Mike Scroggins Wins PBA50 UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl In The Villages In PBA50 Tour Debut

Eight-time PBA Tour winner defeats Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III 255-246 in championship match

THE VILLAGES, FL – After a nearly year-long absence from top-level competition recovering from foot problems, eight-time PBA Tour winner Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, won the PBA50 UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl In The Villages presented by Radical Tuesday in his PBA50 Tour debut at Spanish Springs Lanes.

Scroggins, who qualified fifth for the finals, won three consecutive matches before battling fellow lefthander and tournament leader Parker Bohn III in a championship match that went down to the 10th frame.

Bohn, who dominated the tournament and was coming off a win in the season-opening Pasco County Florida Open last week, threw a strike on the first ball in the 10th frame and then a nine-count and spare forcing Scroggins to get the first two strikes in the 10th. Scroggins got the first two strikes and then a nine-count on the fill ball to beat Bohn 255-246.

“This is one of the best

feelings I’ve had in bowling especially after what I’ve been through for the past year,” Scroggins said. “It made it extra special to beat the great bowlers that were in the finals which I felt very fortunate to do.

“I was having good success on the right lane so when Parker left that nine-count, I felt pretty confident I could get the job done,” Scroggins said of the final frame. “I just told myself to relax and throw the kind of shots I’m capable of and I could win it.”

Scroggins suffers from the condition plantar fasciitis, a tendon and ligament disorder in both feet, which put him out of action for more than nine months.

It’s been a long road to recovery and it’s really something that won’t totally go away,” Scroggins said. “It’s something that comes with age and I’m going to continually have to manage it.”

As the fifth qualifier in the stepladder, Scroggins opened with a 231-205 win over PBA Hall of Famer Johnny Petra-

glia who was trying for his ninth PBA50 title at age 68. Scroggins then went on to beat two-time PBA50 Player of the Year and eight-time PBA50 Tour winner Ron Mohr 239-227 in the second match before beating Hall of Famer and four-time PBA50 Player of the Year Tom Baker 234-202 in the semifinal match.

The PBA50 Tour heads to Mooresville, N.C., for the third stop of the season when George Pappas Victory Lanes hosts the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic presented by Columbia 300 April 26-29.

REDLANDS — Bobby Hornacek has the potential to be as good a bowler as there ever has been. His form is compact and precise. His disposition is temperate and mature.

His bowling pedigree is first class. He is the son of two of the best bowlers in the Citrus Belt (Jenelle and Zack Jellsey) and has learned to compete against SoCAL's best in the JAT (four titles) and JBT (five titles) programs.

With so much going for him the Fullerton Union High School graduate recently stepped into the adult world joining a night league just after

his twentieth birthday. He immediately showed he belonged by rolling 852 (252 - 300 - 300). As far as I know it is the highest three game set by a bowler under the age of twenty-one at EMPIRE BOWL. Just a couple of weeks after he followed up with an 803 (253 - 279 - 269). The overall Empire



Bowl record is 870 rolled by BOBBY WILLIAMS.

Hornacek is currently averaging 241 with five career 300s and three 800s. His Junior Gold League average was 206. He used his Global 900 Respect ball to roll his 852 but still considers his Storm Hy-Road his favorite because it is the most versatile ball ever

made.

Bobby has been bowling virtually his whole life because mom Jenelle and dad Mike Hornacek always brought him to the lanes with them. Bobby's favorite professional bowler is MIKE DEVANEY because MIKE is a “SWEET-HEART.” Bobby is grateful to “Bowlers Deals” and his ball driller and step-dad Zack Jellsey for their support.

Bobby Hornacek is another example of the great people who are bowlers. He is intelligent, composed and a man beyond his years. Because of young men like him bowling has a great future.

PBA Billy Welu Scholarship Applications Now Being Accepted

CHICAGO — The PBA has announced it is now accepting applications for the 2015 PBA Billy Welu Scholarship Award which recognizes exemplary qualities in male or female college students who compete in the sport of bowling.

The winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. To be eligible candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintaining at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent. Applications must be postmarked by June 15.

The scholarship was established to annually recognize a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence. Welu, who passed away in 1974, was best known for his expert analysis alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the “Pro Bowlers Tour” series. Welu was a two-time PBA Tour champion and a member of the PBA Hall of Fame’s inaugural induction class in 1975.

2-Time All-Star & Former MLB Pitcher Joins Team Storm

Storm Products, Inc. announced today that 2-time All-Star and former Major League pitcher John Burkett has been inked to a staff contract.

