

Atom Splitters vs. L.A. X in 'Battle of Los Angeles' Finale for 2014 PBA League Elias Cup - April 13th on ESPN

NORTH BRUNSWICK — Television and Internet personality Chris Hardwick and L.A. Clippers all-star guard Chris Paul will have a score to settle this Sunday on ESPN at 11 a.m. when their respective Professional Bowlers Association League teams battle it out for the 2014 PBA League Elias Cup from Brunswick Zone Carolier in North Brunswick, N.J.

In what can be called the 'Battle of Los Angeles,' Hardwick's Silver Lake Atom Splitters presented by Spiceworks team, and Paul's L.A. X presented by Gobowling.com team, are the two surviving teams from an original eightteam field that competed in a six-round series of head-tohead single-elimination team matches that incorporated singles, alternate-shot doubles, trios and Baker team contests.

During each PBA League match, one point is awarded for a win in singles, doubles and trios contests with three points at stake in the five-player Baker team finale. In case of a 3-3 tie at the conclusion of the match, a one-ball, suddendeath roll-off between players selected by the team managers will determine the winner.

The Atom Splitters are managed by four-time PBA Tour champion and noted bowling instructor Mark Baker. L.A. X is managed by former Team USA member and current United States Bowling Congress President Andrew Cain.

Sunday's opening singles match up will feature reigning PBA Player of the Year twohanded Australian star Jason Belmonte bowling for L.A. X against 17-time Tour champion and former Player of the Year Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, representing the Atom Splitters.

In the alternate-shot doubles match, Barnes will pair with 2003 USBC Masters champion Bryon Smith of Roseburg, Ore., against PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., a 33-time Tour winner, and his partner two-time Player of the Year and 13-time Tour titlist Mika Koivuniemi of Finland.

In the trios match, the Atom Splitters lineup will send 15time Tour winner Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., three-time champion Dom Barrett of England and ninetime Tour winner Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, against L.A. X's Belmonte, two-time Tour winner Andres Gomez of Colombia and 2012-13 Rookie of the Year E.J. Tackett of Huntington, Ind.

In the Baker finale, the Atom Splitters' Smith, Barnes, Barrett, Malott and Jones will line up against L.A. X's Koivuniemi, Tackett, Gomez, Belmonte and Bohn.

TORRANCE — There were no big action news in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League's second stop at Gable House Bowl. Both Dan Flores who hit a perfect game in the travel league's first stop there and Mark Fisser twice who had close encounter with 300 (289-299) in the league's prior stop at Jewel City Bowl did not come close to perfection.

The best Flores could do was a 215 in his 2nd game and the day's high game 256 in his 4th game for a 831 series. Fisser rolled first 3 games of 224-223-242 (689) but ended up with the day's high series 850 for four to lead the day's 8 men honor roll. Their 800s were the only two 800s of the day,

Two bowlers dueled with each other and came short 6 pins and 9 pins of 800. League President Ed Abakumoff hit 236-174-202-182 for 794 while his opponent Bob Jones had 222-182-162-224 for 791. The 4 others on the roll list were Leroy MacMonagle with (203-203) 724, Jeff Stansell with (212-203) 733, Gorman Low (200) 719 and League Secretary-Treasurer Bob Taylor with 705. The high lady was Anita Lorenzo with 176 and 611.

Jones' league leading Eagle Rock fell again for 2nd time in row this time to Abakumoff's third place Riverside, 13 to 7. Riverside with Abakumoff and teammates Low and Vice President Sharon Caldwell took the first two games 6 to 2. Eagle Rock rallied in taking third and 4th games but lost the all important series and total pins. 2066 to Riverside's 2094.

There is no change in team standings as Fisser's 2nd place Anaheim also lost 9 to 11 of Stansell's Mid City but Anaheim gained two points, 7 points behind first place Eagle Rock. MacMonagle's last place Orange County finally won 11 to 9 from Flores' 5th place S F Valley.

This 54 years old traveling League thanks Gable House Bowl management and staff for hosting and hopes to return next season. The league will take an Easter sojourn and return to Canoga Park Bowl on Sunday April 27 with bowling at Noon.

