BAKERSFIELD—The first meeting of the Board of Directors was held April 8-9 at the Sheraton Four Points Hotel in Bakersfield. President Al Hoffmann offered his welcome and noted that he was optimistic that we would meet our target date of May 31, 2006, for the completion of the merger. First order of business was adoption of our **MISSION STATEMENT:** *“The California USBC Association, as the governing body, ensures the integrity and protects the future of the sport, provides programs and services and enhances the bowling experience”* and.....
VISION STATEMENT: *“The vision of the California USBC Association is to be the unified organization of choice focused on the growth of the sport”.*

You can well imagine the amount of work that was cut out for this newly elected Board of Directors, for they had been given the responsibility of organizing this new association. Nothing could be passed over. Nothing could be taken for granted but, everything on the President's full-page agenda was covered by this group of volunteers, many of whom had never met before, much less work together on such a large scale. Many issues required much review, discussion, and compassion before the final decision was reached. I share with you a mere sketch of all the work that was done.

A number of recommendations coming from the Transition Committee on services that had been provided by the CWBA, CSBA and CSYABA, were discussed at length and the board agreed they should be retained.

A design for our logo, was well received and will be submitted to USBC for approval.

The following Awards Programs will be retained:

Hall of Fame (Adults in Meritorious Service or Superior Performance); **Distinguished Service Award**; **Meritorious Service Award for Youth**; **Proprietor of the Year Award**; **Associa-**

tion of the Year Award; **Association Officer of the Year Award**; **Coach of the Year** and **Coaches' All Star Team**. Other programs to be continued will be the **Bowling Clinics**; **Websites** of CWBA, CSBA and CSYABA, (eventually to be combined and linked); and the bowlers charity, **BVL**. It was agreed that our organization establish relationships with the **“500”** and **“600” Clubs** and the **California Bowling Writers**.

Although Saturday was a 1-o-n-g day, it proved to be extremely productive

We returned at 8:00 AM Sunday morning, and were immediately introduced to our new committee assignments. For some 2-1/2 hours, committee members huddled together in different corners of the meeting room putting all their individual thoughts on paper. Each of the eight committee chairmen reported on their concerns and recommendations from which came many progressive ideas.

After setting the next board meeting for June 17-18, President Hoffmann adjourned the meeting at 12:30 PM.

“This writer was impressed. I paid attention to all and what they had to say. I feel you can rest assured that you have elected a balanced group of people, who have the respect for the bowlers who have invested their money and passion for the future of our youth. I urge you to continue to show your support and encouragement in our future endeavors”.

Live From Orlando, It's The USBC Annual Meeting Bowl.com to feature streaming direct from Florida

GREENDALE, Wis.—Anyone not able to attend the Annual Meeting portion of the first United States Bowling Congress Convention in person can watch the activities live on their computers via a video streaming feature on bowl.com.

Viewers will be able to watch everything as it happens at the Orange County Convention Center with the exception of the keynote address by CBS-TV sportscaster Greg Gumbel. Streaming will be available from 9-9:30 a.m., 10:15-11:30 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. Friday, April 21 and from 9 a.m. until noon on Saturday, April 22. Times are approximate.

“Broadcasting the Convention on bowl.com is truly groundbreaking for USBC,” said USBC New Media team leader Eric Rehl. “It's an example of how USBC is leveraging technology to reach out to its members, to connect with them and provide more value for their membership. This Convention is just the beginning. There will be a lot more to come.”

The initial Friday morning time includes the introduction of the USBC Board of Directors, invocation, national anthem and call to order. After Gumbel's speech, past and new members of the USBC Hall of Fame will be introduced and the Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow winner presented.

Immediately following lunch will be the President's Message, Strategic Planning Committee Report and Chief Executive Officer's Report. The day will conclude with USBC award winner recognition, Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow presentation and open forum where delegates can ask questions of USBC leadership.

April 22 begins with the memorial service. After a short break will be the legislative session, Meet for the Cure* ceremony to benefit the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, Nashville 2007 Convention presentation and adjournment.

About 2,500 people are scheduled to “Experience the Magic” at the first USBC Convention to be held April 19-22.

