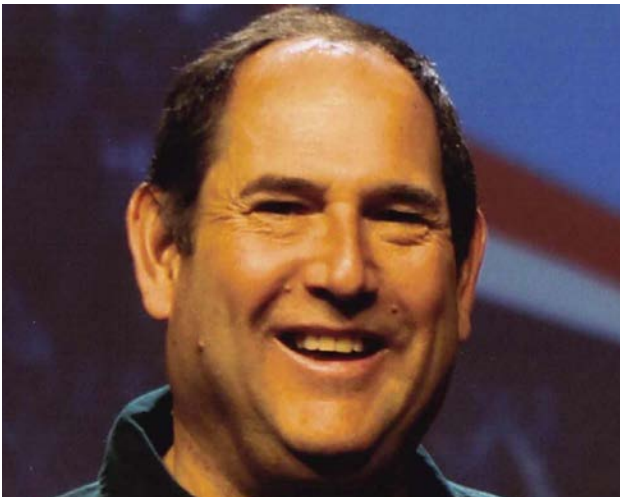
MONTCLAIR — Mr. Scott Poddig is the USBC California Association's winner of our 2014 Proprietor of the Year Award and certainly fits all of the award profile expectations. He will be honored at the CALUSBC Convention June 7th & 8th at the Crowne Plaza Hotel (formerly the Holiday Inn) in Sacramento.

It is our task to recognize those bowling center proprietors who are extra special. One who is doing everything possible to keep the occasional recreational bowler "coming back"; who is outstanding in the promotion of our Adult and Youth bowling; one who does many great things in the service to their Adult and Youth Leagues; and one who sets an

example in the field of leadership in our sport by being a member of the local, state and national bowling associations.

Poddig is not a stranger by any means in our California bowling arena, as for over ten years he was a partner and General Manager in the operation of Harley's Camarillo Bowl in Camarillo. By his side at the center was his wife Teresa his bowling partner, along with their children Jordan 17, John 26, Jaime 27 and even their 2 Yr old "I Love To Bowl" Grandson Atticus.

While at Harley's Camarillo Bowl, Poddig constantly hosted activities to draw the adult and youth bowlers into the center and was even a consultant to ESPN (in-cen-

ter qualifying) finals of the \$250,000 Bowling Shootout. However, it was always Pod-

dig's passion to run "his own" center. That opportunity came to fruition on July 16, 2012

when he and his wife Teresa acquired ownership of the beautiful Bowlum Lanes in Montclair. Poddig didn't waste any time putting the youth program at the top of his list.

He pays the sanction fees for all juniors in their program; sponsors juniors in tournaments (when parents can't afford to pay); has hosted the JAT (Junior Amateur Tour); JBT (Junior Bowlers Tour); Collegiate Montclair Open & Collegiate Bowlum Open. And, he has hosted the CAUSBC Women's Championship Tournament; CALUSBC Helen Duval Veterans Tour-

nament; West Coast Senior Tournament; Billy Myers Sr Annual PBA Regional Tournament.

Besides being a member of the local Chamber of Commerce, and a loyal supporter to numerous local, state and national events, Poddig visits the local schools to promote Youth Bowling..... and the list goes on, and on, and on.

BOBBY CAMPAGNALE Wins Citrus Belt Masters

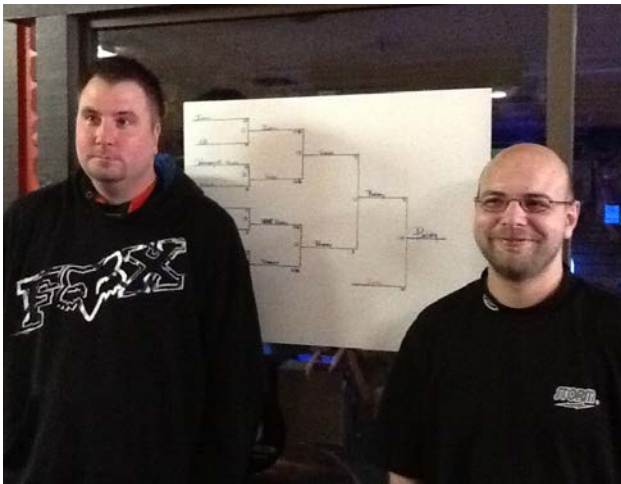
SAN BERNARDINO — Bobby Campagnale is this seasons Citrus Belt Masters Champion. After placing second three times and third once in the past four years, Mr. Campagnale finally won the most coveted title in the Citrus Belt.

