The Match Game will be estimated at \$3,500 and the 3-6-9 IS at \$1,600, so lots of cash available this Saturday.

New members join for only \$10. Seniors Men 55+ and Ladies 49 + join free. We also guarantee a min of three Super Seniors Men 63+ and Ladies 55+. June 22, we visit the Popular Action Lanes in El Monte for a SEMI Frozen Hdcp event. Plus there is a \$975 Horses Pot carry during the Beat the Board finals. Then on June 29 we visit West Covina Lanes for a FROZEN Handicap event.

Then it is off to Las Vegas July 3-4-5-6, \$14,000 1st with Bonuses in that big one and Saturday Night Finals.

PBA50 US OPEN ROLLS INTO SIN CITY!

LAS VEGAS — This years PBA50 (formerly called Senior Tour) arrived at Sun-coast Lanes during the town's first heat wave of the summer. What a better way to stay out of the heat, inside a casino and bowling center. With the first wave of qualifying rounds lasting two days, you would see PBA50 regulars like Johnny Petraglia, Dale Eagle, and Ron Mohr, as well as a couple of newbies like Jack Jurek, Randy Pederson, and Mike Edwards (all PBA past champions.) If you were really paying attention, you could see a couple of women champions Tish Johnson and Robin Romeo participate in a event that features a tricky lane pattern and a grueling week of bowling. 24 games just to make it into Match play, then additional 24 games before the cut to final four for the stepladder final.

Qualifying started on a Tuesday (with a Senior regional taking place on the day before, won by Jack Jurek). The abundant bowling fans present to watch, unlike regular PBA tour events in town, were an older fan base, saw that the scores were lower for those

who bowled the earlier times and fresh oil. By the time it got to the burn, and drier surfaces the bowlers started to open up their shot. What I did notice

was that on the second day of qualifying, the bowlers were ready for the change in conditions, due to a different arsenal or a plan of attack. This includes players choosing to ride the outside lines (which all four of the bowlers that made the finals incorporated into their game).

After the two days of qualifying, the field was cut down to Match Play. By watching the bowlers, and the look in the eyes, you can see last years PBA50 US Open winner Amleto Monacelli had something to prove to the other bowlers. He was a force here as he once was back in

his heyday in the PBA. When the first eight games of Match Play was over, he was in first by 168 pins and never looked back.

The following day and last day of the four-day tournament saw plenty of excitement. The fifteen more games of head-to-head matchups saw a lot of ups and downs between bowlers and spots 2 thru 10. You saw the legend Walter Ray Williams JR move all the way up to second seed then down to five then to

where he would end up by the end. Even bowler and ESPN announcer Randy Pederson was in the top five looking to make the finals, but winding up in 14th place after some tough games at the end of Match Play.

So now the twenty-fourth and position round game has arrived, and the top Four make it to the stepladder finals. Seeds 1 & 2 were already locked up by Amleto and Las Vegas Native, and PBA champ Eric Forkel. The eyes were all on the men seeded 3 thru 6 (Ron Mohr, Walter Ray, Lennie Boresch Jr., and Wayne Webb). Who would make it to the finals. Everyone felt that Mohr (currently #3) would make it. Webb (currently 6th) finished his game first and murdered the pins whereabouts depending on the outcome of the match between Mohr and Walter Ray, he could slide in to the #4 seed. Mohr seemed to be struggling never could get in the groove while WRWJ continued his ability to ride the line that made him famous and scored well. As a matter of fact his game and the bonus pins per win jumped him to the #3 seed moving Ron Mohr to #4, while Wayne Webb just missed making the finals by 17 pins and earning the Fifth Place check.

After a short break, and time for the PBA lane man to prep Lanes 49&50 (as well as continued on page 4

Focused Jake Peters Wins First Title in Lucas Oil PBA Badger Open

Second-year PBA Tour competitor out-battles ex-Wichita State teammate Josh Blanchard

MILWAUKEE — Jake Peters of Decatur, Ill., who had never finished higher than 19th place in a previous Professional Bowlers Association Tour event, defeated former Wichita State University teammate Josh Blanchard of Gilbert, Ariz., 245-212, to win his first PBA Tour title in the Lucas Oil PBA Badger Open at AMF Bowlero.

