PBA50 Competitor David Williams Jr. Dies In Car Accident

IOWA CITY, Iowa – The Professional Bowlers Association learned that David Williams Jr., 53, of Omaha, Nebraska, has died of injuries sustained in an automobile accident Thursday while on his way to compete in the opening tournament of the PBA50 Tour season in Clearwater, Florida.

Williams, a double lung transplant recipient, was a 27-year member of the PBA who had won two PBA Regional tournament titles and a PBA50 Regional title in Council Bluffs, Iowa, in 2016. After being diagnosed with sarcoidosis, an incurable hereditary form of lung cancer, Williams continued to bowl – commonly with an oxygen tank at his side to assist his breathing between shots.

Williams underwent his double lung transplant at the University of Iowa hospital in Iowa City on March 29, 2018, and less than a

year later – on March 10, 2019 – he finished third in a Pre-Tournament Qualifier to earn a berth in the PBA's 10th anniversary World Series of Bowling in suburban Detroit.

Williams [told the story](#) of his battles and determination to continue competing to Bowlers Journal International editor Gianmarc Manzione just a week before his fatal accident.

Details regarding the accident were not immediately available although Williams' wife Sheri had announced on her Facebook page Thursday that he was hospitalized in a coma in Iowa City where he died later in the day.

Information regarding services will be announced later.

Freak Accident Hinders Jason Belmonte's Dominant Season

A freak accident during a youth bowling event prior to the USBC Masters has played a hand – no pun intended – in slowing Jason Belmonte's dominating season in 2019, including his bid for a 12th major championship in the Masters, an event he had previously won a record four times.

As told to FloBowling senior editor Lucas Wiseman, the 35-year-old Australian two-handed player explained his injury:

"I had my hand in a ball, and I was giving some of the kids a tip," Belmonte said. "As I swung the ball back with one hand, one of the fellas was holding his ball, and he had moved a little bit. So, when I swung it back, my finger in the ball got jammed into the ball the young fella was holding.

As soon as I did it, it split open and started bleeding and the bruising and swelling came up pretty quick."

The cut, across the crease below his fingertip on his middle finger, and the bruising and swelling accompanying the injury, forced Belmonte to bowl using only his ring and little fingers to grip the ball – something he said he had "never done before."

The result was a 194.73 average for his 15 qualifying games in the Masters and a 169th-place finish – well below the cut line.

Belmonte was hoping for rapid healing before his next major test – a Round of 16 match against fellow two-hander Kyle Troup in the inaugural PBA Playoffs. Belmonte was the runaway top qualifier for the Playoffs, earning a first-round



bye, and will face Troup – who eliminated PBA Hall of Famer Chris Barnes in his opening Round of 24

match – in a Round of 16 match that will air on Monday, April 22, at 6 p.m. on FS1.

REDLANDS – Joseph DeLaTorre is currently the top senior left handed bowler in Redlands. In two senior leagues at EMPIRE BOWL he is currently averaging 220 and has averaged near 230 at times.

Joseph is involved in every aspect of bowling. He is a bowling inventor, with a United States Patent on a new automated channel pin sweep. His invention has caught the attention of several investors including some from China and a PBA star.

Joseph is also a bowling coach. He coaches youth bowlers at Empire Bowl and gives private lessons on a regular basis. As a PBA member Joseph's knowledge of the sport is extensive.

Most of all Joseph is known for his bowling. He is a smoothie, the smoothest left-hander I have ever seen on the lanes in this area. He is the left-handed

version of David Ozio, the smoothest PBA bowler ever to roll a bowling ball.

Recently, Joseph was awarded a 299 award by TERRY LANKSTER on behalf of THE NATIONAL BOWLING ASSOCIATION (TNBA). Joseph's near perfect game was rolled in the Noonlighters League at Empire Bowl, a TNBA sanctioned league.

I recommend bowlers check out the TNBA. Membership is open to all bowlers for about \$25 a season and league sanction fees are just five dollars. TNBA is recognized by the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) and TNBA members are required to be USBC members.

Congratulations to Joseph for his outstanding bowling and thank you to the BOWLING NEWS for recognizing the accomplishments of our CALIFORNIA senior bowlers.

Fast and Furious – That’s Craig Allmon

WINNETKA – Craig Allmon is your typical bowler.

He doesn’t practice.