Absence of Pro Tour Leaves USBC Queens as Only Major Former pros have moved on since discontinuation of women't tour

GREENDALE, Wis. - For years, Kelly Kulick built toward her dream of earning a living as a professional women's bowler. It didn't take long for that dream to crumble right before her eyes.

Kulick was an up and coming bowler on the Professional Women's Bowlers Association Tour, earning top rookie honors in 2001 and on her way to a promising career.

Not long after breaking through and winning her first title - the 2003 U.S. Open, a major on the PWBA Tour - Kulick was looking for a new job.

Dozens of the best female athletes in the sport of bowling were in the same boat after the PWBA simply ran out of funds before its fall swing in 2003. It marked the end of a 22-year run of women's professional bowling and severed the tour's relationship with cable network ESPN2.

Now the women of the former PWBA have one opportunity a year to compete for a major title - the United States Bowling Congress Queens. With a prize fund of \$200,000 and a field of more than 300, it is the largest, most prestigious and only major women's event left in the country. The event will be conducted June 17-20 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev.

“For me it was devastating; it was heartbreaking when the PWBA fell apart,” said Kulick, a four-time member of Team USA before turning pro. “So much of my passion and love is about bowling. I waited so long in my life to get to that point and I finally win my first title, things are going my way, learned everything I could and it just broke my heart when it collapsed.”

The downfall of the PWBA was in the works for many months before it happened. The direct reason for its failure can be pointed at a lack of sponsors and private donors willing to step up and keep the tour solvent.

“We had some sponsors, but it wasn't enough to pay the bills,” said John Sommer, who owned the PWBA until it ceased operations. “It's a long, sad story. The girls deserve more.”

Left with a career that had suddenly vaporized, many of the women lived on hope that the tour would start back up. When it didn't, the players moved on

to other endeavors.

Some of the players left the bowling industry completely, working jobs ranging from construction to medical fields. Others went on to run pro shops or bowling centers.

Eventually, the Professional Bowlers Association, which had only allowed membership by men since it's inception in the 1950s, opened its doors to women. Kulick was one of a handful who took advantage of the opportunity.

“I wanted to come out and bowl no matter what, whether it was against men, women, internationally it doesn't matter,” said Kulick, who has earned just \$14,360 in two years as a PBA member. “When the PBA opened its doors it was an opportunity to bowl against the greatest bowlers in the world. I can learn more being out here.”

“My basketball coach when I was younger told me to play against the guys because they would make me better and these guys are going to make me better because I have to be at the best every time. It has been challenging and difficult.”

Some women have been able to find limited success on the PBA Tour. Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., who was a standout on the PWBA Tour, made history by becoming the first woman to win a PBA regional and finished second in a PBA national event.

On the amateur level, women's bowling is flourishing. Bowling is the fastest growing sport at the high school level and the NCAA began recognizing women's bowling as a championship sport in the 2003-04 season.


But once the players emerge from college, there is no place for the best to compete on the professional level anymore.

Eight-time USBC Team USA member and two-time U.S. Amateur champion Diandra Asbaty is one of those left out on the cold.

At 25, Asbaty is in her prime, but with no women's tour on the horizon she's content with continuing to compete as an amateur and earning a spot on Team USA each year.

“It's sad that becoming a professional bowler cannot be in a young girl's dreams anymore,” Asbaty said. “It is unfortunate that the women who dedicated

New Duos Take Leads In Classic, Division I Doubles at USBC Women's Championships

RENO, NV—New teams in Classic and Division I Doubles have taken over the leads at the 2006 United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships presented by the Eldorado, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus.

Cathy Johnston and Dianna Innerst moved into the top spot in the Classic Division at the National Bowling Stadium with a 1,274 pinfall on April 13. Johnston shot 241, 194 and 210 for a 645 score; while Innerst fired a 629 with scores of 204, 244 and 181. Innerst also took over second place in Classic All Events with 1,883.

Johnston and Innerst bowl for the Dangerous Curves I team out of San Jose, Calif.; and

though they were thrilled with their performance, it wasn't their best as a doubles team. "Four or five years ago, Cathy and I bowled somewhere in the 1,470s at a tournament at the High Sierra Lanes in Reno," said Innerst, a 41-year-old mother of two and an R&D manager for a biotech company out of Mountain View, Calif.

