Francois Lavoie Wins PBA Xtra Frame Greater Jonesboro Open

JONESBORO, Ark. — In a tournament that put a premium on spare shooting, Quebec City native Francois Lavoie threw an error-free game to upset top qualifier Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., Sunday, 224-152, to win the PBA Xtra Frame Greater Jonesboro Open at Jonesboro Bowling Center.

Lavoie, PBA's 2016 Rookie of the Year and the 2016 U.S. Open champion, converted four spares and threw in a string of four strikes late in the game to knock off Ciminelli, who had otherwise dominated the event.

Ciminelli, a 31-year-old left-hander, cruised to Saturday's qualifying lead by out-averaging his closest competitor by nearly 25 pins per game. Despite slowing his scoring pace to an overall 223 average on Sunday, he qualified no. 1 for the four-man stepladder finals by 304 pins over England's Stuart Williams.

But the title match was his downfall. After failing to convert the 3-7 split in the second frame, Ciminelli also failed to convert the 3-5-6-9 in the eighth frame and missed a 6 pin in the ninth.

DOWNEY — After five rounds of bowling, and four playoff matches, the Brunswick Invitational wrapped up its 31st season with the championship match at Del Rio Lanes on Monday night. SYSCO and Keystone Lanes squared off in a best of 5 match that moved pairs each game and played on the four different patterns that were bowled on throughout the season.

Sysco qualified for the playoffs as the #2 seed. They had won the fourth round of the season and beat Western Pacific Bowling Supply in the semi-final match to reach the championship. Sysco members include Paul Barraco, Charlie Kinstler, Steve Brode and Gabriel Martinez.

Keystone Lanes was the #1 seed going into the playoffs, giving them the right to sit out until the championship match. Keystone won the third round this

Monacelli Wins PBA50 Northern California Classic For Eighth Career PBA50 Tour Title

Hall of Famer defeats Hugh Miller 229-198 in championship match for first title of the season

BRENTWOOD, Calif. (May 31, 2017) – Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli kept his focus after a split and open in the seventh frame of the championship match to win the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV Wednesday for his eighth career PBA50 Tour title.

The 55-year-old Monacelli won his first title of the season by beating stepladder finals top qualifier Hugh Miller of Mercer Island, Wash., 229-198, at

Harvest Park Bowl.

"It was a good test because I didn't let it bother me," said Monacelli, who left the 6-7 split in the seventh frame. "I let it go real quick and kept myself pumped up. I had the lead at that point but I was able to recover and did what I needed to do in the last three frames to win."

Miller, who was trying for his fourth PBA50 Tour title, rocketed to the tournament lead when he rolled back-to-back 300 games in the first two games of the continued on page 9

After 27 Years Away From the Sport,
Jeneane Walker Is Back on Top

WINNETKA – Jeneane Walker could be excused for being a trifle giddy after her team claimed the “Guys and Dolls” league title last month at Winnetka Bowl.

Jeneane, after all, blasted a career-best 595 series (210, 201, 184) to lead “The Corner Pins” to a dominating victory in the league championship match.

But that wasn’t the most remarkable part.

Jeneane did it in her first season back in the sport after being away for 27 years. That’s no typo. Jeneane had put her childhood passion in mothballs for 27 years before she hooked up this season with teammates Wayne Jacobson; her father, Jack Redding; and her husband, Dwayne Walker.

A few decades ago, Jeneane was bowling juniors in the San Fernando Valley area and ranked among the best of the local players. “When I was 14, I bowled a 245 and that was my claim to fame. I averaged 160 and it hasn’t changed,” said Jeneane with a big smile.

Jeneane finished her first season back in bowling with exactly a 160 average. Her dad, coincidentally, also averaged 160. Dwayne, a stylish lefty, anchored the team with a 189 average and Jacobson chipped in with a 182 average.

Jeneane said she returned to the game amid pressure from Dwayne and Jack. “My dad wanted to bowl with me,” said Jeneane, a former employee of now-defunct Granada Lanes.

Jack, an accomplished bowler who has several perfect games in his resume (as does Dwayne), had never bowled with Jeneane in a league.

