Bill O'Neill Slows Brian Valenta Express to Win PBA Badger Open
Pennsylvania veteran throws clutch double in 10th frame to win fifth PBA Tour title



SHAWNEE, Okla. — Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., derailed Brian Valenta's hopes for a first title, throwing two strikes in the 10th frame to edge Valenta, 243-235, in the Professional Bowlers Association Tour Badger Open championship match at the Grand Casino Resort Event Center.

The finals of the third of five Oklahoma's Grand Casino Resort PBA Summer Swing events, contested on a 52-foot Badger lane condition — the longest oiling pattern in PBA's library of lane conditions — aired Tuesday on CBS Sports Network.

Along with his fifth career PBA Tour title — and first since the 2012 Cheetah Championship — O'Neill earned \$10,000 and a berth in Oklahoma's Grand Casino Resort King of the Swing, a special event that will conclude the Summer Swing.

While Valenta, a two-handed, high-revolution player, played a severe inside line, lofting the ball 10 feet or more down the lane, O'Neill moved to the right side of the lane and played a much straighter shot to the pocket.

"I knew I couldn't play (as

USBC California Association

SACRAMENTO – The USBC California Association hosted a full weekend of events for the delegates attending the 2014 Annual Convention, which was held at the beautifully refurbished Crown Plaza Hotel (formerly Holiday Inn) Saturday and Sunday, June 7th and 8th. The affair was kicked off with the CAUSBC Board of Directors meeting from 8:30-11:30 am., immediately followed by The Youth Delegate Meeting/Lunch from 12:15 to 1:30. After catching their breath for 15 minutes, all Adult and Youth Delegates gathered for the USBC Jamboree, moderated by David Prange, USBC Western Regional Manager, from 1:45 to 3:30. Prange brought forth numerous plans all the associations can instill to improve membership with an attitude of “TOGETHER WE CAN”.

This year, California USBC and California Bowling Writers partnered to bring a coming together of bowling leaders and guests for a first ever joint evening Awards Banquet. One hundred twenty-five delegates and guests attended “An Evening to Remember”, which was held Saturday from 5:30-9:30. Sponsoring the event was the El Dorado Hotel Casino; National Bowling Stadium, and Storm Bowling. The keynote speaker was Jennifer Cunningham, Executive Director of Marketing of the Reno Sparks Convention & Visitors Authority responsible for developing and coordinating the communications, public information, website and social media, creative and all marketing aspects of the RSC-VA as well as special events. Cunningham is no stranger to bowling via her dealings with National, State and Local associations and has also been part owner of two restaurants. The agenda for the evening included all Award winners to be honored: Hall of Fame – Meritorious Service (Posthumously): **Diddy Watts**, Pacoima, (No.L.A.County USBC); **Superior Performance: Tori Romeo Carter**, Laguna Hills, (O.C. USBC); **Proprietor of the Year – Scott Poddig**, Bowlum Lanes, Montclair, (San Gabriel Valley USBC/ So.L.A.County USBC); **Star of Tomorrow: Tre Webber**, Rohnert Park, (Central Sonoma County); and, this year two **Scholarship** awards were presented from the Youth Committee, **Morgan Cunneen**, Vista, (No.County USBC); and **Charles Sandfer**, Twenty-nine Palms, (Citrus Belt USBC).

The BVL Committee Co-Chairs Rosie Parker and Mabel Sheasley noted that California was recognized at USBC Convention for 2012-2013 contributions of **\$129,766.33** and second place for State Contributions per Member. The top contributions by our associations, based on their membership, were recognized. Nine representatives were in attendance to accept on behalf of their respective association. Current standings of contributions Citrus Belt USBC leading with **\$18,938.00**; San Diego USBC

\$10,825.00 and Orange County USBC at **\$10,000.00**. Californis’s current overall contributions to date are **\$9,065,892.55**.

Wrapping up the awards ceremonies was Marianne Evans, Secretary of the California Bowling Writers who also had chaired their annual Marijane Viat Writing Award Contest. Each entry had been reviewed by a team of judges who had selected the “best of the crop”, the decision kept secret until this event. “And the winner was..... **Bette Addington**, Bakersfield, (Golden Empire USBC) for her article “Getting Stronger Every Year”. The evening came to a close a bit after 9:00 and much socializing ensued.

