Bakersfield's Joe "JP" Smith Wins \$25,000 in AMF National Bowling Tournament

LAS VEGAS — The excitement started to brew back in mid-March when we heard that Joe Smith had won the District Finals down at AMF Riverside Lanes in Riverside. It was the same weekend as our GEUSBC Mixed City Tournament and the news spread quickly at AMF Southwest Lanes that Smith would be going on to Vegas to bowl in the record-breaking \$700,000 AMF National In-League Tournament boasted as the "richest bowling tournament!"

This was the third year for this event and, according to AMF CEO and President Fred Hipp, "Our biggest and best yet. Once again, our league

bowlers demonstrated an impressive level of skill and sportsmanship."

Smith, 26, was among 108 finalists to compete the weekend of April 27-28, at The Orleans in Las Vegas. Finalists were competing in four divisions (Open, Division A, Division B and Division C). Smith was competing in the Open division. This year more than 25,000 AMF league bowlers entered this tournament.

Representing AMF Southwest Lanes, Smith started his journey qualifying in the Tuesday night Aquaducks league at AMF Southwest Lanes during this winter season. He bowled on a team with Vicki Taylor, Dot McKinney, Don

Ashbridge, Danica Ashbridge (Joe's girlfriend) and Joe. He qualified with a 709 (70 pins over his average) which placed him third overall in the center finals and also made him eligible for the District Finals.

In March, Joe along with another local qualifier, Don Apple, traveled to compete in the Division Finals in Riverside. There Smith shot a 716 (77 pins over his average) to win and Apple ended up second. For winning his Division, Smith advanced on to an all-expense paid trip to Vegas and a shot at winning \$50,000!

The weekend of April 27-28 had Smith bowling a total of 11 games over the course of

Walter Ray Williams Jr. Wins PBA Senior Don Carter Memorial

Hall of Famer defeats Bo Goergen in title match 247-217 to cap off emotional week

WINTER GARDEN, Fla. — Rebounding from a tough 2011-12 Professional Bowlers Association Tour season and coping with the emotions resulting from his father's recent passing, Walter Ray Williams Jr. persevered to win the PBA Senior Don Carter Memorial Open presented by Ebonite Wednesday for his third career Senior Tour title.

Williams defeated Bo Goergen of Sanford, Mich., in the championship at Carter Family Bowl, 247-217, marking his first Senior Tour win since the

Senior Mark Roth Allentown Open in May of 2011.

In the 2011-12 Tour season, the 52-year-old Hall of Famer's record streak of 26 consecutive years making at least one TV finals appearance came to an end and he had a best finish of only 17th in the Shark Open. On Tuesday his father passed away after a lengthy illness.

"I'm not an emotional person but I'll have to admit this was an emotional week for me," said Williams. "It helped a great deal to have my family here not only for my dad but also to be here to watch me bowl."

Even though the scores showed that Williams was dominant in match play, he felt fortunate to win all four of his matches Wednesday.

"On paper it looked easy but I can tell you that in a few of those matches my opponents bowled better than they scored," said the PBA Tour all-time titles leader with 47 wins. "An example was Bo in the ti-

tle match when he started with the first five (strikes) but then had a split in the sixth frame which gave me an opening."

Williams' win in the second tournament of the 2012 season comes off a fourth-place finish in last week's season-opening Senior Sun Bowl In The Villages in The Villages, Fla.

"It was a great tournament and nice to win again," Williams said. "It's a confidence builder and now I just hope I can keep some momentum go-

Diverse Class Inducted Into USBC Hall of Fame

ARLINGTON — The United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame has inducted one of the most diverse classes in its history, including its first wheelchair bowler, one foreign-born player, and a three-time U.S. Open winner.

In all, nine individuals were inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame during ceremonies at the Sheraton Hotel in Arlington, Texas.

The Superior Performance category saw four new inductees: Dave Husted of Milwaukie, Ore.; Amleto Monacelli of Venezuela; Tom Baker of King, N.C.; and Dede Davidson of Buellton, Calif.

Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., and Gary Daroszewski of Franklin, Wis., were inducted in the Outstanding USBC Performance category.

Joan Feinblum of Santa Rosa, Calif., and the late Kerm Helmer were inducted for Meritorious Service, and wheelchair bowler Al Uttecht of Anaheim, Calif., became the first person inducted in the Pioneer category since 2008.

Dave Husted, 52, won the U.S. Open in 1982, 1995 and 1996. He won the Showboat Invitational twice, in 1990 and 1995, and owns 14 Pro-

fessional Bowlers Association titles overall. In 2008, the PBA ranked him No. 23 on the list of the 50 Greatest Players in PBA History. He was elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 1996.

