Many former junior bowlers are expected to pack the center for nostalgic purposes and share lots of memories on and off the lanes. Many special bonus prizes have already be set aside for the participants in that Junior Alumni squad and it is expected to be the highlight of the weekend's activities. Loschetter's Nine-Year Quest Ends with Lucas Oil PBA Wolf Open Victory

Near-perfect finish helps 33-year-old journeyman claim first PBA Tour title

MILWAUKEE, Wis. — Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio, ended his nine-year quest for a Professional Bowlers Association Tour title when he defeated four-time PBA Tour winner Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., 264-231, to win the Lucas Oil PBA Wolf Open at AMF Bowlero.

The second of five GEICO PBA Summer Swing presented by Lucas Oil telecasts aired Tuesday on CBS Sports Network.

Loschetter, 33, who had finished second four times during a PBA Tour career that began in 2003 and included 153 previous events, followed a pair of poor shots in the third and fourth frames with a near-perfect finish to run away from O'Neill for the win. Loschetter entered the Wolf Open finals as the top qualifier, claiming that honor in the preliminary rounds at AMF West by two pins over PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla.

"I've put in thousands of hours in this game and to finally win is what matters to me," Loschetter said. "To say I'm a champion is amazing. I didn't

think for a long time that was ever going to happen. It finally did."

Pete Weber Wins USBC Senior Masters

LAS VEGAS — Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., claimed the 2013 United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters title in dramatic fashion Friday.

Weber delivered a clutch finish after fellow Hall of Famer Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., gave him an opening in the final frame. Weber struck on his first shot in the 10th frame to lock up the win, 229-205, at the South Point Bowling Center.

"Even though it's a senior tournament, it ranks right up there with all my other wins,"

said Weber, who turned 50 in August to become eligible to compete on the PBA50 Tour. "I don't care if it's a senior major or a regular major. All majors are what make you great. I just can't wait for the regular Masters to come along now."

Weber was given a chance to take the title after Boresch stepped up in the final frame needing a double to lock up the win but left the 3-4-6-7-10 split. Boresch failed to convert the split, giving Weber the golden opportunity to win.

"I loved the shot off my hand," said Boresch, who



made it through match play unbeaten before the stepladder loss. "I was ready to run it out. I must have gotten it a little slow or something. I probably needed to be tighter and firmer on that shot because it just picked up and took off on me. Bummer."

Sitting on the bench, Weber said he didn't expect to see Boresch make a mistake like that in the closing frame.

"I expected Lennie to throw two strikes and win," Weber said. "I let out a big sigh of relief, though, and just got up there, was aggressive and threw a strike."

A USBC Masters victory has always been the missing piece to complete Weber's bowling career, but even though this victory came in the *continued on page 2*

She bowled a total of 9 games over the 3 days.

Some might feel that's quite a feat, but her greatest run of 300's was in 1993 when

she broke the USBC record for most 300's in a single tournament. Paula rolled 3 perfect's in 28 games during a WWPB tournament in Palo Alto, CA. The 20 year record still stands to this day along with Walter Ray Williams, Jr. on the men's side with 4.

The 53 year old native Southern Californian is currently on DV8 Staff and rolled a Brutal Nightmare during the TNBA event and a Diva during league. The USBC Citrus Belt and California State Hall



of Famer will be receiving awards from both the TNBA and USBC for her accomplishment.

Senior Masters, Weber said he takes pride in it.

"You know what, this does have that Masters name behind it and that does mean a lot to me," said Weber, who owns 10 career major titles on the PBA's national tour. "I'll take another Senior Masters win anytime."

Weber, who earned \$16,000 for the win, came into the stepladder finals as the No. 3 seed and had to win three matches to take the title. In the semi-final, he knocked off local favorite Kerry Painter of Henderson, Nev., 204-182.

In his first match of the day, Weber took down fellow Hall of Famer Wayne Webb of Grove City, Ohio, 247-229. Webb defeated No. 5 seed David Axon of Bellevue, 212-193, to open the stepladder finals. For more information on the Senior Masters, visit BOWL.com/SeniorMasters.