JOHNSON, BELMONTE SELECTED AS 2013 IBMA BOWLERS OF THE YEAR

ARLINGTON, TX — Wins in major events propelled Liz Johnson and Jason Belmonte to major accolades as they were selected 2013 Bowlers of the Year by the International Bowling Media Association.

Johnson, a 40-year-old right-hander from Cheektowaga, N.Y., captured the top spot in the women's voting in large part because of her victory in the U.S. Women's Open. Belmonte, a two-handed thrower from Australia, led the men's voting thanks to winning the United States Bowling Congress Masters. Accomplished achieved during calendar-year 2013 were considered by the worldwide panel of voters.

In addition to her U.S. Open victory, Johnson placed second in team event, third in Masters, sixth in doubles, 14th in all-events, and 33rd in singles in the World Tenpin World Championships. She also finished third in the International Bowling Championships and World Bowling Tour finals, and tied for 17th in the USBC Queens.

She collected 144 points, including 24 first-place votes. Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., was next with 70 points followed by Shannon O'Keefe with 47, Diana Zavajova with 22 and Missy Parkin with 15.

"I am both overwhelmed and honored that IBMA chose me as the 2013 female bowler of the year," Johnson said. "As our sport continues to expand globally it is really a special award because now we are competing with all the talented girls internationally."

Belmonte, the 30-year-old two-handed Australian who also was named PBA Player of the Year for 2012-13, easily led the men's voting with 205 points including 39 first-place votes. Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., was a distant second with 69 points, Wes Malott 41, Sean Rash 34, and Mika Koivuniemi 17.

"I am incredibly honored to win such a prestigious award," Belmonte said. "Thank you so much to everyone who voted for me. It certainly means so much to me to be named Bowler of the Year and I will display the award proudly."

Besides his USBC victory, Belmonte also captured the Australian Masters. He placed second in the Professional Bowlers Association Tournament of Champions, World Championship, and U.S. Open, third in the Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championship, fourth in the Summer Swing GEICO King of the Swing special event, and fourth in the WSOB V Viper Championship.. He led the PBA in earnings with \$135,679 and in average at 223.70.

Johnson and Belmonte will be honored June 25 during the IBMA Convention as part of International Bowl Expo in Las Vegas.



W.R Williams Begins PBA50 Player of the Year Title Defense in Pasco County Open Ktra Frame to provide live coverage of PBA50 Tour season-opener April 13-15 in New Port Richey, Fla.

NEW PORT RICHEY, FL – With a new crop of PBA Tour talent becoming eligible for the PBA50 Tour in 2014, the road to a third consecutive Player of the Year crown won't get any easier for two-time defending PBA50 Tour Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr.

Williams heads an all-star list of more than 160 players ages 50 and over who are entered in the season-opening PBA50 Tour Pasco County Open April 12-15 at Lane Glo Bowl in New Port Richey, Fla.

All qualifying and match play rounds of the tournament will be covered live on PBA's exclusive online bowling channel, Xtra Frame. For subscription information, visit pba.com and click on the Xtra Frame link.

As the 2014 season gets underway, Williams will again face challenges from his two closest rivals in 2013, fellow Hall of Famers Pete Weber and Amleto Monacelli who are among 10 Hall of Famers in the field including newly-eligible PBA50 challengers Norm Duke and Parker Bohn III.

Williams, the winner of a record 47 PBA Tour titles and a record seven PBA Player of the Year crowns, got his 2013 PBA50 season off to a good start with a third-place finish in the Pasco County Open and went on to win three titles during the season, bringing his PBA50 Tour career total to seven. Along with his three titles, he had two thirds and two fourths including fourth in the Senior U.S. Open.

With his legendary career of accomplishment on the PBA Tour carrying over to the PBA50 Tour, Williams is still able to find challenges to stay motivated.

"I still love competing," Williams said. "I'm one of those lucky people who loves what they do and I've been able to make a living doing it. I haven't lost the desire."

Despite competing in only six tournaments in 2013, Weber, a 37-time winner on the PBA Tour, made an immediate impact in 2013, earning PBA50 Rookie of the Year honors thanks to winning two titles including his first major in the USBC Senior Masters.

