MISSY PARKIN WINS 2011 USBC QUEENS



2011 USBC Queen's Champion Missy Parkin

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - After a heart-breaking finish at last year's United States Bowling Congress Queens, there was no way Missy Parkin of Lake Forest, Calif., was going to let the coveted title get away again.

The 29-year-old right-hander headed into the 2011 USBC Queens more determined than ever and defeated top-seed Elysia Current of Ephrata, Pa., 214-189, to claim her first major championship at the Oncenter Convention Center on Wednesday.

The championship round aired live on ESPN2 and marked the first time a women's bowling event was broadcast in high definition.

"I've made TV shows before, but I've never won, and words can't describe how I'm feeling right now," said Parkin, who took home the Queens tiara and \$20,000 first-place check for the win. "I was raised in a pro shop and a bowling center, and this is something I've always dreamed about. To finally get it is an amazing feeling."

Parkin made a run at the Queens title last year in El

Paso, Texas, but her efforts were derailed by a 7-10 split that haunted her for months after. She stepped up needing a mark to defeat eventual champion Kelly Kulick in the second match of the night, but the untimely split left her with a fourth-place finish.

"After last year's show, I was pretty devastated, and for a while after that, every time I left the 7-10, I got angrier and angrier," said Parkin, whose only loss this week was against Current in the match to determine the No. 1 seed for the TV show. "But today, I definitely had a different mindset. I told myself I needed to throw 10 good shots every game, and that's all I could do. That was my plan all week, and it worked out well."

Current started the championship match with three consecutive strikes before being slowed by a split and three straight spares in frames five through seven. A missed washout in the ninth frame ended her bid for her first win on bowling's biggest stage, but she intends to learn from the experience.

"I didn't catch a couple of

the shots like I should have, and the end result wasn't good," said Current, who was the 2003-04 Collegiate Player and Rookie of the Year at Fairleigh Dickinson and then went on to help Wichita State to a televised national championship in 2007. "I'm definitely going to take what I learned here and use it to help me achieve bigger and better things."

Current, a 26-year-old right-hander, earned \$10,000 for the runner-up finish.

In reaching the title match, Parkin downed USBC Hall of Famer and 2002 Queens champion Kim Terrell-Kearney of Grand Prairie, Texas, 235-172. Terrell-Kearney received \$7,000 for the third-place effort.

To open the championship round, one-time Professional Women's Bowling Association titlist Cathy Dorin-Lizzi of Sandusky, Ohio, defeated USBC Hall of Famer and three-time Queens champion Wendy Macpherson, 180-168.

Dorin-Lizzi was the only bowler in the 206-player field guaranteed to make the show, since she was slated to be the

sideline reporter for the telecast, but she chose a different route, which included a match-play win over her hall-of-fame sister, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard. Dorin-Lizzi's run came to an end in the second match of the night as she fell to Terrell-Kearney, 223-206. She took home \$5,000 for the fourth-place finish.

The 2011 Queens featured 206 of the top female bowlers in the world competing for a total prize fund of \$120,000.

BOBBY LYONS ROARS!

REDLANDS — There's no meow in Bobby Lyons bowling game. While he may be as gentle as a kitten to his friends, he turns into a wildcat on the lanes. Steady head, focused eyes and measured steps all describe Bobby's approach toward his prey, those ten pins. He goes after pins like Simba after Bambi.

Just days ago, Bobby Lyons roared. The result was a 823 (279 - 279 -265) record tying series. The set ties the high for an Empire Bowl senior, and Lyons may be the oldest Citrus Belt bowler to break the 800 barrier. He is 70 years and 6 months old. The series tied Bobby's own house record, rolled four years ago, and equaled by LARRY BOYD just three months ago.

Lyons' high score was nailed down with a Hammer Taboo. The ball was drilled by MARV SARGENT of BOWLERS DEPOT PRO SHOP. Bobby wants Marv to know that he is grateful for taking care of his equipment.

The big series boosted Bobby's average to 235 for the season. It is the highest book average ever registered by a Citrus Belt bowler, sixty-five years or older. The previous record book average (231) for a senior, was set by FRANK WEILER last season at the age of 66. In 2009, DAVE GULLEY booked 229 at the age of 65.

Bobby's thanks go out to the BOWLING NEWS for supporting Citrus Belt senior bowlers. He wanted to say super senior bowlers, but how can a seventy year old claim to be a super senior while competing against EMPIRE BOWL'S many ninety year old keglars?