Dwayne, however, says he deserves the credit for Jeneane’s return, saying, “I finally convinced her to bowl.” Jeneane concurs: “Totally,” she said.

Dwayne, incidentally, met his wife at Granada Lanes. She worked several jobs at the bowling center, including bookkeeper, and remembers that Dwayne “kept asking me out and asking me out.”

Dwayne’s persistence paid off. The two have been married 27 years.

“The Corner Pins” will take the summer season off, but Dwayne said the newly formed team is not finished making waves. “We’ll be back to defend our championship [in the fall],” he proclaimed.

Why I Stopped Watching Football - Part 2

Another aspect of those early visits to see the San Francisco 49ers and my favorite player, Bob St. Clair, was the decision from our family about where to eat after the game.

My sister always wanted to go to The Hippo on Van Ness Avenue in San Francisco, probably because it was all decked out in pink, and featured a hamburger patty topped with ice cream, hot fudge, pickles and a cherry on top.

For my parents it was the more conservative “Zim’s... Where Else?,” as their famous slogan purported. Steve Zimmerman, son of World War II veteran and founder Art Zimmerman, once said that a Zimburger was more than a fast food burger in a sack.

In a 1995 article from the San Francisco Chronicle, Steve said that “the Zimburger was bigger, leaner and hotter. With it came a big slice of genuine Bermuda onion, a high quality bun and a very thick slice of tomato.”

But for me, nothing could top Mels Drive-In. There was something about staying in the car and having a beautiful young car hop bring the food to you that was most comforting to a 10 year old.

And the food was out of this world! Tops on my list was a Mels Poor Boy Sandwich with an Orange Cream Shake. The burger came on a sourdough roll, and if you’ve never had a sourdough roll from San Francisco, your life story is not yet complete. (My Mom must have helped me finish the Poor Boy because it was quite large, and included a salad).

I often wondered why that location at 140 Van Ness Avenue closed, so I went searching on the internet and found some answers at Kips American Graffiti website.

If you haven’t already guessed, Mels was the famous drive-in used in the 1973 film by George Lucas entitled “American Graffiti.”

According to Mark Groesbeck, founder of Kips American Graffiti Blogspot, the drive-in underwent a mass sit-in by the “Ad-Hoc Committee to End Discrimination” in the fall of 1963.

“Many of the participants were students at San Francisco State University who were protesting the fact that management had not hired any black people to work in visible capacities such as car hops, waiters, waitresses and cashiers,” states Groesbeck.

According to Mark, the picket lines began to appear in October as activists carried signs that read “Don’t Drive-In, Drive-Out Segregation.”

“By the first weekend of November the protest had evolved into the first mass sit-in of the Bay Area Civil Rights Movement,” said Groesbeck.

Just like Bob St. Clair and the University of San Francisco football team that I alluded to in Part One of this story, Mel Weiss and the Mels Drive-In management team settled the dispute by agreeing to hire and train black employees in “upfront” positions.

Groesbeck goes on to say that “Mels was one of the first establishments to improve their policies by making them more fair to African Americans, and they were truly a shiny brass hinge on the door that opened to a new generation.”

And although Mels Drive-In put principle ahead of profits, the Van Ness location was never quite the same, and was ultimately sold to Foster’s Old Fashion Freeze, another popular chain of fast food restaurants that continues to this day.

By now you’re probably wondering what all of this has to do with bowling. It just so happens that Mel Weiss, one of the brightest entrepreneurs of his day, jumped on the bowling craze of the early 1960’s and attached 40 lane bowling centers to some of his Mels Drive-In, or other fine restaurant locations that he operated.

Even more special to me than visiting Mels Drive-In after a 49ers game, was taking a little longer drive to Mels Bowl in Redwood City, where I could bowl the night away while my parents indulged in the fine food provided by an upscale restaurant inside the bowling facility.

My early memories of those visits came full circle when I went to work for American Recreation Centers in the 1980’s. By that time Bob Feuchter, the founder and chairman of ARC, as well as my mentor and loyal adviser, had purchased the Mels bowling properties from Weiss.

But how that came about is a mystery that neither Steven Weiss, Mel’s son and present owner of the Mels Drive-In chain, nor historian Mark Groesbeck could answer.

