Two Big Events On Horizon For Women Bowlers

GREENDALE, Wis.—For a week in August later this year, the top women bowlers in the world will have the unique opportunity to compete in two major events at the same time.

The U.S. Women's Open, a United States Bowling Congress event, and the Professional Bowlers Association Women's Tour Trials will be held simultaneously at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., from Aug. 13-18.

The two individual events will share qualifying scores in a format that has yet to be determined. The qualifying, which promises to be a long, grueling format, will be conducted on all five PBA Experience lane conditions to test the competitors' skills.

"I think this is definitely a step in the right direction to put women's bowling back on the map," said Shannon Pluhowsky, a seven-time Team USA member and defending USBC Queens champion. "Right now, all we really have is the Queens, so I'm looking forward to taking advantage of the extra opportunities."

Each event will have a separate entry fee - \$250 for the U.S. Women's Open and \$750 for the Tour Trials.

The U.S. Women's Open final rounds will feature a unique bracket elimination format in which the top 16 players will compete on television. In a deal with ESPN, the first four rounds of the finals will be taped Aug. 17-18 and shown on Sept. 16, 23, 30 and Oct. 7. The final four competitors will return to Reno

for a live televised championship round on Oct. 14.

The top 16 players who exercise the option of competing in the Tour Trials will advance to compete in the PBA Women's Series, which will feature four events with a total prize fund of \$50,000 for each event, including a top prize of \$10,000 and last cash of \$1,800.

The championship match of all four PBA Women's Series events will be televised as part of the ESPN telecasts for the four Denny's PBA Tour events in which women's events will run concurrently.

All players who elect to join the PBA Women's Series must become PBA members. However, those players scheduled to compete in the World Tenpin Bowling Association Women's World Championships in Monterrey, Mexico, from Aug. 31-Sept. 8 will be able to delay their decision to join the PBA until after that event in order to protect their amateur status.

The Bowling Proprietors Association of America, which previously owned the rights to the U.S. Women's Open name, recently agreed to allow USBC to resurrect the event for the first time since 2003. BPAA centers will also have the option of conducting local qualifiers for the U.S. Women's Open.

The first major women's event of the year, the USBC Queens, will be conducted April 28-May 2 in suburban Charlotte, N.C. The finals of the event will be televised live on ESPN2 on May 2 at 7 p.m. Eastern.

NORWALK—Have you ever wondered what your purpose is? For bowlers, those perfect 300's, or 800 series, or how about picking up a 7-10 split. Each of these moments is exciting in a bowler's life, but bowling has a lot more to offer!

I remember as a child that bowlers were people that would come together to play a sport, but more importantly they learned about each other and themselves. What did they discover? They found people who like themselves, whether they were doctors, parents or someone who could barely pay their league fees. What all of us have discovered is this is a sport that cares!

In the last 24 months, at Keystone Lanes, we have rediscovered this concept. One afternoon, the general manager was speaking of how we could increase our league membership. So we had a crazy idea of having a tournament to help the blind by having a fund raiser. (At least that is what we thought at the time.)

In the next few months, we planned and we began to work towards fulfilling this dream. Our first fundraiser was not the highlight of the year nor was it noticed by many, but what happened next began to change lives.

The 6 bowlers decided that they wanted to have a league of their own at Keystone Lanes! Once again, not a lot of hoop-la, but along the way people began to notice and volunteers appeared out of the woodwork. A group of seniors began to help and then some of the leagues like our Friday night leagues began to participate by dropping a few dollars our way to help with league fees.

Today Norwalk's Journey for the Blind league has become the largest blind league in the state and they have done amazing things. Maggie Campillo, is one of those examples. She was an assistant manager at Taco Bell, and about 4 years ago while working her eyesight was lost. This did not stop Maggie, because if you know Maggie she is the eternal optimist. When Maggie first started the blind bowling league, she averaged 6 pins a game. That may not seem like much but Maggie has become a seasoned bowler after 24 months. She had three strikes in a row (An Amazing Turkey!).

