Barnes Bounces Back

UNCASVILLE, Conn.—An up-and-down season for Chris Barnes couldn't have ended on a higher note.

Barnes won his second career Denny's PBA Tour Major title, defeating defending champion Steve Jaros, 234-227, in the title match of the 2006 Dexter Tournament of Champions Sunday at Mohegan Sun Arena.

Barnes, who withdrew from five events early in the season with a back injury and was in danger of not winning a title for the first time since 1998, won \$100,000 for his seventh career title.

"My belief in everything turning out holds true," said Barnes, who came in having lost 12 of his last 13 matches on TV. "There was an opportunity for it to go the other way. I bowled a good game but sometimes it seems like the way my luck goes, the other guys just bowl a little better. He had a chance and I thought I was going to have to strike out, but I was fortunate he gave me an extra miss."

After starting the match with a strike, Barnes left a 6-7 split and opened in the 2nd frame, but he responded with six consecutive strikes to take the lead. After Barnes' run ended with a spare, Jaros - working on three straight strikes - could have pulled even with a strike, but he spared in the 9th, then struck and spared in his 10th frame. Barnes then picked up a spare and knocked down eight pins in the 10th to win.

Barnes advanced to the title match with a 255-191 win over Amleto Monacelli. Barnes was perfect through the first seven frames, but his bid for a 300 game ended when he left a 10-pin in the 8th frame. Monacelli, who was trying to become the oldest bowler to win a Tournament of Champions, never got on track.

Jaros defeated Tommy Jones, 247-233, in the first semi-final. Jones led early after Jaros had back-to-back spares in the 3rd and 4th frames, but Jones opened in his 4th frame after a 4-7-10 split. Jaros took advantage with five consecutive strikes and his spare in the 10th frame shut Jones out.

Jaros took home \$30,000 for 2nd, while Jones and Monacelli earned \$10,000 apiece for the 3rd and 4th place finishes, respectively.

Chris Barnes

The Tournament of Champions offers a two-season exemption on the Denny's PBA Tour, but Barnes was already exempt through 2007-08 due to his U.S. Open win last season.

The 2006 Dexter Tournament of Champions concludes the 2005-06 Denny's PBA Tour season. Next week, six bowlers will compete in a special event, the "Motel 6 Roll to Riches" which features a winner-take-all \$200,000 prize. The event is comprised of the four Major winners from the 2005-06 season (Barnes, Mike Scroggins, Jones and Walter Ray Williams Jr.) as well as two PBA stars chosen by the fans via an on-line vote (Pete Weber and Norm Duke).

Ohio Becomes 18th State To Add High School Varsity Bowling

Boys, girl programs will begin in 2006-07 season

GREENDALE, Wis.—By unanimous vote Thursday, the Ohio High School Athletic Association added boys and girls bowling as a varsity sport starting with the 2006-07 academic year. During the 2005-06 season in Ohio, about 160 boys teams and 160 girls teams competed in bowling at the club level for their high schools.

Ohio becomes the 18th state to offer bowling as a championship sport at the high school varsity level, joining Alaska, Arkansas, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Iowa (girls only), Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Washington (girls only). About 25 additional states offer bowling at an interscholastic club competition level.

"Now the kids can officially represent their school in the sport they love," said Greg Coules, commissioner of Ohio High School Bowling. "I've spoken to many school athletic directors around the state who support high school bowling. Now they have the opportunity to elevate bowling's status from club to varsity."

Bowling is the fastest-growing high school sport according to a 2005 survey conducted by the National Federation of State High School Associations. Participation in bowling programs jumped by 14 percent for boys and 13 percent for girls from the 2003-04 to 2004-05 school years - more than any other sport. Nearly 40,000 students competed on a high school bowling

team during the 2004-05 school year.

"High school bowling has phenomenal support from the Ohio bowling community," said Jeanne Klescewski, director of United States Bowling Congress High School and Collegiate. "The community's solid relationship with school athletic associations led to this addition."

USBC High School is a resource for school administrators, high school state athletic associations, state proprietor associations and industry member organizations in the creation and maintenance of high school bowling programs. USBC High School actively offers guidance to all levels of high school bowling by providing rules, instructional opportunities, awards and industry resources to ensure the success of high school bowling nationwide.

Inaugural USBC Convention On The Horizon

2,500 People Expected to Attend April 19-22 in Orlando Florida
GREENDALE, Wis.—About 2,500 people are scheduled to “Experience the Magic” in Orlando, Fla., at the first United States Bowling Congress Convention to be held April 19-22 at the Orange County Convention Center.

Attendees will include state and local bowling association delegates, athletes, bowling center management and general members. All will take advantage of the educational and social opportunities available as the organization conducts the business of bowling.