Sunday morning found all the registered delegates and guests up bright and early for the Annual Meeting scheduled for 9:00 am. With her term of office expiring July 31, 2014, President Linda Johnson-Pilios would, with much emotion, be presiding over her final CAUSBC Annual Meeting. She greeted the delegation and special guests with grace and brought the gavel down at 9:09 am, calling the meeting to order. Lynn Graves, Sgt-at-Arms was asked to present the Memorial and lead the delegation in the Pledge of Allegiance. Officers and Directors answered to the Roll Call by Association Manager Larry Peppers. The Credentials Committee reported 133 Delegates registered and eligible to vote. The 2013 Annual Meeting Minutes were approved as amended. The Rules of the Council of Delegates were approved. The President called on several Committee Chairman to briefly touch on their functions since each Delegate folder contained a written report. However, to allow the state association to be more productive and better serve the bowlers, the Legislative Committee presented four proposals of change in our State By-Laws, all with a recommendation of a Yes vote.

(1) **Art.V, Sec. A: Board ‘Composition, Authority and Duties** – Currently reads: ‘The number of Youth Directors is. 8’ The committee moved to adopt. “The number of Youth Directors is 6.” **APPROVED**.

(2) **Art VII, Sec. B: Board Meetings Paragraph 2**, Currently reads: “ 2. Quorum 16 Board Members constitute a quorum. The delegates representing adult membership, Youth Delegates, and Board determine the number. The committee moved to adopt. “2. Quorum 12 board members constitute a quorum. The delegates representing adult membership, Youth Delegate, and Board determine the number”. **APPROVED**.

(3) **Art.VII, Sec. B: Board Meetings, Paragraph 4** - Currently reads: “ 4 Actions(s) Without a Meeting. Actions that are deemed necessary to conduct business/operations of the association may be taken outside of a board meeting by use of mail,

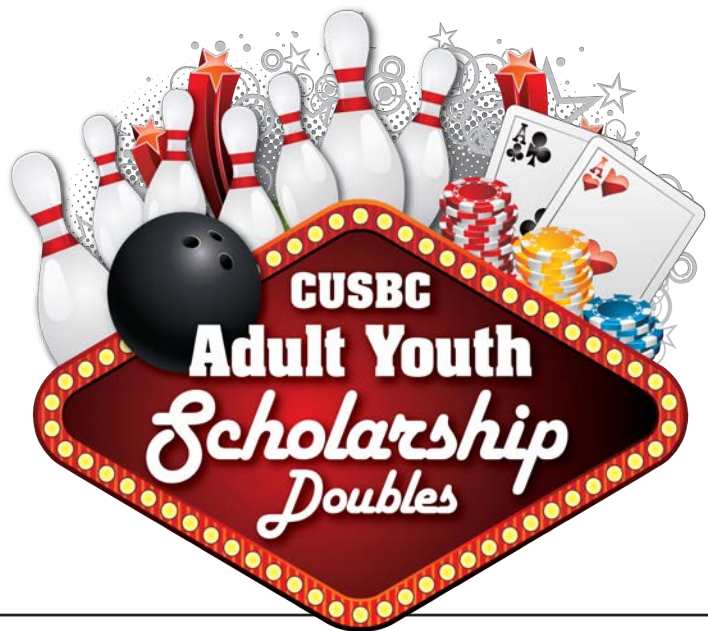
e-mail or teleconferencing. This type of action must be permissible by state law and approved by the delegates representing adult membership, Youth Delegates and Board. The procedures found in the USBC Association Policy Manual, Chapter Eight, Section D, Item 4 must be followed. “ **The association does allow the Board to vote via mail, e-mail, or teleconference**” The committee moved to adopt. **APPROVED**.

(4) **Art. IV, Membership and Dues, Paragraph 3** - Currently Reads: “The delegates representing adult membership, and all officers and directors by a two-thirds vote determine and adopt adult dues, if any. The annual state adult dues are \$1.00. The annual state youth dues are \$0.50. The committee **recommended** to adopt. “The delegates representing adult membership, and all officers and directors by a two thirds vote determine and adopt adult dues if any. The annual state adult dues are \$2.00. The annual state youth dues are \$0.50”. After much discussion the proposal was **WITHDRAWN** and returned to the committee for review. There was no unfinished business.