The first of five GEICO PBA Summer Swing presented by Lucas Oil telecasts aired Tuesday on CBS Sports Network.

Peters, a 24-year-old second-year PBA Tour competitor, used a high level of inward focus to bowl a pair of near-perfect games en route to his first win. He started the semifinal match against newly-crowned USBC Intercollegiate Singles Champion Aaron Lorincz of Belleville, Mich., with six strikes — and nine strikes on his first 10 attempts — for a 265-174 victory, and started the title match against Blanchard with another five strikes.

"I told myself all last night and today that I was going to be slow, stay focused, stay in the moment and see what happened," Peters said. "I told myself if I could keep the ball on line, if it strikes, it strikes. If not, there's nothing I could do. The hardest thing to do, once you get a few in a row, is to not get amped up and that's why I looked down a lot.

"It was fortunate the first six struck, and then the first five in the title match. That never happens."

The victory fulfilled a lifelong dream for the former two-time Junior Team USA member.

"It's something I wanted so bad, something I wanted forever," Peters added. "I told my fiancé (Melissa Hurst) this morning that I'm ready for this. I told her this is the one moment I've practiced for forever. Since I was five years old I've been throwing mock shots in front of a mirror to win a title. I've done this a million times; it's just that no one else has seen me do it.

"I've bowled Josh in match play before. I know how good he is, and that if I didn't put shots on line, I wasn't going to win. He wasn't going to give me anything. If I had lost, I would have been perfectly okay with that. I know he's going to win, but I'm kinda glad it didn't happen today."

Peters said the money he won wasn't the reason for his jubilation.

"I got the check, but that didn't mean much until I got to hold the trophy," he grinned.

"That's really what it's all about."

Reminded that he also becomes eligible for the PBA Tournament of Champions for the first time, Peters responded, "Wow. I never even thought about that. That's really awesome."

Blanchard, the 2011-12 PBA Rookie of the Year, was disappointed he missed his chance for his first title, but was happy for his ex-Wheat-shocker teammates.

AMERICA EVENT IN LAS VEGAS OCT. 15-17

LAS VEGAS — The new Secretary-Treasurer of Deaf Senior Bowlers of America Ed Abakumoff rolled up his sleeves and went to work, printing flyers, entry forms, eligibility rules and newsletter and mailed them out to all DSBA participants in US and Canada. Also enclosed in the mailing is a reservation form furnished by The Orleans Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center for October 12 to 20 at special rate of \$32.00 (Sunday-Thursday) and \$89.00 (Friday-Saturday).

All that to remind the deaf senior bowlers to get ready to plan on going to Las Vegas to bowl in the 17th annual seniors get together at the Orleans Hotel on October 15-17. Also to tell their senior friends to come to the senior get together to meet or to bowl. Plan now as the entry deadline is Thursday Sept. 12, 2013 and for the Hotel special rate deadline is Friday Sept. 13, 2013.

Remember DSBA's eligibility rules states senior men must be 55 years old and up and senior women must be 50 and up. So tell your senior friends that.

The usual bowling total entry fee is \$130.00 which covers DSBA dues, Singles and doubles, optional All-events and optional Match play eliminations. Or for these who are conservative, without optional All-events and optional Match Play Elimination, the entry fee is \$85.00.

Prior to his new position as Secretary Treasurer, Abakumoff was a member of DSBA Board of Directors. When DSBA was organized, one of its founders Carol Moers (Denver) was elected as its first secretary-Treasurer and remained in that position for the last 16 years. In last year's meeting Moers decided to retire from office and Abakumoff was elected to replace her.

DSBA was founded Las Vegas in 1985 by Vernon Jones, Las Vegas, Bill Fry, Hawthorne, CA and Moers, Denver. At Sam's Town in the first senior bowlers meeting the trio were elected as President, Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer respectively.

"It's nice to see (Jake) win. Obviously you want to win yourself, but it's nice to see guys who have worked as hard as he has win," Blanchard said. "He bowled a great game, but I'll get there eventually."

