FISSER 279-978 IN DEAF TRAVEL AT HIGH SCORING CANOGA PARK BOWL

WINNETKA — Southern California Deaf Traveling League took advantage of freshly oiled lanes of Canoga Park Bowl to score the season best 180 plus average per bowler. Mark Fisser led the nine bowlers honor roll that included four with 800 plus 4 games series and two women.

Fisser, the former 1987 USBC Star of Tomorrow rolled games of 257-279-199-246 for 978 to help his Anaheim team move up to first place. More than 100 pins back of Fisser was League President Ed Abakumoff's 867 (195-222-239-211) which beat Dan Flores' 854 (204-227-242-181) in their duel. The 4th 800 was a surprise made by Andy Lorenzo with his season best 862 (198-257-237-170). Missed out of 800 by 9 pins was Jeff Stansell's 791 with steady 200-193-202+196.

The rest on the list were Gorman Low with (210-210) 772, League secretary Bob Taylor with (214-201) 732 and two women Celia Salcedo (201) 720 and Anita Lorenzo (198) 718.

In Fisser's Anaheim move to first place, his teammates Emad Aranki and Jim Mohr helped in a near sweep 16-4 over absence depleted Orange County whose Anita Lorenzo won all its 4 points. Anaheim, which holds the season team series 2372, also scored its second 2300 team series, 2302.

Former league leader Eagle Rock, without its 'A' bowler Bob Jones who was in Reno for the USBC Open Championship, lost 6-14 to 5th place Stansell's Mid City. Eagle Rock fell to 2nd place three points behind new leader Anaheim. Abakumoff's Riverside held on to 3rd place with 13-7 win over Flores' 5th place S F Valley.

This scratch $\hat{6}$ teams trio league thanks Canoga Park management and staff for the high scoring condition and hopes to return next season.

Next week Sunday May 4th at AMF Cerritos Lanes will be the league's final position round in which Anaheim will face Eagle Rock. Anaheim needs to win only 9 points to shut out Eagle Rock. Eagle Rock must win 12 points for the league title. All other teams bowl for points prize money.

WAS "THE VILLAGES" FIELD THE TOUGHEST Championship group in PBA History?

FLORIDA — It's one of those unofficial statistical categories, but long-time PBA observers have been wracking their brains trying to recall if there was ever a tougher field of finalists than the group of five who bowled for the PBA50 Tour UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl in The Villages title Tuesday night at Spanish Springs Lanes in Florida.

All five finalists – top qualifier Tom Baker, Pete Weber, Norm Duke, Parker Bohn III and Walter Ray Williams Jr. – were PBA Hall of Famers and combined they have won 164 PBA Tour titles, plus another 19 PBA50 Tour titles (not including The Villages' title Duke won Tuesday). Baker was low man on the PBA Tour titles list with 10. Weber and Duke are tied for third on the all-time list with 37 each. Bohn is sixth with 33. Williams is the all-time leader with 47 Tour title.

Baker is the leader in PBA50 Tour titles with 10 (fifth-best on the all-time list). Williams has won seven titles as a "senior" player. Weber won two titles in his "rookie" year in 2013. Duke got his first PBA50 title in his second appearance (he finished second to another Hall of Famer, Amleto Monacelli, in his "senior" debut a week earlier in New Port Richey, Fla.) Bohn, who also bowled in his second PBA50 event in The Villages, had top-five finishes in both events.

In addition, Williams is a seven-time PBA Player of the Year and two-time defending PBA50 Player of the Year. Duke and Bohn have each won PBA Player of the Year honors twice. Weber has never won Player of the Year honors, but is a former PBA and PBA50 Rookie of the Year. Baker is the only player to win PBA50 Player of the Year honors four straight years.

The PBA50 Tour season is just getting started, but it promises to be the most exciting campaign ever for the elder statesmen of the PBA...and all of the remaining tournaments will be covered live on PBA's exclusive online bowling channel Xtra Frame (except for the USBC Senior Masters, which will be aired on USBC's online channel BowITV. Page Joins Kulick as Athlete Representatives on USBC Board

ARLINGTON, Texas - Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., will join Kelly Kulick on Union, N.J., on the United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors starting Aug. 1. Kulick was re-elected to a second term to the USBC Board while Page was elected for the first time by the Athletes Advisory Council. Kulick's first term will expire at the end of the season; Page replaces Tony Manna Jr., who is completing his third and final term. Board members are limited to three terms.

Athletes who have been Team USA members in the past 10 years are eligible to vote to determine athlete representatives to the board. Kulick, 37, first joined the board as an athlete director for the 2011-2012 season. She said she had several reasons for seeking re-election, including that she currently is the only female athlete representative, USBC has implemented many changes during her short time of service - decisions she has supported and wants to follow through on - and her travel schedule has slowed so she can commit more time. "I've also learned more about the organization and how it runs," Kulick said. "I have enjoyed getting to know the other board members. They have inspired me and educated me all at the same time. ... As cliché as this sounds, one person can make a difference. I only hope to learn more and grow the sport for all." Kulick is a 10-time and current Team USA member and two-time Junior Team USA member. She has won 30 medals in international competition, including the first team gold for the United States at the World Games when she teamed with Mike Fagan for the mixed doubles title in 2013.