Or as he puts it, he practices three games every week – the night he bowls in his River Maniacs League on Monday nights at Winnetka Bowl.

“I’ve been bowling once a week for 18 years,” says the 53-year-old Allmon,



Practice or no practice, Allmon enjoyed a special night March 18 – smashing a 265 in his first game, a whopping 107 pins above his book average. That translated into a stratospheric 320 with handicap. Furthermore, Allmon tallied his first 600 series (265-156-188), finishing with a 609.

Allmon called the 265 the biggest highlight of his bowling career, but a 600 series had been a longtime goal. “It took a long time,” Allmon said. “Took 18 years to do it.”

His dual highlights were celebrated by his teammates, which included area superstar and teammate Johnnie Englehart. “Awesome,” was the way Englehart described his teammate’s performance, particularly Allmon’s first game.

Allmon also got a great reception when he returned to his Winnetka house. “I came home and told my wife [Leslee] and she smiled and said, ‘Good for you. Take a shower and go to bed. You have to get up early,’ ” Allmon recounted with a laugh.

In his 265, the right-handed Allmon crushed 10 strikes, including nine in a row, starting with the third frame. His style is somewhat unorthodox; Allmon fires fastballs, mostly straight shots, with a bit of a hook at the end.

It may not be conventional, but Englehart said, “Anytime you throw nine strikes in a row, you don’t do it by accident.”

Allmon said at one time in his career, he threw the ball a blistering 25 m.p.h. or so, but he has since toned it down. “My goal was to break a pin,” he joked.

Allmon knows where he got his bowling genes. His dad, Tommy Joe Allmon, was a terrific bowler out of San Antonio, Tex., who averaged 261 one year, Allmon says.

For now, Allmon says he will maintain his speedy delivery. “I throw it too fast but when I try to slow it down, I screw it up,” he says.

That was definitely not the case during his 600 series.

Imperial Valley USBC City Tournament

EL CENTRO – Long time teammates Derek Murray and James Gray earned a pair of victories in the Imperial Valley USBC City Open Tournament held at Strikezone here. Murray and Gray took the doubles portion and teamed with Ceazer Moore and Danny Chin in the team competition during the Imperial Valley USBC sanctioned event.

Gray (196-225-189 for 610 series) bowled in a second team competition and joined Nunez (206-279-236 for 739), Oscar Grijalva (223-205-265 for 714) and Matt Gray (191-177-235 for 687) to take second overall with a 2,750 handicapped score.

The quartet of Josh Thornburg (191-224-215 for 630 scratch series), Carl Danesi (214-216-237 for 667), John Whitehead (187-210-182 for 579) and Granados (193-195-236 for 624) finished third with a handicap score of 2,725.

James Gray bowled a perfect 300 game to help win the doubles competition along with Murray. Gray posted games of 237-221-300 for a 758 series and Murray chipped in with a 216-259-214 and 689 series for a doubles total of 1,447 to win by a narrow margin of 3 pins. Impressive when neither had a handicap and were bowling scratch.

The husband and wife team of Erica and Dan Stauff finished a close second with 1,444 pins. Erica bowled a 683 handicap series on scratch games of 140-202-149. Dan started with a sparkling 275, over 100 pins above his average, and added a 171-201 for a handicap series of 761.

The father-son tandem of Richard Granados and Richard Granados Jr. took third in doubles. Richard Jr began with a spectacular 239, over 100 pins above average, and followed with a 210 and 170 for a handicap total of 856. Richard added 151-154-182 to a doubles total of 1,442 pins.

David Granados had a solid handicap series of 750 to take the singles competition. His scratch games of 246-232-239-edged runner-up Johnny Urrutia's 203-210-279 for a 743 score. Mike Reyla rolled a terrific 289 scratch game and scored third (211-289-215) for a score of 739.

In tallying all events in the tournament, Nunez took top honors. His 740 in doubles, 721 in team and a singles score of 687 totaled up to 2,202 in handicap play. Murray was runner-up with a trio of scratch series of 803-653-689 and a 2,145 total. Grijalva was a close third with series of 793-647-630 for a total of 2,133.

EL CENTRO – A last minute decision to double up paid off in dividends for Lori Vanoni and Shelby Ayersman as they took the Doubles competition at the annual El Centro City Championships at the Strikezone Imperial Valley. Vanoni and Ayersman topped the Singles class to complete a very successful weekend.