The Badger Open, bowled on a 52-foot lane conditioning pattern – the longest ever used in PBA Tour competition – was the first ever televised by CBS Sports Network. In the opening match, Michael Haugen Jr. of Phoenix defeated Kurt Pilon of Warren, Mich., 224-180. Lorincz eliminated Haugen in the second match, 215-170, before losing to Peters.

The finals of the Lucas Oil Wolf Open, the second event in the GEICO PBA Summer Swing series, will air next Tuesday, June 18, at 7 p.m. ET. The preliminary rounds of the Wolf Open was contested on a 32-foot lane condition pattern – the shortest of the eight PBA "animal patterns" – at AMF West. Advancing to the finals at AMF Bowlero were top qualifier Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio; PBA Hall of Famer and 37-time Tour champion Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla.; 20-year-old rookie E.J. Tackett of Huntington, Ind.; PBA Hall of Famer and 37-time titlist Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., and four-time Tour winner Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa.

RUSSELL RUIZ's

First Is An 838

and An 1107

REDLANDS — EMPIRE BOWL registers another first. Russell Ruiz rolled his first 800 in the Men's Club with an 838 (248 - 300 - 290). Russell's fourth game was 269 for a 1107 four game series.

A few weeks ago I wrote about MARK DYER rolling a 1098 four gamer. At the time I asked if anyone knew of a higher four game series bowled in the CITRUS BELT. First, I heard of Hall of Famer MARV SARGENT bowling an 1120 in 2000, at the old San Hi Lanes. Friends, Marv averaged 280 for four games that night!

While Sargent had a phenomenal night at the dawn of the new millennium, guess what JIM THURMOND did in 1993? While bowling in Hemet, Hall of Famer Thurmond averaged 289.5 for an unbelievable 1158 four game set. According to Jim, his 1158 was a California record at the time. It could still be the California record. I do know that the current national record is 1198 (299.5 average).

All of the above means that Ruiz's 1107 is the third highest known four game series in Citrus Belt history. Russ's big four gamer included two strings of 18 or more strikes. Russ finished his first game with seven in a row and then rolled 300. A spare to start game three ended his first major string of strikes at 19. From there Russ finished his third game with eleven strikes (290) and started his fourth game with seven strikes. His second major string ended at 18 in a row. When Russ's day was over he had 41 strikes.

Ruiz used a Global 900 Break Point Pearl to roll his big score. The ball was drilled by MARV SARGENT and Russ is grateful for the work Marv has invested in his equipment. Russ asked me to thank his family, especially wife CAS-SANDRA, for supporting his bowling efforts. Russ knows the bowlers of the Men's Club support him and he appreciates their backing.

Ruiz has been bowling for thirty years but has never had a better day on the lanes. His previous high three game set was 798 bowled at DEL ROSA LANES in 1998. Russ has ten perfect games, seven of which are certified.

Looking back on his bowling experiences, Russ told me his all time favorite ball is the classic Columbia Yellow Dot. What a great choice. We all know that the Yellow Dot is probably one of the top five balls ever manufactured.

Like most good bowlers, Russ is a PBA fan. His favorite touring players are all time title winners EARL ANTHONY and WALTER RAY WILLIAMS, Jr. He likes these two greats because they both were strait shooters, generally playing a direct line to the pocket. Russ is also a big fan of Citrus Belt Hall of Famer CORKY De MAIO. He enjoys practicing with Corky so he can study his game. Russ told me that there is no one better to study than Corky.

Simply put, De Maio is a stylist with more experience and knowledge of the game of bowling than just about anyone else in the Citrus Belt. Best of all, Corky is willing to share his knowledge with anyone who asks for help.

neighboring lanes for practice) the stepladder finals were ready to start. Once again Ron Mohr took on Walter Ray Williams Jr. (this is actually the third game in a row the two matched off, by coincidence they bowled against one another the last game before the position round occurred). When you watched Mohr in the practice frames before, it looked like he was going to experiment a little more inside. That was not the case when the game started. From frame one, he played the outside part of the lanes and struck easily. On the other hand, Walter who has made a career throwing the outside shot, just couldn’t get it dialed in. He was around the pocket but when he left a pocket 7-10 on his second frame, he never could carry a solid strike. Mohr had the game in control the whole time defeating WRWJ 279-195.

