

ARLINGTON—Former American Bowling Congress Life Member Bert Lindgren of Liberty Lake, Wash., died June 11 at age 95 and former ABC Director Joseph Griffith of Milford, Mass., died June 14 at age 76.

Lindgren joined the ABC Board of Directors in 1957, retiring and being named a life member in 1978. He was a charter member of the Northwest Hall of Fame in 1963 and also elected to the Spokane (1966) and Washington State (1986) Halls of Fame.

Griffith was elected to the ABC Board of Directors in 1991 where he served through 2004 when ABC merged into the United States Bowling Congress. He was elected to the Massachusetts Bowling Hall of Fame in 2001.

The longtime Massachusetts Department of Employment and Training employer services representative was most recently serving on the advisory committee of the Blackstone Valley Technical Vocational High School in Upton, Mass. He won a state seniors championship in 1989. He served many years with the Worcester County and Massachusetts BA including terms as president of both. He was a life member of the Worcester County BA.

Griffth's funeral will be held June 27 at 9 a.m. at the Edwards Memorial Funeral Home, 44 Congress Street, Milford, MA followed by a Mass of Christian Burial at 10 a.m. in St. Mary of the Assumption Church, 19 Winter Street, Milford, MA. Burial will follow in North Purchase Cemetery in Milford MA. Visiting hours will be June 26 from 5-8 p.m.



Some Good Scores Bowled By Deaf Bowlers

While we wait for the Pacific Coast Deaf Masters and Senior Master results to come, there are some scores by two top hearingimpaired bowlers reported to me.

Super Sub Degroff Rolled 279/781 at Jewel City

GLENDALE—Ken DeGroff who has a storied record of many 300's and 800's which landed his name in the USBC record books, reported that he had a "strikingfest" last June 19 as a super sub in Linda's Las Vegas League at Jewel City Bowl. He pounded out lots of strikes in his 234-268-279 games for a 781 series that night. Great for him!

Ken is famous as the first deaf bowler to bowl back to back 300's twice! That puts him in the USBC records and he has the distinction of being ont only deaf bowler to bowl 300 in four different Deaf Club Classics in four different cities.

With no disrespect to Ken, I know a couple great deaf bowlers had bowed two 300's in a deaf tournament. Like I reported last week with Mayland's Daniel Krpata's feat of recently bowled 300 in last May's and last year's Eastern ADB tournaments. Detroit's Pete Kaczmarzyck had bowled 300 a day apart in the 1990 National Deaf Tournament and Carl Malucci, Las Vegas rolled two 300's in one day in 1997 National Deaf Tournament. Malucci also had a 300 in each Pacific Coast Deaf and Southern Nevada-California Deaf tournaments and also one each in So. California Deaf Classic and Downey Deaf Classic.

One of the days I will write about Ken's interensting records of feats besides the two mentioned above.

Malucci Had A 299 On Leagues Final Night at Red Rock

LAS VEGAS—Last month's issue of the Bowling News I mentioned that Carl Malucci ended his Mountian Siders League at Red Rock Lanes with 246 average with is a record for deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers. On that final night May 17, he shot a 299 game which made two 299 games at Red Rock Lanes for him. He feft a 7 pin standing on his last ball in the 10th frame for a career 15th 299 game.

Back in 1997 when I was putting together the USA bowling team, with two months to go I needed one more woman to fill the women's team for the World Games for the Deaf in Denmark (it was changed to Deaflympics in 2001). Jeri came to me with her desire to go on the team. With no time to raise her fund for the trip, she accepted to go on her own. In Denmark she made her mark when she won the Silver medal in singles.

Since then she collected Deaflympics medals in 2001 Italy and 2005 Austrilia. Now she deserves all the help in fund raising for the trip to Taiwan next January.

The upcoming telecasts will again feature two-way communication between announcers Rob Stone and Randy Pedersen and a selected player on each team during competition, a first in televised bowling.

The Baker Scoring System will be used where five (of the six) players bowl two frames in one game to combine for one score. Teams will also be able to take advantage of the "Endless 10th Frame" bonus. If the team that is behind in the match strikes on its final ball in the 10th frame, it can continue throwing shots as long as each is a strike. If the opposing team loses its lead, it can then try to rally in its own Endless 10th Frame but only if its anchor bowler also struck on the final ball in the 10th. Each Endless 10th Frame strike adds 10 pins to a team's score.