The tournament was played over a two-weekend span and sanctioned by the Imperial Valley USBC.

The ladies split a 1,381 doubles handicapped score as evenly as possible with Ayersman posting a 691 (170-177-188) handicapped series, while Vanoni had a 690 series (151-223-193) to take top honors in Doubles.

Elba Partida teamed with Theresa Reyla to get second. Partida had a 735 series (167-233-179) with Reyla's 610 series (138-143-143) to total 1,345. Debbie Angulo's 675 (181-201-179) went along with Toni Stauff's 660 (195-142-170) to earn the third placing.

Vanoni was above average in all three games to take the Singles division, scoring scratch games of 178-199-206 for a handicapped total of 706. This narrowly edged Ayersman's 696 series with scores of 188-155-197. Bebe Pacheco took third with a 653 series (157-173-152).

In the team competition, Partida and Reyla teamed with Elisa Garcia and Martha Soto to take first prize with a 2,566 total. Partida led the team with a 696 series (204-174-162) with Reyla adding a 635 (148-144-157), Soto notching a 620 series (123-175-142) and Garcia's 615 (125-148-141).

The team of Tuesday Verbrugh (158-135-220 for 684), Roberta Dale (147-190-184 for 653), Patsy Robinson (176-158-172 for 614) and Rita Noden (124-136-135 for 599) took runner up. Third place was taken by Connie Arredondo with a 659 (107-128-142), Ananice Bush's 658 (177-213-127), Teri Woodruff's 617 (136-155-152) and Maria Grijalva with a 606 (181-116-183).

Partida bowled consistent enough in all three categories to take the All Events title. Her total of 2,074 (series of 540-579-487) outdistanced Verbrugh's 1,977 total (513-469-482) and Toni Stauff's 1,965 (510-507-489).

FOX VIEWERSHIP, SOCIAL MEDIA IMPRESSIONS CONTINUE TO IMPRESS

The PBA Tour’s historic television package with FOX Sports and its social media impact, boosted by its new relationship with FloSports, continue to show impressive gains in 2019.

During the recently-completed PBA World Series of Bowling X, highlighted by live or first-run WSOB events on FS1 for five consecutive nights in late March plus multiple re-airs throughout the week, PBA competition was watched by 3,106,000 viewers on FS1 or FS2.

To date, 15,583,000 viewers have tuned-in to watch the PBA on FOX, FS1 or FS2 in 2019, including repeats. That’s 43 percent higher than the total audience for PBA telecasts during the entire 2018 season (10,907,000). In addition to FOX coverage, FloBowling streamed more than 50 hours of WSOB X coverage, including exciting elimination match play rounds during a week FloSports said had the most bowling fan viewership traffic to date.

At the same time, PBA’s social media and web site traffic continues to set records, rolling along at a pace that approached 70 million impressions across its Facebook, Twitter and Instagram accounts during the first three months of the year.

It was due to history being made on the lanes with Jason Belmonte’s 11th major victory in a thrilling climactic title match in the PBA World Championship; Kris Prather winning his first title; Dick Allen winning his second title of the year and The World team captained by Amleto Monacelli again shining the spotlight on the PBA’s powerful base of global stars. Rising talents including Kyle Sherman, AJ Chapman and others served notice that many styles of players can achieve success across the multiple challenging patterns and conditions PBA Tour competition presents. The inaugural FOX Sports season now moves into the highly-anticipated PBA Playoffs that will include eight consecutive Monday night prime-time telecasts on FS1 April 8 through May 27 leading into the live FOX semifinal and final rounds on Saturday and Sun., June 1-2.



FloBowling To Broadcast Teen Masters This Summer

The best high school bowlers in the country will be showcased this summer when the 2019 Teen Masters will be broadcast live on FloBowling.

With a history dating back to 1997 when PBA champion Mike Fagan was the first boys champion, the Teen Masters offers high school bowlers the chance to compete for a championship on a level playing field that rewards hard work, organizer Gary Beck said.

The event will take place June 29-July 5 at Sawgrass Lanes in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

“As a personal subscriber, I am thrilled to bring FloBowling’s outstanding coverage to the 2019 Teen Masters Championships,” Beck said. “Family and friends at home will be able to watch their favorite teen bowlers online the same as if they were on the PBA Tour.”

