In addition to his PBA50/ Senior Tour titles he also won three PBA50 Regional titles and one regular PBA Regional

He had competed on the PBA50 Tour as recently as the 2012 season when he bowled in seven tournaments and had a best finish of 16th in the PBA Senior Northern California Classic.

Prior to joining the Senior Tour Gurney worked as a heavy equipment operator for the city of Glendale, Calif.

According to a January 2012 examiner.com profile of Gurney, he was inspired to bowl PBA competition because of friends who questioned his ability to make a second career as a professional bowler.

"My motivating factor (for joining the tour) was the people I was hanging with," Gurney said. "They all asked, 'Why? What are you going to do with the senior tour? You're good howler but you're not that good.' I wanted to prove them wrong."

Gurney was also the winner of 16 West Coast Senior Tour tournaments.



Clutch 10th-Frame Performance Helps Duke Win GEICO PBA King of Swing Hall of Famer wins four matches, avenges Milwaukee Open loss to Barries with two strikes in final frame


MILWAUKEE. - Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Norm Duke successfully concluded the GEICO PBA Summer Swing with a clutch 10th-frame performance for a bittersweet 222-213 victory over Chris Barnes in the GEICO King of the Swing special event.

It was the kind of performance that has made Duke one of the PBA's most popular players.

The final event in the GEI-CO PBA Summer Swing presented by Lucas Oil telecasts aired Tuesday on CBS Sports Network.

Duke, a 49-year-old Clermont, Fla., resident, defeated four Summer Swing event champions in impressive style after earning his way into the King of the Swing field as the "wild card," the highest pointgetter without a title.

As the No. 5 qualifier for the stepladder finals, Duke began his climb up the stepladder by defeating Badger Open titlist Jake Peters of Decatur, Ill., 220-190; Bear Open winner Jason Belmonte of Australia, 258-226, and Wolf Open

champ Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio, 207-205. Those victories set up a championship re-match against Barnes, who had defeated Duke, 246-237, in the title match of the Milwaukee Open earlier in the Summer Swing.

Bowling on the same Badger lane condition Barnes had selected for the Milwaukee Open finals - a right the Double Oak, Texas, resident had earned as Summer Swing points leader - Duke successfully turned the tables on Barnes.

In the Milwaukee Open, Barnes won when he threw two strikes in the 10th, surviving to claim his 15th career title when Duke struck on his first shot in the 10th, but left a 10 pin on his second

In the King of the Swing finale, Barnes' string of four strikes ended when the 9 pin stood on his second shot in the 10th frame. Duke, working on a double heading into his 10th frame, needed two more strikes to win, and he got what he needed.

'I realize it's not a PBA Tour title, but it still feels good," Duke said. "I'll go home without a title, and that's disappointing because I'm here to win titles, but I did win an event.

'I needed to spend some time on TV. I haven't been on TV in a while, and when I got there and didn't perform the way I wanted in the Wolf and Milwaukee Opens, it was just because we haven't had any tournaments for a while," Duke continued. "It takes a little time just to get comfortable. In the Wolf Open, I was scared and nervous, but today was a walk in the park.'

Duke was unhappy with a couple of shots he made in the previous events that, in his mind, probably cost him titles. But converting the 1-2-4-10 washout after making a bad shot in the 10th frame against Peters in the opening match of the King of the Swing finals was a key moment.

'When you bowl a lot of games on TV, there are going to be some shots you're not real proud of, but I was about 90 percent happy with the shots I made today," he said. "I had to make that washout

"When I get home and reflect on the Summer Swing, one of the things I'll probably congratulate myself on was my ability to keep a strong focus on what I needed to do. I feel pretty good about that."

There is no such thing as tournament time-because there are fine tournaments being conducted 12 months of

Ever stop to think of how many tournaments are available in the world each year? An educated guess might put the figure at more than 10,000.

There are big money, small money and no money tournamets. There are family, school, church, business, profession, city, county, state, sectional, national, zone, continent and world tournaments. There are pro tournaments and amateur tournaments and pro-amateur tournaments.

There are singles, doulbles and team tournaments. There are events for boys, girls, men, women and mixed covering every age. There are sibling tournaments, husband and wife, father and son, mother and daughter, and any other relationship tournaments.

There are club tournaments and shop tournaments and office tournaments and religious tournaments. There are tournaments for people who can't see or can't walk or can't

And with all that only a small percentage of the number and scope of the variety of bowling tournaments staged annually have been touched upon.