Beat the Board Event with a \$975 Horses Carry Over

MONTCLAIR — On our return to Bowlm Lanes we saw a decent. Although a lighter turnout we had a great time, and Great Food also. 166 entrants came out for a fun day of bowling. The cut scores were +78 for the men and +43 for the women, on a medium shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) Terry Hodgson and Ely Cruz. For the women it was newcomer Sandra Tiffin. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 43 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

High qualifiers for the tournament Bob Alvarado for the men with a +191 and for the women it was Jeannette Chang with a +105. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$5,000. Bob would draw the score and he drew a 407. No bowler matched that

score so the \$5,000 pot carries over with a Reserve of \$1,030. In the 3-6-9 Rolloff Bryan Moore almost hit the \$1,600 Pot but missed shot 4. We go for \$1,700 Saturday at Action Lanes.

Edmund Del Mundo and Rithy Ath led the Optional Doubles with a 1452 for \$110. Finishing in second place was Thomas Licauco and John Licauco, yes father and son, with a 1404 for \$90. There was a total of \$880 paid out in doubles and 18 paid spots with low to cash of 1345.

The semifinalists took the floor and the leader was ABTA Regular Ben Bagaoisan with a +167! A close second was Gina Velarde at a +159. Gina would sit out the first round of the top 16 Single Elims. Ben had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$2,645. He drew a 290. No bowlers matched that score, so we will estimate the pot at \$4,200 Saturday.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In Round one, the seven losers

were Tomas Chavez, Bryan Moore, Christopher Eguilos, William Garrett, Jonathan Gonzales, Faye Josafat, and David Hurtado, each got \$100. In Round two, the four losers were Sandy Tiffin, Mark Fisser, Rithy Ath, and John Licauco getting checks of \$105.

We are now down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$33, John Armenia, to a high of \$104 for Willie Parawan. In match one, we saw our tenth seed Willie Parawan bowling the fourth seed John Armenia. This match went back and forth, both doing well, but in the end John found the shot and fired a big six bagger to advance with a 271 to 256 victory. Willie also bowled very well! In the other match, it was fifth seed Robert Mendoza bowling the second seed Gina Velarde. In this match, Gina just returning to bowling got tired. That allowed Robert to coast to a victory with a 223 to 169 match. Gina bowled great. Watch out bowlers as it

looks like she is getting back into form. Willie and Gina cashed in 4-5 places and each got \$110.

The semi-final match was set, John Armenia vs Robert Mendoza (the weekly "horses"). We would see John paying \$33 and Robert paying \$92 if they would win the match. Again another good match, as John would start out slow with a couple of opens in the first five frames. He was matched by Robert, but the opens in the fourth and fifth frames kept it close, as he would only lead by four pins at that point. Then Robert doubled, but John started a string of four strikes in the seventh to pull away and take this match with a 204/233 to 172/213 and advance to the title match. Robert bowled so well, and would finish in 3rd place for \$200, John advanced to the title match and was your horse winner for \$33.

The title game was on with the top our qualifier Ben vs. John Armenia. Match started slowly and after the third frame, an open by Ben would drop his lead to eight pins. Ben was able to get a strike in the fourth frame. That brought up John and he would open in the fourth and then strike in the fifth. Ben opened in the fifth by missing the six pin and then left the 4-7-10 split in the sixth. John doubled to take the lead and he would not look back as he continued to strike and finished out with a 219/248 to Ben's 149/197 and take home his third ABTA championship. He would take \$1,000 for the victory and an additional \$1,700 for Cash and Carry to give him a total of \$2,700. Ben would take home \$500 for his second place finish. Congrats to two gentlemen as Ben did very well at Bowlm and John wins his third title. He has been with the ABTA at least 18+ years and always one of the Good Guys! I remember his father Frank who has since passed. A Great Guy, brought John into the ABTA. Great people!! Frank is Proud of his son; from above, no doubt!

Champion John Armenia is from is Orange and used a tropical breeze drilled by Ramon at Carter. He is married to Connie and they have four children, Sarah, Jacob, Joey, and CJ. He would like to thank his family, specially his wife for all her support. The most notable contenders to make it to match play includ- ed: 1. Michael Haugen, 2. Eddie Van Daniker, 3. Scott Norton, 5. Frank Barefoot (CB - Citrus Belt bowler), 6. James Doolen (CB), 9. P.J. Haggerty, 10. Missy Parkin, 12. Alan Mojado (CB), 13. Justin Ziegler (CB), and Mike DeVaney (CB). Ten other Citrus Belt bowlers competed with Nathan Urrutia of Moreno Valley being the only one of them cashing. He made \$400 for placing twenty-fourth.