Maggie is improving every week and in the last two months she has averaged over 60 pins a game. What is adding to the excitement is that Maggie is just one our inspirational stories that will be told in the next few months. Maggie along with 25 other Blind and partially blind bowlers will be representing Norwalk, and the surrounding areas at the National Bowling Tournament for the Blind. The American Blind Bowling Association is sponsoring this event and each of our Blind Bowlers is going! Over \$30,000.00 was needed to accomplish this task.

In the next few weeks we will acquaint you with some of our blind bowlers and you will see how their lives are changing, but what is more exciting is how they are changing ours! Bowling is a sport that cares and it helps bring out the best in bowlers in this amazing sport.

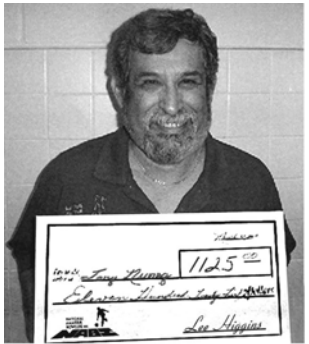

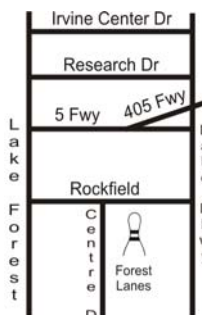
An Ebonite ball was raffled off, & the lucky ticket holder was Bob Browne. Congratulations!

Tenpin Slants

At one time, Tim and Vickie Myers were avid—and excellent—bowlers. But that was more than 30 years ago.

Tim was good enough to have rolled five 300 games and an 838 series, which was pretty hard to do in those days. And Vickie was good enough to win a WWPB (Western Women Professional Bowlers) title, the 1978 Robby's Automatic Positioner Open. She was also the sergeant-at-arms of the organization, which recently changed its name to the Western Women Premier Bowlers.

Tim was the first to give up bowling. He preferred to watch Vickie compete in the WWPB tournaments, as well as in the once-prestigious Greater Los Angeles Women's All-Star Travel League. The league expired about 20 years ago.

Tim was a quiet person. He was so quiet that few knew he was a man of many talents. In addition to his expertise with a bowling ball, he was a 7-handicap golfer with two holes-in-one to his credit, a tennis buff, a shrewd card player, and the owner of a very successful business for 25 years in El Segundo, near the Los Angeles Airport.

During that time, Tim and Vickie became close friends with Joan Romeo and her late husband, Raymond. Joan has her own successful business, The Marketing Team, in Van Nuys.

Joan tells a very interesting story about Tim. "Although he has many talents, none of them were remotely connected to music," she said. "Oh, he liked to listen and maybe on occasion, even dance a little, but for the most part when he wasn't working or traveling you could find him with his family or friends indulging in one of his pastimes.

"But in November of 2005, while on a visit to his daughter's

home in Idaho, his granddaughter Sloane expressed her sadness about all the trees being cut down just to build a new shopping mall," Joan said.

"Although I wouldn't describe Tim as a 'tree-hugger,' his granddaughter's feelings triggered his own—at 2:30 a.m.—and inspired Tim to write his first song, 'A New Strip Mall.'

"Little did his family realize this was only the beginning of a new career. Their husband, father and grandfather couldn't stop himself. And now, a year and a half later, Tim has 25 original songs in his repertoire, sings them all, and has learned to play the guitar.

"Oh, and did I mention this new career was launched at a CD Release Party during his 60th birthday celebration in September '06 at the Belamar Hotel in Manhattan Beach?

"Reviews of the event were quite favorable, and he was classified as 'a little bit country.' As country music is actually a catchall category that embraces different genres of music, it's believed its roots are in traditional folk music. 'Outta Nowhere'—the name of his CD—presents a unique combination, which includes a little bit country and maybe some bluegrass, it can be adapted to several different styles, including Americana," Joan concluded.