While it has been a long and circuitous path to the top for Bobby, there is no shame in the numerous close calls he has experienced. There is no shame in finishing second, especially when you were beat by the likes of MIKE DEVANEY, EDDIE VAN DANIKER, DAVE WODKA and VINCE WOOD.

Bobby placed third during qualifying with a five game set of 1110 (222 average). The top five qualifiers were JEFF LEWEN 1223 (244), ED LACOBAS 1152 (230), Campagnale, RANDY MYERS 1106 (221) and JUSTIN ZIEGLER 1101 (220).

ROBERT SNYDER and VINCE WOOD had automatic seeds into the finals as last years Open Tournament All-Events Champion and last years Masters Champion respectively.

After the first two rounds of match play it looked like

three time Masters Champion, Vince Wood, would march through the field undefeated. He won his first two matches handily while all other finalists struggled.

Then the tide turned suddenly in the third round when Campagnale and Wood faced off as the last survivors in the winners bracket.

Bobby took control early with a long string of strikes in the first game. Vince roared back in the second game and made it close. However, five consecutive single pin taps at the end of game two torpedoed

Vince's chances. His nineteen pin win in game two wasn't enough.

After losing an early match to Wood, Justin Ziegler started winning in the Consolation Bracket.

His winning earned him a rematch against Wood and he took full advantage of the opportunity. He rattled off games of 245 and 246 to end our defending champions day.

The finals saw Ziegler go against Bobby Campagnale for the title.

These two high revolution rollers have been friends and

teammates for years.

Both are fierce competitors and enjoy competing against each other. This was evident by the friendly chatter during the match. Any time one of them caught a break or misstepped he would hear about it from the other.

Justin rolled ten solid strikes in the first game to take a 22 pin lead, 268 to 246. He continued to lead the match through most of the second game until the eighth frame. He made a good shot but left the 4 - 6 -10 split.

That was all that Campagnale needed. He proceeded to strike out to win the match and championship.

It was an exciting tournament that could have been won by any of our finalists. The lane conditions were difficult but the bowlers showed they are talented and able to handle them, no matter how deep or shallow or wide the puddle. That being the case, it was still evident that the condition on any given pair may dictate the winner.

The tournament was ably managed by MIKE RADDEMAN (Citrus Belt President), RICK HILL (former president) and ALISHA HILL.

Page Joins Kulick as Athlete Representatives on USBC Board

ARLINGTON, Texas — Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., will join Kelly Kulick on Union, N.J., on the United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors starting Aug. 1. Kulick was re-elected to a second term to the USBC Board while Page was elected for the first time by the Athletes Advisory Council. Kulick’s first term will expire at the end of the season; Page replaces Tony Manna Jr., who is completing his third and final term. Board members are limited to three terms.

Athletes who have been Team USA members in the past 10 years are eligible to vote to determine athlete representatives to the board. Kulick, 37, first joined the board as an athlete director for the 2011-2012 season. She said she had several reasons for seeking re-election, including that she currently is the only female athlete representative, USBC has implemented many changes during her short time of service – decisions she has supported and wants to follow through on – and her travel schedule has slowed so she can commit more time. “I’ve also learned more about the organization and how it runs,” Kulick said. “I have enjoyed getting to know the other board members. They have inspired me and educated me all at the same time. ... As cliché as this sounds, one person can make a difference. I only hope to learn more and grow the sport for all.” Kulick is a 10-time and current Team USA member and two-time Junior Team USA member. She has won 30 medals in international competition, including the first team gold for the United States at the World Games when she teamed with Mike Fagan for the mixed doubles title in 2013.

Page, 30, is a seven-time Team USA and two-time Junior Team USA member, and has won more than 20 medals in international competition. A member of the Professional Bowlers Association Tour since 2007, he was named the PBA Rookie of the Year after making the championship round in five events. He was a member of the Kansas team that captured the 2004 Inter-collegiate Team Championships and he was named MVP of the tournament.

He said it means a tremendous amount to him to have his peers elect him to the board. “I decided to run for the board because I don’t want to sit on the sidelines and continue to watch,” Page said.

“I want to help turn the sport of bowling around and make it a household name again. I believe with my knowledge, experience, and passion that I can help us do some great things in the near future.” Kulick and Page each will serve a three-year term on the USBC Board.

2014 USBC Convention Comes to a Close

RENO, Nev. – Delegates elected four board members and decided eight legislative proposals on Friday, the final day of the 2014 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting. Delegates took part in seminars, heard from industry leaders and saw the presentation of national awards during the USBC Convention that started Tuesday.

