It Was All About Fun At First USBC Bowling With The Stars

Hollywood's rising young stars teamed with top woman bowlers for charity exhibition

GREENDALE, Wis. — With popular television shows such as "Skating with Celebrities" and "Dancing with the Stars," could a similar formula work for bowling?

After a positive reception from rising young celebrities and Los Angeles-area bowling fans, the United States Bowling Congress Bowling with the Stars charity event held on May 8 could be the start of something big.

Some of Hollywood's popular young television and movie stars teamed up with three top woman bowlers in a Baker format competition to benefit USBC's Bowl for the Cure®, a fund-raising initiative in partnership with the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation. The event was held at Corbin Bowl in Tarzana, Calif.

Former Professional Women's Bowling Association stars competing were Kim Terrell and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard along with amateur standout Diandra Asbaty. All will be contenders for the title at the 2006 USBC Queens - the only major event in women's bowling - to be conducted June 17-21 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev.

One woman pro and three celebrities comprised each Bowling with the Stars team, named after three major USBC bowling programs:

Team USBC Youth

Captain Diandra Asbaty is the official spokesperson for USBC Youth bowling. She is the reigning women's U.S. Amateur champion and an eight-time member of USBC Team USA.

Stars: Tequan Richmond, 13, stars as "Drew" in the acclaimed Chris Rock show "Everybody Hates Chris;" Chloe Suazo, 14, stars as "Zoey" on ABC's sitcom "Freddie;" and Michael Alan Johnson, 15, hosts The Disney Channel's "Mike's Super-Short Show."

Team USBC High School Captain Carolyn Dorin-Ballard is the official spokesperson for USBC High School bowling. She is a 20-time PWBA titlist and is the 2001 Queens chamStars: Max Prado, 14, recently appeared on "The Tonight Show" with Jay Leno and plays "Nelson" in the hit film "The Benchwarmers;" Shelbie Bruce, 13, starred alongside Adam Sandler in the film "Spanglish;" and Alex Solowitz, 26, former star of MTV's "2Gether," stars in the upcoming Bruce Willis and Justin Timberlake movie "Alpha Dog."

Team USBC Collegiate Captain Kim Terrell is the official spokesperson for USBC Collegiate bowling. She is a ninetime PWBA champion and won the 2002 Queens.

Stars: Alyson Stoner, 12, star of the films "Cheaper by the Dozen" 1 and 2 and featured on The Disney Channel's "Mike's Super-Short Show;" Robby Bruce, 11, vocal performer for films including "Stuart Little 3" and "Into the Blue;" and Shawn Parr, a host on KZLA 93.9 FM in Los Angeles, the voice of the Golden Globes and costar in the upcoming film "Lucky You."

The event's Baker format required each bowler on the team to alternate frames with the pro woman bowler bowling the second, sixth and 10th frames, respectively. The team with the highest three-game total score was crowned the first USBC Bowling with the Stars champion.

Prior to the event each star received a complimentary specially-fitted Storm bowling ball, bowling shoes from Etonic and a retro-style USBC bowling shirt.

"This is like Christmas," Shelbie said. "I can't believe how cool this stuff is."

For the "Dancing with the Stars" and "Skating with Celebrities" shows, celebrities undergo weeks or months of training prior to competing. The celebrity bowlers had to rely on a 30-minute crash course with the woman pro bowlers prior to competition.

"Kim was a great coach," Alyson said. "The most important thing I learned was to make my spares."

After guidance from the pros the celebrities were soon learning how to throw effective hooks and developing a much improved form.

"At first I thought it was best just to throw the ball down the middle of the lane," Robby said. "But after learning how to curve it, I could knock down more pins."

In 1980 Wilma's suppressed desire to get back into the bowling game came to fruition when she joined a league and it wasn't long before she was averaging 206 and recorded a 277 game, for which she collected a trophy from the league.

Hosting USBC Events Takes Time, Dedication & Preparation For Hopeful Cities

CORPUS CHRISTI, TX—Hosting a United States Bowling Congress Open or Women's Championships requires years of preparation and a city-wide cooperative effort. Bidding cities are usually familiar with the potential impact of the events and their possible contribution to the local community and economy.

During its 143-day run from Feb. 11 until July 3, more than 63,000 bowlers from all 50 states and four foreign countries will have converged on the American Bank Center Exhibit Hall in Corpus Christi, Texas, for the 2006 Open Championships.