Jesper Svensson, EJ Tackett Pace Opening Round of Inaugural Main Event PBA Tour Finals

ORLANDO, FL — Sweden’s Jesper Svensson, a six-time PBA Tour winner at age 22, and EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., PBA’s reigning Player of the Year at age 24, paced the opening round of round robin match play qualifying in the inaugural Main Event PBA Tour Finals at Main Event Entertainment Orlando.

The first two rounds of match play aired May 30 Tuesday night on CBS Sports Network.

Svensson, a two-handed left-handed player and PBA’s 2015 Rookie of the Year, easily defeated fellow two-hander Anthony Simonsen of Austin, Texas, 268-233, and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., 268-217, in his first two matches in the Group One bracket. Tackett, a high-rev right-handed power player, got past Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., 237-222, and Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., 227-200, in his first two matches in Group Two.

With his 2-0 start and grand total of 636 pins, including 50 bonus pins for each match win, Svensson jumped into a 132-pin lead over Rash in the race for seeding positions for the Group One stepladder finals that will air on Tuesday, June 13. Australia’s Jason Belmonte was third in Group One with a 1-1 match play record and 485 total pins. Simonsen was winless in his first two matches and sat in fourth place with 436 pins.

“I moved my hand position a little after my first three shots,” said Svensson of the three single pins he left and converted before throwing strikes on his next nine shots against Simonsen. “That did it. After that, I just tried to throw the ball good and hoped it would strike.”

Tackett finished the opening round with 564 total pins, 53 pins ahead of England’s Dom Barrett with fourth with a 1-1 match play record and 511 pins. Ciminelli was third with a 1-1 record and 486 pins, and Jones, who lost both of his matches, was fourth with a 467 total.

Tackett, who left eight single pins to go along with 16 strikes in his two matches, said, “There were a couple of shots where I got around the ball a bit, but I haven’t had anything worse than a nine-count. Basically, in this format you have to win matches. If you win all four, you don’t have to bowl big games to be in it at the end.”

Round One qualifying will conclude with Svensson meeting Belmonte and Rash bowling Simonsen in Group One, and Tackett vs. Barrett and Ciminelli vs. Jones in Group Two, followed by a position-round matches in each group. The final Round One matches will air on CBS Sports Network on Tuesday, June 6, at 9:30 p.m. EDT. Group One and Group Two stepladder finals will air on June 13 and June 20, respectively, followed by the Main Event PBA Tour Finals telecast on June 27.

“I reminded myself of what I do best, and that’s keep the ball in play,” Lavoie said. “I don’t strike as much as some of the guys out here, so I have to do what I do best.

In the title match, “I was just trying to fluff the ball and leave makeable spares,” he added. “I figured that would put me in a good position.”

It was the same philosophy that got Lavoie into the stepladder in the first place. He defeated Japan’s Shota Kawazoe in his final two matches, shooting 200 in game seven and 238 in his final match to advance to the stepladder finals where he broke open a tied match with Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, with three strikes, a spare and a double to win, 210-178. He then struck on six of his first seven shots to eliminate Williams, 232-196, to advance to the title match.

Lavoie won \$12,500, his third PBA Tour title and 25 points in the PBA’s Xtra Frame Storm Cup points competition.

Englands's Dom Barrett Takes Lead In Xtra Frame Storm Cup Points Race

England's Dom Barrett, with a fifth-place finish in the PBA Xtra Frame Wilmington Open after a third-place finish in the Xtra Frame Reality Check Classic in March, has taken the lead in the Xtra Frame Storm Cup points standings after two of seven events.

Barrett, who owns five PBA Tour titles including the 2013 PBA World Championship, earned 18 points in Tamarac, Fla., and 16 points in Wilmington, N.C., for a total of 34 points and a one-point lead over Reality Check Classic winner Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Ariz. Blanchard earned 25 points for his win in Tamarac, Fla., and another eight points for finishing 13th in Wilmington.


In each Xtra Frame Storm Cup event, the top 20 players earn points toward a pool of \$50,000 in bonus prize money that will be awarded to the top five players. The winner of each Storm Cup event receives 25 points. Second place is worth 19 points, third 18 points with points diminishing by one through 20th place, which is worth a single point.

Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Fla., is third with 28 points after finishing seventh in both of the first two events. Wilmington winner Anthony Simonsen of Austin, Texas, is tied for fourth place with Venezuela's Ildemaro Ruiz with 25 points, but he didn't bowl in Tamarac.

Rounding out the top 10 are Dick Allen, Columbia, S.C., in sixth place with 20 points; AJ Johnson, Oswego, Ill., and Rhino Page, Orlando, Fla., 19; EJ Tackett, Huntington, Ind., 18; and Jason Sterner, Rockledge, Fla., and Shawn Maldonado, Houston, tied for 10th with 17 points each.

Just Call Him ‘Miracle’ Martino

WINNETKA – Do you believe in miracles? Tom Martino does. He lived through one. “He’s so frickin’ lucky. He’s lucky to be alive – and his son too,” said Loree Zeller, one of Martino’s friends. Martino, a veteran bowler who recently smoked a personal-best 267, got into a harrowing car accident on May 28, the day before Memorial Day. Martino was driving northbound on the 170 Freeway in the North Hollywood area with his son Michael when his car was abruptly rammed by an SUV on the lane to his left. “I was driving on the freeway one moment,” related Martino, “and the next moment I’m fighting for my life.” The impact from the SUV sent Martino’s car into a tailspin and his car was jolted two lanes over to the right where his car bounced off a protective wall along the shoulder. Martino’s car then ricocheted the other direction and across traffic. Incredibly, his car wasn’t hit as it finally landed on the diamond lane facing oncoming traffic.

“I can’t believe we made it,” Martino told his son when his car finally came to a rest. “It’s not over yet,” Michael said. “We’re facing the wrong way on the diamond lane.” Recognizing his car’s precarious position, Martino started waving out the window to alert drivers of his vulnerable car, which sustained considerable damage. After noticing that the car was still drivable, Martino executed a quick U-turn that safely got his car back into traffic. At this time, the SUV driver was long gone. Martino soon called the police and they reported they had located the SUV driver – a young adult, who Martino surmised may have been texting when his car banged into his.

Martino, a Chatsworth resident, went to Urgent Care and his injuries remarkably were not considered serious at first diagnosis. His son also escaped serious injury. Martino’s biggest injury was whiplash, which was causing considerable discomfort to his neck. Still, Martino returned two days after the accident to his weekly bowling league and reunited with teammates Marti Tirabassi, Diane Weed and Shannon Renee at Winnetka Bowl. Martino took the night off bowling and his “Tom’s Cats” teammates celebrated his accident wasn’t worse. Martino was even smiling broadly watching the action at Winnetka Bowl, knowing that he had miraculously dodged a big, big bullet. “It was a miracle,” Martino said. “The viciousness really scared me.”

- **DICK SANDERS** was the man at **PALM SPRINGS BOWL**. His column was a newsy doozy. He even listed past winners of his marathons along with current winners of a "Buck to a bundle".
- There was supposed to be space set aside at the Helms Athletic Foundation (for sports) to house bowling memorabilia. Did it happen? Don't know — yet! Maybe more to come.
- **BETTY ANN FRIEDMAN** and **GARY MADISON** were Bowling Writers choices for "Bowlers of the Year".
- Women put in Writers Hall of Fame: **WILMA ANDERSON**, **JO ETTIEN**, **ALYCE MRAK** and **DORIS PORTER**.
- Is the **BOB PEARSON** that bowls at **CAL BOWL** the same guy who was toppling pins all over town in 1971?
- Who was writing House Columns?
- **BOWLING SQUARE** -- **ROSANNE HEINZ**; **CLARK CENTER** -- **BETTY GOULDING**; **CO-RONA** -- **EILEEN NAGY**; **ENCINO BOWL** -- **HARRY GRANT**; **TRIANON BOWL** -- **RALPH NICASTRO**; **GABLE HOUSE BOWL** -- **LEA TILTON**, **MAR VISTA** -- **DON FORSYTHE**; **MAR-LIN-DO** -- **SACK HILL**; **SANTA FE** -- **MERLE MATTHEWS**; **ALL STAR** -- **TREESA SPENCER**; **RODEO** -- **JIM THOMPSON**; **EASTLAND** -- "MAC" McALLISTER .