On Friday, the delegates heard from USBC President Andrew Cain and USBC Interim Executive Director Chad Murphy before voting on four open spots on the USBC board. Current board members Jo Dimond of Columbus, Ohio, Marci Williams of Wichita, Kan., and Robert Spigner of Chicago were elected to the USBC Board of Directors and will be joined by Karl Kielich of El Paso, Texas, who served a two-year term on the board from 2011-2013. The board members will begin their three-year terms Aug. 1. Each of the four board members elected Friday were selected on the first ballot. Six candidates, each slated by the USBC Nominating Committee, were on the ballot and a candidate needed a majority of the 825 eligible voting delegates for election.

Spigner led the voting with 564 votes followed by Williams (528), Dimond (506), Kielich (460), Jay Daryman (378) of York, Pa., and Brian Bulko (309) of El Paso, Texas. Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., recently was re-elected to a second term to the USBC Board by the Athletes Advisory Council. The athletes also elected Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., to replace Tony Manna Jr., who is completing his third and final term. Board members are limited to three terms. Athletes who have been Team USA members in the past 10 years were eligible to vote to determine the athlete representatives to the board.

The 825 voting delegates (794 association delegates, eight athletes and 23 board members) voted on six proposals relating to USBC bylaws (two were withdrawn), one proposal relating to league rules, and one proposal related to tournament rules during the legislative session. USBC bylaws proposals required a two-thirds vote to pass while league rules and tournament rules required a majority vote. Five proposals (one league rule, one tournament league rule and three USBC bylaws) were accepted and three proposals (USBC bylaws) were rejected. Please see below for the proposed amendments and the voting results. USBC also showcased its significant financial support of charitable causes during Convention week.

USBC Bowl for the Cure received a late donation of \$25,000 from Barb Chrisman and Storm Products to reach its Your Roll to a Million goal set last year. The late contribution pushed the total donation to Susan G. Komen For The Cure over the \$1 million mark to \$1,000,427.09.

In 2014, USBC Bowl for the Cure eclipsed the \$10 million mark in total donations to Susan G. Komen For The Cure. Go to BOWL.com/BFTC for more information on Bowl for the Cure.

The Bowlers to Veterans Link, which raised more than \$823,000 for America’s activeduty and veteran service men and women, recognized the top state and local associations for their contributions during the 2012-2013 season.

The top BVL state contributors for the season were California (\$129,766.33), Virginia (\$45,276.90) and Texas (\$39,928.71). For local associations, Citrus Belt USBC was the top contributor with \$23,026.57 followed by Minneapolis USBC with \$15,466.87 and Nation’s Capital Area USBC with \$15,319. 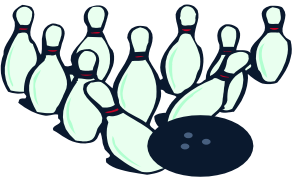
VOSS TOPS WALTER RAY IN PBA50 SOUTH REGIONAL EVENT

went from a successful pro-gram to the best program in the United States.

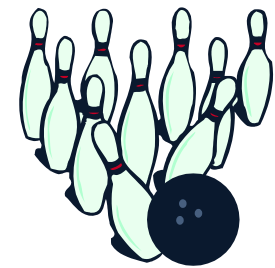

They learn how to win, how to lose, how to organize, how important team efforts are, and how it is just as important to be an individual. And they learn that, sometimes all too painfully, and they learn without undue pressure on them.

Boys and girls interested in bowling can't bowl all they want since most allowances won't stretch that far. Many become a little more eager to do some extra chores around the house to earn some extra money to bowl some extra games.

Some take on a part-time job, and many keep score at tournaments. There, mothers have little to fear, a bowling center is a good place for a youngster to be.

... Golf can be an aggravating sport, but most pro bowlers play golf to relax from bowling, which also can be an aggravating game.

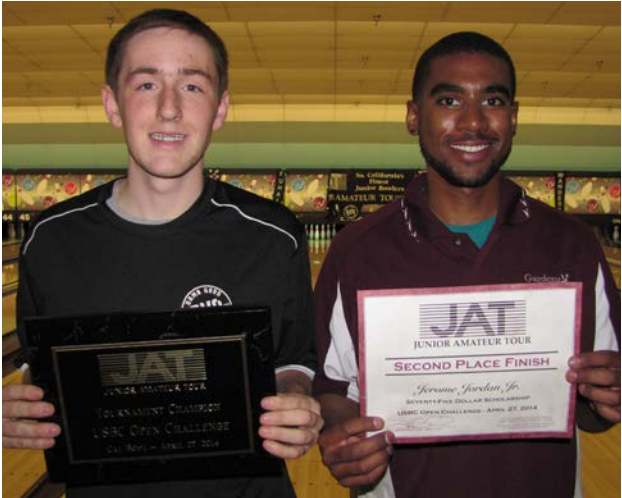