Johnston, also 41, who currently lives in Folsom, Calif. (no, not at the prison, she insists), is widowed and is a professional in materials management. She makes the four-hour roundtrip commute to San Jose each week to bowl with the Dangerous Curves I.

The two women have bowled together for 10 years and have come to know each other's games very well, which they say is one of their winning points. "We can talk to each other out there," Johnston said. "We have a very good rapport and always can spot what mistakes the other might be making. And we welcome each other's comments."

Another of their secrets, Innerst declared, is their competitiveness. "We are very competitive. We never give up. As long as there are frames left to bowl, it's not over for us," she said emphatically.

That competitive nature displayed itself when the two traveled to the USBC Women's Championships with six balls each. "You just never know how the lanes will react on a given night," Johnston said. "So it's a matter of matching the right ball with the right conditions."

At the same time, Cathy Johnston admits she isn't above abandoning a ball at the bowling lanes or donating it to a college bowling program if it's "stopped working" for her. She's not sure how many balls she's donated to San Jose State University, which is where Dianna Innerst served as women's head bowling coach for five years, and also managed to pick up a degree in health science.

"College bowling is a great experience," Innerst insisted, and she wishes more young people would take up the sport.

Father is Like Son as Esquivel Wins ABTA Title at CAL

LAKEWOOD—Rogelio Esquivel won his first ABTA title in fine style at Cal Bowl and duplicated the feat that his son did last month at West Covina Lanes. He won from the top seeded position finally downing upstart Stan Por in the title game to take home a nice \$1,100 top prize.

The bowlers turned out in force at Cal as 233 entrants participated in the 3 Squad Only Event. The scoring was very good, taking +84 (men) and +59 (women) to make the semi finals. Due to the great turnout we had 51 bowlers advance to the semifinals. Included were the added Super Seniors Tim Austin, Adam Drozdz and Dodie Sajonas.

Rogelio Esquivel struck often in the Semis to lead them all at +175. He was tops in the Semifinals and able to sit out and bowl for the title, besting Freddie Catamaran +154. Freddie would receive a first round bye in the single elims and enter in round two. It took a +72 Men, to make the sweet 16 single elims and a +60 for the three guaranteed women.

The bowlers took to the lanes. In the first round single elims, losing their matches were Stephanie Fenwick, William Baskin, Jinny Lei, Rico Cayton, Gerry Hingco, Lynn Waldie, and James Mathews. They got checks of \$112.50 in 10-16th places.

In round two being eliminated were Eddie Palma, Fred Catamisan, Chuck Gowdy, and Chris Abing. They cashed in 6-

9th places and \$127.50 each. Round three had Stan Por hold tough in downing Oliver Esmerjada 234-224 as did Ben Hurtado in downing David Emrich, 248-196. Oliver and David who was showing off for his mom :-) were 4th, and 5th and checks for \$140 for their fine bowling with Stan and Ben to meet for the right to bowl Rogelio for the title.

This was a nice match but Stan struck late and pulled away to win big 211-179. Ben was third and \$210 finishing third with great bowling. Stan was off to bowl in the title game vs Esquivel.

The title game was on and Esquivel elected to lead off, he did with a spare, open and Stan the same. Rogelio doubled in frames 3-4. Stan was clean but should have taken a Whole Life Policy on the left lane as he just couldn't strike on that lane. Rogelio then got tough and tossed a turkey in frames 6-7-8 to take a big lead. Stan could not double and the title went to the gentleman from Huntington Park 203/222-183/202. He now has matched his son Luis as they have now each won an ABTA Title. Rogelio is a fine man and bowls with us most every week and is deserving to say the least. We are glad to have him as our latest Champion. His lovely wife Maria also bowls with us and perhaps she is next to win. It wouldn't surprise me :-) Congrats to a great guy!

Great bowling by another great guy Stan Por, a titlist who has bowled in the ABTA for

many years and has many friends in the club. Title #2 is next for him.

Kudos also to Ben Hurtado who almost got to the title game. A title is next for Gentle Ben! He is well respected in the ABTA!

