

2006 California Pepsi Championships Awards \$75,000 in **Scholarships!**

The California Pepsi USBC Youth Championships awarded a record breaking \$75,000 to 273 scholarship recipients. The District Finals had 4,479 participants compete at 8 different sites throughout the state on March 11-12 and March 18-19, 2006. Thank you to the hosting centers for their hospitality and to everyone for their help and support. And tremendous thanks to www.EliteBowling .com for their discount bowling cards that were provided to all participants at the district finals! Please visit them online and help us to thank them. 1,623 participants were in the 11-Under division and based on a ratio of 1:8, 205 bowlers earned scholarships totaling \$24,560!

The State Finals for the 12up divisions were held at Cedar Lanes in Fresno on May 6-7. 524 bowlers traveled from Eureka to San Diego to compete for scholarship money and eight berths into the Pepsi National Finals and the Junior Gold National Finals to be held in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida this July. The first place winners of each district finals held back in March were presented with certificates and commemorative watches for their outstanding achievement. The division breakdowns were 315 Boys 12-Up Handicap, 132 Girls 12-Up Handicap, 62 Boys 12-Up Scratch and 15 Girls 12-Up Scratch participants.

16 bowlers (the top 4 from each division) qualified for the stepladder roll-off that followed the final squad of qualifying on Sunday. For the 12-up Boys Handicap division, the 3rd place qualifier did not return for the roll-off. We went to the next alternate, 5th place and he was also a not available.

Continuing down the line, we found the 6th place alternate, RANDY SKAGGS (\$3500 scholarship) from Victor Bowl who was packing up to leave in the parking lot. We got him in the bowl and literally threw him down on the lanes for the first roll-off match, which he won against 4th seed JOHN CIANCIOLO (\$2000

scholarship) from Bel Mateo Bowl. Randy kept on going and defeated 2nd seed JJ LEWIS (\$2500 scholarship) from Double Decker Lanes and top seed JEREMY BRUUN (\$3000 scholarship) from Cedar Lanes. Randy will be taking home the largest scholarship award of the tournament of \$3500!

In the 12-up Girls Handicap division. 2nd seed KAYLEE RIDDLE (\$2035 scholarship) from Fantasy Lanes defeated top qualifier JESSICA HILVANO (\$1750 scholarship) from Jewel City Bowl for the championship. Both girls will be joining the other finalists to compete for an additional \$20,000 in scholarships in Ft. Lauderdale.

In the 12-Up Boys Scratch division, defending champion CARMICHÂEL **BRIAN** (\$1500 scholarship) defeated top seed JOE MARTINEZ (\$1100 scholarship) for a 2nd championship title. This was an exciting match that came down to the 10th frame with a possible tie forth coming.

In the 12-Up Girls Scratch division, KATIE MCCLEL-LAND (\$425 scholarship) climbed the ladder to the final match, but was defeated by top seed DANIELLE SCHILLING (\$530 scholarship). Both Brian and Danielle (both were our past State Scratch champions for 2005) will be representing CA in the Jr. Gold National finals in Ft. Lauderdale and will have an opportunity to compete for additional scholarship dollars earmarked specifically for Pepsi qualifiers. (All of the eight can be followed on www.bowl.com).

USBC Approves **New York Youth** Bowler's Two 900 Series

GREENDALE, Wis. - Two 900 series rolled by a New York teenager have been officially approved by the United States Bowling Congress.

The two perfect three-game series - three consecutive 300 games or 36 straight strikes - by Robert Mushtare, 17, of Carthage, N.Y., were rolled during pre-bowling sessions for the Pine Plains Junior/Senior League at Pine Plains Bowling Center in Fort Drum, N.Y., on Dec. 3, 2005 and Feb. 19, 2006, respectively.

Due to the extraordinary circumstances of having two 900 series rolled during pre-bowling periods in the same bowling center by the same person, USBC conducted a thorough investigation into the score submissions. In keeping with the current rules of the sport as approved by USBC delegates - which allow for the recognition of honor scores rolled in pre-bowling sessions - USBC approved Mushtare's scores.

"USBC did conduct a thorough inquiry. Based on the information derived in the interviews, USBC concluded that the rules of the game were followed, and therefore the scores were approved," said USBC Director of Sport Jeff Henry.

USBC administratively rejected a 900 series by Mushtare submitted as having occurred on Nov. 5, 2005 during a pre-bowling session in the same league at Pine Plains Bowling Center. That

decision was based on the fact that the league was not certified and that Mushtare was not a USBC member at the time the score was bowled. The administrative decision was appealed by Mushtare and ultimately denied by the USBC Legal and Legislative Committee.

With his two 900s, Mushtare becomes the first person to have rolled certified multiple perfect series and the youngest to roll an approved 900. He also becomes the first youth bowler to shoot a certified 900. Mushtare becomes the 10th person to roll a certified 900 series, making it 11 approved 900 series that have been recorded in the 111-year history of certified league bowling. Following is a list of the 11 USBC-approved 900 series with the locations and dates the scores were bowled: (Note: All scores before Mushtare's first 900 were approved by the American Bowling Congress, one of the organizations that merged to form USBC.)