At the same time, nearly 55,000 women will make their way to the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., for the 2006 USBC Women's Championships, which began March 16 and will run until July 2.

Next year, the Open Championships will be held in Reno, while the Women's Championships heads to Charlotte, N.C., but most bowlers don't know how or why those locations were selected.

In most cases, it is the local convention and visitors bureau that initiates the process, often organizing a task force that includes city officials, dignitaries, local and state bowling association leaders and business owners.

The process starts years in advance as cities interested in hosting the event begin an indepth bid process. As an example, in July of 2005, the process began for cities looking to host the 2010 and 2011 Women's Championships and the 2012 Open Championships.

The interested cities were issued promotional materials and a DVD about the tournaments. If they were still considering a bid for one or both events, they were sent a bid package, which included more details about the requirements necessary for consideration.

"Hosting an event of this magnitude takes years of planning and preparation, but that long-term commitment is necessary to ensure that the city is ready for nearly 100,000 visitors," USBC Chief Tournament Officer Roseann Kuhn said. "We always need to keep one eye on the future, and the game has now changed a little since the Women's Championships will begin using the arena setting in 2010."

In 103 years of competition, the Open Championships has been held in 48 cities in 26 states, attracting participants from around the globe. The first tournament was conducted in Chicago's Welsbach Building in 1901, as 41 teams competed for a \$1,592 prize fund.

The Women's Championships was first held in 1916 in St. Louis' Washington Recreation Parlor with eight teams and has since been held in 55 cities in 28 states.

In order to even be considered, a host city must have a facility big enough to hold at least 48 lanes, which requires a minimum of 78,000 square feet. The event also needs an additional 12,000 square feet for vendor and office space, as well as room for seating for 800 spectators.

To put things in perspective, last year's tournament used 93,685 square feet at the Baton Rouge River Center, while the American Bank Center Exhibit Hall in Corpus Christi was a little tighter fit at 90,176 square feet. After the venue was assembled for the 2006 event, there only was 3/16 of an inch to spare between the edge of the custom scoreboards and the wall.

"This year definitely was a tighter squeeze, but Corpus Christi was determined to have us back because of the impact we had during our first trip in 1992," Open Championships tournament director Brian Lewis said. "We've really enjoyed our time here so far, but as we look down the road we have to consider how much the tournament has grown and the needs that accompany that growth. After Reno in 2007, we're going to Albuquerque, N.M., and Las Vegas, which have larger facilities and will be able to accommodate more lanes and more bowlers.'

Aside from a large convention center which must be available for at least 200 consecutive days to allow for construction, competition and tear down, the host city also must be served by three major airlines with sizable aircraft and enough staff to handle the added baggage, which includes bowling balls. And with 600-800 new bowlers and guests continued on page 2

Up Your Average

Instruction to Help Raise Your Scores

PUSHING BOWLING'S ENVELOPE THE VALUE OF NEW IDEAS

"Outside the Box" thinking can often generate new and unusual ways of attacking the problems we face in our attempt to stick our heads up above the rest, so to speak, and become winners. As we all know, there are always some among us who are inventive, innovative, original thinkers...those who constantly come up with new ideas; different, imaginative, maybe even strange methods to help solve the problems that plague us. While they sometimes fail, such imaginative new ideas occasionally lead to techniques which later become gospel.

But such original thinkers, no matter how ingenious, no matter how well their ideas work, are virtually always followed by the hordes of negative critics and nay-sayers who, with their feet firmly planted in the muck and mire of sameness and old fashioned ideas, will immediately turn thumbs down on anything new, often just because it is new.

Fear of this mindless kind of criticism is often the reason for such ideas dying before they get a fair chance, thus never getting fair exposure. As a result, many potentially great new concepts or techniques never see the light of day. Bowlers who would try something new are sometimes afraid to be embarrassed, so they often give up on their ideas rather than risk being laughed at when experimenting with something different and unusual.

To help declaw such negative thinkers and show how a bit of courage in the face of possible ridicule, can often solve even an industry wide problem, here's a recent example of a tactic you won't find in any current books or tapes, but which really works:

THE BUN SQUEEZE...SOMETHING NEW

Some time ago one of my students was wrestling with one of those all too common problems from which many bowlers worldwide suffer...the error of over bending from the waist during the release and follow through. This over bending is usually accompanied by a heavy cost in weak, inaccurate shots.