Next game was a battle to move to the finals and for bragging rights of Las Vegas. Recently Ron Mohr relocated to the desert where he could be in the center of the bowling world. Unfortunately as soon as Eric Forkel took to the lanes he seemed lost, and couldn’t find the pocket. From his first frame 3-7 split conversion, he really never threatened the past PBA50 champion. The closest he came was 13 pins in the fifth frame. Eric had a strong showing earlier in the day during match play earning his #2 seed, but no matter what he did he couldn’t find a double the whole game. Still a great showing by the Las Vegas champion.

So we have last years PBA50 US Open champion (Amleto), vs 2012 PBA50 US Open champ (Mohr) bowling for the \$14,000 check. The first thing everyone noticed during the final game was lane 49 was breaking down faster and the one to control it first will have the advantage. Mohr opened in the first leaving a 4-7-10 split and really never found his stride until the seventh frame. Monacelli rolled along filling frames, and up by 25 in the sixth frame. Mohr finds the shot and strikes on the next three balls, while Amleto throws a strike in the eighth with spares surrounding that frame. When Mohr stepped up to bowl in the tenth, the crowd felt the momentum he was gaining and knew he had to strike at least once to pull off the victory and defeat Monacelli who pretty much rolled over everyone during the Match Play rounds. Unfortunately, the one pin that every bowler, no matter how good the shot is, stalked him and Mohr left the dreaded ringing 10 pin. Monacelli wins the PBA50 US Open for a second year in a row by a score of 199-193.

If you are a true fan of good bowling, go check out a PBA50 event when it hits your area. You might not see any two handed bowling, but you’ll definitely see some true talent on the lanes.

MARKIEWICZ and
SARGENT Lead
SoCal Bowlers at
SENIOR US OPEN

LAS VEGAS — The PBA introduced a new format for this years SENIOR US OPEN, switching from three six game qualifying rounds to two eight game rounds. They did so to free up Monday of tournament week for a PBA Senior (PBA 50) Regional tournament. PBA Champion Jack Jurek won the regional and led the Open, after the first round, with a 236 average.

The new format suited several SoCal and CITRUS BELT bowlers. San Diego’s BOB MARKIEWICZ was our top first round qualifier. He finished the first qualifying round (8 games) in second place, just behind Jurek, on the wave of a whopping 231 average. MARV SARGENT wasn’t far behind in twenty-third place with a 210 average, and PAUL NILSEN averaged 204 for forty-second place.

The significance of what these fellas did can be better appreciated when their performance is compared to that of the great WALTER RAY WILLIAMS, Jr.

He finished the day behind them in fiftieth place, with a 201 average.

Bob’s performance is the best by a SoCal competitor in a Senior Major since Murieta’s DON MOSER led the SENIOR US OPEN, then went on to finish in the top ten, about three years ago.

On the second day of qualifying Markiewicz and Sargent continued to contend. Bob ended the second round with a 210 average, good for twelfth place. Marv placed twenty-second, averaging 207. Unfortunately, Nilsen struggled a bit and his 193 average was good for seventy-fifth place. The field was then cut to 53 bowlers, from a starting field of 189.

The third “cashers” round began Thursday morning with Bob and Marv competing with the other 51 top senior bowlers in the world, trying to advance to match play. Marv improved his overall average to 210 for twenty-four games, good for tenth place. Bob ran into some problems but still finished the round in twenty-second place on the strength of his 206 overall average.

Both moved on to match play. Twenty-four games of round robin match play would determine the four bowlers who would qualify for the step ladder finals.

Match play saw our guys hold their own. Bob finished with a 11-12-1 record and a 10,190 score (48 games and bonus pins) good for nineteenth place.

Sargent finished twentieth with a 10,068 score and a 8-16 record. Markiewicz earned \$1,600 while Sargent took home \$1,580.

Other Citrus Belt competitors included DON MOSER, RAY COBB, and TOM SMITH. Nineteen time PBA National Champion AMLETO MONACELLI eventually won the championship followed by RON MOHR, ERIC FORKEL, and WALTER RAY WILLIAMS, Jr.