"I really would like to thank the USBC for even considering me," Husted said. "I was fortunate enough to throw a bowling ball for a living for

The Perfect Game

Carol: Congratulations are in order, Steve. More questions are coming in from our readers.

Steve: Wow! Someone is still reading bowling stuff? Back in PA, bowlers are going into hibernation!

Carol: You better believe it! Here in Southern Cal we take bowling seriously. We bowl all year long!

Steve: I’m impressed! So, what’s this week’s question?

Carol: This one is from Melissa, who is a 17 year old high school student from Van Nuys. She says, “I only bowl occasionally with my friends. I have fun and would probably bowl more often, but they tease me because I throw a backup ball. Can you help?”

Steve: I sure can, Melissa! You need to find new friends to go bowling with.

Carol: Uh, Steve, I don’t think that’s quite where we want to go with this one.

Steve: Relax, Carol. I was only kidding. The problem is not that she rolls a backup ball; it is that she feels her friends are laughing at her because of it. The fact is that it’s not unusual for young ladies to roll backup balls, so let’s look at this differently. Instead of calling it a backup ball, let’s say she is right-handed and rolls a ball which curves to the right. Such a trajectory is normally associated with left-handed bowlers. Melissa, my advice for you is to move your stance to the left. Roll the ball over the third arrow from the left-hand gutter and

Carol: channel!

Steve: Huh?

Carol: It’s a channel here, not a gutter. You’re not in Pennsylvania anymore, “Dorothy!”

Steve: Got it! Okay Melissa, my advice is for you to move where you stand (on the approach) to the left and roll your ball over the third arrow from the left hand gutter.

Carol: Channel.

Steve: Gutter!

Carol: CHANNEL!

Steve: GUTTER!!!

Carol: CHANNEL!!!!

Steve: Fine! Roll your ball over the third arrow from the ditch on the left side of the alley and

Carol: Lane!

Steve: What?

Carol: We don’t call it an alley. We call it a lane.

Steve: Lane. Got it! Okay Melissa, move your stance to the left and roll the ball down the left side of the lane so that it curves into the 1-2 pocket. It is very important that you pick a particular arrow as a target and stick with it. Move your stance to the right or left just a little at a time until hitting that arrow puts the ball in the pocket. Your friends will stop laughing when you begin outscoring them.

Carol: I disagree. If she’s right-handed, I think she should stay on the right side of the approach and adjust her wrist position to make the ball go straight or hook to the left.

Steve: That’s good advice also, Carol. There are always options in coaching. But I believe my advice is more appropriate based on the little bits of information her question provided. I’ll explain if you like.

Carol: I insist.

Steve: Adjusting wrist position is advanced technique but Melissa is not an advanced bowler. She is a casual bowler, a beginner, using rental shoes and a house ball, hanging on to which is probably a struggle. She is self-conscious and has a lot to learn about this game. At this point, she wants to do better, but would probably quit bowling completely rather than tolerate further embarrassment. Paying attention to her wrist may make her so inconsistent that she never sets foot in a bowling center again. Her friends are probably not much better than she is; birds of a feather and all. For her to be successful, we need to take her natural talent and make it more effective. Moving her reverse hook to the left side of the lane changes the balls entry angle to one which is more effective in terms of pin-fall. Coupling that with a brief lesson on spot bowling should increase the number of spares she converts. Any improvement leads to confidence. Confidence leads to league play. League play leads to personal coaching and custom fit equipment which will enable her to develop advanced abilities. Rather than quitting, Melissa will be on a path which leads to a lifetime of enjoying the perfect game.

Carol: Huh, I never looked at it that way.

NAVARRO CLOSES WITH 298-947 IN DEAF TRAVEL AT DEL RIO

DOWNEY — So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League had an exciting season final position round session at Del Rio Lanes with Francisco Navarro being near perfect in his first game. Navarro started with 11 strikes in row and went high on his 12th ball leaving 4-10 split standing. The hard throwing right-hander finished with 298-213-228 (739-208 for 947 as a consolation he took over the league’s season high game and series.

Bob Jones previously held the high series 928 and Gorman Low had the high game 289. The 947 is Navarro’s (this season’s) third 900 and the most in this league and raised his average up to 195. Bob Jones, although missing the last two sessions leads with 200 average.

Navarro’s heroic helped his powerful first place Covina team beat 2nd place Joes’ S F Valley 12-8 in this final position round session. The win helped Covina move up to a rarified 200 points level with 211.5 match points in this match points league.

The closest battle for positions was the last place 1.5 points between 7th place Whittier and 8th place Riverside which Riverside beat Whittier by 2 points 11-9 and exchanged places.

