## WESTERN PACIFIC BOWLING SUPPLY WINS 25TH EBONITE INVITATION TITLE

*Ramon Torres, Gabriel Martinez, Herman Ferguson & Leonard Ruiz Jr. Take the \$16,000 1<sup>st</sup> Place Prize at Del Rio Lanes* by Mike Cammarata

DOWNEY — A great crowd was on hand at Del Rio Lanes this Monday night to see the final match of the season in the Ebonite Invitational. The match was set as a best of five between the J.A.T. team and Western Pacific Bowling Supply. J.A.T. had won two matches previously in the roll-offs to advance to the finals, while Western Pacific has sat out until this point, having qualified as the #1 seed.

The games were to be bowled across five pairs of lanes using all of the different patterns that the league had bowled on during the course of

the season. Game #1 bowled on our second round pattern, which is a replica of the U.S. Open shot. The pattern was our lowest scoring condition of the season this year and played that way in the championship as well. J.A.T. had the only two bowlers on the pair to break 190, as Larry Campbell shot 228 and Matt Jones shot 211. That was enough to lead J.A.T. to a 773-708 win, and a 1-0 series lead.

Game #2 moved pairs, and went to the highest scoring of our four patterns, which is very similar to our house shot. In spite of this, several

bowlers struggled early, but it wasn't long before everyone found the line. Coincidentally, the only two bowlers to shoot over 200 in the first game (Campbell and Jones), were the only two not to break 200 in the 2nd game. A very tight scoring group of 224 from Ramon Torres, 227 from Gabriel Martinez, 221 from Herman Ferguson, and 226 from Leonard Ruiz Jr., paved the way for a 55 pin victory for Western Pacific, evening the match at one game a piece.

The short oil Cheetah was up next. An early three bagger from Torres and a four

bagger in the middle frames from Martinez was all Western Pacific needed, as J.A.T. struggled with this pattern from the beginning. Game #3 went to Western Pacific, 763-664, and moved them within one win of the title.

The fourth game of the series bowled on the Shark pattern. The game stayed fairly close early, and even saw a small lead for J.A.T. around the fifth frame, and while most of the Western Pacific team struggled with the occasional split on the difficult pattern, Ramon Torres struck on 7 out of 8 shots starting in the fourth frame to carry them to a lead. The lead got wider with the struggles of the lone lefty on the pair, Ken McElvaney. Ken had a fantastic season for J.A.T., but threw an unbelievable five consecutive washouts as the game wound down, and being unable to convert, it was simply too much to overcome. The final score was 758 to 691, and it was time for Western Pacific Bowling Supply to celebrate, and collect the \$16,000 first place money.

It was a great season of bowling. There were many honor scores bowled, and some memorable games during the playoffs and at the end of

*Vaughn Doody Wins Super Senior*

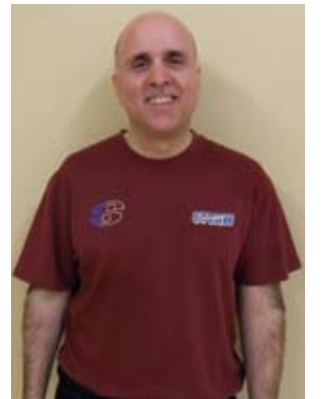

LAS VEGAS—The WCST Ebonite Singles, set another record of high individual scores at Santa Fe Lanes in Las Vegas last weekend. Eric Forkel (Henderson, NV), won his 14th Regular Division Title. A total now for 9 tournaments, \$72,305.00 paid out and overall for 307 tournaments, a total of \$3,548,426.00 paid out.

The division averaged 231 per agme per man in the qualifying for 190 games. The final, averaged 240 per game, per man for 36 games.

NORWALK — In 1955 a group of men from Hughes Aircraft got together and formed a bowling group that would travel to different bowling centers, once a month, within the Southern California area. They didn't have enough men to form teams, so they decided to bowl against each other, or as we know it, go head to head. It was decided to use the Peterson Point System to declare who the winner would be at the end of the season.

So what better name for the league than the NOMADS TRAVELING SINGLES. They never expected that the Nomads would blossom into the league it is today (or was) or last as long as it has.

Until 1962 there was only one group of men bowlers, but the number increased to 72 bowlers, and it was then divided into three divisions so that no matter what the average everyone would have a chance to win.

In 1956 the ladies were finally allowed to join. Otherwise the guys may not have been able to get out of the house. (Just kidding!!) The ladies had their own officers to run their part of the league.

For a long time the men and women bowled separately. It was then decided to mix the group so we would get to know each other better. Buz and I joined in 1964 (we think), and at that time the membership consisted of 78 men and 48 ladies. We all love the challenge of bowling at the different centers, especially Santa Maria. Each year the center puts on a BBQ for us, and it is wonderful...don't miss it!!

The charity roll-off each month was introduced a number of years ago, and we have donated quite a bit of our dollars to different charities over the years. The donations include the monies from our X-mas party raffle as well. Last year's total was over \$800.00 and it appears we may pass that total this year!

Over the years the men and women have formed teams for different tournaments. One year at the Ladies Nationals our Nomads had 30 women bowling. It was great! We all wore American Flag shirts, and received applause as we walked the street to the arena. We haven't done that recently, but maybe we can do it again?