PAULA VIDAD WINS USBC SENIOR QUEENS

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - Paula Vidad of Sun City, Calif., claimed the 2011 United States Bowling Congress Senior Queens title in record fashion as she defeated defending champion Char Hammel of Las Vegas at the On-center Convention Center on Wednesday.

Vidad put together games of 225, 221 and 269 for a 715 series, the highest championship-match score in USBC Senior Queens history, while Hammel finished with 211, 225 and 202 for a 638 set. Hammel previously held the record with 705, which she shot on the way to the crown in El Paso, Texas, last year.

Only 10 pins separated Vidad and Hammel after the second game of their three-game title bout, but Vidad started the finale with a spare and five strikes to pull away. Hammel spared in frames four through six and never recovered.

"This is the most prestigious event there is for us, and

I'm so excited right now," said Vidad, a 51-year-old right-hander, who qualified fifth and then averaged 215.8 on the way to a 6-0 match-play record. "I've always want to win a USBC title in my career, and this is amazing. You can win at the city and state level, but to do it on a national level is what you dream of doing."

Because the Senior Queens uses a true double-elimination format, Hammel needed to defeat Vidad twice to become the first bowler in the event's 11-year history to claim back-to-back titles. Last year, she beat defending champion Janine Primrose of Gardnerville, Nev., to win the event.

"For not having what I felt was the best look, I had a very good week," said Hammel, who qualified 26th and then averaged 211 on the way to a 5-2 match-play record. "There's definitely a fair amount of pressure as the defending champion and knowing that you have to beat

someone twice to win again. I knew going in how great Paula was throwing the ball and how comfortable she was, and I knew it would take a lot to get by her. But it was a great week overall, and I'm extremely happy."

The victory earned Vidad a check for \$3,500, a tiara, pendant and trophy, while Hammel earned \$1,800 for second place. This year's Senior Queens featured 76 of the world's best female bowlers age 50 and older.

Kevin Gannon Wins The Super Senior Division

WCST Ebonite Singles in a Very High Scoring Tournament

at Orleans Casino Lanes in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS—Eight bowlers went to the finals of the WCST Ebonite Singles at Orleans Casino Lanes in Las Vegas. Winning his 1st Title this year, and his leading over-all total of 36 Titles, Kevin Gannon (Lakewood), won this tournament by 113 pins over the 2nd place finisher. All 8 finalists qualified with a 240 plus average, for the 10 games, with Kevin, 2492, down to eight place, Lee Taylor, 2416.

Ron Winger did not make the cut, with 2406. The 25 bowlers entered for the 250 games of qualifying averaged 220.1 per bowler, per game, one of the highest qualifying round in the WCST history. The tournament entry field was smaller, due to the short notice change of date, that moved the tournament from April 23-24, to the following, Friday and Saturday, April 29-30. The finals on Saturday. 64 Games bowled, bowlers averaged 224.8 per bowler, per game. Kevin rolled 1906, for the 8 games, won 5 of 8 matches to win.

The biggest factor for Barry Gurney and Dick Baker to finish 2nd and 3rd, was going into the position matches. Bernie Iwasczysyn in 2nd place, 50 pins ahead of Dick, and 73 pins ahead of Barry. Jim Slaughter in 3rd place, 45 pins ahead of Dick, and 68 pins ahead of Barry. Then disaster struck for both Bernie and Jim. In separate matches, Barry rolled a 279 game and Dick, a 236 game and won their matches, and received bonus pins for the wins along with their scores, and both passed Bernie and Jim. Bernie rolled a 171 game, and dropped to 4th. Jim, a 145 game and dropped all the way to 7th. Top 3: 1st Place, Kevin Gannon, \$800.00, 2nd Place, Barry Gurney (W. Hills), \$625.00 and 3rd to Dick Baker (Henderson, NV), \$500.00. 9 checks paid out for a \$3,820.00 pay off. 6 Tournaments this year, \$37,535.00 paid out, and for 327 tournaments, a total of \$3,510,460.00 paid out.

Brunswick Trio Team Bowls Three Clean Games - Sets or Ties National Record

MURRIETA—The BRUNSWICK CAL OAKS Trio Team finished their three league games at 10:53 PM the other night, to the cheers of twenty onlookers. The roar was so loud, I wandered over to find out what happened. They had just completed three clean team games - a TEAM “CLEAN SWEEP.” It means the team had no open frames for three league games. It also means the team either SET or TIED a USBC NATIONAL RECORD - ninety clean frames in three certified league games, by a trio team.