Under New Business, President Johnson-Pilios called on Al Hoffmann, Novato, a member of the Nominating Committee to present the slate of the eligible candidates to serve on the CAUSBC Board of Directors for the next two years. Since the slate presented offered only one candidate in each office and with no objection, the President declared each elected by “Acclamation”.... **President:** Rosie Parker, Azusa; **2nd VP:** Kathy Bruegeman, Cameron Park; **Sgt-at-Arms:** Lynn Graves; Chula Vista; **Dir. #2** Larry Peppers, Petaluma; **Dir. #6:** Cheryl Huntington, Anaheim; **Dir. #8:** Larry Campbell, Oroville; **Dir. #12:** Darvis Lee, Sonora; **Dir.#14:** Eugene McCown. (The Nominating Committee had been notified by **Dir. #4:** Melissa Ade, she had submitted her resignation due to moving to Nevada; and **Dir. #10:** Phyl Knoll and **Dir. #16** Chuck Shock, were not seeking re-election.).

President Johnson-Pilios invited reports from the California Bowling Writers, California State Seniors Bowling Association, The California State 600 Club and the California 500 Club.

With no further business, Larry Peppers, Association Manager, on behalf of the entire CAUSBC Board of Directors, presented President Johnson-Pilios a beautifully engraved Golden Gavel Plaque. At the same time, David Precht, Past President of the San Gabriel Valley USBC and on behalf of the association Board of Directors presented the President, with an engraved Clock Plaque. With no further business, and although teary-eyed, the President managed to declare the meeting adjourned at 12:15 pm.

Citrus Belt's DARRON PETERS & MARV SARGENT Finish in Top 20 at Senior US OPEN

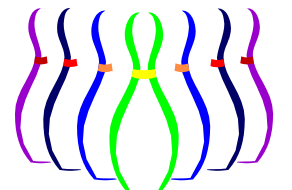

Tom Baker Wins PBA50 Northern California Classic For 11th Career PBA50 Tour Title

In another matchup of PBA Hall of Famers, Baker defeats Parker Bohn III for first title of the season

BRENTWOOD, Calif. – Tom Baker of King, N.C., survived a championship match battle of Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famers Wednesday to win the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV for his 11th career PBA50 Tour title.

Baker, a four-time PBA50 Player of the Year, defeated fellow Hall of Famer and PBA50 Tour rookie Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., 290-245, in the title match at Harvest Park Bowl which was also his first win of the season. In the first six tournaments of the 2014 PBA50 Tour season each has been won by a PBA Hall of Famer.

“The whole day I had to rely on my equipment,” said the 59-year-old Baker who also owns 10 PBA Tour titles. “I must have used five or six balls today and the ball I used in the championship match I didn’t even use all day.

“I was pretty fortunate to be able to bowl for the title,” he continued. “In the round of 16 I was down 2-0 and had to battle back to win the next three games to pull it out. I was having a lot of trouble leaving 10 pins on really good shots so it got pretty frustrating.”

Ironically Baker avenged a championship match loss to Bohn in the Brentwood Classic PBA Tour tournament in 1998 where Bohn beat Baker 239-222 for the title.

“We were talking about that and the one thing I remember about that match is I left a big split that cost me a chance to win the tournament,” Baker said. “Naturally I was hoping history wasn’t going to repeat itself.”

With his win, Baker moves into a tie for fourth on the PBA50 Tour career titles list with Gene Stus. John Handegard leads with 14 career titles with Gary Dickinson and Dale Eagle tied for second with 12 titles each.

In the semifinal round, Baker advanced to the championship match by defeating Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli, 228-195, and Bohn defeated five-time PBA Tour winner Eric Forkel of Las Vegas, 242-198. Bohn and Monacelli were trying for their second titles of the season while Forkel was trying for his first career PBA50 Tour title.

Two-time defending champion Walter Ray Williams Jr.’s quest for a third consecutive Northern California Classic win was thwarted with a 2-0 defeat in the round-of-8 best-of-three match against Forkel earlier in the day.

The next stop for the PBA50 Tour will be Caveman Bowl in Grants Pass, Ore., June 20-23 for the seventh stop of the season.

Colorado’s Mike Dias Wins PBA50 Grants Pass Open For Second Career Title

GRANTS PASS, Ore. – More than three years after winning his first PBA50 Tour title, Mike Dias of Lafayette, Colo., captured the second title of his career Monday by winning the PBA50 Grants Pass Open presented by Track.

Dias defeated PBA Hall of Famer Dale Eagle of Newport Beach, Calif., 229-224, in the championship at Caveman Bowl to win his first title since winning the Senior Don Carter Open in April of 2011.

Dias jumped to the early lead in the title match starting with the first four strikes and Eagle answered with five in a row from the fourth to eighth frames, but a pocket 7-10 split in the ninth and a missed 10-pin back in the third frame ultimately cost Eagle the match.

