

Herzog Insurance Wins \$16,000 in Ebonite Gold Coast Hotel cashes in for \$12,000 after 5 game battle Monday night

DOWNEY — The two teams vying for the Ebonite title and \$16,000 were on the lanes for practice at 8:30 P.M. Monday. Equipment was checked, the lanes were dressed with the four patterns to be used and hand shakes all around.

Introduction of the two teams was made by proprietor Charlie Kinstler. Starting on lane 23 was the "GOLD COAST" team. Lead-off lady was Andrea Snyder with a 219 season average, then Mike Cammarata 203, Greg Neuer 209 and Kevin Valmonte 208.

Monitor on lane 24 showed, Steve Gurrieri 210 heading up the HERZOG INSURANCE foursome, followed by Brian Main 196, Gabriel Martinez 206 and Raul Rosales 216.

There was standing room only on the concourse. Lots of family, friends and fans were given a "live" show of spare making, strike stringing and mutual respect.

Rules of the roll-off were simple; first team to win 3 games went to the cashing window for \$16,000 and the "other' team received \$12,000.

Game One was contested on the CHEETA (Short Oil) PATTERN. "GOLD COAST" posted an 879 averaging 219 per player. HER-ZOG INSURANCE came up short with 851 but with a 212 average, and with the talent for staying clean, everyone in the crowd knew it was only the start of a real battle.

For Game Two, the teams moved to the "LONG OIL"

pair. Too many splits caused lower scores all around. Andrea's 183 was high for the GOLD COAST as they slid down hill, getting snow balled by HERZOG INSURANCE 821 to 636 victory.

Glad to move off of 25-26 the crowd slid right to get a better look at 27-28. The "NATIONAL USBC" pattern at least allowed a few short strings and single corner pins were makeable. Not big scores from these great shooters but "GOLD COAST" managed to top "HERZOG INSUR-ANCE", 749 to 696.

Moving again for Game Four, they caught the "HOUSE SHOT". Andrea pounded out a 269 to lead her team to a disappointing 861 loss. Gabriel's 259, Brian's 215, Raul's 236 and Steve's 226/936 was the high team game of the night, insuring the win.

MARV SARGENT IS TOP Citrus Belt Bowler in PBA Senior US Open

LAS VEGAS — Citrus Belt Hall of Famer Marv Sargent finished twenty-second in last weeks PBA Senior US Open at the Suncoast. He averaged 222 for 51 games and sported a (10 - 13 - 1) match play record against the best senior bowlers in the world. Marv was up against such senior stars as Tom Baker, Brian Voss, Wayne Webb, Mark Williams, and Walter Ray Williams Jr.to name a few.

Marv made the cut to the top 55 by averaging 231 for the first eighteen games of qualifying. At that point, he was in seventh place. During the Round of 55 he scored at a 212 clip, for nine games, and a twenty-first place position go-

Amleto Monacelli Wins Etonic PBA Senior U.S. Open

LAS VEGAS - Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli of Venezuela, won the 2012 Etonic PBA Senior U.S. Open Friday to become the first international player to win a PBA Senior Tour title.

The 50-year-old Monacelli defeated fellow Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr., 255-247, in the championship match at the Suncoast Bowling Center in his Senior U.S. Open debut and the third tournament of his Senior Tour rookie season.

"I wanted to win the U.S. Open so badly on the national tour so that it is why I'm so happy to win the Senior U.S. Open," said Monacelli, who had a national tour U.S. Open best finish of second in 1990. "It is so unbelievable to win against one of the greatest

frame and left the six pin and knew I gave a chance to Walter Ray. I was just lucky he didn't get that second strike in the 10th frame.

For Williams, the PBA Tour's all-time titles leader

have made it to the finals.' In the semifinal match. Monacelli defeated PBA Tour veteran Mike Edwards of Tulsa, bowling in his Senior Tour debut, 235-225, to advance to the title match.

"I came here hoping to win but there are so many great bowlers on the Senior Tour,' said Monacelli, who in 1997 was the first international player inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame and was recently inducted into the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame. "I'm very happy to be a pioneer for international players."

In the opening stepladder match, Edwards defeated Hall of Famer Wayne Webb of Columbus. Ohio, who was trying to become the Senior U.S. Open's first three-time winner, 268-244 Webb also finished fourth in the 2011 Senior U.S. Open. The Senior Tour moves across town for the season's second major, the USBC Senior Masters June 10-15 at the South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

bowlers of all-time - I'm just very happy.

Monacelli, a 19-time winner on the PBA Tour, withstood a challenge from Williams who could have won with two strikes in the 10th frame of the title match. Williams struck on the first ball but left a 10-pin on the second shot.

"I was bowling well but had a couple bad shots in the last game," Monacelli said. "I threw a bad shot in the ninth

with 47 wins, it was a bittersweet result as he finished as runner-up for the second consecutive year. But Williams felt fortunate to be the top qualifier for the stepladder finals after nearly being eliminated from the tournament after the third qualifying round finishing in a tie for 45th just 35 pins above the cut.