In fifty plus years of bowling, I cannot remember hearing of any team completing a three game set without an open frame. Have you? I imagine the Saint Louis Budweiser team, of five, may have had 150 clean frames when they bowled their record three game score. However, I don’t know for sure.

The members of the Brunswick team and their scores follow:

Mike Copenig	288 - 244 - 238 = 770
Bob Simrak	256 - 206 - 225 = 687
Dewaine West	238 - 238 - 228 = 704

The threesome left only one split all night, a 5-7 converted by Mike Copenig. West rolled thirty-five perfect pocket hits, striking twenty-four times and leaving eleven seven pins. The lefty converted all eleven.

While the team had ninety official clean frames, they actually bowled 103 clean frames. Together the team registered 68 strikes, 33 spares and two fill balls. The maximum number of opportunities available to a trio team in three games would be 108 (3 X 36).

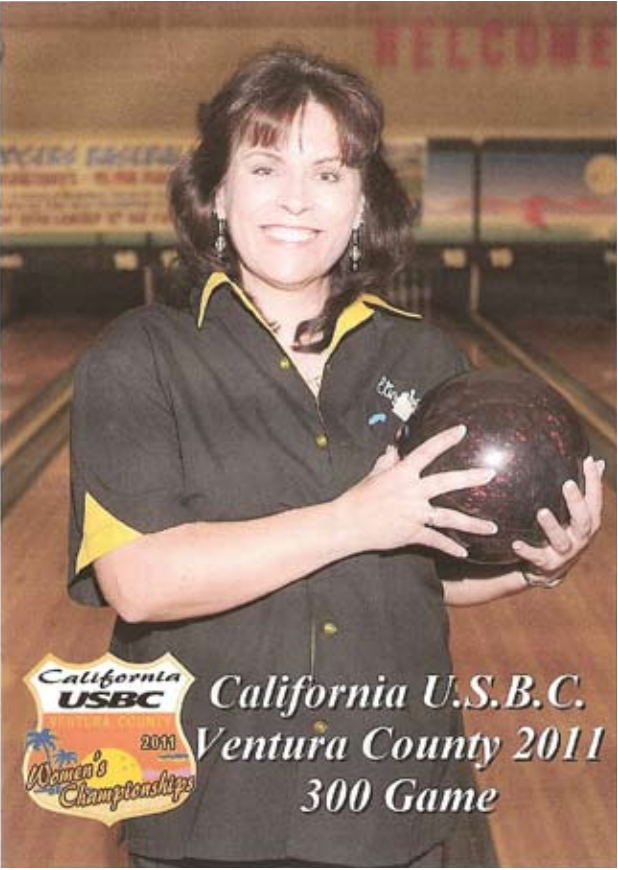

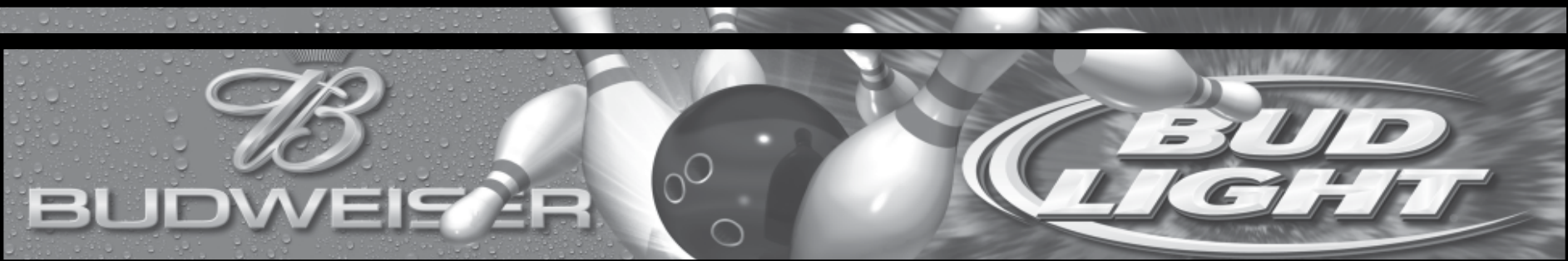