I HAVE BOWLED IN FIVE SENIOR US OPENS but have never seen the scores lower than this year. Based on these scores, I believe this years oil pattern was the most difficult in years. The US OPEN and SENIOR US OPEN always feature the toughest oil patterns. The money cut usually can be accomplished with a deuce to deuce plus five average. This year a 198 average made the money cut. Who would imagine that the top senior bowlers in the world would have difficulty averaging 200!

LAKEWOOD — We returned to Cal Bowl where we saw a decent shot and 200 entries on Saturday for a fun day of bowling. The cut scores were + 90 for the men and + 54 for the women, on a medium shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) Leo Tartamella +84, Lonzell Burnett + 80, for the women at +9 was Emma Soliman. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 52 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The High qualifiers for the tournament Du Quach for the men with a + 175 and for the women it was Kerry Lucka with a +111. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. We now have a backup pot of \$295 started. This week we saw Cezar Marcella miss in the final round, so he got \$50 for Beer Money. We will go for \$1,600 next week at Bowlm Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Du Quach and John Phan with a 1505 for \$110. Finishing in second place was David Dittlinger and Steve Brode with a 1461 for \$90. There was a total of \$1,020 paid out in doubles and 21 paid spots with low to cash of 1370.

The semis took the floor. Finishing in first was Derrick Brown with a +146, and in a close second was Jhickie DeLuna at a +142. Jhickie sat out the first round of the top 16. Derrick had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$1,695. Derrick drew a 217. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no one who shot that score, so we will estimate the pot at \$3,500 Saturday at Bowlm.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Danny Guevarra, Victor Fabian, Scott Johnson, Ed Palma, Jimmy Natividad, Louis Evans, and Shawn Harper, each will get \$100. In Round 2, the four losers were Leo Silva, David Dittlinger, Bethany Mendoza, and Jhickie DeLuna with each getting checks of \$105.in 5-9th places

This would get us down

to the final five bowlers. The weekly horsres were paying a low of \$79, Kristine Soliman to a high of \$158 for Lonzell Burnett. In one of the matches, we saw our sixteenth seed Kerry Lucka bowling the fifteenth seed Kristine Soliman. This match went back and forth and saw both bowlers bowling quite well. However, in the end it was Kristine that would pull away and advance with a 242 to 219 victory. In the other match, it was 5th seed Danny Eguilos bowling the 12th seed Lonzell Burnett. This was another close match to the end, and Danny would come out on top with a 216 to 209 and advance. Finishing in 4th and 5th place this week were Kerry Lucka and Lonzell Burnett. They each got \$110.

Our semi-final match was set, and pit the 5th and 15th seeds in this match. In the weekly “horses”, we would see Kristine paying \$79 and Danny paying \$112 if they would win. This was again another good match from both bowlers. Kristine would start out struggling on the left lane opening the first three times on the lane. But after the fifth frame Danny would only lead by 22 pins. Kristine would

Derrick struck and then opened in the seventh.

Danny would get a strike and spare in the seventh and eighth frames. Derrick would open again in his next two two frames and put him down by 17 pins and that would be enough for Danny as he would go on to take home his second ABTA championship with a 181/226 to 145/198. He would take home \$1,000 for the victory and an additional \$425 for Cash and Carry, and \$100 for wearing his ABTA shirt to give him a total of \$1,525. Derrick would take home \$500 for his second place finish.

MILWAUKEE — Combine five tournaments on a variety of oil patterns in three different centers over a period of two weeks and you have the makings of a dizzying endurance test that proves who the greatest bowlers of the world truly are.

That was the premise for the 2013 Geico PBA Summer Swing held at three Milwaukee area AMF centers between May 19 and June 2.

The old adage that the cream always rises to the top was certainly true as PBA Tour veterans Chris Barnes and Norm Duke capped two series of great match play to win the Milwaukee Open and King of the Swing respectively.

PBA Commissioner Tom Clark explained how the Summer Swing concept evolved from the World Series of Bowling.

“When we drew up the model for the first World Series we wanted to have a series of tournaments in different centers in one city,” Clark said. “We started with two centers in Detroit in 2009, but it hasn’t always worked out that way.

“The summers used to be reserved for invitational all-star events. The players wanted a format that more bowlers could enter. Secondly, we wanted to use oil patterns that did not play the same. Using three different AMF centers in one city over two weeks here was ideal for us.”