As a matter of fact, you may remember that some time ago I described a successful tactic for helping correct it...the technique of dropping the left hip forward and downward (left handers, right hip forward and downward) during the last step of the approach!

This technique creates a "leveraged" body position, from which the release will be much more powerful in terms of pin action.

At the end of such an approach, your chest should be directly above the front knee...not in front of it, not behind it, but directly above it! That 's the "Power Position" for the release

POWERLESS EFFORT, OR EFFORTLESS POWER?

Anyway, after describing this to that student, I saw her very first try executed with perfect knee bend, form and position at the line. This amazed me, because the vast majority of bowlers need many tries before they finally master this technique. Surprised at her immediate and perfect response, I said, "Wow! You got that

problem solved pretty fast...my compliments! How did you do

She gave me a totally unexpected answer. She said, "Rolf, as I hit the line on my last step, I just told myself to drop my left hip forward, then to squeeze my buns together! That's all! That's what made it work for me."

Well, this was a new one on me. But I didn't laugh at it nor shoot it down. Instead, I tried her idea myself and it really worked...creating a perfectly leveraged body position at the line, but with less thinking, which makes it easier to execute! Wow! Just go forward and downward with the left hip (right hip for left handers) and then simply squeeze the buns together! Easy and effective, because suddenly this leveraged body position at the line creates much more power at the pocket, much greater pin action and more

Obviously, before writing about it I tried it with dozens of other bowlers, including professionals, juniors, seniors, all types. It worked for every bowler who tried it, so naturally I've been teaching it ever since. I'm describing it here, because it becomes so effortless with a little practice that the body soon creates just what the headline above says...a leveraged position from which the ball can be released with effortless power!

Many of you already know my philosophy of learning from my students. Bowling students are often an immense fund of additional ideas. So never be afraid to tell your coach of an idea that may come to you, or to try it yourself. If it won't work, you'll soon find that out, but it is nothing to be embarrassed about. Without new ideas, no sport could progress!

So from now on, let's call this the "Bun Squeeze". It really works!

THE OFTEN MISUNDERSTOOD KNEE BEND

All really serious students of modern bowling know and accept the importance of being "under the ball" for the release. I have been amazed, however, at how many supposedly high level players seem to believe that being under the ball refers only to the hand. It must be understood that for optimum arm position for a correct release the body must also be under the ball! The part so often misunderstood is the fact that no matter how much the knees are bent at the line, the instant the body bends forward from the waist, that body is no longer under the ball, but *over it!*

Well, it is easier to bend the knee on that last step, if you just tell yourself to "drop that hip" instead. Since you can't drop the hip without the knee bending, you only need to think about one thing instead of two. So by following the technique described above, you are automatically "under" the ball, so to speak.

It works!

THE VALUE OF THE EXPERT

How many of you have ever heard of John Jowdy? Most higher level bowlers and all PBA professionals, know that name intimately. Jowdy is the only coach ever to be elected into the PBA Hall of Fame by the players, as a coach. He is generally known among top bowlers world wide, as "Coach of the Pros".

Jowdy's outstanding instructional book, "bowling eXecution", is a huge best seller among bowling books, and in addition to working with many of the PBA's top professionals, he teaches seminars to amateur bowlers world wide.

The reason I mention the great coach's name here is because

Jowdy is the originator of the leveraged body position we've discussed this month. He refers to it as the "sitting" position.

Why? Because when we get the body into that position, it really does feel almost like we are sitting down for the release.

Jowdy is the acknowledged expert and that's what I mean by the

above headline about "the value of the expert". Be sure to remember that last important point. When the body is

correctly placed into this position, your chest will be directly above your front knee! It won't be in front of the knee and it won't be behind the front knee...but directly above it.

And squeezing those buns will keep it there!

Try it. You'll like it.

arriving each day during the tournament, the city must have enough available rental cars and at least 600 hotel rooms per day.

A monetary bid of at least \$750,000 for the Women's Championships and \$1 million for the Open Championships also is required to help offset the costs of building the venue. With an estimated economic impact of \$13-\$15 million per month during the tournament, cities may bid more to increase their chances. This year's event is projected to bring between \$75 and \$100 million to the Corpus Christi economy

"It's undeniable what kind of impact our events have on the host cities, and that's why places like Syracuse and Baton Rouge have been eager to see us return," Kuhn said. "With this process, we can always be sure that the cities really want us too.'