"It's a strange game," said Williams, who was trying for his fourth career Senior Tour

ing into match play.

Match play saw Marv average 218 for 24 games. His ten wins netted him

300 bonus pins for a final score of 11,632.

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS by Connie Marchione

FRANK GALLO CASHED IN 36TH PLACE IN PBA SENIOR U.S. OPEN AT LAS VEGAS

LAS VEGAS — Frank Gallo, Jr. whose distinction is being the first deaf member of Professional Bowlers Association back in 1972, planned his trip from his home in Jacksonville, FL to Las Vegas for the two senior major tournaments with a stop over in Arizona for a couple of PBA West Region Senior tournaments. The two majors are Etonic PBA Senior U.S. Open, presented by Suncoast at Suncoast Bowling Center on June 3 to 8 and USBC Senior Masters at South Point Bowling Center on June 11 to 16.

The first stop was on May 28 at Johnson Lanes in Sun City West, AZ for the PBA West Region Senior Open, in which Gallo scored 8 games total of 1761 (220.1 ave.) to place 17th. The score was short of making match play but Gallo cashed as a Super Senior for \$250.00.

The second stop was on June 1 at Starlite Lanes in Flagstaff, AZ, in which Gallo made the cut for match play and place to cash for \$750.00. (This writer did not have the scores of this event).

PBA Senior Bowler of Year Ron Mohr, Alaska, won both tournaments.

In Las Vegas, Etonic PBA Senior U. S. Open at Suncosst Bowling Center drew 221 senior bowlers 50 years old and over. This is a tough event with 3 squads of bowlers each going 6 qualifying games for 3 days at 3 scheduled times. Then the top 55 scorers goes together for 9 more qualifying gamed to make the top 24 for the match play rounds. At the end of 51 games the top four will play in the stepladder one game match for the title. In first Day Qualifying round of 6 games Gallo rolled a respectable 1328 (221.3 ave.) to place in 45th. Good because he placed within top 55. On the second day round of 6 games, Gallo struggled a bit with 1301 (219 ave.) for 2629 total dropping him out of top 55 into 61st place. Gallo knew that he had to do better on the third day to get back in top 55, which he did. On the third day round of 6 games Gallo shot 1365 (227.5 ave.) for 3 days total of 3994. Great as his 3994 put him back in top 55 in 39th place. But he still had to average better that that in next day's qualifying round 4 of 9 games to make the top 24 for the match plays. Unfortunately on Day 4, the best Gallo could do was 1986 (220.6 ave.) for a grand total of 5980 to place in 36th. That was far away from top 24 but Gallo cashed for \$1050.00, which is not bad for a deaf senior bowler. Anyway, it was interesting to note that after Day 3 Qualifying, the bowling's great, Walter R, Williams, Jr. was below Gallo with 3902 in 48th place. That is 24 places out of top 24 to make up with 9 games to go. Probably a do or die situation for any other pro but not to WRWII. The great one rolled 9 games total of 2289 (254.3 ave.) for grand total of 6192 for 12th place. In the two days 24 games match plays, WRWII moved up to 8th with 3 wins-5 losses, then up to 2nd with 10-6 and again 16-8 to become top seed for championship finals. Unfortunately WRWII lost to Amleto Monacelli, Venezuela for the U.S. Open title 255-247. Amazing! Surprise! The defending Senior U. S. Open Champion Ron Mohr after warming up with two wins in Arizona failed to qualify after the 3 days qualifying games. With this week's USBC Senior Masters at South Point Bowling Center going on, lets see how Frank Gallo Jr. and others do.

2012 California Pepsi Youth Championships

FOUNTAIN VALLEY — The 2012 Pepsi Championships will be awarding \$40,000 in scholarships to 202 youth bowlers this year. These winners survived through two rounds of qualifying for the 11-Under Division and three rounds of qualifying for the 12-Up Division. League-level qualifying was held in November and January and the District Finals were held this past March at eight different locations over two different weekends. Based on a ratio of 1:2 from league level to District, a total of 1,231 bowlers participated in the 11-Under Division (a 3% increase over last year) and 1,936 participated in the 12-Up Divisions. The 12-up division was just slightly lower than last year. We still need to boost up the 12-up Scratch Divisions, especially the Girls 12-up Scratch Division.

