Wayne Webb Wins 2008 Senior U.S. Open

LAS VEGAS—In a battle of Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Hall of Famers, first-year Senior Tour player Wayne Webb defeated Johnny Petraglia to win the 2008 PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Suncoast Friday at the Suncoast Bowling Center.

Webb, a 20-time Denny's PBA Tour titlist bowling in only his second Senior Tour event, defeated Petraglia 204-172 in the championship to win the \$20,000 first prize.

"Bowling the championship match was just like the rest of the tournament for me," said the 50-year-old Webb. "You really had to stay on your toes and keep moving and adjusting. I really didn't feel like I had that good of a shot until this morning's match play round. It felt like I had to make perfect shots the whole tournament."

For Petraglia it was a bitter disappointment after having dominated the entire tournament from the opening qualifying round to earn the No. 1 qualifying spot for the stepladder finals.

"You never want to lead a tournament by a lot because it makes it that much more terrible to lose—just terrible," said the 61-year-old Petraglia.

Webb was able to overcome

an open in the sixth frame of the championship match—a missed 10-pin -- which dropped him two pins behind Petraglia.

"I couldn't believe I missed that spare but I just yanked it," Webb said. "I thought that was going to be the turning point in the match but I was able to recover. "It's tough to see someone who bowled as well as Johnny this week lose but when it comes down to one match, it happens."

In the semi-final match Webb defeated two-time Senior U.S. Open champion and PBA Hall of Famer Tom Baker, 225-212 to advance to the final. In the opening match, Baker defeated one-time Senior Tour and five-time Denny's PBA Tour champion Bob Handley, 176-156. It was the second consecutive year that Baker and Handley finished third and fourth in the Senior U.S. Open, respectively.

The U.S. Senior Open is a major on the Senior Tour. As one of the most demanding formats in the sport the four finalists had to bowl 51 games of qualifying and match play to make it to the stepladder.

The next stop on the PBA Senior Tour is Klamath Falls, Ore., for the PBA Senior Epicenter Classic June 23-26.

Up Your Average

Instruction to Help Raise Your Scores



Using Break Point Techniques To Increase Your Scores

Articles dealing with “Break Point” techniques have been so popular that requests for back issues emptied the shelves. You’d think every bowler alive would learn about break point to increase strike percentages, wouldn’t you?

Well, you’d be wrong!

It’s true that all professionals use break point targeting as a valuable tactic. Yet it seems that even the better amateur tournament bowlers who employ it are in the minority. Among mid range bowlers it seems to be almost non-existent, while those below 150 have never even heard of it.

Why? Shouldn’t any tool to help scores be welcomed by all? That’s exactly what break point bowling does, no matter what the lane conditions are.

But what is the break point?

Well, it is defined as the point down lane where an already hooking ball begins to actually “break” toward the pocket. So, if you watch the ball’s travel down lane, you’ll see just where that point is. The reason so few bowlers know about it is because the normal “house” lane oil condition hides many of a bowler’s mistakes. So league bowlers have little reason to change.

But anybody who wants real, permanent improvement, will need to learn to bowl on tougher, more difficult lane conditions... and break point bowling is a huge scoring helper in those tough conditions! But...many league bowlers don’t realize that break point targeting is also a winning technique in normal conditions, not just the difficult ones. So it’s a win-win situation for all!

A Quick Background

I have been teaching break point techniques since the early 1980’s, but never knew whose idea it was. Later, I learned that long time coach Sam Baca was the originator of the break point principles. He’s the one who deserves credit for originally coming up with its principles.

Getting To The Point (The Break Point)

One of Baca’s main revelations was hard to swallow by many at first, but is actually true. That is, that several successfully striking bowlers, although each may be using a different line, will, nevertheless all have the same optimum break point on the same lane! So if one bowler is using a deep inside line, the second one a mid-lane line and the third points the ball from the far outside (a down-and-in shot), the successful break point will be the same for all (see illustration 1).

Difficult though it may be to believe at first, this turns out to be oh so true in actual play! Why? Well, the strike creating break point on a given lane bed is actually determined by the lane condition itself, not the bowler’s lane play area!

Notice that in illustration 1, the balls of all three players, regardless of which part of the lane they play, have virtually the same break point to pocket! Just another reason for the importance of break point targeting.

