SIX BOWLERS INDUCTED INTO USBC HALL OF FAME

GRAPEVINE — Del Ballard Jr. turned 48 years old on Friday and received a present he has long awaited.

Ballard was one of six inductees into the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame during ceremonies at the Gaylord Texan Hotel. He was elected in the Superior Performance category.

Joining Ballard in the hall of fame class of 2011 are Carol Gianotti and Wayne Webb, also for Superior Performance, Jeff Richgels for Outstanding USBC Performance, Cheryl Robinson in the Veteran category and Roseann Kuhn for Meritorious Service.

Between 1987 and 1993, Ballard won 13 Lumber Liquidators Professional Bowlers Association Tour titles, including the 1988 USBC Masters and the 1989 Firestone Tournament of Champions. He won the U.S. Open in 1987 and 1993 and totaled nearly \$1.3 million in PBA career earnings. He was selected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 2009.

“Welcome to my birthday party, and I’ll cry if I want to,” said Ballard, who underwent treatment for tonsil cancer last year. He thanked USBC President Darlene Baker for the phone call to tell him he had

HULSENBERG TAKES DOWN DEFENDING CHAMPION KULICK TO WIN 2011 BOWLING’S U.S. WOMEN’S OPEN

ARLINGTON — Hall of Famer Leanne Hulsenberg of Roseville, Calif., topped defending champion Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., 218-183 to win the 2011 Bowling’s U.S. Women’s Open on Thursday. The championship round was contested on lanes constructed on the 50-yard-line of the famed Cowboys Stadium before a crowd in excess of 6,000, making it among the most well-attended events in bowling history.

Competing in the most unique venue in the history of women’s bowling, Hulsenberg claimed her first title in nearly a decade and earned \$50,000

for the victory. The event, presented by the brands of Ebonite International and conducted by the Bowling Proprietors’ Association of America (BPAA), will be broadcast on Saturday at 6 p.m. Eastern on ESPN2.

“I’m actually sitting here thinking I can’t believe this just happened to me,” said No. 2 seed Hulsenberg, a 27-time professional champion who won her last pro title Sept. 19, 2002, at the Three Rivers Open in Pittsburgh. “This win means so many different things to me. For my family it’s a very special day because I met my husband after I stopped bowling full time. On a bowling level, it’s special because I’ve been with Ebonite for 20 years and they had so much to do with this tournament.”

Had one of the finalists thrown a perfect game in the championship match, they would have received a \$1 million prize, which is unprecedented in the history of bowling. The quest for \$1 million ended quickly, however, as both players started the championship match by leaving a 10 pin.

“With the pressure of playing on one of the largest stages there is - Cowboys Stadium

and on national TV - Leanne rose to the occasion and delivered an exceptional performance,” said Steve Johnson, executive director of the BPAA. “This is an incredible moment in a year that has seen bowling flourish in popularity among women and continue its incredible resurgence as the nation’s number one participatory sport. Speaking on behalf of the bowling industry and the 71 million bowlers across the United States, I congratulate Leanne for demonstrating everything that makes bowling great and for showing what a

champion is made of.”

Top-seeded Kulick, who won the 2003 and 2010 U.S. Women’s Open, got off to a shaky start in the match, only striking on one shot in the first six frames while leaving the 4-6-7-10 split for opens twice. The 183 game was the lowest Kulick shot in her 49 tournament games. She entered the championship match averaging 241.35 for the event.

“Unfortunately, my feel just wasn’t there tonight,” said Kulick, a seven-time Team USA member who is the only

900 Global Pulls Off Stunning Upset to Win GEICO PBA Team Shootout Jaros sparks last-place qualifier to PBA Manufacturers Cup victory

CHICAGO — San Antonio, Texas-based 900 Global pulled off the biggest upset in the five-year history of the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour’s summer series special events, winning the Manufacturers Cup to conclude the GEICO PBA Team Shootout at 10pin bowling lounge.

The finals of the annual summer-season team competition aired Sunday on ESPN, capping a series of 15 half-hour programs.

Sparked by anchor bowler Steve Jaros of suburban Yorkville, Ill., No. 4-seeded 900 Global defeated Brunswick, 206-194; defending champion Storm Products, 258-255, and top-seeded Ebonite International, 215-191, for a three-match sweep of the Baker Team format stepladder finals.

“Our new name is Team Bottom Feeders,” said 900 Global’s Robert Smith. “That’s

what we looked like for the first 12 matches. We were our own rally-killers.”