Yet, many bowlers never have rolled in a tournament.

Let it be known that there is a tournament for every bowler, regardless of the size of your average—or budget. Look through any bowling publication, check the desk or bulletin board at your bowling centers and read all your communications and you're sure to find one or two tournaments designed just for you.

Tournament bowling is the extra icing on the bowling

Tournament bowling is fun, and always profitable. It isn't always profitable in a financial sense, though many have won cash, merchandise, trips and other goodies, large and small. But you always enter into a new and exciting phase of the sport where the competition is different but the game

How can you tell if a tournament is a good one? Check out those conducting the tournament, where it is being run, and read closely all the rules and fine print on the entry blank. A tournament survives only if bowlers are given a fair shake and tournaments don't last unless they have needed

In many tournaments, particularly local and state and national association events, plus most charity tournaments, many dedicated people work hours that would stagger the

In some tournaments you can win six figures or more. In others you can't win much more than satisfaction in being a player, and maybe a title and trophy, be it thimble size or taller than you are.

You can't gain the full rewards bowling offers unless you roll in tournaments even now and then.

So give your local or state tournament a whirl. Don't miss some of the fine competition your local center offers. Check out tournament clubs. There is as wide a variety of tournaments as there is in the aims of bowlers but bowlers can find the right one with a little effort.

If you've never rolled a tournament, roll one in the near future. If you have, roll one more.

There can be problems at times, like when the nudist convention ran a bowling tournament. Nobody looked at the scores.



Ashley Dunn Earns Unprecidented 4th Consecutive 1 Seed Into Teen Masters National Finals

LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA - SAWGRASS LANES - JULY 4, 2013 — Sixteen year old Ashley Dunn (above center) has earned the 1 seed yet again in the High School Girls Division of the Teen Masters National Championships. Both the Boys & Girls High School Division Champions will be decided this November when the tournament continues first at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas where the top 4 Boys & Girls will be narrowed down to the final 2 in each Division.

Once the final 2 have been determined through what is expected to be round robin match play (specific details have not yet been released at time of publication), the 2 Boys & Girls still alive in the competition will move to South Point in Las Vegas where the Division Champions will be determined on the specially constructed television pair for filming the PBA World Series of Bowling Stepladder Finals. The Teen Masters finals were originally scheduled to take place in New York at Grand Central Terminal as they had the previous 2 years. Just before their practice sessions in Ft. Lauderdale began participants were told by Gary Beck of Killer 'B' Promotions, Founder and Owner of the Teen Masters Tournament, that due to circumstances beyond his control the finals would be rescheduled from early August in New York to the beginning of November in Las Vegas, to coincided with the PBA World Series of Bowling. Not a bad deal!

Ashley has been the most dominant competitor in the 16 years history of the Teen Masters Tournament events. She had made her first appearance at the age of 12 in 2009 in a field with over 120 of the Nations finest High School age females and she didn't finish last. It was Ashley first appearance in a National tournament, and a learning experience. She became determined that she wanted to win a Teen Masters tournament just as she had witnessed Danielle McEwan do that year in the Las Vegas Fashion Show Mall. It didn't take long as she began working hard when she returned home. To her delight the following year the tournament introduced the U14 Division. Ashley fought her way to the 1 seed for the Xtra Frame broadcast finals. The rest is history as they say, she won the U14 Division again the following year as the 1 seed in Grand Central Terminal, then again the next year in her debut at the High School level as the 1 seed. Now once again she will head to the final 4 as the 1 seed and an opportunity to earn her 4th consecutive National Teen Masters Championship.

Last year the Teen Masters held it's Inaugural World Series in conjunction with the PBA World Series of Bowling, and Ashley won yet another Teen Masters even taking the World Series Championship with a match play record of 5 - 1. So in reality she will be attempting to win her 5th consecutive Teen Masters Championship, but the 4th National. Never in the 16 year history of the tournament has there been a more dominant competitor. These are extremely challenging lane conditions, ask any Junior that has ever bowled it, and that's why in 16 years there has only been 1 honor score bowled during any portion of the tournament. A local young man, Devin Bidwell accomplished the feat by bowling a 300 on mixed pairs in 2010. Ashley would like to thank her Coach Mark Baker, her Ball Technician Will Wilson, her Mood Therapist Barry Asher, her good friend and confidant Cody Mendoza, The California Bowling News for publishing her accomplishments, and all her friends and family for their support!