Once the bids have been submitted, the USBC makes site visits to the qualifying cities, and those selected are invited to make presentations to the USBC executives at the organization's headquarters in Greendale, Wis.

In February 2006, representatives from Albuquerque, Baton Rouge, El Paso, Texas, and Syracuse, N.Y., made their presentations before the executives made their final selections.

In the end, El Paso earned the right to host the 2010 Women's Championships, where the event will be held in an arena setting for the first time outside of Reno. Syracuse, which hosted the Open Championships in 1999, will welcome the women in 2011. And finally, just one year removed from hosting its first Open Championships, Baton Rouge will prepare for the tournament again in 2012. Both tournaments also are contracted to be held in Reno's National Bowling Stadium every third year through 2018.

"We're excited about where we are headed," Kuhn said. "These are all beautiful cities and have a lot to offer the bowlers.

Bowlers and their families and friends spend an average of three and a half days in the host city, spending nearly \$200 per day on lodging, food and entertainment, according to an online survey of tournament participants randomly conducted by the USBC.

The 2005 event in Baton Rouge was the largest ever held outside of Reno, attracting 13,222 teams and more than 130,000 total visitors. The economic impact to the area exceeded \$75 million.



Bob Jones, Tim Estes (WA), Pablo Yoma, Jim Mohr, and Gardy Rodgers were in their first GLDBA tournament. Ed Abakumoff, Robert Ellison and Joey Harris (NV) had bowled in GLDBA a couple times or so. Ecept me, Connie Marchione who was in his 7th GLDBA event, GLDBA as the granddaddy of all deaf tournaments, is older than all

As the official results showed, there is a change in both actual and handicap team lists, one team, Albany Elites of Albany NY which placed 2nd was disqualified. As this result, all teams moved up one place in both actual and handicap lists.

This disqualification was a boon for So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers which placed 5th in the handicap list, moved up to 4th giving the team \$200.00 more for \$800.00. So Each on the team, Marchione, Mohr, Rodgers, Estes and Yoma got \$160.00 for their efforts. The companion team, West Coast All-Stars, comprised of Abakumoff, Jones, Harris Stogryn and Ellison failed to place in the team money. 

Citrus Belt's St. Peter & St. Paul Ladies Charitable League Completes 35th Season

by Frank Weiler RANCHO CUCAMONGA The St. Peter & St. Paul Ladies Charitable League will complete its 35th consecutive season on May 18, at Deer Creek Lanes in Rancho Cucamonga.

The league was started at Thunderbird Lanes in Ontario in the fall of 1971, its first season being 1971-72. Many of the first ladies to join the league came over from the St. Joseph Ladies League which started at Thunderbird Lanes in 1966 for the 1966-67 season. The St. Joseph Ladies League is no longer in existence. The St. Peter & St. Paul Ladies Charitable League bowled at Thunderbird Lanes from 1971 to 1985, at Upland Bowl from 1985 to 1996, and at Deer Creek Lanes from 1996 to the present.

As a charitable league, each lady bowler contributes ten dollars to a fund to be donated to the St. Vincent de Paul Society for the poor. We should commend these lady bowlers for helping the poor while enjoying the sport of bowling. I wonder why there aren't more charitable bowling leagues?

Some of the ladies bowling today have been in the league for many years.

June Seidel, a charter member of the league, joined in the fall of 1971 after bowling in the St. Joseph League in the 1960s.

Other long time league members and the season they joined the league: (1975-76) Lucy Herber; (1981-82) Linda Lam; (1986-87) Mary Carniello, Mary Hughes, and Sharon Tait; (1988-89) Paula Dauber and Dorothy Nigliazzo; (1990-91) Irma Hogue; and (1996-97) Gloria Miller. Currently, there are 48 ladies in the league, ranging in age from thirty-two to eighty-two years. Three members are currently over eighty years of age, three are in their seventies, six in their sixties, eleven in their fifties, twelve in their forties, and thirteen in their thirties.

Does anyone know of a Citrus Belt certified (formerly sanctioned) league that is currently operating and started up before the St. Peter & St. Paul Ladies Charitable League, in the fall of 1971? Does anyone know of a sanctioned/certified Citrus Belt league no longer operating, that operated for more than thirtyfive consecutive seasons?
