week.

The 2006 United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships begins its 109-day run at the National Bowling Stadium on March 16 and will continue through July 2.

The event, formerly known as the Women's International Bowling Congress Championship Tournament, will feature 10,976 teams from across the country.

Opening ceremonies will begin at 6:30 p.m. March 16 and will feature three local bowlers throwing out the ceremonial first ball. Bowlers on the opening squad will also take part in a mass ball shot to kick off the tournament.

This year marks the fourth time the event has been held at the National Bowling Stadium, which has undergone recent renovations. The changes to the stadium include new carpeting, a new scoring system and new lane panels.

The Women's Championships, which was previously held in Reno in 2003, 2000, 1997 and 1988, is open to any USBC female member. It features five average-based divisions, giving bowlers of all skill levels an opportunity to compete for a prize fund estimated to reach \$2.5 million.

Highlighting the 109-day run of the tournament is the USBC Queens, which will be held June 17-21. The Queens will feature approximately 300 of the best women competitors in the world - both former professionals and amateurs - who will compete for a guaranteed prize fund of \$200,000. The USBC Senior Queens will also be held at the same time.

In the days leading up to the opening of the Women's Championships another event will take place on the lanes at the National Bowling Stadium. The USBC Senior Championships will be contested March 14-15 with bowlers in five divisions competing in the handicap singles event.

WESTMINSTER—The 48th season of the Las Vegas Travel league ended Monday at Westminster Lanes and the Position Round resulted in few changes. Cal Bowl B withstood many challenges during the season, and even tied a couple of times for league leadership, but they had dead aim on the title from the start and held on to top position on team standings for the past 21 consecutive weeks.

Berneice King credits Daisy McReynolds for her contribution until Daisy was sidelined in November for major surgery. She had raised her average from 137 to 149 and though she could not bowl the rest of the season, she'll be back next year. Teri Hefner replaced her, and at 164 average, she has raised to 169 on 63 games.

The team entered at 621 and closed at 664 with Teri and 644 with Daisy. Berneice King captains the team and other members are Bernice Bennett and Katrena Whitmore. Congrats.

This was the largest prize fund in Vegas league history with the top team collecting \$1,000.00 and last place team got \$525. Eleven individual prizes paid a total of \$550 and next year may be even bigger. The Team sweeps also provided a record pay off. The 50/50 fund pays sweeps and a \$568 prize that will pay 10 places.

The 2006-2007 league meeting is slated Monday 10 a.m. July 10 at Cal Bowl. The league is filled at this date but we welcome names for possible replacement bowlers, and subs. Speaking of subs, thanks to all of them for their support. It's true that their bowling is paid but there is a lot of miles traveled through the season and gas has not been cheap. We also thank Bowling News for the space provided to showcase our weekly action.

Awards will be presented following bowling at Arnolds, (next door to Washington Mutual) to the team and high scorers for the season: Keystone A, 794 and Rossmoor B, 2204.; 156 and over individuals, Betty Klemin 236 and Doris Lewis, 659. Doris also had 258 high game and closed the season with 183 average; 155 and under, Bernice Williams 235 and La Ruth Murray 581.

REMINDER: The league sheet bowlers get on Monday, March 20, is the final one for averages that will be submitted to the OCUSBC for 2006-2007 book.

Please keep it for reference and, if bowling in other leagues, keep the league sheet from them, as of April 15, because Vegas league entering averages are based on **HIGHEST CURRENT BOOK AVERAGES**. Bowlers often have higher average in "house" leagues and other associations.

Then on Sunday morning in the singles and doubles events at Canoga Park Lanes Bob kept his momentum on scoring 258-209-269 for a big 741 in singles. With his 88 handicap he scored 829 for the top on the board. In doubles with J. Severstein rolling 246-202-180 for 628, Bob blasted games of 223-208-258 for 691and 1329 total and 1514 with handicap.

For his all-events, Bob scored his career best 2113 total for 234.7 average. Perhaps his 2377 total with handicap may place hi, at the top in all-events. (Note: some of the scores may not be accurate because they were taken from the copies of scoresheets that were hard to read.)

What’s more? Bob hates to miss bowling in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League which was scheduled on the afternoon at AMF Bahama Bowl. Right after he finished in the tournament, he rushed over to Pasadena just in time for the league’s second game. Just like nothing was left off, Bob was still sizzling with 248-257-211 for 716. That is his best bowling day averagewise.