If this sounds like a group for you, love bowling and like to travel — we will be starting the Winter Session in September. This year we traveled to Laughlin, Santa Maria, San Diego, Bakersfield, Lake Forest, Downey, La Habra, Montclair, and will sweep in Vegas. Call me! 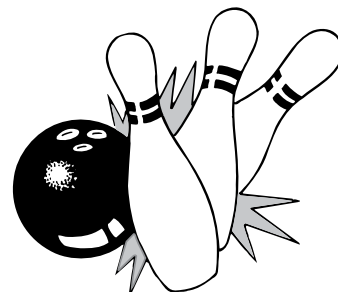
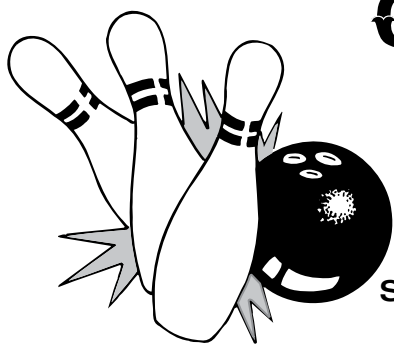

NORWALK—Melvin Finner, a regular ABTA performer won his first ABTA Title at Keystone Lanes in a VERY Exciting way to say the least. Doing it the tough way, winning five straight matches in the single elim finals, finally edging our pretty Hi Qualifier Annaliza Agoncillo in double championship match. The first ended in a tie (exciting). He won the title game to take home a nice \$2,200 to Bellflower.

Melvin topped a decent turnout of 172 entrants which was good with so many regulars unable to bowl in this event per Vegas Leagues and more. The Cut scores were very high on Saturday, as it took + 113(men) and +93 (women). Sunday's Squad had men +93 and Ladies +27 and with the added Super Seniors of Leo Tartamella, Bobbie McCollum, and Adam Drozd we totaled a field of 54 to the Semifinals in hopes of making the top 16 single elims.

Round three got hot as Melvin Finner edged tough Super Senior Frank Menchaca on the final ball 244-240. Bev Fitzgerald downed Bethany Mendoza in a good one 262-254. Bethany and Frank are 4th and 5th at \$115 each with nice bowling.

Beverly and Melvin now met for the right to advance to the title game vs Annaliza.

# National Deaf Bowling News

## 120 Enjoy So. Calif. Deaf Travel’s 50th Anniversary Banquet

LOS ANGELES — One hundred twenty bowlers, spouses and fans feted in the General Doolittle Room in the Proud Bird Restaurant in celebration of the So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League’s 50th Anniversary banquet last Sunday. Included in that number was veteran long time Bowling Manager and Co-Publisher of the California Bowling News, Carol Mancini. She was invited along with other Bowling Managers but she was the only one present.

League President Ed Abakumoff effectively handled the Master of Ceremony duties, welcoming all present and introducing VIP Mancini and the past league President Bennie Maucere who was present there. The league officers and committee members were also introduced.

After Lonnie Jones Jr. gave a short blessing invocation, the audience enjoyed the buffet luncheon menu of two different salads and fresh fruit display, entries of Lemon Chicken and Roast Top Sirloin of Beef along with rosemary red potatoes and seasonal vegetables. The desserts were different cakes, pastries and cheesecake. Because 10 diners did not show up, some of the audience made another refill from the leftovers.

The program restarted with MC Abakumoff giving the short story of how the deaf traveling league began with 6 teams of trios in 1960 after the defunct National Bowling League and using its point system. The system was not favorable so the following year it changed to match point.

He continued, the league grew in later years and almost went bust in 1975 when only five bowlers remained and changed to a singles league to keep going. In 1981 deaf women with 150 average or better were allowed to join. Then in its 25th year the league was at its largest with 16 teams of four-some, a total of 64 bowlers but being big was hard to get available lanes in smaller bowling centers.

In its 50 years, Abakumoff said it had traveled to 54 different bowling centers at 6, 8 or 10 centers per year and some of its favorite large centers had ceased operating. Also in the span of 50 years, the league had a total of 309 deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers bowling one year or more. It’s Founder and Secretary-Treasurer, Connie Marchione is the only one able to complete 50 years with Don Millwee missing a few years as next in longevity.

There were other facts the league had produced during the years which is too long to mention here. At the end Abakumoff asked Marchione’s wife Dorothy to come up and presented her with a live flower plant and a gift card thanking her for letting her husband work for bowling. Then next he asked Connie to get his award. The award was a crystal bowling pin on a blue stand trophy, which he proudly accepted.

In his speech, Marchione thanked all and said that it was all done with their help and it could not be done alone. Also he had fine officers assisting all the years and Presidents carrying the same responsibility as he did. So he felt that the four living Presidents should get an award too, but only two were able to attend this banquet. Then Marchione surprised Bennie Maucere and Abakumoff with the league’s plaques for their services as its President.

MC Abakumoff then asked the bowlers for their comments. Most of them came with praise for Marchione’s work as Secretary and his written articles. Next, Abakumoff asked Carol Mancini to say some words and Mancini responded with her kind words for deaf bowlers she knew for so many years, especially Connie.

The banquet ended with thanks to the committee members, Chairman Bill Fry and his wife Carol for the pens and wrapped favors, Vice President Sharon Caldwell and Don Millwee for taking care of listings of members and guests. Then most of the well-wishers came to shake hands and embrace Marchione. Marchione had brought 50 old program books each of 1985 and 1989, the league had worked in hosting the two tournaments for the guests to take home as souvenirs. They were gone so fast. Those who missed them can ask him for either one of them.