“We couldn’t get anything going in the preliminary matches,” Jaros said. “But we figured if we could manage our TV lane the right way and make good shots, we could get the job done and that’s what happened. For whatever

reason, the other teams kept putting us on the left lane and that’s the lane we would have chosen if we had been able to pick the one we wanted.”

In the Baker Team finals, each team bowled its entire game on one lane. Each player bowled two frames to complete a game. Because 900 Global was the lowest seeded

team in the finals, its opponent had the right to select the lane it preferred – and all three opposing teams opted to bowl on the right lane.

“During the stepladder finals, we got relaxed, got the momentum and rode it,” Smith said. “It was fun to get more than two strikes in a row.”

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

FOLLOWING FRANK GALLO, JR ON PBA SENIOR TOUR

BRENTWOOD—This writer is a big fan of PBA since it was founded in 1958 and then in 1971 PBA's head of Press Relations Bud Fisher gave me my first PBA press credentials. In 1972 at Rockford, Ill during the World Deaf Bowling Championship a deaf young Frank Gallo, Jr. of Deer Park, NY came to me and told me that he joined the PBA. At first I was skeptic and checked with PBA Public Relations, which replied affirmative but did not know Gallo, Jr. being a deaf bowler. So with his deafness known, PBA announced Gallo, Jr. as its first deaf member. That known made it easier for him.

Now flash forward to this date, Frank Gallo Jr. Jacksonville, FL is nearing his 4th decade as a PBA member and doing well as a Super-senior (age 60 and up) on the Senior Tour and Senior Regional events. Although he loves bowling on the tour, he never got rich and as one of the PBA journeymen, he tries to cash in as many events as possible.

Gallo's last season statistics from April 1, 2010-March 31, 2011 in PBA Senior South Regional showed 13th place out of 207 senior participants in 6 out of 11 events for 60,690 points. 15th for cashing in 6 events for \$2,650.00, 11th in averages with 209.23 for 69 games and 9th in cashing percentage for 5 out of 6 events 83.33%. That doesn't count what he did in other regionals and this year's senior tour.

Last May this column told of Gallo, Jr's poor showing (92nd place) in this year's PBA Senior Tour opener Don Carter Open at Winter Gardens, FL. Also but he bounced back in the next event, PBA Senior Sun Bowl in the Villages (FL) with a 300 and 3526 total in qualifying rounds placing 9th for the match plays. His perfect was his 8th in PBA since the last one in 2005. He received one bye and in the Round of 24 match play lost 2-3 to Brian Brazeau but cashed for \$1,100.00.

Also told was in the next event PBA Senior Miller High Life Classic at Mooresville, NC Gallo, Jr. could not keep pace in this high scoring event with his 3392 (16 games) placing in 63rd. But as a super-senior he cashed for \$700.

Looking up at May 21-24 PBA Senior Mark Roth Allentown (PA) Open Gallo, Jr. was joined with another deaf PBA Senior member Jim Theyken, San Diego who is in his 2nd year. Both did not do well and Gallo, Jr. had 1500 for 95th place and improved in 2nd round with 1619 for 3119 good for 72nd place. Gallo again cashed \$700 as super-senior. Theyken must get more experience on tough lane conditions.

Next on June 12-17 a major on the tour PBA Senior U.S. Open, presented by the Suncoast at Suncoast Bowling Center, Las Vegas, Gallo had 1262 for 6 games in 42nd place. He struggled but dropped to 59th with 2437 and finished lower with 3590 (18 games) in 68th. Once more as a super-senior Gallo received \$700.

Following with June 19-22, PBA Senior Northern California Classic at Brentwood CA Gallo fell in 53rd place with 1st 8 games 1692, then blasted his best 8 games of the year 1802 for 3494 to place 22nd, good for the match plays. In Round of 32 Gallo beat Mark Scime 3-1 but in round of 24, Mark Williams beat Gallo 3-0. In losing in Round of 24 Gallo got \$1,150.00.

Now with \$4,700 earned, Gallo, Jr. has a month hiatus to get ready for the next major on the tour July 31-Aug. 5, USBC Senior Masters at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl, Columbus, Ohio. Then follow up with 4 more events in month of August to end the 2011 tour. Surely knowing Gallo, he will complete in all of them.

woman to win a title on the Professional Bowlers Association Tour. “The humidity level was very high, and I never got a comfortable fit with the ball. There never was a happy medium. It wasn’t that I was lost on the lanes. I went in and did the best I could.”

In the semifinal, Hulsenberg escaped with a narrow victory over No. 5 seed Lynda Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 247-246, after Barnes went high and left the 6-10 on her final shot of the game. Hulsenberg, who trailed by 42 pins at the halfway point of the match, rebounded by closing the game with seven consecutive strikes.