PASADENA...After missing his first game because of participating in the City tournament, Bob Jones arrived at AMF Bahama Bowl just in time to catch up two frames of his second game in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling league. Without benefit of warming up, Jones started striking and ended up with 248 and 257 then finished with a 211 for a big 716. A good score but being absent in his first game, it was not at the top of the league’s honor roll. (Was there some loud B00’s?)

The league’s leader South Bay’s Don Millwee rolled 190-223-210-199 for the day’s top honor roll score 822, followed by teammate Pablo Yoma’s 811 from 199-145-241-226. Tenpin Slants

LAS VEGAS—Char Hammel gets better with age. How else can anyone explain why, at 51, Hammel just scored the biggest victory of her 26-year bowling career.

Hammel’s impressive performance came in Jeanette Robinson’s Golden Ladies Classic, which was held March 6-9 at the Orleans Bowling Center in Las Vegas, her hometown, having moved there from Whittier, Calif. It was the first time the popular righthander has competed in the 16th edition of the annual event, which Robinson, a Hall of Famer, originated in 1991 at the old Showboat Hotel.

When Hammel accepted her first-place check for \$2,250 and a handsome trophy, the attractive brunette promised she would return in 2007 to defend her hard-earned title. The awards were presented by Robinson and Mike Monyak, Director of Bowling Operations for Coast Casinos’ four centers, all located inside of successful hotels in Vegas.

The Golden Ladies Classic attracted 75 veteran bowlers, three of them from England. That number would have been higher, had it not been for six late cancellations, including Florida’s Shirley Levens, who won the GLC three times (1998, 2004, 2005). Also, for the first time, Jeanette Robinson did not compete because she has three torn tendons in her right foot sustained in an auto accident last January.

“The tournament was a huge success,” Robinson said, “and things could not have gone any better.” She loves hosting the GLC, which she calls her “baby” and “a labor of love.”

The GLC tournament format consisted of a 15-game qualifying round (three 5-game blocks), an 18-game match play segment (three 6-game blocks) and a 5-woman stepladder finals.

The qualifying round was led by 2002 GLC champion Sandy Postma of Lansing, Ill., who rolled 3387, a fine 225.12 average. Char Hammel was a close second with 3340 (222.10 average).

As scheduled, Postma and Hammel met in the opening match. It was then that Hammel took charge of the tournament, firing a 300 game with 12 solid pocket strikes on lanes 3 and 4. The match was a war, as Postma pounded the pins for 259—and lost by 41 pins.

Hammel went on to win 15 of her 18 matches and earned the top spot for the stepladder finals by 187 pins over surprise runner-up Debbie Christiansen, a feisty lefthander from Wichita.

Rounding out the top-5 were 65-year-young Dee Price, a 3-time GLC titleist (1993, 1999, 2003) from Stockton; Lil Johnson, Lawton, Okla., and Kathy (McNaughton) Solowitz of Northridge. Both Johnson and Solowitz are former touring pros.

Johnson captured the first two stepladder matches, defeating Solowitz, 213-178, and Price, 228-171. Johnson was then eliminated by Christiansen, who won 249-219.

In the championship match, it was Hammel all the way as she beat Christiansen, 237-179. Hammel went spare, 3-bagger, a solid 10-pin spare, 3-bagger, and two more 10-pin spares. Meanwhile, Christiansen, troubled by the oil moving down on the lanes, could manage only two strikes, seven spares and a 7-9 split.

Christiansen displayed her good sportsmanship by saying, “Char bowled great all week, and she deserved to win.”

Christiansen received \$1,300, followed by Johnson with \$800, Price \$625, and Solowitz \$550.

Anita Pope, Silsbee, Tex., won the Super Seniors (60 and over) division, good for \$650 and a trophy. Defending champion Fran Deken, Coweta, Okla., finished second for \$500. Deken is the former PWBA (Professional Women’s Bowling Assn.) tournament director.

TOURNAMENT NOTES: Before winning the Golden Ladies Classic, **Char Hammel’s** biggest win was a regional WWPB (Western Women Pro Bowlers) title. Hammel attributed her GLC triumph to being in a “comfort zone” virtually the entire tournament. “I used the same (15-pound) ball most of the time, and I didn’t have to move my feet or target more than three of four boards throughout the tournament,” she said...