Participants will learn the latest about USBC and the sport while improving their skills and knowledge at more than three dozen educational workshops

and exhibits April 19-20. Workshop topics include “Learning About Bowling Balls and Lane Play,” “Leadership Training - Youth Leaders” and “Attracting Tournament Sponsors and Publication/Web Advertisers.” The “Exceptional People/Service” topic features two sessions, one subtitled “Extraordinary Association Performance” and the other “Extraordinary Center Profits.” Youth programs, coaching, strategic planning, building membership and diversity also will be among the topics explored. In addition, updates on high school, collegiate and Sport Bowling will be available.

Mingling with the sport’s stars will take place the evening of April 20 during the Academy Award-themed Awards Night/Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. A variety of USBC and industry awards will be presented before the five newest members of the USBC Hall of Fame (Fran Deken, John Sommer Jr., Ron Pollard, Rick Pollard and Nancy Fehr) are inducted. USBC Chief

Executive Officer Roger Dalkin and USBC and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Nelson Burton Jr. will be the evening’s hosts.

April 21 begins nearly two days of official business with the highlight being the keynote address that morning by CBS-TV sportscaster Greg Gumbel. The next day, delegates will vote on 21 playing, league and tournament rules. Five of them deal with general playing rules, seven with league rules and nine with tournament rules. While delegate voting determines what happens to bowling’s rules, all members are welcome to give their thoughts on all topics.

P.S. Bowling News’ Carol Mancini will be attending as a delegate, hoping to redeem herself after the April fool statement concerning U.S. B.C. mistake.

CERRITOS—Good Guys strike again and Paul Passarino tossed many of them in winning his first ABTA title in fine style as he downed five straight opponents in the top 16 single elim finals to win his first ABTA title and \$2,300 and deservedly so after downing our top seed John Conway in the title game.

Paul wasn’t the only bowler performing well at Cerritos as we saw four bowlers share a \$1,080 Match Game Marvin Galsim, Belinda Crowder, Roger Wrase and Steve Hower. They got \$270 each for their fine 192 game.

Cerritos had a great shot and produced cut scores of +78 (men) and +24 Ladies. The added Super Seniors at Premiere were Adam Drodz, Ester Wilwayco and the ‘Champ’ Paul Passarino. Due to a nice turnout of 204 entrants, we had 51 semi-finalists in the cash line in hopes of making the top 16 single elim finals.

John Conway led the way in the semis, as he was tops in the Semifinals with a fine +108. He sat out and bowled for the title, and bested Frank Zhen at +102. He received a first round bye in the single elims and entered in round two. It took a +50 Men, to make the sweet 16 single elims and a +34 for the three guaranteed women.

The Bowlers took to the lanes. In the first round single elims, losing their matches were Belinda Crowder, David Olsen, Dave Fairow, Ronnie Cordero, Donnie Johnson Jr. Romy Cajucom and James Abilar. They got checks of \$100 in 10-16th places.

In round two, being eliminated were Shelly Hall, Frank Zhen, Anthony Flores, and Rich

Yanagita. They cashed in 6-9th places and \$110 each.

Round three saw Paul Passarino use his strike ball, downing Vic Garcia 240-208. Tracy Cueto downed Marvin Galsim 228-201. Vic, Marvin and David were 4th and 5th with checks of \$120. Tracy and Paul met for the right to bowl Conway for the title. This game was a good one to say the least as Paul recovered from opening the first two frames and a four bagger by the pretty lady to storm back with a huge five bagger and turkey to win 243-241. Tracy was third with fine bowling and \$200. Paul was off to the title game vs top seed, Conway. The title game was on. John elected to have Paul lead off and he did with a turkey, split the fourth frame and John just couldn’t carry on the right lane. Paul then found the line with a huge four bagger and a 222/232-196/213 win. His first ABTA title, and most deservedly so! Paul is a great guy who has bowled with us the past 1 1/2 yrs and finally got a title. He is glad of the Super Senior program that we have :-)

A very affable fellow. He is well-liked by all in our club. Congrats Paul!

Great bowling by one for the good guys, John Conway who almost won his first title. Tracy Cueto bowled awesome in third also!

ABTA Notes: Tourney Hi Qualifiers were Brian Reyes (men) +172, and the pretty cosmetologist Roe Estes who led the ladies at +103. They will get paid entries to our next regular event.

The 3-6-9 was worth a big \$1,700. Alan “the Dragon” Aguilar eliminated the field and then missed on the first shot. We

will go for \$1,800 this Saturday at Cal Bowl in the 3-6-9. That’s \$50 per ball for the Dragon! :-)

The Match Series was UNmatched as Brian Reyes drew a 551. Was worth a \$832. We will estimate the Match Series to be \$1,200 this week. For only a \$2.00 entry fee.