- A company called "CAPCO" ran a \$25,000.00 singles. 44 centers held qualifiers.
- **MILDRED PEACHY** was inducted into the California Hall of Fame.
- San Diego's **TOM THURBER** shot 2 300's to win the P.B.A. Regional.
- CBS-TV put on a short lived bowling show called "Pinpoint". Stars of the first show was **DAVE SOUTAR** and **MIKE McGRATH**. Never "herred" of it.
- **GARY FORD** was pictured as proprietor of **PALOMAR LANES**. Boy did he get around!
- **CARMEN ELIAS** won the State Queens at **THUNDERBIRD LANES**.

- The \$80,000.00 Winston-Salem North Carolina tournament was sponsored by R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co., makers of Salems and Winstons. The T.V. station bleeped out the brand names during the commercials.
- A bus loaded with bowlers from **FRONTIER LANES** in San Diego rolled into **ENCINO BOWL** and took a shot at the Grant Classic. Grant's squad organizers were really an army, ready to kill the pins!
- **CAROLINA LANES** was renamed **GLENN ALLISON LANES** after he and **GEORGE MALHIAT** purchased it.
- Bombs scares turn out to be hoax. **ARROWHEAD LANES** and **RIVERSIDE** were on alert. Even Cal State Women's tourney got a "call"!
- A stamp was issued by the Post Office saluting bowling. It pictured a ball and pin and 8 cents.
- 32 countries sent bowlers to the F.I.Q. in Milwaukee. Most countries to enter ANY sporting event!
- **JOHNNY PETRAGLIA** joined Brunswick's Advisory Staff. Did his Green Beret Experience help him?
- One of the guidelines in the P.B.A. Image book was "Never knock lane conditions, the host proprietor or fellow pros." Too bad that is not a "league rule".

- **CHIPPEWA LANES** in South Bend was investigated by the A.B.C. for having Eleven 300 games bowled in the P.B.A. Open. **BARRY ASHER** and **BUD HORN** were 2 of the eleven.

- **CIVIC LANES** was sold and renamed **BAY SHORE BOWL**.
- **BILLY MYERS** pocketed \$500.00 for his C.B.C. win.

final match play round and posted a 6-0 record. He was still in contention in the title match until he also left a split (4-6) in the seventh frame and was unable to challenge Monacelli after that.

Monacelli, who won the 2015 Northern California Classic, advanced to the title match by defeating Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, in the semi-final 9-6 in a one-ball roll-off after tying 233-233.

The second match was a strike-fest with Monacelli defeating Chris Warren of Grants Pass, Ore., 296-280. Monacelli and Warren set a new mark for highest scoring match in a PBA50 Tour championship round eclipsing the previous high scoring match set by tournament winner John Hricsina who defeated Mike Durbin 276-267 in the 1998 Vermont PBA Senior Classic. Monacelli’s bid for a 300 fell short when he left the 1-2-8-10 washout on the final shot of the 10th frame.

“Even after all the years I’ve been bowling professionally, I’m still learning,” said Monacelli, who also owns 20 PBA Tour titles. “Everything changes so quickly and it’s a challenge to keep up with those changes. That’s why I work so hard on both my mental and physical game.”

In the opening stepladder match, Warren beat two-time PBA50 Player of the Year Ron Mohr of Las Vegas, 245-213. Warren, a four-time PBA Tour winner was trying for his first PBA50 Tour title and Mohr was trying for his ninth PBA50 Tour win.

The PBA50 Tour travels to Las Vegas for the USBC Super Senior Classic, for players 60 and over, at Sam’s Town which begins with qualifying on June 2 and concludes with the stepladder finals on June 4 at 11 a.m. PT. Following the Super Senior Classic will be the USBC Senior Masters, the season’s second major, which begins with qualifying on June 6 and concludes with the stepladder finals on June 11 at 10 a.m.

After the Senior Masters, the PBA50 Tour moves across town to the Suncoast Bowling Center for the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm, the season’s final major, which begins with qualifying on June 12 and concludes June 16 with the stepladder finals scheduled for 4 p.m.