“The title match was probably representative of the whole tournament,” said the 57-year-old Dias. “It was a combination of getting some breaks, making the right ball changes and staying out of trouble. With a longer oil pattern this week it was really a challenge.”

Dias’ previous best finish this season was fourth in the season-opening Pasco County (Fla.) Open. “Coming into this season I felt I was getting closer and closer to getting another win,” Dias said. “I really put in a lot of work over the off-season and I feel like it’s paying off.”

Eagle was trying for his 13th career PBA50 Tour title which would have put him in second all alone on the PBA50 Tour career titles list. Currently he is tied for second with Gary Dickinson with 12 titles, two behind leader John Handegard with 14 wins.

In the semifinal matches Dias defeated Harry Sullins of Chesterfield Twp., Mich., 258-247, to advance to the championship match while Eagle defeated two-time defending PBA50 Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., 237-228, who was trying for his second win of the season. Dias’ win breaks a streak of six consecutive PBA50 Tour tournaments this season which have been won by PBA Hall of Famers.

The PBA50 Tour season takes a break until July 18-23 when the season resumes with the PBA50 Dick Weber Super Senior Classic presented by Storm and the PBA50 Pro Bowl West Fort Wayne Classic presented by Ebonite at Pro Bowl West in Fort Wayne, Ind.

LAS VEGAS — How good is Jim Starks? Good enough to compete and beat the best senior bowlers in the world. He proved as much at last week’s Senior Masters Tournament at the South Point Hotel and Casino.

Jim averaged 229 during three days of qualifying, which was good for fourth place in a field of 309 competitors. At that point, he only trailed Walter Ray Williams, Jr., Jack Jurek, and Brian Voss. His qualifying score topped greats Tom Baker, Parker Bohn III, Amleto Monacelli, Wayne Webb and Pete Weber to name a few.

At the conclusion of qualifying the top sixty-four scorers moved on to match play. In addition to Mr. Starks, other Citrus Belt performers who made the cut included DAR-RON PETERS of Temecula (20th place, 219 average) and JIM MURTISHAW of Menifee (51st, 212 average).

Other Citrus Belt keglers in the field included GARY HENDERSON (Moreno Valley), MARV SARGENT (Temecula), and PAULA VIDAD (Sun City). Former Citrus Belt stars CIGGY CZAJA and FRED KOURI also competed. Ciggy made the cut (57th place) with a 211 average.

Jim Starks has always been a tough match play competitor. His many local titles attest to that and he didn’t let up in Vegas. Jim won his first three Masters matches, the third with a big 791 - 747 win over Rick Steelsmith. Jim then ran into a hot Mike Edwards and suffered his first loss. Jim finished tied for ninth after a tough two pin loss to Robert Brown. Jim’s finish earned him \$2,500.

Darron Peters took home \$2,000 after winning two matches, including a win over Parker Bohn III. Jim Murtishaw also won two matches and \$1,500.

far inside as Valenta was playing),” O’Neill said. “Mika (Koivuniemi) couldn’t do it, Marshall (Kent) couldn’t do it and Pete (Weber) couldn’t do it. If Pete can’t play inside, I have no business being there, so I told myself two hours ago, in practice, I’m going to stay right here and make it work.

“It was one of those days when everything worked out, and when I got up in the 10th, I really wasn’t nervous. I knew what I had to do. Whatever (Valenta) did, it didn’t matter. I knew I was going to get up there and double, and that’s what I did.

“It felt great to do so. It’s been a while since I’ve been in that position. I couldn’t be happier.”

Valenta was obviously disappointed about falling short of his first title, but the 29-year-old seventh-year pro was pleased about winning three matches in his first PBA Tour television appearance.

“My ‘A’ game is lofting, and I did pretty well today,” Valenta said. “I only made two bad shots. I knew if other guys played to the right of me, they had to go straight. If they moved left to where I was, then it was playing my game against yours and we’ll see who wins. I wanted them to come my way because I figured my rev rate would be the equalizer.

“I had a great time,” he added. “I got a little intense, but I didn’t go crazy.”

In his first match, Valenta threw strikes on his first five shots and filled the final five frames in cruising to a 237-172 win over Koivuniemi, a 13-time PBA Tour winner from Hartland, Mich.

With the oil burning out in the front part of the lane, Valenta began lofting the ball past the arrows and continued striking in an easy 236-165 win over Kent, a PBA rookie from Yakima, Wash., who didn’t strike until the eighth frame.