ABTA Notes: Tourney Hi Qualifiers were Rey Hernandez (men) +203, and Jinny Lei led the ladies at +110. They will receive paid entries.

The 3-6-9 was worth a nice \$1,800. Danny Guevarra and Paul Passarino couldn't eliminate one another so they settled for a split of the \$50 consolation. We go for \$1,900 this Saturday at Bowling Square.

The Match Game 3 was UNMatched due to the 259 drawn by Esquivel. So we estimate a \$2,700 Match Game Saturday at Bowling Square.

The Match Series was Matched due to the 472 drawn by HQ Hernandez. Danny Alcayde gladly accepted \$1,212 in cash for his fine 472 Series. Danny was buying the beer at Cal:-) and he claims that is the best 472 he has ever bowled. Congrats Danny! He is surely most deserving!

The optional doubles were taken by Gerry Hingco and Stan Por. Their 1506 got them \$130. Hingco came in 2nd and 3rd also with Gibin Kim and Rich Yanagita. We paid 13 places and \$910 in the doubles!

National Deaf Bowling News

Malucci Rolls 36th Career 300 & 758 at La Habra Bowl

LA HABRA—It was a long time coming. Finally the Whittier prolific deaf bowler with most 300 games Carl Malucci rolled his 36th career 300 last Thursday at La Habra 300 Bowl, the place where Glenn Allison hit the first ever 900 series. The last time Malucci hit his 35th was at the defunct Regal Lanes during the 2003-04 season.

In early summer of 2004 Malucci was stricken by a virus of some kind and was away from bowling for 16 months. His illness forced him to turn down an invitation to bowl on the Deaf Team USA for the 2005 Deaflympics at Melbourne, Australia. .

When recovered, he returned to bowling and was the surprise winner of So. Calif. Deaf Classic last January. He was doing fine with a 225 average in his Thursday night league, Frank’s Gold Cup at La Habra 300 Bowl. Then Malucci’s back injury forced him to stop bowling again for 4 weeks.

Amazingly on the 5th week last Thursday night Malucci resumed bowling in Frank’s Gold Cup league and rolled 12 in row for his perfect game. He followed that with 202 and 256 for a 758 series, which moved his average up to 227.

Malucci reported that he was not the only one with the 700 series that night. His teammate Daniel Vasquez, Jr. being rejoiced with his return, rolled 711 from games of 204-255-263. In that 263, Malucci said, Vasquez, Jr. started with 9 strikes in row and thought it would be nice for the team to have 2 perfectos for the night but Vasquez, Jr. blew it in the 10th frame. Vasquez, Jr. now sports an even 200 average.

That makes three 700s for the early month of April. On Wednesday April 5, Ed Abakumoff in his Moreno Valley league rolled his first three games of 276-234-225 for 735 and finished with 226 for 961. Malucci’s 758 better than Vasquez’s 711.

For the deaf bowling records, Malucci’s 36 perfect games are the most by a deaf bowler unless some one comes up with proof of more than his does. Last known report had Jeff Reese, Florida with 34 career 300s.

Moreover, Malucci’s 36 is not big for USBC records because the USBC record has Jeff Carter of Springfield, IL with the most, 83. You would think the pros in PBA had more than that but no. Also this same Jeff Carter is the one who in 2001 had the record highest average 261 for the whole season.

The former team won both actual pinfall and with handicap titles last year at Merrillville, IN.

Also re-entered for a repeat in the Doubles event are the duo of Scott Helberg and Richard Egger from Toledo, OH.

Helberg-Egger duo also set a record doubles score of 1486 last year winning both actual and handicap titles.

Last year’s actual and handicap Singles champion, Roger McGartland returns to defend his titles which he won with 771 score. Egger also will defend his actual All-events title, which he won with a record 2210 total. Ron Hood, Jr. of Scranton, PA will try to repeat as handicap All-event titlist which he won with total score of 2222.

The Herman Cahen Master champion, Kevin Moran, Rochester is in Chicago to repeat. Moran defeated Bill Davis, Chicago in the finals for the title.

The tournament starts with the Cahen Masters all day on Friday April 21. Then on Saturday the 76 teams will be in 2 squads bowling 3 games and on Sunday 23rd two squads of Singles and Doubles will finish the tournament.