The key to holding a series of events in different venues was keeping production costs at a level that CBS Sports Network could live with.

“If we did one show, it would cost \$160,000,” Clark said. “If we wanted to do five shows in five different centers, the cost



would have been \$800,000 to \$1 million.

“What we’ve been able to do here is hold qualifying tournaments in three different centers and then tape five shows in two days at AMF Bowlero at a cost of \$250,000. CBS Sports Network stepped up to pay for it. They wouldn’t have done it in five different centers.”

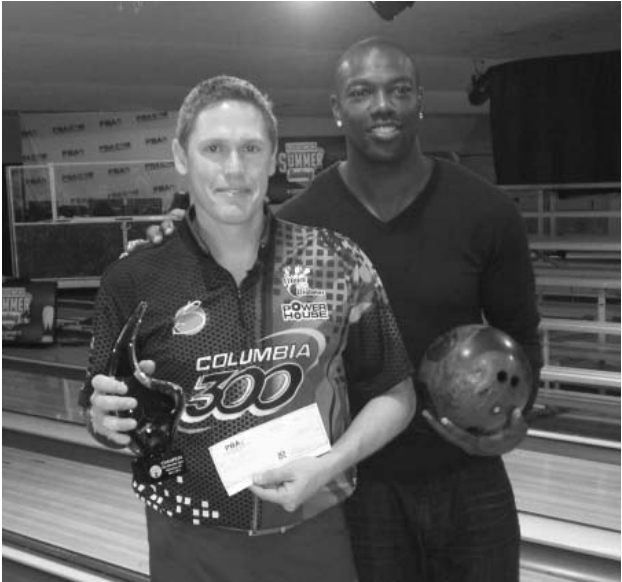
One needed a scorecard to follow the progression of each “animal” qualifying event leading up to the Milwaukee Open. The competition began with the Badger Open at AMF Waukesha on a 52 foot oil pattern, then moved to AMF West for the Wolf Open on a 32 foot pattern, followed by the Bear Open on a 40 foot pattern at AMF Bowlero.

Three shows – the Badger, Wolf and Bear finals --were taped on Saturday, June 1. They produced two first time PBA champions, Jake Peters and Chris Loschetter, along with Player of the Year candidate Jason Belmonte who captured the Bear Open with a 235-211 victory over Barnes.

That set the stage for the Milwaukee Open finals Sunday featuring Barnes, Pete Weber, Norm Duke, Mike Fagan and Jason Sterner. Fagan eliminated Sterner 198-182 before Duke took charge by defeating Fagan 238-194. Duke and Weber then hooked up in a classic match, tied at 157 through seven frames before Duke eked out a 225-217 victory.

The championship match was another classic as Duke and Barnes were tied 217-217 heading into the 10th frame before Barnes prevailed 246-237.

Following an hour and a half break, Duke, Peters, Belmonte,



Loschetter and Barnes returned to the lanes for the King of the Swing rollofs which were designed as a made-for-TV exhibition and not an official PBA Tour event.

In any event, the competition featured close matches throughout. Duke, who bowled in seven of the eight matches taped that day, proved unstoppable, gaining a bit of revenge by edging Barnes 222-213 to become king for a day.

The Badger and Wolf tournaments drew 90 entries and the Bear had 100. While the numbers may have been low, Clark said, “We had 45 of the top 50 point leaders here. We would have liked to have seen more local entries, but if the top players didn’t come, I’d be more concerned.

“We had some awesome matches and two first time winners (Peters and Loschetter). Barnes winning the Milwaukee Open (on the 52 foot oil pattern) was a testament to his ability to adapt to all types of conditions.

“Also having (celebrity team owner) Terrell Owens here for the weekend was great. He loves the sport.”

Reflecting on results of the PBA’s first ever Summer Swing, Clark said, “It’s challenging for the players to bowl and then come back later the same day for another show. It’s too early to know what we’re going to do next year, but certainly Milwaukee would be a candidate to host it again.”

CBS Sports Network will air the Geico Summer Swing events on five successive Tuesday evenings – June 11, June 18, June 25, July 2 and July 9 – at 7 p.m. Eastern time. Each will be a two hour broadcast.