The Match Game worth \$1,080. Matched by four of our fine bowlers Steven Hower, Belinda Crowder, Roger Wrase and Marvyn Galsim. They got a nice \$270 each. We will estimate a \$1,200 Match game Saturday.

“I work Thursday through Monday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., about 7-8 hours each day. Dealing poker is a little different from the other pit games, like blackjack. We spend 30 minutes at each table, dealing anywhere from two to four tables in a row, even five tables, if we’re really busy.

“I enjoy dealing poker,” said Hammel, who also likes playing the game as a hobby. “Sometimes, you feel bad when you put a bad beat (or cards) on someone. But that’s poker.

“I also like dealing because they (the players) throw a lot of cash at you (in the form of tokens, or tips). The biggest tip I got was \$100 after I dealt a man a royal flush. He had it on the flop (in Texas Hold ‘Em), so there was no way he could lose the pot. Plus, our (poker) room pays a bonus of \$1,000 for royals. He (the player) was down about \$600 that day, so he was happy to get his money back, and then some.

“Poker dealers keep their own tips, not like the blackjack dealers who usually share their tips.”

Asked if she had come down from Cloud 9 yet since winning the Golden Ladies Classic, Hammel replied, “I’m not sure about Cloud 9, but I’m still bowling well. I’ve had so many people congratulate me. I even got a call from my friend, Jim Myers, from the San Diego area, who followed up by sending me a nice card a couple of days later.”

When Hammel was asked how she was going to celebrate after her big victory, she said, at that time, she wasn’t sure. It turns out that she and hubby Mark went out to their favorite Sushi bar and “had a great dinner.”

Hammel says she’ll keep her game sharp this summer by bowling in the Wild Dog Scratch Singles, “a tough-shot league,” at the Gold Coast, a sister center to The Orleans. Hammel is currently bowling at The Orleans in Jeanette’s Scratch Trios, in which she’s averaging 214.

Southern Californian will remember Hammel because she used to compete regularly in the WWPB (Western Women Pro Bowlers) events when she lived in Whittier. She was known as Char Ford in those days, before she was married to Mark Hammel, who owned and operated a pro shop (at Canoga Park Bowl, I believe).

“I miss bowling the WWPB’s,” Hammel said, “because I work every weekend. I might try to bowl in November at Mission Hills Bowl (in Bill Mossontte’s annual WWPB Mixed Doubles), if I can get the weekend off. It’s always such a great tournament.

“The next MoRich Mixed Doubles at The Orleans is a possibility, depending on the days of the week it runs.”

And, of course, Hammel definitely plans to defend her newly won title in next year’s Golden Ladies Classic. “I haven’t sent in my entry yet, but my reservation is in,” she said.

How did you get started in bowling? I asked Hammel.
“I started when I was 25-ish, in a Vacation League at La Puente Lanes in La Puente (near Whittier),” Hammel replied. “The center is long gone, of course. At the end of the league, everyone went on a cruise to the Caribbean.

“I bowled three or four years on Sunday nights in that league, and every year we went to a new (vacation) destination. Then I started to get the bug to become a better bowler. I took a lot of lessons from several coaches. But my best coach became my husband and best friend-Mark. We were blessed that bowling brought us together.

“Mark has always been so supportive. He let me follow my dreams, to bowl on (the PWBA) tour, even though it was not profitable.

“Mark is always honest with me, no sugar coating. Sometimes, we (the bowlers) like to blame the lanes, the ball, or maybe a bird that just flew by. But if Mark thinks it was because of my execution, he lets me know.

“I’m not aggressive by nature, so I have to work at staying aggressive (on the lanes). It was really fun to bowl an entire tournament (the GLC) and have Mark there to share and enjoy how well I bowled, even with the many ups and downs of the tournament. What a great time it was! It was also great to have some friends there (at The Orleans) supporting me too.”

Hammel also had some nice words about the Golden Ladies Classic. “Jeanette founded a great tournament,” Hammel said. “Jeanette has so much fire in her. She can’t wait to get back competing again (following an auto accident in January). I don’t know where she gets the energy.

“Nothing would make me happier than to see Jeanette bowling again in next year’s GLC. She is a very special person.”

Speaking of Jeanette Robinson, the renowned Hall of Famer is already working to make the 2007 Golden Ladies Classic bigger and better than ever.

The GLC has had its growing pains ever since 1991, when Jeanette hosted the inaugural event at the old Showboat Bowling Center. At that time, there were 40 entrants.

Since then, that number has grown slowly, adding a few more entries each year. At the recent GLC, there were 75 ladies at The Orleans. Jeanette says she’s shooting for “a total of at least 100 next year.”