Asked how she planned to celebrate her big win, Hammel said, “I’m not sure, but I know I’m going to turn the (\$2,250) check over

to my husband (**Mark**). He’s my treasurer, my coach, my everything. He takes very, very good care of me”...Mark indicated that he “cracks the whip” in order to keep his wife aggressive on the lanes...

Char’s 300 was her 11th perfect game, but she has a long way to go before catching up with her husband. Mark, once a promising Southern California bowler, had 26 perfectos before he was stricken with multiple sclerosis and had to give up bowling about five years ago...Char has an interesting occupation; she deals poker at the plush Green Valley Ranch Hotel & Casino ...

Char and Hall of Famer **Virginia Norton** are close friends, perhaps because they both grew up in Whittier...Another Hall of Famer, **Pam Buckner** of Reno, competed in her first GLC. She couldn’t enter previously because she was on the road so much as the top western regional sales rep for Ebonite. Pam surprised herself by firing 1191 (a 238.10 average) and leading the opening 5-game qualifying block. A southpaw, Pam had a very sore right knee that made it difficult to slide at times. But she gutted it out and eventually placed 10th...Pam and hubby **Steve** planned to stick around until the following Sunday for the NASCAR 400-mile race at the Las Vegas Motor Speedway. They’re both huge NASCAR fans, of course, as is **Karen (Crowther) French**, who drove over from Modesto to join them. Pam and Karen were former WWPB members many years ago...

Before the end of the tournament, **Jeanette Robinson**, thanks to never-ending help from husband **Dick Porter**, distributed flyers for Golden Ladies Classic ’07. The dates are March 5-8. For early reservations or more details, call Jeanette at 1-888-365-7111, Ext. 6442...According to the final GLC figures, the 75 entries, at \$150 per bowler, generated an income of \$11,250; however, the total prize fund paid out was \$14,320, or a difference of \$3,070, thanks to added monies from The Orleans and cosponsor Storm Products...

Hall of Fame writers Dick Evans and John Jowdy, along with this veteran pin scribe, had the opportunity during the tournament to sit down with Coast Casinos’ genial Mike Monyak, who has been in the bowling business since he was 12. The 47-year-old bowling executive still refers to himself as “a longtime pin chaser.”

Monyak provided the trio with some amazing statistics about the status of bowling at The Orleans, which opened in December 1996. “We’re averaging 47 lines per bed (70 lanes),” Monyak said, “and that’s for every 365 days.”

“I estimate that, in almost 10 years, there’s been 20 years of wear on the bowling equipment,” he said. “We’ve already replaced all 70 pinsetters and we’ll soon replace the lane beds and automatic scorers.”

As much business as the Orleans Bowling Center is doing, Monyak said that the new 64-lane South Coast establishment has already surpassed it. “South Coast is averaging 48.5 lines per lane,” he pointed out, “and they already have 4,500 league bowlers in spite of being open only three months.”

Although The Orleans has fewer league bowlers than South Coast, the former does more open play and hosts more special events, like the semiannual Mini Eliminator and league sweepers, most of them from Southern California.

When The Orleans conducts a tournament or league sweeper, Monyak estimates that each visiting bowler will spend an average of \$600 to \$800 at the tables. “So, it’s the job of the bowling department to attract people,” he said. “We’re no different from the gift shop (at The Orleans) as we are all working for the good of the whole properties (Coast Casinos).”

In addition to The Orleans and South Coast, the other Coast Casinos bowling centers are located at the Gold Coast (70 lanes) and Suncoast (64 lanes).

Monyak, by the way, is an excellent bowler. He is averaging 220 in a league at the Suncoast. And last year, Monyak was inducted into the Southern Nevada Bowling Hall of Fame.

As a final question, Dick Evans asked Monyak why he hosts the Golden Ladies Classic at The Orleans, especially since this event attracts only a fraction of the number of bowlers that compete in the two Mini Eliminator tournaments each year.

“Why?” responded Monyak, rhetorically. “Because it (the Golden Ladies Classic) is so much fun. And besides, it’s important to Jeanette, and we enjoy having the ladies here. But the bottom line is, it’s a fun tournament; if it weren’t, we wouldn’t have it.”
