BWAA's Connie Marchione Injured During USBC Hall Ceremonies

KANSAS CITY—2005 BWAA Rip Van Winkle Award winner Connie Marchione, a 2006 inductee into the USBC Hall of Fame, has returned home after sustaining shoulder and rib injuries from a fall during the USBC Hall of Fame ceremonies in Kansas City.

Connie, a pioneer in communications efforts among deaf bowlers, fell from an elevated stage during the program when he accidentally stepped off the stage on his way to the men's room. He was immediately attended to by another BWAA member, Craig Mathews, a 30-plus-year paramedic and captain with West County Emergency Medical Services in suburban St. Louis, until a medical response team arrived.

Connie sustained a dislocated shoulder and five broken ribs, and was hospitalized in Kansas City for a couple of days before returning home. We have not heard from Connie since he arrived home, but another BWAA member and Connie's close friend--Ed Abakumoff--was going to check on him.

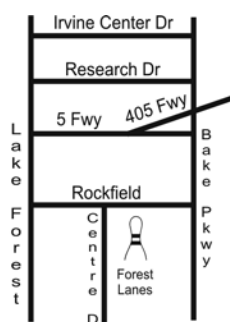

previous selection, Australia, withdrew.

“We are pleased to step in and showcase the world’s best bowlers in this unique setting,” USBC Chief Operating Officer and WTBA President Kevin Dornberger said. “It will have been nearly 14 years since we last hosted the World Championships and USBC is up to the challenge.”

The United States last hosted the World Championships, which until 2003 featured both men and women, in 1995 to

help open the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev. The United States, which will become the first three-time host of the World Championships, also hosted the 1971 event in Milwaukee.

The Women’s World Championships, which tentatively will be held July 25-Aug. 2, 2009, is expected to feature more than 225 athletes from 43 countries competing in doubles, singles, trios, team, all-events and Masters. The events will be conducted in a stadium setting, which will enhance the event for spectators as well as competitors.

Dick is acclaimed as one of the outstanding teachers of bowling, one who can help the pro and amateur alike.

Dick’s Physical Education background is the basis for the Ritger System to better bowling, entitled “The Feelings of Bowling”™

Floretta McCutcheon, “first known” woman bowling coach

LAKEWOOD—The brand new Ultimate Jr. Elims kicked off its first week at Cal bowl. This program is a spin-off of the West Coast Jr. Elims and has been changed to increase the competition and scoring, while at the same time adding some relief and fun. The format provides an elimination of some sort each and every week, a score – a session – and eventually bowler(s). However, the program still stays within the state guidelines of the WCJE, if by chance that program ever arises again.

This summer long tournament format is simple for the indi- vidual bowler. Bowl 5 games each session and eliminate the lowest game. Bowl 10 sessions of qualifying and eliminate the worst session. Half of each division (boys and girls) will be eliminated after the qualifying round. The top half of each division advances to match play. The first week of match play is standard format – equal number of games for each bowler, with 30 bonus points to the winner of a match. The field is then cut in half again for the second week of match play. Here the format will be Bracket Elimination, best of 3 games to determine the champion(s). Therefore, the bottom line is 9 sessions, 36 games, match play.

To add some fun to the summer, we’ve included a doubles-team format to the mix. The team event will be based on the five games per session and 10 sessions, with no elimination. This will keep the bowlers honest in trying their best each game, each session. The team event will be through the qualifying round only.