Last year’s Teen Masters took place in Las Vegas at the South Point Hotel and Casino and three of the defending champions will be back in 2019.

Girls varsity champion Jenna Williams, girls junior varsity winner Jillian Martin and boys junior varsity champion Brandon Bohn will return. Boys varsity champion Tom Hankey Jr. has moved on to the college level and is enrolled at Webber International.



KRIS PRATHER, ANDREW ANDERSON JOIN ELITE FIELD FOR 2019 BARBASOL PBA TOUR FINALS

LAS VEGAS – Two of the Go Bowling! PBA Tour’s hottest young players – Kris Prather of Plainfield, Ill., and 2018 PBA Player of the Year Andrew Anderson of Holly, Mich., will make their debuts in the elite eight-player Barbasol PBA Tour Finals field in July.

The Barbasol PBA Tour Finals, presented by Red Rock Casino, Resort & Spa, will take place at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas and will be televised live by CBS Sports Network over a span five shows (two on Saturday, July 20 and three on Sunday, July 21). Prather, who won his first PBA Tour title in the 2019 Scorpion Championship during PBA World Series of Bowling X, has made eight championship round appearances during the past two seasons while Anderson used his break-through campaign in 2018 to build his two-year competition points total and break into the eight-man PBA Tour Finals field.

Australia’s Jason Belmonte, the PBA Tour Finals defending champion, was leader in the competition points race to qualify for 2019 after he accumulated 46,700 points in Go Bowling! PBA Tour competition over the past two seasons. The two-year points race ended with the USBC Masters on April 1.

Also qualifying for the 2019 Tour Finals are Masters champion Jakob Butturff, Tempe, Ariz. (40,267 points); Anthony Simonsen, Little Elm, Texas (38,919); EJ Tackett, Bluffton, Ind. (37,919); Prather (31,266); Anderson (30,983); Marshall Kent, Yakima, Wash. (29,447), and Bill O’Neill, Langhorne, Pa. (28,937). Prather and Anderson replace Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., and Dom Barrett of England, who finished ninth and 10th, respectively. Rash and Barrett both bowled in the 2017 and ’18 Tour Finals. New centers, new surfaces, new balls, new champions---lots to write about in 1989.

- Gold Mark Trading Stamps issued their first special commemorative stamp with Glenn Allison's signature and 900. Later on, you could get your own stamp!
- Dodee Kuntz was named SEDBA "Secretary of the Year" for 1989.
- Jess Stayrook, San Diego, won his first PBA title.
- Columnist John Jowdy was all over the ABC for rejecting Allison's 900 on the "grounds of illegal lane conditions." The "900" battle has continued...even in 2019!!!
- The WIBC paid out \$819,427 to tournament cashers.
- **Rowland Bowl** had a one million dollar re-model (in the middle of Womens State Tournament) and got a name change to **Colima Lanes**.
- The July 3 issue showed new co-publishers of the Bowling News, Charles Kinstler and Carol Mancini. Ken and RoseAnne Lowman retired to Las Vegas. Lillian Oak remained as Advertising Manager (and retired in 2019.) We received all the back issues from 1940! In 2004 the Corderman's- Owners of Pacific Bowler- retired, leaving Southern California to the Bowling News.
- The High Roller drew 1583 entries at the **Showboat**. Mike Kuttich of San Diego collected \$100,000 for second place. A limo driver from New York banked \$200,000!
- Chris Schenkel won the BPAA "Man of the Year" award for his contribution to bowling. (When the "Tour" came to town, Chris was the person the fans wanted to see and talk to. The Pros were too busy!)

Players Clean Up at Bowling Centers

WINNETKA – Bob Adams has a ritual that he performs before every shot.

He cleans his bowling ball.

After meticulously wiping the oil off his ball with his spiffy Storm towel, Adams is then primed to bowl. And he knows what he's doing. Adams, a top bowler, is known as the "Sparemeister" because he has often finished games with spares in every frame. So, his fussiness with an oil-free ball merits considerable scrutiny.

"It keeps the ball from sliding and holds the line better," says Adams about his toweling off the oil. "Everybody does it."

So, do bowlers need to frequently wipe the oil off their bowling ball to prevent their shots from wavering off course?

That question apparently is up for debate.

Elite bowler Johnnie Englehart suggests that removing the oil from one's ball is generally overrated. He says if there's a "smudge on the ball, I'll see that I'll wipe that off."