Reaching For Improvement

Baca also pointed out that one of the reasons some bowlers reject the principles of break point targeting is that they perceive it as a major change, and they’d rather stay in their “comfort zone”. Well, to succeed, we must be willing to stretch our comfort zone... not to hide in it!

But there are legitimate reasons some bowlers have initial difficulty using break point principles. Some find it difficult to visualize a target so far down lane. We’ll explain how to overcome that. Since there are always several possible break points that will get ball to pocket, some bowlers just flat don’t understand that every such break point may not be the one that will get a strike. We must remember that we didn’t necessarily get robbed if a pocket hit didn’t strike. Just hitting the pocket is no guarantee.

Then there are those who don’t realize what was just mentioned above...that the location of the optimum break point which will create the strike is not determined by which line the bowler happens to be using...but by the lane condition. So when the lane condition changes, that’s when break point also changes...and the bowler must be aware of that.

The “How To”...The Actual Method

It’s obviously more difficult to hit a target in the break point area (approximately 35 or 45 feet away) than at the arrows. The fact that most lane beds have no visual markings at that distance makes it even tougher. One way to make it easier is to just visualize a target at that distance. Another is to visualize a target area rather than just one small target. That’s easier than expecting to hit a specific board so far away. So I created an imaginary square, 6 boards wide and deep to be visualized at the intended break point. This larger area is easier to get the ball into. That’s the target (see illustration 2).

As with any target, the bulls-eye is in the center, a one board wide dot that will gain the highest strike percentage. Getting the ball farther away from the center will yield a lower percentage of strikes, but anywhere within that target will always score better than missing it altogether. Obviously, if the bowler has chosen the wrong break point area for the condition, that break point could be hit all day long and still not score well.

Finding The Correct Break Point

Since the optimum break point’s location depends on the lane condition, doesn’t this mean that if one or more other bowlers on a given lane are striking consistently they must have found that break point? Of course! By merely watching for the location of their break point, yours will be the same as theirs on that lane. So...“going to school” on those consistent strike shooters is the easiest way to discover your break point! Virtually all winning professionals use this going to school technique. It’s especially rewarding in tournaments, where you move to the next pair after