Monacelli, a 19-time winner on the PBA Tour, successfully defended his PBA Senior U.S. Open title in Las Vegas in 2013 for his second career PBA50 Tour title. Other top finishes during the season included two seconds, two fifth and two-eighth-place finishes.

"With the competition looking to be even tougher this season, it would be an awesome accomplishment to repeat as (PBA50) Player of the Year," Williams said. "I'm pretty confident heading into the new season. I bowled well in the (USBC Masters in February) and I bowled well in a couple regionals recently.



"My practice routine is still pretty much the same, working on repeating shots, practicing on different lane conditions, different parts of the lane and making spares."

Hall of Famer Tom Baker, also entered in the Pasco County Open, holds the record for PBA50 Player of the Year honors with four consecutive crowns from 2005 to 2008.

Williams, Weber and Monacelli were rewarded for their 2013 seasons by qualifying for the first PBA50 Finals which were conducted as part of World Series of Bowling V. Williams won the title by defeating Monacelli in the championship match 224-204.


Throughout the 2014 PBA50 Tour season, players will again be competing for three berths in the end-of-season PBA50 Tour Finals which will be conducted at a site and date to be determined. The three berths will be based on Player of the Year points which are earned for championship round finishes.

Five-time PBA Tour champion Bob Learn Jr. is the Pasco County Open defending champion. Last season he overcame a sprained lower back suffered half way through the tournament to defeat Hall of Famer Wayne Webb in the championship match, 226-206.

Pasco County Open competition begins on Sunday April 13.

Colorado's Sharon Powers Defeats Defending Champion Tish Johnson to Take 24th Annual Golden Ladies Classic Crown

LAS VEGAS — Sharon Powers, Lakewood, Colorado defeated 2013 GLC champion Tish Johnson 257-237 in the title match to win Jeanette Robinson's 24th Annual Golden Ladies Classic Tournament March 20 at the Orleans Bowling Center.

Powers worked her way up the ladder to the final match against qualifying leader Johnson. In the pressure packed final, both players rolled plenty of strikes.

Powers got it going in the 4th frame, rolling a seven-bagger which gave her the victory. Hall of Famer Johnson never missed the pocket, but left three 7-pins along the way that proved to be the difference.

It was the first big national championship for Powers, a member of the Colorado Bowling Hall of Fame. For Johnson, a 25-time pro tour champion, it was a frustrating runner-up finish because she held more than a 400 pin lead over second place going into the finals. Powers earned \$2200 for the win, and Johnson took home \$1100.

In matches leading to the title game, Powers ran the table. In the first match, she defeated fifth place finisher Kristy Whicher 236-222. Powers then rolled by Oklahoma's Lil Johnson 247-225, and advanced to the top by defeating Pam Pancoast 236-202. Pancoast cashed for \$800, Johnson earned \$700 for 4th place, and Whicher's 5th place check was \$600.

The 2014 event laid a good foundation for the 25th Anniversaryof the GLC coming next year. Hall of Famer

ABOUT THE PROS

• A pro bowler's opinion of a town is based mostly on how well or how badly he or she bowls there, not whether it is a pleasant or historical site. And you can bet that a bowler's opinion of a lane condition is in direct proportion to how well it was hit. To a winner, it's the best. To the runner-up, it's excellent. To the casher, it's fair to good. And to the also rans, it's not a matter of pleasant conversation.

• Soaker or no soaker (bowling ball dipped in various chemical(s) to give extra action). Don McCune was the most abused Bowler of the Year in history in 1973 because he fathered and mastered the soaker, now banned. But McCune came back in 1974 to prove his ability, winning \$33,000 (excellent earnings then) without winning a tournament. Today's legal bowling balls make yesteryear's soakers look like backup balls.

• A pro bowler would be a fool to suffer the frustrations and instabilities which almost inevitably are a part of the career, unless he or she firmly believed some day would bring stardom, and all that goes with it.

• Pro bowlers really aren't superstitious, but some claim it's a scientific fact that they roll much better while wearing certain colors

• Marshall Holman on Marshall Holman "I'm an emotional player. If I were passive I'd be mediocre. My actions are spontaneous, and I can no more control them than other players can change to the way I react. It's the way I work. What I do is gut and heart reactions. You just don't change them that easily.'