Page, 30, is a seven-time Team USA and two-time Junior Team USA member, and has won more than 20 medals in international competition. A member of the Professional Bowlers Association Tour since 2007, he was named the PBA Rookie of the Year after making the championship round in five events. He was a member of the Kansas team that captured the 2004 Intercollegiate Team Championships and he was named MVP of the tournament.

He said it means a tremendous amount to him to have his peers elect him to the board. "I decided to run for the board because I don't want to sit on the sidelines and continue to watch," Page said.

'I want to help turn the sport of bowling around and make it a household name again. I believe with my knowledge, experience, and passion that I can help us do some great things in the near future." Kulick and Page each will serve a three-year term on the USBC Board.

2014 USBC Convention Comes to a Close

RENO, Nev. - Delegates elected four board members and decided eight legislative proposals on Friday, the final day of the 2014 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting. Delegates took part in seminars, heard from industry leaders and saw the presentation of national awards during the USBC Convention that started Tuesday.

On Friday, the delegates heard from USBC President Andrew Cain and USBC Interim Executive Director Chad Murphy before voting on four open spots on the USBC board. Current board members Jo Dimond of Columbus, Ohio, Marci Williams of Wichita, Kan., and Robert Spigner of Chicago were elected to the USBC Board of Directors and will be joined by Karl Kielich of El Paso, Texas, who served a two-year term on the board from 2011-2013. The board members will begin their three-year terms Aug. 1. Each of the four board members elected Friday were selected on the first ballot. Six candidates, each slated by the USBC Nominating Committee, were on the ballot and a candidate needed a majority of the 825 eligible voting delegates for election.

Spigner led the voting with 564 votes followed by Williams (528), Dimond (506), Kielich (460), Jay Daryman (378) of York, Pa., and Brian Bulko (309) of El Paso, Texas. Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., recently was re-elected to a second term to the USBC Board by the Athletes Advisory Council. The athletes also elected Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., to replace Tony Manna Jr., who is completing his third and final term. Board members are limited to three terms. Athletes who have been Team USA members in the past 10 years were eligible to vote to determine the athlete representatives to the board.

The 825 voting delegates (794 association delegates, eight athletes and 23 board members) voted on six proposals relating to USBC bylaws (two were withdrawn), one proposal relating to league rules, and one proposal related to tournament rules during the legislative session. USBC bylaws proposals required a twothirds vote to pass while league rules and tournament rules required a majority vote. Five proposals (one league rule, one tournament league rule and three USBC bylaws) were accepted and three proposals (USBC bylaws) were rejected. Please see below for the proposed amendments and the voting results. USBC also showcased its significant financial support of charitable causes during Convention week.

USBC Bowl for the Cure received a late donation of \$25,000 from Barb Chrisman and Storm Products to reach its Your Roll to a Million goal set last year. The late contribution pushed the total donation to Susan G. Komen For The Cure over the \$1 million mark to \$1,000,427.09.

In 2014, USBC Bowl for the Cure eclipsed the \$10 million mark in total donations to Susan G. Komen For The Cure. Go to BOWL com/BFTC for more information on Bowl for the Cure.

The Bowlers to Veterans Link, which raised more than \$823,000 for America's activeduty and veteran service men and women, recognized the top state and local associations for their contributions during the 2012-2013 season.

For local associations, Citrus Belt USBC was the top contributor with \$23,026.57 followed by Minneapolis USBC with \$15,466.87 and Nation's Capital Area USBC with \$15,319. 



In the semifinal round, Voss eliminated another hall of famer, Wayne Webb of Columbus Ohio, 180-189, 247-198, 212-167, while Williams swept Ron Mohr of Las Vegas, 187-186, 212-209.

• Amateur Eric Traylor of Pearland, Texas, defeated 2012 PBA Southwest Region Rookie of the Year Sean Lavery of Plano, Texas, 241-173, to win the PBA U Can Bowl 2 Houston Southwest Challenge presented by Motiv at Houston's Del-Mar Lanes Sunday. PBA Challenge events are limited to bowlers who have never won a PBA event.

In the championship match, Traylor followed a 7-10 split in the first frame with a string of eight strikes and coasted to the victory. He earned \$2,000 but does not get credit for a PBA title because he isn't a member.





Boys and girls interested in bowling can't bowl all they want since most allowances won't stretch that far. Many become a little more eager to do some extra chores around the house to earn some extra money to bowl some extra games.

Some take on a part-time job, and many keep score at tournaments. There, mothers have little to fear, a bowling center is a good place for a youngster to be.