To show how powerful the Covina trio team of Navarro, Andy Lorenzo and Emad Aranki is, this team finished almost 40 match points ahead of 2nd place S F Valley. In comparison another almost 40 match points separates the remaining 7 teams from S F Valley to last place 8th team Whittier with Navarro’s 947 leading the day’s honor roll of 8 bowlers, the rest were Robert Audette with the only other 800, 215-183-205-202 for 805, Jeff Stansell missed 800 by 10 pins with 790 from 222-232-137-198, Gorman Low with 735, Connie Marchione (215) 718, Jim Mohr (202-205) 715, Ed Abakumoff (219) 712 and Emad Aranki 202.

The 52 years old League thanks Del Rio’s management and staff for the splendid hosting and will return next fall. The league will end its 2011-2012 season with its sweepstakes on May20 at Keystone Lanes with bowling time at 11 AM.

Hello Deaf Bowlers!

NORWALK—This is my first article on bowling tips/advice. I want to let everyone know that there are many different tips/advices to improve ones game- there is no wrong way to improve your bowling- its important to know how to bowl right to improve your scores.

I’ve been taught by numerous coaches- and each coach provides different styles/techniques.

One of the coaches I’ve worked with is John Jowdy- I’ve been blessed to work with this coach. He is well known among the PBA bowlers. John has been kind to provide me with support on tips for deaf (and hearing) bowlers.

I plan to write tips to help with the game - As the 2010-2011 season comes to a close - some of you may take the summer off from bowling. During the summer, you can continue to bowl in a summer league or practice. Practice is very important- as the saying goes “practice makes perfect”. You can still practice and not bowl in leagues. The key thing is work on what you want to work on; you can work with a coach on watching your game. Coaches can observe your game and give you pointers that you need to practice. Practice - this will improve your score. Your coach can help with your form; different hand positions; or try different balls.

Its important you should bowl as much as you can- so you will not get out of shape. If you want to be a better bowler- practice or join a league!

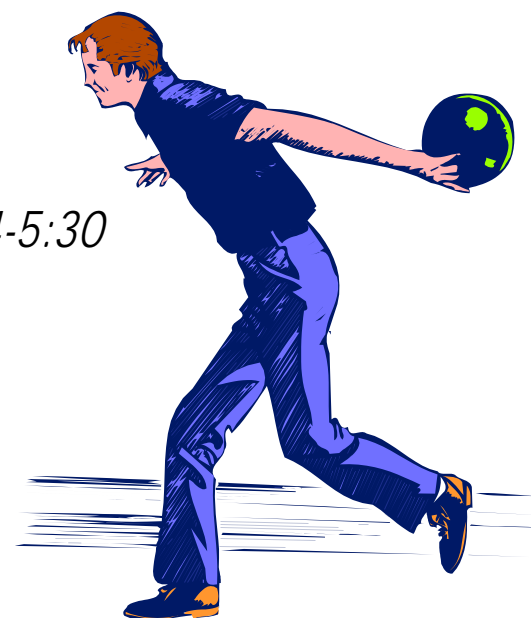

Adding to the joy of the moment was the Reno Silver Dollar Barbershop Quartette who serenaded throughout the room and then joined with 30 of their brothers and thrilled the opening squad of the USBC Women’s Tournament (going on upstairs) with their inspirational rendition of the National Anthem.

Credit for the creation of this wonderful Hall goes to: Keith Hamilton, Elaine Hagin, Eric Kearney, with a special mention of our curator, Keli Thomerson. From Reno, a big applause for Joe Kelley and the design team was the Worthgroup of Denver, Co.

Since the Merger of WIBC and ABC in 1999, to many, there has not been much that has gone right. Membership that was once four million strong has now dipped below two million. But – On April 14 at the opening of this IBMHF Satellite Museum and Hall of Fame and viewing pieces of history and those wonderful women who helped build bowling – one could not help but reflect on the glory days.

about 25 years, and I am very grateful for that. It is a great honor to be in the USBC Hall of Fame. The entire Husted family will remember this night for a long time to come.”

The 50-year-old Amleto Monacelli won 19 PBA titles between 1987 and 2005. He won the Japan Cup twice, in 1987 and 1995, and claimed a major title at the 1989 Touring Players Championship. He became the first international player (Finn Mika Koivuniemi is the only other) who was selected PBA Player of the Year (1989, 90) and is still the only international player who was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame (1997). In 2008 the PBA ranked him No. 21 on the list of the 50 Greatest Players in PBA History.

“When I told my mother that my dream was to compete in the PBA, she told me the first thing I had to do was pray every night,” Monacelli recalled. “Believe me, I did not miss one night of praying. Now to receive the recognition of being inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame is such an honor.”