But he says, overall, bowlers' fixation with cleaning the oil off their ball "is wasted energy, to be honest."

Englehart says the aggressive nature of high-performance bowling balls keeps the oil residue from having little effect.

Englehart averages over 240 so if there's any oil buildup on his ball, it doesn't seem to bother him. "I have [cleaned bowling balls] in the past, but I've gotten away from it," says Englehart, who has bowled for more than 50 years.

Then there's upstart Justin Pluchino, perhaps the most talented young bowler in the area.

Pluchino says he does pay attention to the excess oil on his bowling ball. "I [clean] it every six games," he said. "I wipe it down and give it a good polish."

So what does this all mean – when three talented bowlers use different regimens but they're all successful?

Pluchino seemed to sum it up: "It's all personal preference."

- Carl Malucci won 6 months free bowling at **Friendly Hills** for his 300 game. He has eight sanctioned to date.
- Non-smiley Doug Johnson was pictured receiving a \$700 check from Jack Pennington for his Western Senior Bowlers Tour win.
- The "lane dressing" mystery continued. Meeting after meeting of "experts" was held. NEVER-NEVER-EVER was there a solution to the problem. Was there too much oil? Not enough? Wrong oil? Dirty lanes? Weather? Ball surfaces? 30 years later- 2019- every center is faced with the same situation!!! If there are 8,000 lanes in the U.S. there are 8000 different lane "conditions"!!! Oops- fell off my soap-box.
- Joe Coleman tried his "darness" to run a Coleman Classics, a scratch tournament. A nice guy but didn't have the knack for tournament play. He went bye-bye.
- Connie Marchione was inducted into the National Deaf Bowlers Hall of Fame.
- The manager at **Mission Hills Bowl** offered \$25,000 to anyone who rolled a 300 game in either the Kings and Queens or Majors leagues during the season, a total of \$50,000. If more than one, it would be divided.
- Close your eyes and imagine this: the **Showboat** hosted the National Deaf Tournament. 1,100 deaf bowlers from 11 different countries competed in total silence! Only the sounds of the balls rolling and pins falling echoes in the giant center. Connie Marchione- I loved you then and I love you now.
- **San Gabriel Lanes** announced in an ad new ownership and management....but no names!
- Within 3 weeks of the **Mission Hills** offer of \$25,000 for a 300, 3 bowlers chalked up the big one! How many by the end of the league? Maybe we will find out later on.
- The Bowling News got a fax machine!
- Frank Keitz averaged 100 pictures per week. All were developed, checked, captions written and best chosen for print. Year after year after year.
- Another "What the?" Full page ad from **Azusa Bowl** shouted New management and staff- No names attached.
- Lloyd Stone held the office of Secretary of Southeast District Jr Bowling Assn.
- Sweet little Better Goulding (in her white high heels) held tight reigns at **Clark Center**. She soon became one of Frank Kietz favorite subjects.
- For sale-1967 V.W. Bug. Bargain price \$4,000. Only 22 years old, clean and runs well.
- Ron Staub made a big ABTA haul in Vegas. Besides the \$5,000 first place money, he was presented a four foot tall marble and gold trophy. (Every trophy should come with a feather duster.)
- The Long Beach V.A. Medical Center requested a "green-house" when asked by the B.V.L. Chairman what they would like. It was built! Added around it was over 100 fruit trees, shrubs, and vines. 50 patients saw to the care and feeding. California bowlers raised \$260,000 for California Veterans use!!!
- What happened to trip leagues??! **Cerritos Lanes** offered Bahamas, Acapulco, and Cancun. In 2019 its Vegas!
- Attention- "For Sale- A GILMAC" What the.....??? Other items offered in August, 1989; Beatle Records, Beatles Memorabilia, Offset Press, 1976 Motorhome, 1985 Honda Aspencade, 1967 VW Bug. Bowlers would sell anything except their equipment.
- Top bowlers in the Southeast District making the Gary Kowarsch "Bowlers of the Year" list included Jim Todd (averages 231), Gip Lentine (216), Steve Ritchie (213), Dan Roche (213), and Mike Mellick (212).
- Paula Vidad was WWPB Champ in Sacramento!

All these facts and figures were found on the yellowed pages of the 1989 issue. Next time, (maybe even next week) I start on September 1, 1989. What will pop up? If you are a bowler...been around a while...it might be about you!