Valenta moved even farther left and lofted the ball farther down the lane, putting together one string of three strikes in a cat-and-mouse battle with Weber, a PBA Hall of Famer and 37-time titlist, in the semifinal match. Weber trailed by four pins after eight frames, but missed a 7 pin spare attempt in the ninth to let Valenta escape with a 204-190 decision.

The title match was a frame-to-frame battle all the way to the 10th where Valenta doubled to force O’Neill to duplicate his feat for the win.

Oklahoma’s Grand Casino Resort PBA Summer Swing continues next Tuesday at 7 p.m. ET on CBS Sport Network with the finals of the PBA Oklahoma Open. Finalists will be top qualifier E.J. Tackett of Huntington, Ind., the 2013 PBA Rookie of the Year; Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio; Bill O’Neill of Langhorne, Pa.; Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., and reigning PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte of Australia. It should come as no surprise that museums and Halls of Fame are having a difficult time, maintaining and up-grading exhibits and displays, and just meeting operating costs.

There are more than 3,000 nationwide, ranging from little more than a room or two, castle like mansions, to combinations of buildings, with enough related materials to keep going for decade upon decade maneuvering history in storage.

History is great, but you can’t eat it. Priorities are usually to the presentation of religious and other deep felt subjects, or at least alleviate the ills and damage of medical mysteries.

With all the ups and downs, (too many downs lately) of an economy akin to a bouncing ball going wild, there are few black or white answers to so many gray questions.

Over the years, bowling, meaning bowlers, organizations of every description, manufacturers, sponsors and the media have been great when it has come time to honor persons with their own little piece of forever.

No effort should be shunted aside when it comes to keep bowling’s shrine not only surviving — but thriving. Thousands of people have given their time and treasure over a half century to keep the history of the sport a proud and ever growing message that bowling is truly a people’s sport.

ABOUT THE PROS

A pro bowler’s opinion of a town is based mostly on how well or how badly he or she bowls there, not whether it is a pleasant or historical site. And you can bet that a bowler’s opinion of a lane condition is in direct proportion to how well it was hit. To a winner, it’s the best. To the runner-up, it’s excellent. To the cashier, it’s fair to good. And to the also rans, it’s not a matter of pleasant conversation.

Soaker or no soaker (bowling ball dipped in various chemical(s) to give extra action) Don McCune was the most abused Bowler of the Year in history in 1973 because he fathered and mastered the soaker, now banned. But McCune came back in 1974 to prove his ability, winning \$33,000 (excellent earnings then) without winning a tournament. Today’s legal bowling balls make yesteryear’s soakers look like backup balls.

A pro bowler would be a fool to suffer the frustrations and instabilities which almost inevitably are a part of the career, unless he or she firmly believed some day would bring stardom, and all that goes with it.

Pro bowlers really aren’t superstitious, but some claim it’s a scientific fact that they roll much better while wearing certain colors.

Marshall Holman on Marshall Holman: “I’m an emotional player. If I were passive I’d be mediocre. My actions are spontaneous, and I can no more control them than other players can change to the way I react. It’s the way I work. What I do is gut and heart reactions. You just don’t change them that easily.

Winners of pro tournaments don’t forget. They remember how to win and the feeling it brings, and that can keep them going for a long time — no matter what.

Most bowling pros make it by taking one more chance, over and over again. The dismal failures have no problem. They soon realize they can’t make it, at least most of them do, and pack it in. The fringe players, the ones who cash fairly often, but seldom win the big money, have it the toughest. They just get by, hoping for that big win or big year that always seems to be a game or a strike away from their grasp. Quite a few, if they had to do it over again, might take a regular job and be the best bowler in their shop or office. Others are quite candid, and freely admit, that the tour, even when the going is tough, is a lot better than most jobs.

In every way, on and off the lanes, Carmen Salvino has given his all for bowling, almost as though it has been his personal crusade. And all you can ask or demand of yourself or anyone else is that they give their best.

Bowling is a funny game, even though it wasn’t meant to be. Isn’t every bad break spooky pinfall, or curious happening in bowling funny, so long as it happens to someone else? And talking about funny, what happened in San Jose, Calif., in 1971 wasn’t funny to the righthanders in the field. All 16 match play qualifiers were lefthanded.

No sport has as many athletes so close together in ability as bowling. On any given week, any one of more than 50 pros rate almost an equal chance to win any given tournament. The margin difference is often one good game or good shot or one lucky or unlucky break.

Some pro bowlers beat up their hands so badly that when you shake hands with them it’s like sticking your hand into a bag of walnuts.