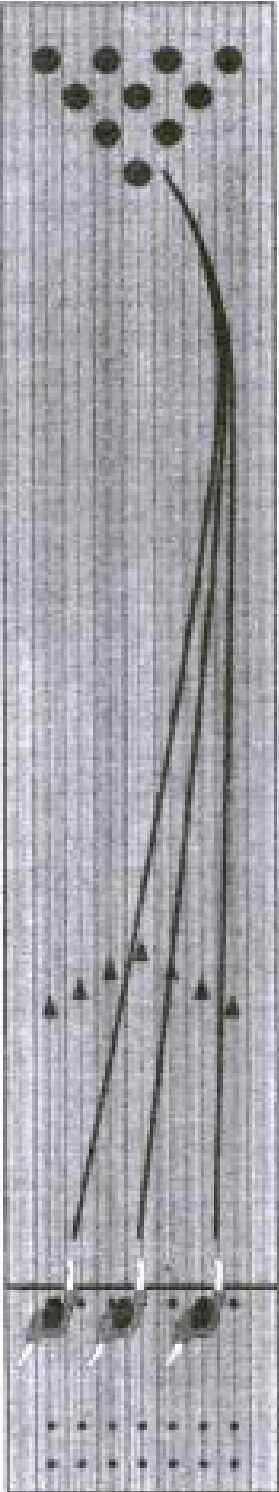

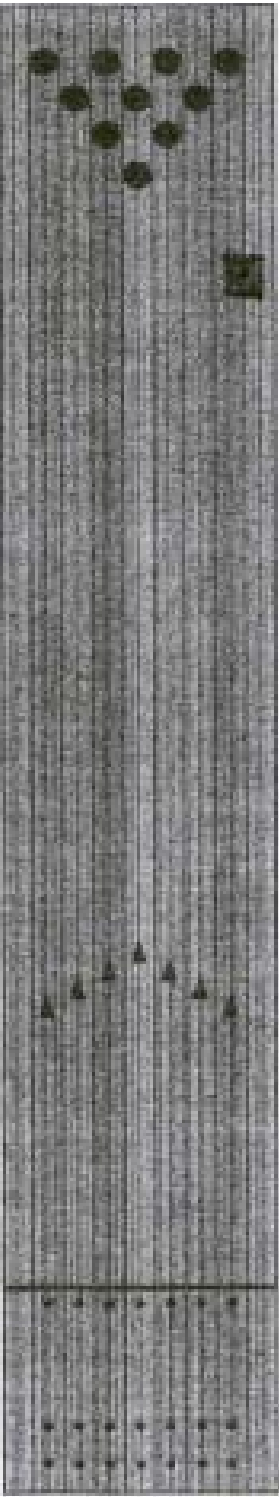

each game.

The other method takes a bit longer, but is just as successful. Test shots to find the line is always a good start. That knowledge is a short cut to finding the best starting position and mark at the arrows, which will get your ball to the pocket at the proper angle. Remember...how the ball hits the pocket is critical. And hitting the break point is the best way!

Keep in mind that the most important single trait in bowling is repeatability! That never changes! Without it nobody can be accurate enough to be successful, so practice accuracy.

Break point targeting can become your savior, especially in tough lane conditions. Why? Because getting your ball to that optimum target takes the lane condition out of the picture completely.

Making it easier

The Brunswick(R) AnvilPro™ lanes feature a cleverly thought out aid for targeting break points. Dark target strips are imprinted into the surface down lane in the general area where balls usually reach their break point. These are called RANGEFINDERS and there are four of them. Each is 36 inches long and one board wide. They are strategically placed as follows (see illustration 3): The two closest ones to the bowler are on the 15 boards (one each on the left and right sides). They run from 34 feet to 37 feet down lane. The two more distant ones are each on the 10 board (also right and left sides) and run from 40 to 43 feet down lane.

Think of these range finders sort of like landmarks...to identify an area into which to physically place your break point target . They make it so much easier to locate the break point that gets the most strikes.

Still Sceptical?

Current US Open champion, PBA Hall Of Famer Norm Duke, after over 24 years on the tour, said that after years of learning how to read lanes, he could now take the short cut of using break point targeting to throw the shots that create the most strikes. Gary Dickinson, one of the winningest senior tour players of all time, when asked why he was watching players on the next pair of lanes, said he was watching the highest scoring bowlers to find out where their break point was.

He found out. He won the tournament!

This Month’s Rolf-ism

At the end of your follow through, FREEZE! Then check your position.

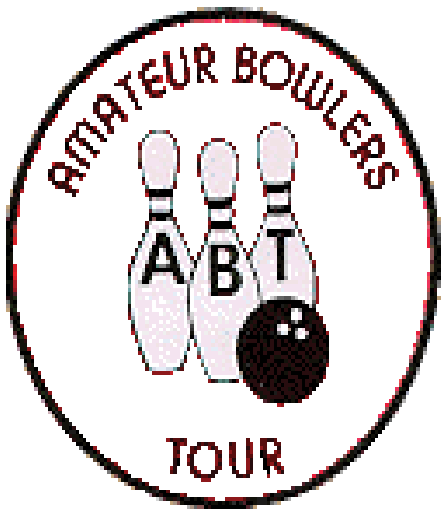

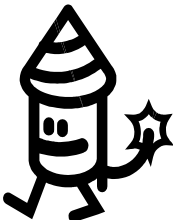

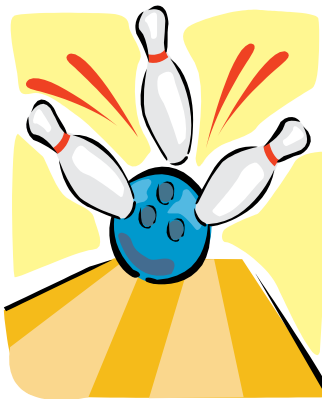

ON A ROLL for July 2008 - TEMPO IN THE APPROACH

Tempo is a very personal area when it comes to how it fits into a coordinated and balanced bowling approach. A lot has to do with a person’s natural and normal comfort. We all know people who we might characterize as ‘laid back’, while other friends might be described as kind of ‘hyper’. When coaching, you should attempt to stay within what is a normal tempo for your student.