Reaching that optimistic figure should not be a surprise to any-

one as the GLC is one of the finest tournaments around. Entry fees are \$150 per bowler- and all of it goes directly into the prize fund. And, even though there are tournament expenses, more money is added to the prize fund because of monetary donations from The Orleans and GLC cosponsor Storm Products. It’s one of the best bargains in bowling.

Dates for GLC ’07 have been set for March 5-8. Official entry forms will be available after the first of September. Tournament reservations, however, are now being accepted gladly by Jeanette. Call her at 1-888-365-7111, Ext. 6442. That’s also the number to call if you have any questions about the GLC. “I’ve already had several requests from new people regarding next year’s tournament,” Jeannette says.

As before, there will be two divisions: Ages 50-59 and Super Seniors 60 & Up. First place is guaranteed to be \$2,000, but will grow depending upon the number of entries. (For example, Char Hammel received \$2,225 when she won in March.)

FINAL ITEM: Brad Edelman, the brains behind those lucrative High Roller tournaments, took umbrage with me about something this scribe wrote in his last column. All I said was that Steve Sanders’ Super Bowl Mini Eliminator at The Orleans was “the biggest and best” of four megabuck tournaments being contested that week in Las Vegas. That was my opinion because I spent virtually all my time at the Mini Eliminator. I had no final figures to compare that tournament with the Super Bowl High Roller, which was held at Sam’s Town. It was simply my opinion. Edelman, on the other hand, says his High Roller was the biggest and best megabuck tournament. Well, that’s his opinion. I’m sure that, if you asked the other promoters, they’d say that their tournament was “the biggest and the best.” And shame on them if they didn’t think that way.



Changes Will Help Meet Demand For USBC Junior Gold Championships

GREENDALE, Wis.—Due to increased demand, the United States Bowling Congress Junior Gold Championships will undergo several changes for the 2007 event, including a new schedule that will allow for even more participants.

With a sell-out field already slated for the 2006 event in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., the 2007 tournament in Buffalo, N.Y., will accommodate nearly 300 more bowlers.

Instead of having three consecutive days of qualifying, the three six-game blocks will be spread out over four days, giving each bowler one off day during the qualifying period. The change allows for 1,728 participants in Buffalo versus 1,458 in Fort Lauderdale.

"It's very important that we continue to let this event grow," USBC Chief Tournament Officer Roseann Kuhn said. "This schedule change allows us to accommodate even more of the top youth bowlers in the country."

One out of every seven entrants will receive a scholarship with the top 96 boys and 48 girls advancing from qualifying to bowl six more games before the field is cut to the top 32 boys and 32 girls who will bowl a final six games.

The top five boys and girls will earn automatic spots on USBC Junior Team USA. The National Selection Committee will choose three more boys and girls from the final 32 to round out Junior Team USA.

AMF Thruway Lanes will serve as the host center for the 2007 event. Qualifying will also take place at Transit Lanes and AMF Airport Lanes.

Held on USBC Sport Bowling lane conditions, the Junior Gold Championships, which is an individual competition, is the largest youth event in the country.

USBC Youth members who average 175 or better (boys) or 165 or better (girls) and who are members of the USBC Junior Gold program are eligible to qualify to advance to the Championships.

Let’s Hear It For John Brunswick!

LAKE FOREST— In 1845, John Brunswick built his first or-nate billiard table in Cincinnati, Ohio. It was built for America’s elite. Coming from Europe’s Rhine Valley, more German than Swiss, young Brunswick came as a woodworker journeyman.

First he was a carriagemaker, then any job where they used a saw and hammer. He’d say, if it is make of wood, I can make it; later added broker/sales skills. He took advantage of the fact America was fast becoming sports minded; English made tables were popular catching Brunswick’s eyes.

French aristocrats found billiards. The “in” game picked up by other European “swells” particularly the English where the words “snooker” and “english” were popularized.

Charles Goodyear “invented” a usable substance in 1839. A Brunswick chemical engineer discovered if you mixed sulfur with Goodyear’s rubber it created a lively cushion. Before that most tables used cushions made of dipped fabric nailed to the rails.

Old John, was a super salesman, craftsman, a judge of those near-do-well pioneers, they would buy his quality products.

He also knew to be successful you had to have worthy/faithful skilled employees.

A visit to Forest Lanes, any pool player will instantly recognize the quality in the center’s three brand new nine-foot Aranith Brunswick tables.

John introduced New England slate for beds fitted into the finest oak and maple frames, fastened with USA hardware.

Some are still in use.

The tables at Forest Lanes has the best, slate from the Far East, wood from Brazil and fasteners from the USA.

The cushions strongs, 18-feet of uniform bounce and the table covered with stain proof Inan Simonis Cloth. Overhead Bud Light shades.

John Brunswick’s dream is here to admire — come on over, pay a visit. The 40-lane center is a state of the bowling art.