· Winners of pro tournaments don't forget. They remember how to win and the feeling it brings, and that can keep them going for a long time - no matter what.

· Most bowling pros make it by taking one more chance, over and over again. The dismal failures are no problem. They soon realize they can't make it, at least most of them do, and pack it in. The fringe players, the ones who cash fairly often, but seldom win the big money, have it the toughest. They just get by, hoping for that big win or big year that always seems to be a game or a strike away from their grasp. Quite a few, if they had to do it over again, might take a regular job, and be the best bowlers in their shop or office. Others are quite candid, and freely admit, that the tour, even when the going is rough, is a lot better than most jobs.

• In every way, on and off the lanes, Carmen Salvino has given his all for bowling, almost as though it has been his personal crusade. And all you can ask or demand of yourself or anyone else is that they give their best.

· Bowling is a funny game, even though it wasn't meant to be.

Isn't every bad break, spooky pinfall, or curious happening in bowling funny, so long as it happens to someone else? And talking about funny, what happened in San Jose, Calif., in 1971 wasn't funny to the righthanders in the field. All 16 match play qualifiers were left-handed.

• No sport has as many athletes so close together in ability as bowling. On any given week, any one of more than 50 pros rates almost an equal chance to win any given tournament. The marginal difference is often one good game or good shot or one lucky or unlucky break.

• Some pro bowlers beat up their hands so badly that when you shake hands with them it's like sticking your hand into a bag of walnuts.

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS

· One of the greatest entertainment shows of all time, hailed around the world, featured the three tenors, opera legends Jose Carreras, Placido Domingo and Luciano Pavarotti. In the TV interview Domingo explained that you need a certain kind of breathing to reach the high notes, and when Pavarotti was singing Domingo and Carreras would sort of breathe with him to help him along. It was like when you are bowling, and you are behind the bowler, and you move from side to side to help the bowler steer the ball.

• What happens when one bowler sticks on a lane and complains, and another bowler says he slides too much on the same lane and complains? A UN like debate ensues and the centers league and bowling officials wished they had stayed home that night.

. In the rush for entries some senior tournaments are lowering the minimum age to 45 or lower from the usual 50. There are super senior divisions for bowlers 60 and over and super super divisions for 70 and up. Is bowling going to get like boxing. Boxing once had eight divisions - period. Now there are junior and super groupings added to the original, making 24. And there are at least three sanctioning groups and that's why there are so many boxing champions, 72 and counting, as other newly created weight divisions and boxing associations pop up. In bowling, in most cases, youngsters and oldsters, what counts is average, not age.

Whenever a so-called unknown wins a bowling event just remember that many a nobody who isn't known by anybody becomes a somebody and is known by everybody, and everybody tells him they knew him when he was a nobody and they knew he would be a somebody someday. Huh?

· Pure fiction is the story of a head-tohead bowling match - as told by the participants two weeks later.

• In the more than 50 years pro bowling has been on TV, the event that caused the most comment and excitement and got the most exposure was not a specific thrilling match or perfect game or a big money purse - it was Mark Roth's conversion of the 7-10 split.

• All bowlers have their bad outings. It has been said that those bad times will be matched by an equal number of good times. Most bowlers I know have a lot of good days coming. In the meantime have a good bowling day - or at least a good day every day.

Junior WYATT HICKS Bowls 300

RIVERSIDE — What is better than bowling 300? How about bowling 300 in your association Junior Masters Singles Tournament. That is what junior Wyatt Hicks did a few weeks ago when he went perfect in the CITRUS BELT Junior Masters Singles Tournament at Riverside Lanes.

Wyatt used his Storm NRG to register his big game and series 696 (154 - 300 - 242). His perfect game earned Wyatt a California State Plaque, a USBC ring and a Citrus Belt fifty dollar scholarship.

Hicks is coached by ART GUZMAN and MIKE RADDE-MAN (Citrus Belt President). He competes in the EMPIRE BOWL youth program in Redlands and averages 187. According to his coaches our headliner exhibits poise beyond his years.

