

The 2009 International World Games Rolls In July

The International World Games 2009 Kaohsiung will be underway in Chinese Taipei July 16-27. Over 3500 athletes will proudly represent their countries, yet most American bowlers do not know about The World Games and how they play a significant role in the world of sports.

Here is a brief overview of its history and organization: The International World Games Association (IWGA) was founded in 1981 in Seoul, Korea and currently has 32 member international sports federations. (IFs) IWGA member sports include sumo, rugby and ten pin bowling. Without going into a minutia of detail, let's just put it this way-the IFs in IWGA are Olympic "wannabees." Although not absolutely necessary for inclusion into the Olympic program, membership in the IWGA often helps a sport attain Olympic status, and Olympic status can mean money, lots of money, along with major "face time" on television. Where does bowling fall into this equation? Bowling would love to experience the prestige and resources that come with a place on the Olympic Programme, so participation in IWGA can be helpful towards Olympic status.

As a sanctioned member of USBC you are actually a member of a number of sports organizations beginning with your league, your local association, your state association and your national organization, USBC, however, it does not end there, USBC is the National Governing Body (NGB) for bowling in the United States and therefore is one member of an international organization called the Federation Internationale des Quillers (FIQ) and FIQ is one of those 32 IFs in the IWGA group. FIQ has a total of 137 members, 112 ten pin and 25 nine pin NGBs. (Nine pin is a discipline of bowling found mostly in Europe)

To confuse you more, FIQ is recognized by the International Olympic Committee. (IOC) Several years ago, many people in the United States became confused when the IOC recognized the IF for Sport Dancing. Many believed, and still believe, Sport Dancing is an Olympic sport, which it is not. The IF has simply been authorized to be the international representative for Sport Dancing to the IOC. You might want to think of the IF as your lawyer who represents your interests to a court of law. (IOC)

The Olympic Games are held every four years and the last Olympic competition was in Beijing, China and the next Olympiad will be in London, England in 2012. The 2016 Games site will be selected in Copenhagen, Denmark October 2, 2009 from impressive bids presented at Sport Accord in Denver last March by Chicago, Madrid, Spain, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil and Tokyo, Japan. The World Games also takes place on a quadrennial schedule. In 2005 the Games were in Duisburg, Germany and this year they are Kaohsiung, Chinese Taipei. Chinese Taipei is also called Taiwan and Formosa

Who will represent the United States in the World Games? Stephanie Nation and Chris Barnes will compete for our country. The US does not get an automatic spot in the World Games. Eight men and eight women from each of three FIQ Zones across the world are selected through a competitive process. Will Stephanie and Chris each win a gold metal? Although they are both excellent and experienced players, don't underestimate the quality or determination of their opponents. We have seen such international players as Cara Honeychurch, Carol Gianotti, Mika Koivuniemi, Ameleto Monacelli and others do well on the professional circuit. Such countries as Malaysia, England, Australia, Japan, The United Arab Emirates, Denmark, Colombia, Canada, Chinese Taipei, the Philippines and many others have represented themselves well over the years in world and regional amateur competition.

If you wish to send Chris and Stephanie a note of encouragement it is easy, both are on the Facebook social networking site and I'm sure they would welcome your message.

Next month I'll have some of the results of the Games and some insight into whether of not bowling will ever be included into the Olympic Games. Stay tuned! Links:



Fred Thompson Speaks at 2009 Bowl Expo

LAS VEGAS—Former Tennessee Senator Fred Thompson addressed a receptive audience at the 2009 International Bowl Expo, held June 22-26 at the Mandalay Bay Resort in Las Vegas. Thompson's conservative view of political, social, and economic policies resonated well with his listeners.

An unsuccessful candidate for the Republican Presidential nomination in 2007-08, the Senator's resumé is diverse. He is a politician, actor, attorney, lobbyist and radio host. As an actor, he is best known for his appearances as District Attorney Arthur Branch in the popular television series, Law and Order, while his movie career has brought him to the screen 23 times including the films No Way Out, The Hunt for Red October, Days of Thunder, Class Action, In the Line of Fire and Cape Fear.

Speaking without notes or a prepared script, the Senator acquitted himself well, entertaining the mostly

small business group with his personal story, interwoven with his self-described common sense opinions. He described his journey through life as full of "happenstance" with no regrets.

All of his issue positions were predictable with strong supporting arguments. The 67- year-old Thompson

seemed to enjoy the Bowling Expo venue where he presented himself as a "friend of freedom." A strong believer in federalism, he has been quoted as saying, "federalism provides a basis for a proper analysis of most

In his press conference after his public presentation, Thompson sat at a long table with reporters and amplified his keynote remarks. At times, it felt like a friendly chat with Andy Griffith in Mayberry. Both Thompson and Griffith give the feeling of being in a room with someone with a slow Southern drawl who is extremely intelligent. His personal journey through life highlights strength of character, perhaps derived from his parents and the environment of his hometown of Lawrenceburg, Tennessee.

The recent election of President Barack Obama and the majority rule of the Democratic Party in Congress

prompted Thompson to opine that the passage of increased federal regulations and taxes will stifle small businesses, including bowling centers. Additionally, the Senator said that such "liberal" policies will cause "the chickens to come home to roost." He described Obama as "naïve," if he believes these policies will prove to

On foreign policy, Thompson presented an interesting take on the current unrest in Iran. He pointed out that the young population in Iran certainly has taken notice of the way the United States has encouraged free elections in Iraq. As a result of this policy in a neighboring country, Iranians long for the same right to determine their government.

As a bowler, the Senator recalled how he bowled in a league with a local civic organization many years ago,

but did not have his own ball or shoes. Like many bowlers, he could not remember his highest game, perhaps by design.

Currently Thompson is a radio host, along with his wife, Jeri, on 170 stations on Westwood One, succeeding Bill O'Reilly when O'Reilly ended "The Radio Factor." He is represented by the prestigious William Morris Agency and will most likely be seen again in television and the cinema, but expressed no future political

Also that Ken's former team Overrated Bowlers won their 2nd team scratch title in a row with a near 3345 score. With such near record score, I had to wait till I got more info from GLDBA secretary-treasurer Mike Jasko, Cleveland on the scores.

Finally, I got them from Jasko but unfortunately Jasko was busy running two tournaments a month apart. He gave me just the series scores, not per game scores except the new record team game 1205 made by the Overrated Bowlers. Thanks Mike.

Overrated Bowlers Hit Record 1205 Game In Winning 3345 Scratch Series

Last year's defending team champion Overrated Bowlers composed of bowlers from Maryland, Indiana, Ohio and New York rolled a new record high team game 1205 in coming 3 pins short of the team series record with 3345 to repeat as the scratch champions for the \$800 prize. 