Tom Baker, 57, won 10 PBA Tour titles between 1980 and 2004, including the 2004 PBA World Championship. He has won nine titles on the PBA Senior Tour, including back-to-back Senior U.S. Open titles in 2005 and 2006, and back-to-back USBC Senior Masters titles in 2006 and 2007. He was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1999, and was No. 40 on the list of the 50 Greatest Players in PBA History.

“When I first started bowling, I never dreamed that major championships and halls of fame would be a part of my career,” Baker said. “I want to give my heartfelt thanks to USBC for recognizing me with this induction. I am truly honored.”

Dede Davidson, 45, was a Triple Crown winner on the Ladies’ Pro Bowlers Tour/Professional Women’s Bowling Association, winning nine professional titles overall. Her Triple Crown victories include the 1991 Queens, the 1993 U.S. Women’s Open, and the 2000 Sam’s Town Invitational. Davidson is the only woman to shoot both an 800 series and a 300 game at the USBC Women’s Championships, a tournament in which she has recorded six top-10 finishes.

“I am honored to be a member of this group of individuals,” Davidson said. “To become a part of bowling history is the ultimate accomplishment of my bowling career. The sport of bowling has given me the opportunity to grow as an individual, and I will forever be thankful for the wonderful experiences bowling has given me. It is a tremendous honor to be standing here tonight.”

The 50-year-old Lennie Boresch Jr. is a three-time titlist at the USBC Open Championships, including the Team All-Events title in 2000, and the Regular Team and Team All-Events titles in 2009. All three titles came with fellow 2012 USBC Hall of Fame inductee Gary Daroszewski. Boresch has 13 top-10 finishes at the Open Championships, and is one of 23 bowlers to record multiple 300s at the USBC Open Championships.

“I’d like to thank the committee for electing me. I know there’s a lot of bowlers to choose from, and I am very honored,” said Boresch, who won the PBA Senior Sun Bowl in his PBA Senior Tour debut just days before his USBC Hall of Fame induction. “What an honor to be inducted with my teammate, Gary Daroszewski. All I can say is this probably is the best week of my life besides getting married to my wife and the birth of my two kids.”

Gary Daroszewski, 53, owns six USBC Open Championships titles. In addition to the three titles he won with Boresch, Daroszewski won Team All-Events titles in 1982 and 1983, as well as a Regular Doubles title in 1989 with Gus Yannaras. Daroszewski has 13 top-10 finishes over 32 years at the Open Championships.

“I am here as living proof that if you work hard and believe in yourself, great things can happen,” Daroszewski said. “I am honored to be a member of the USBC Hall of Fame.”

The 64-year-old Al Uttecht is the most accomplished wheelchair bowler of all time. As a 13-time winner of the American Wheelchair Bowling Association Tournament of Champions, a 12-time AWBA National Scratch titlist, and a seven-time AWBA National All-Events champion, Uttecht paved the way for wheelchair bowlers everywhere. He was confined to a wheelchair after injuries sustained in Vietnam in 1970.

“Being inducted in the Pioneer category is a very special honor for me,” Uttecht said. “I hope that being the first wheelchair bowler inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame opens the door for others. Who knows, maybe someone here tonight will be the next Al Uttecht.”

The late Kerm Helmer was a physical education teacher for more than 35 years who dedicated his life to growing and developing youth and collegiate bowling. His most lasting legacy is as the founder and head coach of the men’s and women’s bowling programs at Erie Community College in Buffalo, N.Y., where he led the Kats to 16 National Junior College Athletic Association men’s titles and 21 women’s titles. Helmer’s men’s and women’s teams each claimed a pair of national titles as well.

“Over the past few years, I have come to realize what an icon my father was in the sport of bowling,” Helmer’s daughter, Kelli, said on her father’s behalf. “I am proud to be his daughter, and to accept this honor on his behalf.”

Joan Feinblum, 80, has dedicated more than five decades of service to bowling at the local, state and national levels, including four years of work on the committees and task forces that helped develop USBC. Feinblum spent more than a decade on the Women’s International Bowling Congress Board of Directors, and most recently served as chairperson of the USBC Nominating Committee and the USBC Hall of Fame Committee.

“I stand here humbled and grateful and I just can’t believe it,” Feinblum said. “What a privilege it is to be inducted. This isn’t about me. It’s about the passion of all those who work and volunteer in this industry. I know that bowling has a big future.”

There now are 394 members of the USBC Hall of Fame - 260 in Performance, 114 in Merit-ori-ous Service and 20 Pioneers.

The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the American Bowling Congress and Women’s International Bowling Congress Halls of Fame.