Barnes began the second match with seven consecutive strikes in eliminating No. 3 seed Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., 259-225. Johnson left a 4-6 split for an open

in the fourth frame and eventually trailed by more than 60 pins, a deficit from which she would never recover.

In the opening match, Barnes defeated Shannon O’Keefe of Arlington, Texas, 268-166. O’Keefe, the fourth seed, failed to strike in the first five frames as Barnes jumped out to an early lead and never

looked back.

The U.S. Women’s Open featured a record-breaking field of 286 of the top female bowlers in the world competing for a total prize fund of \$225,000.

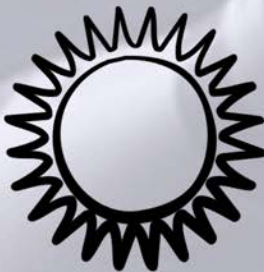

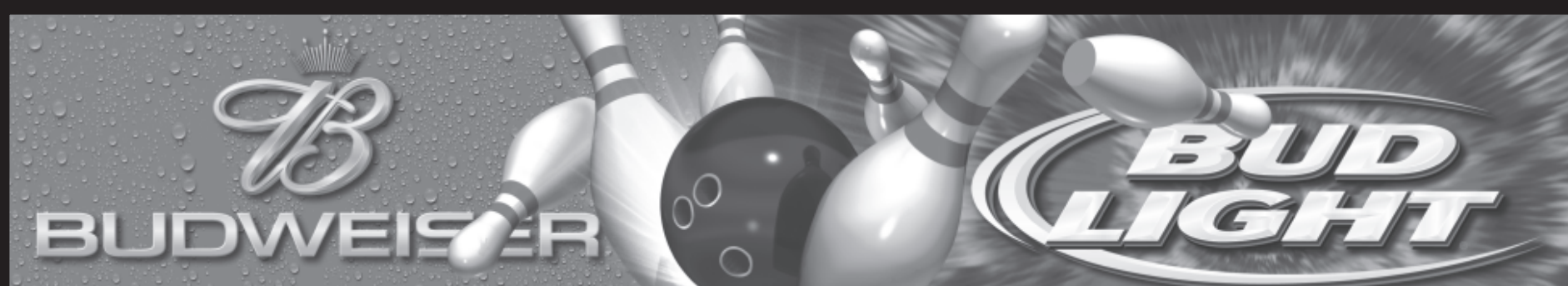

In the opening stepladder match against Brunswick, 900 Global alternated strikes and spares until the seventh and eighth frames, when 2011 USBC Queens champion and two-time PBA Regional title winner Missy Parkin – the only woman in the event – and Smith finally posted back-to-back strikes. That double proved to be the difference.

In the semifinal match against the powerful Storm Products team, Storm's Pete Weber, Ryan Shafer, Wes Malott, Norm Duke and Jason Belmonte all struck to take a 30-pin lead after five frames, but 900 Global answered with a string of seven strikes, including a decisive double by Jaros on his first two shots in the 10th frame that decided the match.

With momentum on their side, Michael Haugen Jr., Parkin, Smith and PBA Hall of Famer Brian Voss struck to give 900 Global a 47-pin lead after four frames against Ebonite International. Ebonite put together a four-strike string of its own late in the game, but couldn't overcome three earlier open frames.

"We decided to stay on the same lane where we shot 290 the day before with the same lineup," said Ebonite International coach Jason Couch. "We just didn't bowl very well and (900 Global) bowled a really good game."

"I'm as excited for 900 Global as I am for myself," Parkin beamed after throwing four strikes and converting two single-pin spares in six attempts during the three games. "Normally throwing the ball harder is my A game, but I found out after the first doubles match that throwing it hard and straight wasn't going to work, especially bowling with the guys. I had to keep the speed down so the ball would roll sooner and get the corner pins out, and it worked."

"Even though this wasn't as intense of a competition as regular Tour events, it was for bragging rights among the ball manufacturers," Haugen added. "And of course you always want to win. We don't have team competition on Tour, so that was fun, too. It's nice to share the win with teammates."

"Being fourth in the finals, we had our work cut out for us," Haugen said, "but you could tell we had good team chemistry. We made all the right moves when we needed to. We had the talent and we had the equipment to get it done."

"After a frustrating day and a half, it was a great way to end things," Voss, a PBA Hall of Famer, noted. "We got some help from (Ebonite's) slow start, but we got it going, too. I love to win. It's very cool."