A native of Beaver, Pennsylvania, the 50-year-old John David Burkett (born November 28, 1964) pitched for the San Francisco Giants, Florida Marlins, Texas Rangers, Atlanta Braves and Boston Red Sox during a 16-year career that began in 1987 and ended with his retirement in 2003 at age 38. He posted a 166-136 record with 1,766 career strikeouts. He was an all-star with the Giants in 1993 (when he contended for the National League Cy Young Award with a 22-7 record) and in 2001 with the Braves.

Burkett also was a National League All-Star in 2001, with the Atlanta Braves, who retired following the 2003 season after going 12–9 with the Red Sox at age 38. His 1996 postseason win with the Rangers in the Divisional Series was the first postseason win in the franchise’s history.

His career as an athlete enters a new chapter when he began his professional bowling career in earnest in the PBA50 Pasco County Florida Open, two weeks ago.

“I’ve been practicing and working out,” Burkett said. “More recently I’ve been working on getting my rev rate back up by changing my grip. I have a tendency to squeeze it and the ball knuckles off my hand, but I’m starting to turn that problem around.”

Burkett, an accomplished bowler for most of his life who now resides in Southlake, Texas, is no stranger to bowling in PBA competition, having bowled in a handful of Tour events since making his debut in 1990 in Pinole, Calif. He also competed in several regionals along the way, and most recently, he competed in PBA’s 2014 Oklahoma’s Grand Resort Summer Swing and the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VI as part of the process to get ready for PBA50 competition.

Now that he plans to make the commitment to bowl a majority of the PBA50 Tour events this season, Burkett likes his chances of putting together a successful season, although he is hesitant to make any specific goals.

“I have high expectations and I believe in myself, but I’m not kidding myself that it won’t be a work in progress,” said Burkett, who plans to bowl seven or eight stops this year. “For most of the guys, making the right adjustments and ball moves is second nature, where for me it’s going to be more of a continual learning experience.

“Being an athlete and bowling more competitive games on a regular basis should produce some good results,” he added. “What I’m going to have to guard against is getting too anxious and going into panic mode when I get lost. If there’s an area that I really need to concentrate on, that would probably be it.”

Burkett’s introduction to the sport came as a youngster when his first job was setting pins at Wedgewood Lanes, a duckpin center which converted to tenpins, in his hometown of Beaver, Pa. A career as a professional bowler might have been in his future had he not also found he had exceptional skills throwing a baseball at a young age. Now, after a successful professional baseball career, he can return his sights to his other passion of bowling.

“I’m so excited and blessed to be able to do it,” he said. “I want to bowl and get to know the guys that I’ve admired for so many years. I’m just looking forward to the whole experience.”

Seemingly, the missing piece of the puzzle for Burkett’s bowling career was a partnership with a ball manufacturer that allowed his desires to accelerate his craft to be realized. With today’s news that search has formally come to end by joining Storm Products’ Regional Staff Team.

“John has been throwing our equipment for some time now with regular success at all levels of competition”, Storm public relations manager Dave Kost said. “But now knowing that he is committed to bowling full-time, we (Storm) felt the timing was a perfect match not only for John, but equally for our brands”.

“JB brings a wealth of pride, professionalism and strong character that undoubtedly comes from his playing days and, that coupled with his passion to grow the sport makes it a win-win partnership”.

ABAKUMOFF LEADS DEAF TRAVEL WITH 258-798 AT CAL BOWL

LAKEWOOD — Southern California Deaf Traveling League bowlers had a tough time scoring on the lanes of Cal Bowl as none of its 6 trio-teams crashed the 2000 barrier. This marks the third time in three different bowling centers this scratch traveling league failed to score at least one 2000 team series. At Cal Bowl Hollywood led with 1986, the same team Hollywood that scored the league’s season high team series 2214 in the last travel session at Winnetka Bowl.


None of the bowlers scored a 800 at Cal Bowl as Ed Abakumoff came two pins short with a 798 with stepladder games of 179-180-181 before closing with a booming 258. Bob Jones who led the league in the past three sessions with 885, 874 and 839 including 8 consecutive 200 games, struggled with a 729. Jeff Stansell closed with a 205 for 707. Three bowlers had a 200, Bob Taylor with 211, Paul Taffolla, Sr. 201 and Gorman Low 200.

Though League leader Orange County lost 9-11 to Abakumoff’s Riverside, it still retains first place. Second place Hollywood moved up closer within 1.5 points with a 12-8 win over third place Eagle Rock. Jones’ S F Valley moved out of the bottom with a 13-7 win over 5th place Stanwell’s Mid City.


