

Teen Standout Wesley Low Jr. Wins Another PBA Regional

DUBLIN — Young, 2-handed lefty standout Wesley Low Jr. of California has done it again.

Low, who turned 18 on April 27, won his second PBA Regional Sunday April 12, 2015, going 9-3 in match play and totaling 5,028 for 20 games to take the PBA Earl Anthony West/ Northwest Memorial at Earl Anthony's Dublin Bowl, PBA reported. Low finished 166 pins ahead of Josh Blanchard, the former PBA Rookie of the Year who won his first two PBA Tour titles back-to-back in recent weeks

Back in March 2013, Low at 15 became the youngest bowler ever to win a PBA title, although I wrote in this blog that it should come with an asterisk since it was a non-champions Regional.

Pete Weber remains the youngest bowler to win an open PBA tournament when he won a PBA Regional at 17 in 1979. (I am fairly certain Weber was not within a couple of weeks of his 18th birthday at the time.)

And, yes, non-members still don't credit for a PBA "title" ---regardless, Low has won two PBA Regionals so he is a 2-time champion in this guy's book.

The bottom line is the uber talented Low has won two PBA tournaments - and likely will win more, hopefully some day as a PBA member.

MOORESVILLE, N.C. -In a tournament he dedicated to his father Jerry, who passed away two weeks ago, Jack Jurek of Lackawanna, N.Y. survived an emotional championship match to win the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic presented by Columbia 300 Wednesday at George Pappas' Victory Lanes.

Jurek also survived an early open in the third frame of the championship match but then roared back with nine consecutive strikes to defeat five-time PBA Tour and twotime PBA50 Tour winner Bob Learn Jr. of Erie, Pa., 264-224. It was Jurek's second PBA50 Tour title to go along with the two titles he has won on the PBA Tour.

VINCE WOOD Wins Citrus Belt Masters by Frank Weiler

SAN BERNARDINO - Vince Wood won the Citrus Belt Masters Tournament last week. NO SURPRISE. Vince Wood became the first bowler to win our Masters Tournament four times. NO SURPRISE. Vince Wood made his victory look easy. NO SURPRISE.

When Vince Wood is on his game he is hard to beat. When Vince Wood is locked in and matches up he is hard to beat. Well last week Vince Wood was on his game and posted a 4 - 1 match game record to capture this seasons Citrus Belt Masters Title.

The seven competitors joining our champion in the finals were Bobby Campagnale, Curtis Covey, Mark Dyer, Kevin Gagnon, Mark Learned, Marc Levy and Mike Nakunz. JOHN VALENTINE JR. just missed making the finals by nine pins after grinding through five games during the last chance qualifying squad. The finals featured a double elimination match play format. Each match was decided by total pins for two games.

Mike Nakunz came out of the gate faster than anyone else, rolling a 300 in his first game. A second game of 233 gave Mike one of the highest two game totals of the day and a win. Mike won two more matches before tasting defeat at the hands of our champion. Wood rolled the second 300 of the day in defeating Nakunz.

Mark Dyer handed Nakunz his second loss and advanced out of the Consolation Bracket to challenge Wood for the title, after Wood advanced from the Winners Bracket. Dyer then handed Wood his only match play loss of the day with a close 422 - 412 victory. A 4-6-7-9-10 split by Wood in the tenth frame of game two was the difference.

Vince turned the table on Mark during their second and final match putting up big numbers 278 - 237 = 515 to win the match and the title by 75 pins.

Wood used his Storm Reign On to win the title. It was the ball that matched up best with the tournament's oil pattern.

MIKE RADDEMAN (Citrus Belt President) and RICK HILL (Citrus Belt Past President) did a great job conducting the tournament finals. They have been doing so superbly for years. Mike and Rick wish to thank all the bowlers who competed in the tournament and the BOWLING NEWS for supporting Citrus Belt bowlers.



A DISCUSSION WITH EDITOR/PUBLISHER CAROL MANCINI



For Bowling Legend Johnny Petraglia, **PBA50 Tournament Named in His Honor Will Have Special Meaning**

Hall of Famer will be among several legends competing in PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open May 2-5 at Farmingdale Lanes

FARMINGDALE, N.Y. -- On May 17, 2012, Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia set a record that may never be broken.

The legendary lefthander became the first player in PBA history to win a national tour or senior tour title in six different decades when he won the PBA Senior Dayton Classic at Capri Lanes in Kettering, Ohio, at the age of 65. He defeated then-reigning PBA50 Player of the Year Ron Mohr, 220-204, in the title match in for his eighth career PBA50 Tour title.

Petraglia, who remains competitive on the PBA50 Tour in his 50th season of PBA competition, will compete in a tournament named in his honor when the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open presented by Brunswick makes its first visit to Farmingdale Lanes in Farmingdale, N.Y., May 2-5.

'I guess it shows how old I am," said the Brooklyn native jokingly after achieving the titlesin-six-decades milestone. "But it's very special to me because it's part of history and makes it all worth it.

"I was wondering if it was going to happen," he said. "There are so many great Senior Tour players and there are more great bowlers from the regular tour who are becoming eligible, so it doesn't get any easier. Another thing that makes it special is that there are some guys who might be able to tie that record in the coming years and decades, but they'll probably not break it.

Overall, Petraglia and fellow PBA legend, the late Dick Weber, both have won PBA titles in six decades, however, Weber's longevity mark includes a PBA regional title. Petraglia also owns 14 PBA Tour titles, winning his first at a national tour stop in Ft. Smith, Ark., in 1966 at the age of 19.

Petraglia, who would like to become the oldest to win a PBA50 Tour tournament at 68, will be a force to contend with in the tournament bearing his name. The Petraglia BVL Open will feature approximately 100 players ages 50 and over and against that same group of players, Petraglia finished fifth in the UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl In The Villages two weeks ago.

"I'm really looking forward to bowling in Farmingdale both as a participant and because of what it means to our veterans," Petraglia said. "My physical game is very good but it's going to be a busy week with all that will be happening. Really, the overall success of the tournament is what's important and if I can do well, that will just be icing on the cake.

"And of course, raising a lot of money for the veterans is the main thing."

In addition to his sterling record as a competitor, Petraglia has been active for decades off the lanes in BVL and other charitable programs in support of United States military veterans. Petraglia served a tour of duty with the U.S. armed forces during the Vietnam War.

BVL, which is funded exclusively by the bowling industry, provides recreational and therapeutic programs and services for America's active duty and veteran service men and women.

Petraglia, one of six players ever to win the PBA Triple Crown, is a member of the PBA (1982) and United States Bowling Congress (2003) Halls of Fame. He also was the recipient of the 2010 BPAA Dick Weber Bowling Ambassador Award, and missed this season's PBA50 Tour opening event in New Port Richey, Fla., to attend the Billiard and Bowling Institute of America's annual meeting in Hilton Head, S.C., where he was awarded the BBIA Industry Service Award.

Sweda said it was her understanding that there were plans to "level the shopping center." A Dollar Store and a couple of banks also exist in the center. Sweda said she "did not know what's going in."

The bowling center has 20 employees, Sweda said.

"We're known in these parts as just an old-fashioned bowling center," Sweda added.

PBA bowler Ross Packard has regularly used Cambrian Family Bowl, rolling countless perfect games and 800 series. Packard turned in a memorable series at the center on Nov. 26, 2002 when he rolled a phenomenal 868.

That series included games of 279, 289 and 300.