The GEICO PBA Team Shootout preliminary matches included singles, best ball doubles, alternate shot doubles, Baker team and "eliminator" formats where each team earned points to determine the stepladder finals positions. At the conclusion of 12 matches, Ebonite International and Storm were tied for first place. Ebonite's Bill O'Neill won a one-ball roll-off with a strike to claim the No. 1 seed after Storm's Belmonte left an 8-10 split.

The preliminary matches produced other highlights, including:

- Storm's Shafer fired a 300 game in his singles match against Ebonite's Chris Barnes, Brunswick's Chris Loschetter and 900 Global's Parkin, and teamed up with Belmonte to shoot another 300 game in their best ball doubles match against Ebonite's Barnes and O'Neill, who shot 280 in a losing cause.
- After Barnes' first-frame spare, Ebonite International rattled off 11 strikes in a row for a Baker Team 290 game in Match 7.
- In a showcase alternate shot doubles match between Storm and Brunswick stars, PBA Hall of Famers Weber and Duke teamed up to bowl a 244-244 tie against Parker Bohn III, another PBA Hall of Famer, and Sean Rash.
- A flare-up between Brunswick's Rash and Storm's Belmonte over a plastic water bottle-creaking episode during the Eliminator match.

The entire GEICO PBA Team Shootout series will be re-broadcast on ESPN2. been selected to the hall of fame "because anybody that's close to me understands I've been through a little bit of a rough time the last year or so, and it could not have come at a better time."

Gianotti, 43, took the 1989 USBC Queens title for one of the 16 Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour titles she won between 1989 and 2000. She's had six top-10 finishes at the Queens during her career and has collected nearly \$1 million in career earnings.

The Perth, Australia, native represented her country in the Seoul Olympic Games bowling exhibition in 1988 and is a multi-time member of Team Australia. She has been a part of three team titles at the USBC Women's Championships and captured the Scratch Doubles title with Missy Klug in 2010.

"I've always said throughout my career," Gianotti said, "how fortunate I have been to have the opportunity to do what I love to do, and that is to compete and be successful. I've traveled the world and met so many people. It is a great honor to be inducted into the hall of fame, the highest achievement you can receive in your sport."

Webb, 53, of Columbus, Ohio, was elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 1993. He won 20 PBA Tour titles from 1978-1997, including the Firestone Tournament of Champions in 1980.

He more recently has become a force on the PBA Senior Tour. He won the 2010 USBC Senior Masters and was named the 2010 PBA Senior Player of the Year. He joined Mark Roth as the only players to earn PBA Tour and Senior Tour Player of the Year awards during their careers.

"Last year I was very fortunate to win the Senior Masters and two other titles which basically filled my bucket list," Webb said. "There were only a couple of things that I had left that I wanted to do in bowling – being Senior Player of the Year and this, being inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame."

Robinson, 59, of Placentia, Calif., was the 1970 Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow award winner. She went on to win four titles on the PWBA Tour and finished second at the Queens in 1980. She won the all-events title at the 1980 Women's Championships.

"Bowling has been my metaphor in life," said Robinson. "Not only has it helped me fulfill my life goals, it has taught me dedication, compassion, and faith in God."

Richgels, 48, of Oregon, Wis., is the first person to be inducted in the Outstanding USBC Performance category. He claimed the first of his four USBC Open Championships titles at the 1986 event (Regular Team) and had 90 clean frames en route to the 1997 Regular All-Events title. He also won Regular Doubles and Team All-Events titles in 2005.

He won the 1985 Team USA Trials to earn a spot on Team USA and represented the United States at the Federation Internationale des Quilleurs (FIQ) American Zone Championships in Bogota, Colombia, where he won gold medals in team and trios.

"I always thought that there could be a place for guys like me, and there are so many of them out there, between the amateur category and the great stars of the PBA Tour," Richgels said. "I'm very proud to be the first inductee in this category. It's a great honor."

Kuhn, 62, of Hays, Kan., was instrumental in the merger of bowling organizations to create USBC and was chief tournament officer for USBC in 2005.

She joined the Women's International Bowling Congress in 1974 as a field representative, served as rules/legal manager from 1988 until 1995 and was WIBC's rules/legal technical advisor before being appointed executive director in 1996.

"I love the legislation process," Kuhn said. "Tweaking rules and by-laws was like a puzzle to me. I never studied law, but I won many a debate with lawyers."

With Friday's inductions, there now are 385 members of the USBC Hall of Fame – 254 in Performance, 112 in Meritorious Service and 19 Pioneers.

The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the American Bowling Congress and Women's International Bowling Congress Halls of Fame.