The State Finals were held at Fountain Bowl in Fountain Valley on May 5-6. Moving back to our original 1:5 ratio to qualify from District to State, we had 329 bowlers travel from across the state to attend. The final top 16 bowlers (4 from each division) qualified to the Stepladder Roll-off on Sunday after the last squad of qualifying. It appeared that no one from the Sunday squad was able to beat the top four boys from the Sat squad. Third seed Kyle Dryer, went undefeated to win the championship shooting 218, 210 and 224 scratch! Kyle earned a \$1,200 scholarship. Fourth place went to Mark Lecount, who was a past Pepsi Champion in 2010. In the Girls Handicap division, top seed Maisie Carney shot 46 pins scratch above her average in that championship match to win the title against Alana Mycroft who was our 2nd place finisher in the 2011 Finals. Maisie earned the largest scholarship award for the tournament - \$1,363. In the Boys Scratch division, the first match ended in a 209 tie between 4th seed Wesley Low and 3rd seed Darren Tang. The rules called for a one game tie-breaker, which Wesley won and kept going until the championship match. Keyon was still hot after already qualifying as top seed with games of 157-207-226-239-259-226 (1314) and took the championship with a 219 game. In the Girls Scratch Division, Bianca Taylor also qualified first and remained on top defeating Ashley Dunn for her repeat crown. Congratulations to all for their outstanding bowling - the matches were extremely exciting and everyone had a great time! The top two finishers from the Scratch Division will receive a travel stipend for their trip to the 2012 USBC Jr. Gold Finals to be held in Indianapolis, IN this July. The top two finishers in the 12-Up Handicap division earned berths into the Youth State Championships that are going to be held in Mission Viejo/Lake Forest this summer. The four champions: Keyon, Bianca, Kyle and Maisie will each receive a custom embroidered jacket and Scholarships will be awarded to all six divisions based on a 1:8 ratio. All scholarship award recipients were sent a scholarship packet and all funds will be held with USBC SMART. The cut scores on Saturday night were + 91 for the men and +25 for the women. On Sunday the cut scores +108 for the men and +25 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Manny Loria (74), and Dino Dennis (75). For the women it was Bobbie McCollum (-11). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 42 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Our top qualifier for the Men was Mark Fisser with a +191. For the women it was Miriam Galluzzo with a +109. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$482. Fisser drew a 472. We had one bowler that bowled this score and it is Ricardo Baca, one of our fine regulars and most deserving. We will estimate the Match Series at \$400 at West Covina. The final bowler for the 3-6-9 roll-off was Kelly Wynn. He missed on his 4th shot so he got a \$50 consolation for beer money!! . The pot will be \$1,900 at West Covina.

In our optional doubles, First was Teddy Villaroman and Julian "Iron Man"Conwi with a 1493 for \$110. Finishing in second were Conwi and Edmund Del Mundo with a 1479 for \$90. There was a total of \$1,060 paid out in doubles and 19 paid spots with low to cash of 1409.

After the semi-finals, the leader was Brad Le Count with a huge +228. Finishing in second during the semi-finals

was Mike Bousquet at a +177. He will sit out the first round of the elims. Le Count had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$1,745. Brad drew a 197. We had three bowlers who shot that score, they were Sam Wu, Manny Natividad, and Julian "Iron Man" Conwi and they get \$581 each! We will estimate the pot at \$1,300 at our next event at West Covina.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, seven losers were Lenny Urrutia, Giang Huynh, Lordan Ferguson, Jeff Wu, Bud Zagorski, Dana Le Count, and Darrow Tiongco, they received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Donovan Chung, Kevin Collier, Alan Libao, and Mike Bousquet, they received checks of \$105 each. This would get us down to the final four bowlers. With the weekly horses paying a low of \$39 (Matt Garcia) to a high of \$221 (Miriam Galluzzo). In this round we saw William Garrett (9th seed) bowling Miriam Galluzzo (15th seed). We would see a match where William rolled over Miriam with a big game 266 to a game of 194 to advance to the semifinal match. In the other match we saw Matthew Garcia (5th seed) bowling Max Maldonado (12th seed). In this match, Max continued his good bowling and squeak out the win with a 228 to 219 to send him onto the semi-final match. Both Miriam and Matthew finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$110 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and would pit the 9th and 12th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses" we would see Max paying \$66 and William paying \$95 if they would win their match. We saw another good match with Max and him continue his hot bowling. While William did not find his shot untill the 8th frame which was too late. Max went on to win the match with a 279 to 205 and advance to the title match. Finishing in 3rd place was William Garrett this week for \$200. For those lucky "investors" that had Max as a horse, he paid \$66.

The title game was all set and we were in the middle of the house at Deer Creek Lanes. It would be Max Maldonado against the top qualifier Brad LeCount. Brad elected to start the match first. This would be a good match that was close through the first half as they both tried to find the shot that would give them the carry and multiple strikes. After the 5th frame it was Brad who trailed by 8 pins and when he came up in the 6th and left the 10 pin and missed, that gave Max a chance. He went up by 19 pins. But that started Brad on his way to strikes and he finished with a 6 bagger to finish with a 225/259 to 181/223 and win his 1st ABTA championship. He would take home \$1,000 for 1st place, \$100 for wearing an ABTA shirt, \$100 for qualifying on Saturday for a total of \$1,200. Finishing in 2nd place for \$500 was Max Maldonado.

Champion Brad LeCount is from Montclair and used a Virtual Gravity drilled by himself. He is married to another one of our top 16 finalist Dana and they have four children. He would like to thank his family for all their support, especially to Dana, and dedicate this win to his mom who passed away last January.

Max Maldonado (2nd Place) is from La Habra, and used a Virtual Gravity. He is