With the final position round coming this Sunday Noon at Covina Bowl, it will be exciting finish at both top and bottom,

FARMINGDALE — The PBA will jump into a big day in the world of sports with a "Clash of the Legends" special event in conjunction with the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open at Farmingdale Lanes in Farmingdale, N.Y. A special competition involving PBA Hall of Famers Parker Bohn III, Walter Ray Williams Jr., Pete Weber and Amleto Monacelli will be part of a unique contest that invites sports fans to pick the winners of the Kentucky Derby, Clash of Legends and the Floyd Mayweather-Manny Pacquiao championship boxing match.

The Perfect Game

THE STATE OF BOWLING

Part 3 of 6

A DISCUSSION WITH EDITOR/PUBLISHER CAROL MANCINI

Editor’s note: This week, our discussion about the evolution of bowling and its effect on participation continues. This week’s topic is titled:

“Has Bowling Lost It’s Balls?”

Carol: What do you think? Pretty catchy title, huh?

Steve: Carol, have you lost your mind?

Carol: What? I learned to bowl with a Brunswick, “Black Beauty.”

Steve: I started with an AMF, “Three Dot.”

Carol: So did millions of other bowlers. Like Ebonite’s, “Manhattan Rubber”, and Columbia’s, “Yellow Dot,” they were hard rubber, cork centered, simple pieces of beauty. Do you see anyone still using or selling them?

Steve: No.

Carol: Then it’s safe to say that we’ve lost them.

Steve: You’ve made your point, but look at the technological marvels that replaced them.

Carol: That’s why we’re here today. Reactive resin bowling balls; good or bad?

Steve: Necessary.

Carol: What do you mean?

Steve: The hard rubber, and polyester balls that followed them, were unresponsive on the glossy surfaces of synthetic lanes. Averages plummeted and bowlers began an exodus. Ball makers responded by developing grit-infused cover stock called, “reactive resin.” The grit can make bowling balls act like studded tires on an icy road. This changed the face of bowling forever.

Carol: Why do you say that?

Steve: The balls from our youth lasted for decades. Some were handed down father to son, & mother to daughter. They were cherished, just like the awards won with them. The owners even had their names inscribed. Dedication to that one piece of equipment is rare these days.

Carol: That really has changed. Hasn’t it?

Steve: It sure has. Forty years ago a typical bowler owned that one ball, a bag and a pair of shoes. Today, some bags hold three balls and many bowlers have more in the trunks of their cars. New balls are coming out constantly and trying to keep up with the latest is financial suicide. That creates a “Have VS Have-not” divide which never existed before.

Carol: Do you think reactive resin balls contribute to the decline in league membership?

Steve: That’s hard to say, but they do skew the game in favor of power bowlers. While they may be the best thing for that segment of the bowling population, they may be the worst thing for everyone else. They can’t be used effectively by weaker bowlers like kids, petite players & the elderly.

Carol: Power has always been an advantage in bowling.

Steve: True! But for what they cost, balls are useless to anyone incapable of controlling them.

Carol: Anything else?

Steve: Absolutely! Besides being expensive, they absorb oil like a sponge so they have limited life-spans. But most of all, I resent seeing bowlers shift from relying on skills to depending on technology. The cores used in today’s balls allow them to be drilled to perform specific actions.

Carol: What’s wrong with that?

Steve: Rather than adjusting to lane conditions, the “Haves” simply change to a ball that suits the condition. I believe that’s bad for the game because other bowlers perceive that to be an unfair advantage.

Carol: True, but no matter what ball they use, bowlers still have to make good shots.

Steve: That’s the part of the game that remains intact.

Carol: Do you think we should to go back to hard rubber?

Steve: Let’s be realistic. That genie is out of the bottle to stay.

Carol: Based on all you’ve said, can I assume you vote to put reactive resin balls in the “Bad for Bowling Membership” column?

Steve: I honestly don’t know. What I do know is this; of all the great innovations that have come to bowling, these orbs have more negatives than any other. But I also believe that bowling is better off with them than without them. They do create higher scores for bowlers who are able to use them.

Carol: That does it for this week folks. Join us again next week when we will discuss the future of our beloved sport.

Danielle Daugherty Honored as USBC's Top Central California Woman Bowler

Danielle Daugherty, an up-and-coming elite bowler from Fresno, has been selected as captain of the Central California United States Bowling Congress women's all-star team.

It marked the second straight year the 33-year-old Daugherty has been named to the team. She was cited for her hefty 221 average.

The 5-foot-10 Daugherty also blistered a 300 game Jan. 25 at Valley Bowl in Madera. That was a noteworthy event because it was the first sanctioned perfect game by a woman at that bowling center, which has been open for more than 50 years.

Daugherty said she was "shocked to be honest" when she learned that she had become the first women to roll a perfect game at Valley Bowl. "There are a lot of good bowlers in the area," said Daugherty, who has been bowling for 25 years. "A lot of women have the potential to shoot 300 so it was an awesome feeling."