Wyatt credits coaches Guzman and Raddeman for keeping him calm as he approached perfection. He began feeling pressure after his first eight strikes and walked back to them for help and got it. After his ninth, tenth, and eleventh strikes he walked back and got the same sound advise: "TAKE A DEEP BREATH AND HOLD IT IN, let the carbon dioxide counteract the adrenaline in your system. Keep calm, take your time." IT WORKED.

Lucky is the boy with coaches like Art and Mike. They know bowling, they know coaching, they know competing, they know physiology, and they know psychology. It all translate into success on the lanes. Congratulations TEAM EMPIRE.

The Perfect Game by Steve Felege

Carol Mancini = the Email Lady

Carol: Steve, I have another interesting email for you this week. It's about a common problem I've heard more solutions for than I care to recall. I'd like to hear your take on it.

Steve: Shoot!

Carol: This one is from Lillian in Hawaii. It says, "I drift. What should I do?"

Steve: Oh, that's an easy one. Lillian, drifting in Hawaii is heavenly! If you get tired of the scenery or your fingers get "pruney", just paddle until you reach dry land.

Carol: You've been drinking too much coffee again, Steve! Seriously, what can a bowler do if he or she is concerned about how many boards they drift?

Steve: My advice for them is to stop worrying about it. All bowlers drift; even the pros. It's nothing more than beginning your approach on one board and ending on another. As long as it's only a few boards and consistent, faagitaboutit!

Carol: What about extreme or inconsistent drifting.

Steve: That's another story. Those are real problems.

Carol: I know, that's why I thought this would be a good subject to cover this week. To begin with, what causes a bowler to drift?

Steve: Bowling causes it.

Carol: Can you be serious for just a few minutes here.

Steve: I am being serious! Swinging a heavy ball while walking is an unbalanced activity. It's only natural for any unbalanced movement to drift toward the heavier side.

Carol: Are you saying the arm-swing causes drift?

Steve: It sure does! The ball and the bowler move together so they have an effect on each other. The motion of the ball, being on one side, exerts a pull in that direction. That pull is the culprit. The farther out the ball is, the greater a force it exerts (it's a center-of-gravity thing). It's why coaches teach that the arm-swing must be kept close to the body; to minimize drift.

Carol: That makes sense. What about bowlers that drift 2 boards 1 time and ten boards the next?

Steve: Those bowler's are up a Hawaiian creek without a paddle.

Carol: Again with the paddle?

Steve: And that creek leads to shark-infested waters!

Carol: I like the analogy.

Steve: It's a worst-case scenario, Carol. If drift is caused by the arm-swing, then inconsistent drift is caused by an inconsistent arm-swing, also known as the dreaded "figure-eight" arm-swing.

Carol: And the cure for a figure-eight swing is....?

Steve: Last week I said that a lot of bowling problems can be resolved by simply improving the stance. The figure-eight swing is a great example of that.

Carol: But isn't the figure-eight initiated by the direction of the push-away?

Steve: It certainly is, but the direction of the push-away is determined in the stance. A proper stance places the ball directly over its target-line and creates the conditions necessary for you and the ball to move straight forward. A stance which doesn't do that creates a push-away which must go sideways.

Carol: Got it! The ball being pushed out and to the side can go outside the target line....

Steve:causing the ball to swing behind the back, inside the target line....

Carol: where it loops around in an attempt to get back on the target line during the forward swing. Steve: Correct. That looping action is behind the back where the bowler can't see it, so it WILL

be inconsistent. As the bowler accelerates the ball, the troublesome pull is generated.

Carol: So, your advice is.....?

Steve: Minimize and stabilize the amount you drift by developing a stance that puts the ball over its target-line and points it in that direction. The push-away can then move the ball straight forward to its target. The pendulum swing kept close to the body will ensure that both you and the ball stay on target. I can't make it any simpler than that.

Carol: How about this? Swing straight; walk straight. Swing crooked, walk crooked.

Steve: How about this? As your arm swings, so shall you walk; consistently or not.

Carol: You always have to have the last word! Don't you?

Steve: No, I don't. Carol: Yes, you do Steve: No, I don't! Carol: Yes, you do!

Steve: NO, I DON'T!!!

Carol: YESS, YOUUU DOOOO!!!