Tim and Vickie, who have two children and seven grandchildren, are longtime residents of El Segundo, where Vickie is an art teacher. She revels in her husband's new career, just as Tim once reveled in watching his wife compete on the lanes.

As a footnote to this story, Joan Romeo is doing what she can to help further Tim's fledgling music career. She is using her P.R. firm to write press releases on behalf of Tim Myers, her good friend—and a rising star.

Joan says more information about Tim can be found on his website at www.tmyersmusic.com. Tenpin Slants did and found an excellent photograph of a smiling Tim Myers playing his guitar. The photo ran in the Oct. 19, 2006 issue of the El Segundo Herald along with a feature story titled "He's a Little Bit Country."

After being in limbo for the past four years, the Professional Women's Bowling Assn. Tour is being revived...sort of.

First, it was announced by the USBC that the U.S. Women's Open will return Aug. 13-18 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno. The last time this tournament was held was in 2003, when Kelly Kulick was the winner. Shortly after that, the PWBA Tour went into the tank. Then, in a joint announcement by the USBC and PBA, it was revealed that a five-event PBA Women's Series, featuring 16 exempt distaffers, will be shown on ESPN as part of the 2007-2008 PBA Tour.

As I understand it, scores in the U.S. Women's Open will determine the 16 exempt players—providing they pay an extra fee. And that's the catch, because that extra fee amounts to \$750. Not many players can afford that, unless they can come up with a sponsor.

The USBC and PBA, however, still are to be congratulated for doing what they can to bring back the women's tour on TV. Perhaps it will lead to finding an umbrella sponsor for a regular PWBA Tour, a la Denny's for the men's tour.

That's the next step—and it's a big one.





The last event in February was almost sold out with over 5800 entries and over \$650,000 was dispersed, with the bowlers receiving extra money as the prize fund was increased, With \$9700 given to bowlers as TAT Bucks to be used in future Tournaments as a gift. over 200 bowlers earned their way to the main finals. There will be 11 separate events with 11 separate prize funds in the next Amateur only event.

All prize funds are guaranteed,. 1st place prize is \$25,000, 2nd - \$15,000, 3rd - \$10,000, 4th - \$5,000, and 5th - \$3,500 and 6th \$2,500. with \$500+ minimum Guaranteed for making the finals. A single entry fee is only \$280 which includes a "Free" Ebonite performance bowling ball, Free squads into the Chance Tournaments and a qualifying entry into the \$30,000 Ebonite Challenge Tournament, and 1 Qualifying Squad for the main event, with 3 other value multiple entries available, and over 500 ways to cash.

This is truly an "amateur" tournament in which PBA or PWBA tour members within the last 10 years are ineligible. There is a special \$30,000 Ebonite Challenge Tournament during the qualifying and CT squads. \$5,000 1st place with the top 5 guaranteed \$1,000 each, a 1 in 6 cash ratio, \$100 last cash There are nine (9) ways to qualify: a strike in the 3rd, 6th, and 9th frames of any 2 games will advance you to the finals. Many others will win there way to the finals in different squad bonuses. All finalist will receive a second "Free" Ebonite performance bowling ball. All TAT entrants will receive one (1) free qualifying entry into the Ebonite Challenge Tournament and all re-entries are only \$10. The Ebonite Challenge Finals will start at 7:00 pm on July 7, 2007. Where else can you bowl for a \$5,000 top prize for free or only \$10.



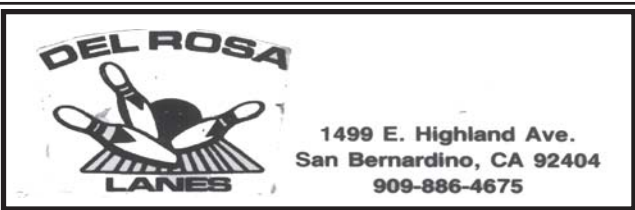