EVERYONE GETS TO PLAY

That should be the theme put forth over and over again whenever discussions of the merits of youth bowling enters any conversation. It is one of bowling's greatest assets and advantage over other sports.

Talk shows devote hours to the subject of how to come up with ways to guarantee that every youngster gets to play. There are all kinds oif special rules in youth baseball, football, basketball, soccer and other sports aimed at solving the problem.

In some baseball and softball leagues up to 15 kids are allowed to come to bat whether they are in the lineup or not. In various youth sports there are mandates that insure that every kid gets his playing minute minimum. Getting to play is the problem for the youth players, their parents, their coaches, and the sports. It also has ben proposed in some areas that no score be kept, and the end of winning and losing.

How silly can you get? In sports and in life there are winners and losers, and win or lose, there is learning.

Many sports have invested millions into developing interest in their sport among youngsters. That isn't meant simply to create future stars but also to create players and fans.

Bowling is woefully weak in the spending department and too many junior programs and school organizations from pre-school through college suffer. Bowling can be expensive for youngsters and their families. Young bowlers should not be viewed merely as a possible source of current income, but as the lifeblood of the sport in pumping new life forever and ever. And it is vital for every organization in bowling to fully recognize that fact of bowling life.

Bowling's biggest plus with youngsters is that everyone gets to play, not in a forced way, but in a full participatory status. Junior bowlers can be classed according to average. Leagues can have two, three or more on a team, and there is always room for one more. And they all get to play. And they all get to know how they did as individuals or as team members.

Boys learn early that girls can bowl well too, and they don't feel nearly as bad as their elders or their counterparts in other sports when they get bowled over by a female. Another plus for youth bowling is that boys and girls get to know each other better in various competitive as well as social situations.

Parents almost dread going to a sporting contest when their children are border players, good enough to play, but not good enough to be a sure thing. Parents of young league bowlers know their youngsters will be in action, no matter how well they shoot, and parents know the kids will be in a classified situation that is either competitive or is aided by a handicap procedure that makes for some semblance of equality, regardless of ability.

Bowling is fortunate that it is a sport that can handle differences in age, size or ability in probably the fairest manner of any sport. But bowling should be shouting from the rooftops to youngsters and parents and adults and educators that this is the rarest of sports, the sport everyone gets to play in a meaningful way.

Those kids who start bowling at two or three years of age with bumper bowling, can still be bowling decades, and even a century later, and the same will apply, everyone gets so play.