Mojado's march to the title began with a Round of 16 win over Frank Barefoot 3-2. In the Round of 8 he defeated Jus- tin Ziegler 2-1. His Round of 4 win was over Mike DeVaney 1-0 and the championship win came at the expense of runner-up Keith Laing of Los Angeles.

One of the most interesting matches saw two PBA National Champions battle in the Round of 16. MIKE DeVANEY slipped into match play by a mere five pins over Tim Porritt. As the sixteenth seed into match play DeVaney had to battle number one seed MIKE HAUGEN. Match play suited DeVaney just fine as he easily defeated Haugen 3-1. The match was compelling because of the national reputation of the two competitors. DeV- aney finished fourth and might have won it all if he didn't lose to Champion Mojado 0-1, 192-202 in the Round of 4.

MARV SARGENT is Citrus Belt's Top Finisher at USBC Senior

LAS VEGAS — Marv Sargent is our best finisher again. Af- ter finishing 20th in the PBA Senior US OPEN he tied for 24th in last weeks USBC Senior MASTERS. He was our only bowler to make the cut to match play, after averaging 204 for fifteen games of qualifying. Sixty-four bowlers made the cut to match play and it took a 201 average to advance. The last bowler in was DON JACKSON of Bonita, California.

Can you imagine missing match play by just one pin after fifteen games? Don't bother dreaming about it, just ask Robert Lawrence from Texas. After fifteen games of qualifying Don Jackson edged Lawrence by one pin, 3015 to 3014, for the final spot in match play. Don averaged 201.0 while Robert averaged 200.93.

Sargent was consistent throughout all three squads of quali- fying. His squad scores (5 game squads) were 1027, 1000, and 1033. That's averaging 205, 200 and 206.

Sargent started match play against former USBC Senior Mas- ters Champion KENNY PARKS. Parks burst on the national senior scene about five years ago and nearly won PBA Senior Player of the year that summer. Parks has consistently finished high in the PBA senior events he has entered, since his debut, so Marv knew he had his hands full. It was a match that see- sawed but in the end Marv prevailed 588 - 566. Senior Master's matches are decided by total pins for three games.

Marv then faced PBA National Champion HUGH MILLER, last years runner-up. Miller is a crafty left hander with ice water in his veins and decades of PBA experience under his belt. In my opinion, Hugh Miller may be the toughest match play competi- tor on the PBA 50 (SENIOR) Tour. Marv never blinked but still came up one pin shy of victory 643 - 644.

After his first loss, Marv moved into the second chance brack- et and won handily over Doug O'Brient 708 - 661. Finally, de- fending champion MIKE EDWARDS eliminated Marv with a 715 series to Marv's 653. From my calculations, Marv ended up tied for twenty-fourth place, winning \$1,580.00. Marv extends his thanks to the BOWLING NEWS for covering the tournament and his efforts to win the tourney.

Other Citrus Belt bowlers who competed finished in the fol- lowing order: DON MOSER, PAUL NILSEN, RAY COBB, J.KENT JOHNSON, GARY HENDERSON, and DONNIE CRANDALL. PBA national tour veteran MOSER just missed the cut by 21 pins, after 15 games. That is missing by just 1.4 pins per game!!!!

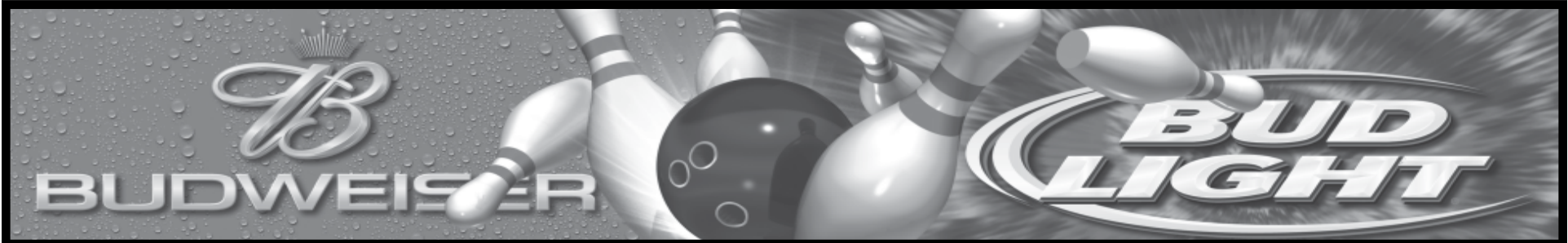