Daugherty has bowled three perfect games (not including five non-sanctioned 300s at University High School in Orlando, Fla.) and an 800 series in 2007 in Phoenix.

She hit exactly 800 by converting the 6-10 spare on her final shot for a 262-262-276 series. "I like living on the edge," said Daugherty, laughing.

Earlier in the series, she converted the 7-10 split. Like many bowlers who unexpectedly knock down the "railroad," she wasn't watching the pin action. "I hit the 10 pin and it bounced back and rolled over and hit the seven," said Daugherty, who combines hard shots with precision.

"Believe it or not," said Daugherty, "the 800 was not as memorable as the 300 I shot at Valley Bowl. "The 300 probably meant the most to me because I'm very close to the owners of the bowling alley. It was an honor to have had this achievement happen there.

"I do a lot of work to help increase the number of customers because the proprietors are very good to bowlers."

For now, Daugherty said she was "working hard" so she could compete in Professional Women's Bowling Assn. tournaments.

And she'll be doing just that when she competes in the PWBA tournament July 9-12 in Sacramento.

"Honestly, my goal is just to go there and put together good games," Daugherty said. "My ultimate goal is to hang with all those women bowlers who I've looked up to for many years."

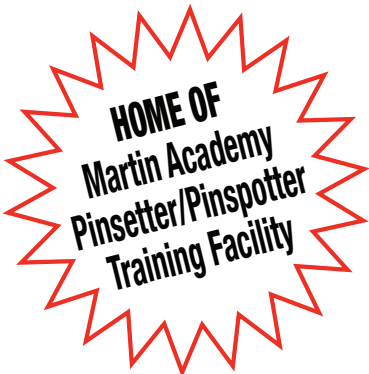

BURBANK — I was in the NLAC office recently and on a whim I looked myself up in some of the old average books. I would have been about 18 years old and had an average of 144. Some would feel pretty awful about that but not me!

Think about it. Bowling averages are very similar to the value of our dollar. Bowling averages have sky rocketed over the years due to the advancement in equipment, lanes and lane dressing. It was rare to witness a 300 being bowled and those who could average 180 to 200 were considered pro material. A dollar would go a long way then and a 150 average was heaven.

As far as the lane conditions go, there were no automatic machines to dress the lanes. Centers would hire a person specific to that job and he had to know his stuff! He would walk each lane, top to bottom, applying oil and start over again, finishing the spread evenly. The lanes would also be swept daily but not necessarily oiled. The lanes were wood, real wood, and varnished, as were the pins. My Dad was a big fan of getting the old pins to burn in the fireplace because they burned so well. No worries about carcinogens then!

Then there is the ball. Mostly rubber then, always black and no such thing as grip inserts or thumb sleeves. Your driller was important since he was the one who determined the inside finish of your finger holes. Relate this to being banished to using a house ball forever, no mercy.

I do miss those days. It was a time of accuracy and control, knowledge and precision and putting all three digits in the ball. The respect one would have for good bowlers was real and warranted.

In conclusion, I figure my 144 was equivalent to a 174 today and I can feel pretty good about an average like that!

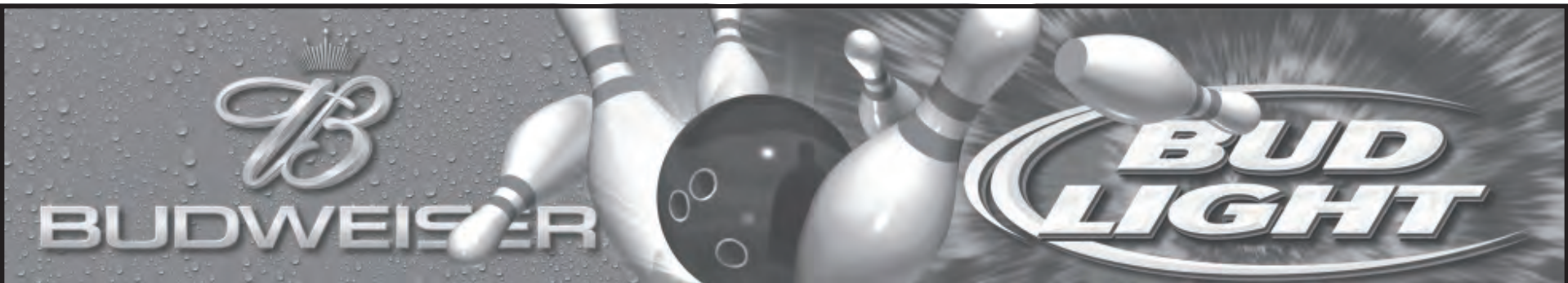