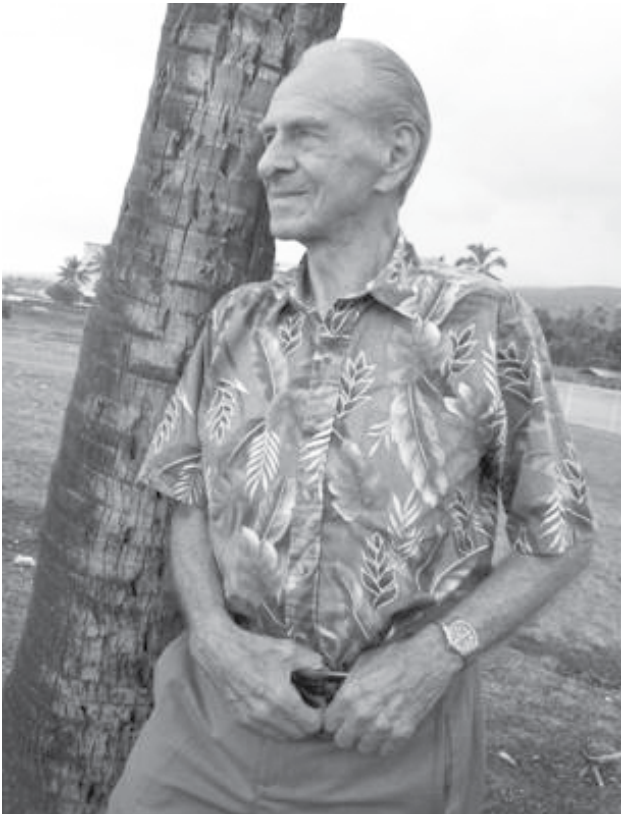

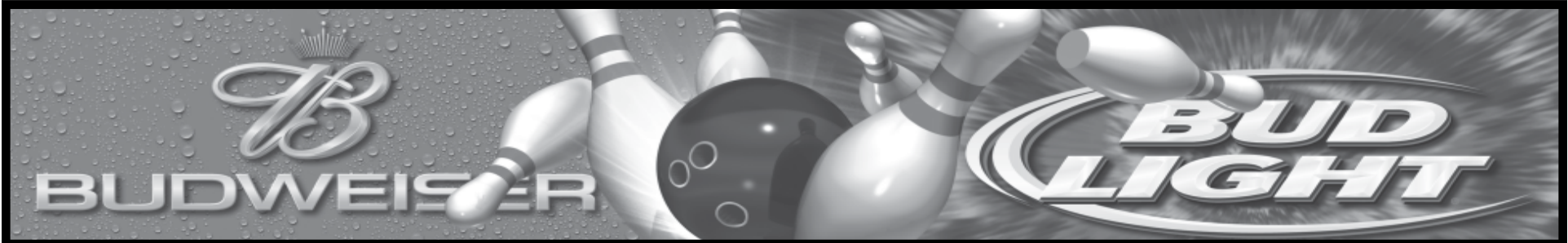

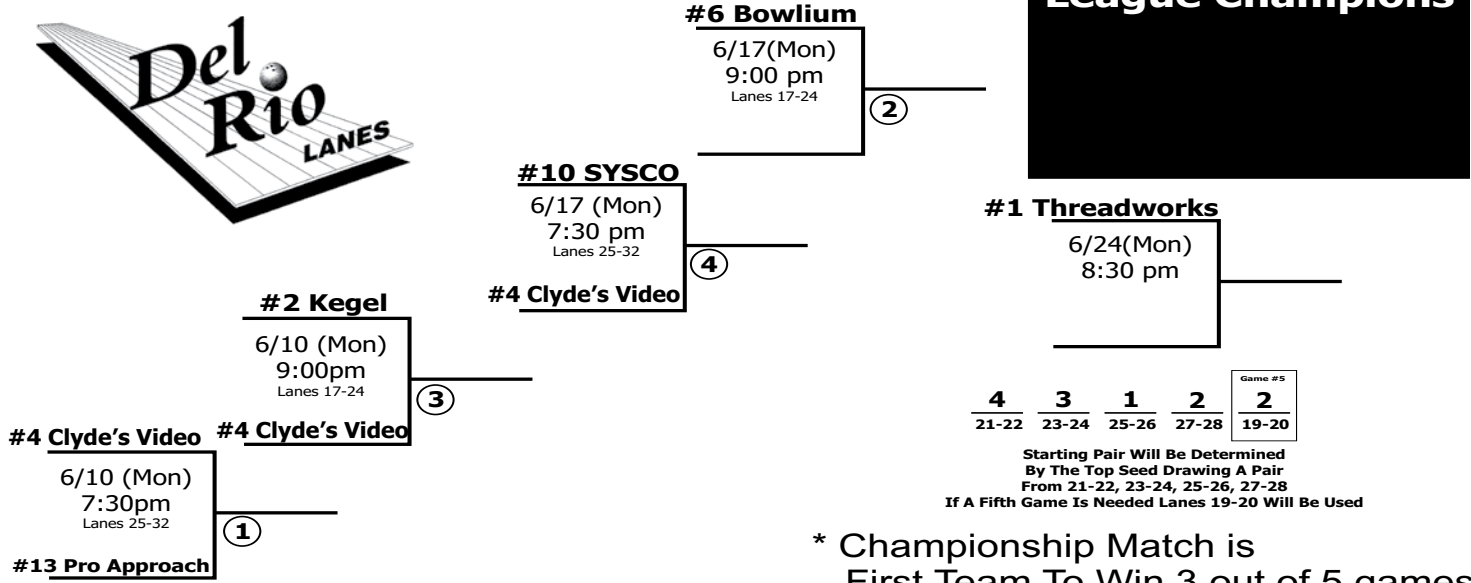