Malott, Svensson Take Advantage of Misfortunes to Advance in PBA Playoffs

Round of 16 competition begins Monday, April 22 at 6 p.m. on FS1



PORTLAND, MAINE – Ten-time PBA Tour winner Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, and seven-time titlist Jesper Svensson of Sweden took advantage of 10th-frame misfortunes by their opponents to advance to the Round of 16 in the inaugural PBA Playoffs at Bayside Bowl.

Malott, the No. 15 seed, and Svensson, No. 23, along with No. 11 Kyle Sherman of O’Fallon, Missouri, and seven-time Tour winner and No. 14 seed Dom Barrett of England, won their Round of 24 single-game elimination matches, that aired on FS1 Monday to advance to the Round of 16 where they will join four earlier winners – three-time Tour titlist Andres Gomez of Colombia; six-time titlist Rhino Page of Orlando, Fla.; three-time winner Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, North Carolina, and 2019 Scorpion Championship winner Kris Prather of Plainfield, Illinois.

The winner of the Playoffs, which features the top 24 players in competition points after the first 13 Go Bowling! PBA Tour tournaments of the season, will earn a \$100,000 first prize.

Malott won his match against No. 18 qualifier three-time tour winner Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Arizona, when Blanchard – needing a nine-count on his fill ball in the 10th frame to win – threw the ball wide leaving the 1-2-4 to lose the match, 212-211.

“My heart goes out to Josh, but we’ve all been there and I know how he feels,” said Malott. “Even though I hated it for Josh, I still felt like I deserved to win because I fought hard to put the pressure on him to get back in the match.

“At the start of the match I was way too quick,” Malott said of his slow start in the match. “With the electric atmosphere here it’s easy to get too pumped up, so I had to calm down. I’m just glad I was able to do what I had to do to get back in the match.”

Svensson won his match against No. 10 seed four-time tour winner Marshall Kent of Yakima, Washington, 206-190 but was also aided in his win by Kent. Holding a five-pin lead heading into the 10th frame, Kent, who missed a 10 pin earlier in the match, left a 4-9 split on his first shot and was unable to convert. Svensson, a left-handed two-hander, took advantage, closing the game with three strikes for the win.

In the other two Round of 24 matches, Barrett, a seven-time tour winner, handily won his match against No. 19 Brad Miller of Lees Summit, Missouri, 237-187, and Sherman won his match against No. 22 DJ Archer of Spring, Texas, 203-182, to also advance to the Round of 16.

Round of 16 and Round of 8 matches will be televised by FS1 on consecutive Monday nights at 9 p.m. ET beginning April 22, reducing the field to four survivors who will return to Portland for the semifinal and final rounds June 1-2, with both shows airing live on FOX at noon Eastern.

The format for the Rounds of 16 and 8 will change to a Race to 2 Points format where each game won is worth one point. If the players split the first two games, a ninth and 10th frame tie-breaker will be used to award the deciding point. The eight Round of 24 winners will take on the top eight Playoffs qualifiers – Jason Belmonte, Jakob Butturff, Norm Duke, Anthony Simonsen, EJ Tackett, Sean Rash, Bill O’Neill and Tom Daugherty – who earned byes to automatically advance to the Round of 16.

SYSCO BEATS CENTURY 21 TO TAKE OVER TOP SEED

DOWNEY – The fifth round of the Brunswick Invitational could be considered the truest test for a team. It is an eight week round that utilizes all four of the lane conditions used throughout the season. A team cannot specialize in one pattern and be successful in the fifth round. In addition to that, the pressure is maximized because it is the final chance a team has to get into the playoffs at the end of the season. And, for the round winners, it is an eight week grind of only bowling against other round winners in a battle for seeding in the playoffs. With each bye a team can earn in the stepladder, there is a significant amount of money made, so these eight weeks are critical for those teams. No soft draws, or easy wins down the stretch for these teams.

Monday night marked the second of eight weeks in this round, and the lane condition that was drawn was the USBC Nationals pattern that was used during the fourth round.