Tempo in a bowling approach mainly refers to the pace of the footwork. However, the tempo in a bowling approach also includes the arm swing and its tempo. The footwork and arm swing are linked.

Why?

The answer is, the arm swing and the footwork will be matched in tempo. The job of the coach is to make sure that the matched tempo is the ‘correct’ tempo for a consistent and productive delivery.

Here are some things to look for that likely require a change in the ‘tempo’ for your student.

1. If you see a definite and slow...heel-toe approach = too slow a tempo
2. If you see a bowler who looks quick and at the foul line rears up or has the body turned sideways = too fast a tempo.
3. If you see an arm swing that is very slow and controlled = too slow a tempo.
4. If you see a very short and quick arm swing = too fast a tempo.
5. If the ball speed is dramatically slow = too slow a tempo

TWO POSSIBLE EXCEPTIONS:

1. Small children often have to ‘move quickly’ to the foul line to generate enough ball speed. If they arrive at the foul line and have good balance, then you may not want to have them change the ‘tempo’ of their approach. If you slow them down, the ball may hook too much and not be controllable.

As they mature, their need to ‘run’ to the line will diminish.

2. Senior citizens OR bowlers who have medical issues may go slower to the foul line than a coach might feel is correct. Based upon age or physical limitations their slower ‘tempo’ may be the best ‘tempo’ for them.

GENERAL GUIDELINE:

Tall bowlers often move more slowly...short bowlers often move more rapidly

A bowler’s height is something the coach should be aware of and enables the coach to work within the comfort level of his student.

SOME REASONS WHY A BOWLER’S TEMPO MIGHT BE TOO SLOW:

- Standing too upright throughout approach (an extreme heel-toe step pattern)
- Slowly counting their steps as they walk
- Starting too far back on the approach (having to take large steps to cover the distance)
- Ball held too long with both hands (not getting it into the swing early enough)
- Ball pushed too far upward in pushaway
- Too controlled an arm swing
- Bad fit of a ball results in too much grip pressure to hold on to ball
- Too heavy a ball
- Fear of going over the foul line (especially senior citizens)
- Parent or friend offering bad advice (common advice is not to ‘rush the line’ which may lead to an approach that is too deliberate)

SOME REASONS WHY A BOWLER’S TEMPO MIGHT BE TOO QUICK:

- Starting the approach with too much forward lean
- Starting too far back on the approach (having to run or gallop to cover such a long distance)
- Ball pushed too far downward in pushaway
- Pushing the ball too quickly into the swing
- Bad ball fit
- Too heavy a ball
- Ball started too soon in approach
- Small in stature attempting to create ball speed
- Watching someone else and trying to copy their style

These problems often result in poor deliveries, inconsistencies, lower scores and ultimately frustrated customers.

HOW TO HELP THE BOWLER WITH THEIR TEMPO

Utilizing the descriptions of problems above you have a simple checklist of areas to look for as you evaluate your student. If you see one or more problem areas from the checklist, work to eliminate that flaw and the tempo will be improved.

Once you have worked with your student to make sure none of the ‘common mistakes’ are being made, here is another way to help your student continue bowling with the correct tempo for him/her.

REMINDER SWING:

Once your student is set up and before they begin their approach, have them take a ‘reminder swing’ before they bowl. This includes pushing the ball forward slightly, letting it swing back and forward naturally, and have the ball return to the original starting position. Then have the bowler bowl and strive to let the speed or tempo of the steps match that of the ‘reminder swing’. It may take several deliveries, but soon you will see excellent improvement and the bowler will be bowling in a more efficient tempo.

While using the ‘reminder swing’ it is important not to worry about accuracy. All focus should be on letting the tempo of the swing dictate the tempo of the footwork. Note: There are some bowlers who use a ‘reminder swing’ as part of their pre-shot routine.

WHY DOES THIS WORK?

The ‘reminder swing’ works because it provides instant feedback to the body as to how fast the ball wants to swing in a natural manner. All the bowler has to do is let the speed or ‘tempo’ of their steps match the natural swing speed or ‘tempo’ of the ball in motion.

The ‘reminder swing’ is a great corrective technique for issues with a bowler’s tempo. It also can be used during a practice session to reinforce a bowler’s existing good tempo.
