# Kulick Takes 2010 USBC Queens

EL PASO, Texas - Kelly Kulick proved she could beat the men earlier this year and Wednesday she came out on top against a field of the top women bowlers in the world, earning her second United States Bowling Congress Queens title.

The Union, N.J., native climbed the five-player stepladder, winning four consecutive matches, and defeating top seed Tennelle Milligan of Arlington, Texas, 232-188, to win the Queens at the El Paso Convention and Performing Arts Center.

Kulick, the No. 4 seed, made sports history when she became the first woman to win a title on the Professional Bowlers Association Tour in January by defeating Chris Barnes, 265-195, to win the PBA Tournament of Champions. On Wednesday, she added her third career major women's title to her resume.

"I feel like I've been carrying a four-leaf clover in my pocket and have had luck on my side lately," said Kulick, who earned \$25,000 for the victory. "This has been the ride of a lifetime. The only way it gets better at this point is if in three months I'm driving a Lexus and have a million dollar endorsement deal."

The 2007 Queens champion

and 2003 U.S. Women's Open champion, Kulick got ahead early in the match and never looked back against Milligan. Kulick threw four consecutive strikes from the fourth to the seventh frame, while Milligan failed to double in that stretch.

"It's heartbreaking for Tennelle because I know what a stellar performance she had all week," said Kulick, who was the runner-up to Liz Johnson at the 2009 Queens. "I just had a good performance all week long as well and it was just about getting to the show and seeing what would happen."

Milligan, the 2005 Queens and 2000 U.S. Women's Open champion, said she was pleased with her performance this week despite losing in the title match.

"I was excited, nervous, pumped up and ready to go out there and put on a good show," said Milligan, who earned \$15,000 for second. "I just went out there and overthrew the ball. Once I calmed down, everything fell into place, but when you are bowling a game on TV, it's the fastest game of your life."

In reaching the title match, Kulick took out USBC Hall of Famer Anne Marie Duggan of Edmond, Okla., 226-176. With the third place finish and continued on page 8

"I didn't bowl very well in nationals, but I picked up steam once qualifying began

for the Senior Queens," Hammel said. "Once I got comfortable with the venue, it all came together for me."

Hammel won four matches in the winners bracket before being handed her first loss of the tournament by Primrose, 657-647, on Tuesday night. Hammel then defeated USBC Hall of Famer and 2009 Senior Queens runner-up Dana Miller-Mackie of Albuquerque, N.M., for the right for another shot at Primrose.

In the deciding match Wednesday morning, Hammel got out to an early lead of 30 pins after the first game and never looked back, easily defeating the defending cham-

For Primrose, it was an end to her bid to become the first repeat champion in Senior Queens history. She went undefeated at last year's Senior Queens and won her first five matches before dropping the pair of matches to Hammel.

The victory earned Hammel a check for \$3,500, a tiara, pendant and trophy, while Primrose earned \$1,800 for second place.



Right behind her and bowling like he was possessed was Josh Gartrell going 226-248-267-237. We also had Brett Huntoon 263-246-248 and Gabriella Mayfield 221-261 to round out the super highs. Additional highs then came in from Michele Stephens 223-253-225, Tyler Samora 246-221, Matt Miller 245, Tobias Halladay 224-234-242, Daniel Martinez 238-242, Bobby Hornacek 241, Wesley Low 238, Tristan Beaner 221-235, Spencer Van Rijsbergen 234-225-233, Valerie Riggin 233-223, Andrew Svoren 233, Lawrence Merriweather 230-223-227-225, Steven Rose 227, Oscar Chan 222-225-225, Aaron Beck 225-222, Baujee Harian 225, and Adam Dubia 224. The notable thing for this tournament, Wesley Low DID NOT make cut. Not to worry Wesley, you're in good company with Tiger Woods this week. Great Bowling all of you.

The leader after qualifying was Ms. Mayall at plus 177 while 16th to advance came in at even. And with five more games to go in match play, the high games just kept on coming in. Huntoon went 269-246-268-234 to share tournament high game with Mayall. He was followed by Riggin 262-235, Beaner 226-244-221, Merriweather 222-244, Chan 233-243-227-225, Mayall 241, Gartrell 237, Mayfield 237, Dubia 232-235-223, Svoren 233-235, Van Rijsbergen 223-224-221, and Beck 222-233. Dubia made the most of match play jumping seven positions to get into the finals.

Those finals then started off with 5th seed Gartrell (+237) who was making his first appearance in the finals, taking on the 4th seed Dubia (+242). Still showing signs of possession, Gartrell captured this match 238-213. He then advanced to meet 3rd seed Chan (+285) and claim another victim 221-204. But all good things must come to an end. sional men and women bowlers. Today he continues to be a soughtafter instructor for both pros and amateurs alike. Jowdy has been a Columbia 300 representative in sales and public relations since 1962 and is credited with the development of Team Columbia which became the first group of top pro players to represent a ball company on the pro tour. Subsequently, all major ball companies have created their own teams.

As a writer, Jowdy's columns appear in dozens of bowling newspapers and magazines and he is the author of two books on the sport, Bowling Execution and Bowling Execution, Second Edition.

Jowdy was elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 1988, principally due to his coaching contributions and undying support for professional bowling. He is the only coach ever elected to the PBA Hall of Fame. He is also a member of the Texas Bowling Hall of Fame, the San Antonio Bowling Hall of Fame, and the Bowling Writers Association of America Hall of Fame. He was inducted to the USBC Hall of Fame on March 15, 2001 and in 2006, he was chosen as the International Bowling Coach of the Year.

Prior to Mr. Jowdy's induction, two Trailblazers, also selected by the Hall of Fame committee, will be recognized as coaching visionaries who laid the foundation for all who followed. The list includes

Joe Kristof - A top bowler and instructor in northeast, he conducted hundreds of clinics as an AMF staff member. An innovator in the pro shop business, Kristof had a stub lane with a full approach in his Columbus, Ohio pro shop where he gave thousands of lessons. He made his name in Chicago as a member of the Kathryns and Taverns Pales teams that won the BPAA team champion-ships in 1947, 48 and 49.

Jeanette Robinson - During her career she served the sport and business of bowling as a leader, organizer, promoter and coach and was an early member of the AMF staff and is a past president of the WPBA (1965-1975). Robinson has coached Team USA to gold in Sweden FIQ; was president of the women's tour for ten years; and has been the "House Pro" at Showboat Lanes and Orleans Bowling Center in Las Vegas for over 30 years where she still teaches.

#### **About the Bowling Coaches** Hall of Fame

The Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame was established by the STE Skills Center, a division of Strike Ten Entertainment (STE), in 2008 and has a presence in the new International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame located at the International Bowling Campus in Arlington, Texas.