The feature match on this week was **J.A.T.** against **Captain Morgan**. J.A.T. swept all five games last week to grab the early lead for the round. Captain Morgan was one of six teams that sat at 4-1, and got the top spot based on total pins. Game one went to Captain Morgan, 828-788. David Schiada topped the scoring for Captain Morgan with a 233, followed by Ramiro Garcia with 221. Game two also went to Captain Morgan, as they opened up a lead of more than 100 pins for totals. In that second game, anchor Joe Jimenez led the way with 252. In the final game, J.A.T. used a steady team effort to post a winning score of 794. Three of the four bowlers for J.A.T were over 210 in the finale, led by Kevin Valmonte's 213. For series, Schiada topped the pair with 630.

Tito's Handmade Vodka and **Professional Approach** were both coming off 4-1 wins last week and squared on against each other on the second pair. Game one went to Tito's, and in a big way. Tito's grabbed an early lead of 117 pins for totals with the win. Will Hinckley led the way with 245 and was followed by Juan Zavala with 218. The Professional Approach team came back to win the second, but only cut the lead for totals by 18 pins, leaving Tito's in control. The final game also went to Professional Approach. Vernon Adams topped the team with 226. Arnold Cheesman added a 203. The win in the final game was by close to 60 pins, but far short of the lead that Tito's had for totals. Tito's takes the match, 3-2, based on the big first game. Will Hinckley fell off dramatically in the final game and still led the pair by almost 40 pins with his 245-235/643 set.

Eric Snow shot a 244/621 to lead **3 Olives Vodka** to a 4-1 win over **Linder's Insurance**. 3 Olives won the first game and the last game by over 100 pins, but Linder's managed to take the middle game of the set. With the four wins, 3 Olives joins Captain Morgan at 8-2 for the round. Those two teams will battle it out on the top pair in next week's matches.

Herzog Insurance and **Forest Lanes** both had mediocre weeks on the first

night of the round and drew each other on this night. Forest took three out of five games in this match leaving both of them in the middle of the pack at 5-5. Nacho Vega of Herzog Insurance led the pair with a 269/673 set, although it was only good for the two wins. Jonathan Gale was clean in 29 of 30 frames on his way to a 231/622.

Bowling Guys rebounded from a 1-4 start to sweep past **Threadworks** and improve to 6-4 for the round. Threadworks falls to 1-9 and will have to get very hot in a hurry to get back into the running. Brandon Grant was subbing for Bowling Guys and topped the pair by more than 50 pins with his 212/616 series.

Keystone Lanes evened their record at 5-5 after beating **DV8** 4-1 in their match. Herbert Jones led the way for Keystone Lanes with a 215-215-232/662 set. Mike Calvillo helped out with 231/599. For DV8, they fall to a disappointing 2-8 for the round. They did win the final game of the night, as Raul Rosales put together eleven in a row for 297.

Bowlum swept all five games in their match against **Don Julio Tequila**. Danny Wilson and Billy Myers Jr. both broke the 600 mark for Bowlum. Wilson had 236/616, while Myers had 241/602.

As for the round winners, the top pair saw **Century 21—PEAK** take on **Sysco**. Century 21 started the night as the top seed with a two-game lead over the Sysco team. In the first game of the match, Century 21 scratched out a four pin win behind a 233 effort from Jon Huff. Game two was almost as close, falling in favor of Sysco this time to even the match. Paul Barraco topped Sysco with 212 to lead them to the win. In the final game, Sysco again came out on top and won totals by 51 pins, giving them a 4-1 win in the match. With the four wins, Sysco vaulted past Century 21 into the top spot on the board by a single game. Sysco's Gabriel Martinez topped the pair, shooting 236/632.

There was another change in the standings amongst the round winners as **Cal Bowl** swept all five games from **Buddy's Bowling Supply** to move up to third place. Now with 90 wins, Cal Bowl is only 3 ½ games behind the top seeded Sysco. Buddy's was actually in the running for the first and third games, but all fell in favor of Cal Bowl. Ramsey Basurto of Buddy's led the scoring for the pair with 222-226/608. Carl Labayan led Cal Bowl for the night with 227/578.

The first sidepot of the night was won by Gabriel Martinez and his 235 game. In the middle game, Herbert Jones came up on top with 215. The third game super pot went to Raul Rosales and his 297. Raul earned \$144 in the super pot.

The Financial Advisors Pot paid \$185 to Joe Jimenez for his 252 game. Will Hinckley earned \$100 for his runner up score of 235.

The long oil of the third round will be on the lanes next Monday night. Give us a visit at Del Rio Lanes on Florence Avenue in Downey. The action begins at 8:30 p.m.
