Junior Team USA Ready To Face Challengers At 2006 World Youth Championships

GREENDALE—When Junior Team USA's P.J. Haggerty and Stefanie Nation return to the World Youth Championships in a few weeks, they personally will notice the growth of bowling worldwide - more countries, more competitors and more challengers.

Haggerty and Nation, who will be competing in their final events as Junior Team USA members, lead a strong United States contingent into the 2006 World Tenpin Bowling Association World Youth Champion-ships, scheduled for July 22-29 in Berlin, Germany.

This year's World Youth Championships, which have been held biannually since 1990, will feature 48 countries — a dramatic increase from the 29 that competed at the 2004 event in Guam.

"There definitely are a lot more good players now," said Haggerty, a 21-year-old Weimar, Calif., native who has been a part of Junior Team USA since 2004. "We should be the deeper, more experienced team there. However, we can't take anything for granted.'

Haggerty will be joined by fellow Junior Team USA members David Lange, 23, of Stevensville, Mich., Ivan Miyasato, 23, of Aiea, Hawaii, and Matt O'Grady, 19, of South Amboy, N.J.

Nation, a 22-year-old Miami native, will be joined by Amanda Burgoyne, 21, of Newport, Minn., Samantha Linder, 20, of Winter Haven, Fla., and Michelle Quirk, 21, of Roseville, Calif., on Junior Team USA girls'

Nation, the women's collegiate Player of the Year from the University of Central Florida last season, helped lead Junior Team USA to the girls team gold medal in 2004. She also took home silver medals in doubles and Masters as Junior Team USA captured eight medals the most among any country competing.

"We need to go into this open-minded," said Nation, who recently finished tied for 32nd at the USBC Queens and won three consecutive U.S. Junior Amateur titles from 2003-05. "We want to win gold, but we know it's not going to be an easy task. We definitely have a challenge out there."

Haggerty, the men's collegiate Player of the Year the past two seasons at Fresno State. brought back a silver medal in boys doubles from the 2004 World Youth Championships. He believes experience in a team environment will end up benefiting Junior Team USA's representatives, seven of whom have college bowling on their resume.

"Having team experience will help us out," Haggerty said about Junior Team USA, which also features six multi-year team members. "We can make moves off each other and communicate



Former ABC **President Julian Johnson Dies At Age 85**

GREENDALE—Former American Bowling Congress President Julian Johnson of New Orleans died July 7 at the age of

Johnson's service to bowling began in 1963 when he became a league president. At the local level, his role soon expanded to become a New Orleans Bowling Association bowling center house representative, a member of the New Orleans B.A. board of directors and eventually the association's president in 1965.

When the position of secretary-treasurer of the New Orleans B.A. became available in 1969, he resigned his post as president of the association to take over the new duties.

His dedication to the sport was recognized in the South with his election to the Southern Bowling Congress board of directors in 1965.

In 1966 Johnson became a member of the ABC board and in 1973 was elected a vice president. He became ABC's 69th president on Aug. 1 of 1982.

Johnson, who was the first ABC president from Louisiana, served as chairman of the ABC High Score and Award Review and Education committees. He also served on the organization's new equipment, tournament site inspection and finance and budget committees, among many



Ten Pin Slants

I've known Glenn Allison for a long time. Like, since 1955. That's when Allison was voted the Southern California Bowler of the Year, and I was a sports writer writing about bowling for the old Los Angeles Mirror.

That same year Allison took off for Chicago, where he joined the famed Pabst team. A couple of years later he hooked up with Steve Nagy's Falstaffs in St. Louis. After Nagy's death, Billy Welu became the new captain.

Allison's career really took off at that point. He became a PBA charter member in 1958 and went on to capture six titles. Allison also collected four ABC eagles plus 10 other top-10 finishes. This past March 18-19, in the USBC Open Championships Tournament in Corpus Christi, the smooth-stroking right-hander became only the ninth bowler to eclipse the 100,000 pinfall mark.

the country-were very upset by the ABC's decision. I still am.

Allison appealed...but it was to no avail, for it was like spitting against the wind.

All this was brought to the forefront recently when a Milwaukee-area bowler named Mark Wukoman rolled the ninth 900 series—which was quickly approved by the USBC. Wukoman, 50, also was recognized by the USBC as "the oldest bowler to shoot a 900 series." Wrong!

Allison, who was born on May 22, 1930 was exactly 52 years and 40 days old when he fired his 900 at La Habra. But, unfortunately, it's another record that won't be recognized by the USBC. Shafted again!

The Glenn Allison story continues: The influential Bowlers Journal International magazine recently came up with

His crowning achievement on the lanes, however, came on the night of July 1, 1982, when Allison recorded his remarkable 900 series. It was the first time any bowler had rolled three consecutive 300 games in sanctioned league play.

The news traveled fast. The next day the ABC's Burt Kellerman, Orange County Bowling Assn. secretary Bob Ramirez and western regional ABC Director Ken Knapp were all at La Habra "300" Bowl in La Habra, Calif.—just east of Whittier—to check the lanes. I was also there.

knows, Allison's 900 was not approved by the ABC because of noncomplying lane conditions. The three officials— Kellerman, Ramirez and Knapp—all agreed that "under ABC Article 7, Section 3 of the ABC Rule Book, the lanes were not dressed in accordance with rules established by the delegates who attend the annual ABC Convention."

It didn't matter that Allison—widely known now as "Mr. 900"—was bowling in an ABC-sanctioned center, on sanctioned lanes and against sanctioned pins while using a sanctioned Columbia bowling ball.

Nor did it matter that three years earlier, in 1979, Allison had been inducted into the ABC Hall of Fame. (In 1984, Allison was voted into the PBA Hall of Fame.)

Everything was sanctioned at La Habra "300" Bowl except for Allison's 900. A lot of Southern Californians—and others across

a new award. The first recipient was Allison, who was presented the award by BJI editor Jim Dressel at the swank Columbia Dinner during the 2006 BWAA (Bowling Writers Assn. of America) Convention at the Las Vegas Hilton.

Henceforth, the award will be known as the BJI Glenn Allison Award. It will not be presented annually, only when a bowler accomplishes something extraordinary on the lanes. (The SoCal Bowling Writers Assn. had a similar award—the Merle Matthews Award.)

After the Columbia Dinner. As every bowling aficionado I had a chance to talk with the likable Allison. The first thing I asked him was, "How do you feel about the two 900 series that were prebowled by teenager Robert Mushtare of Carthage, N.Y. and approved by the USBC?

"It doesn't bother me as long as I have this," Allison said, as he pointed to the USBC Hall of Fame patch on his Navy blue

Allison, one of the most popular bowlers to come out of Southern California, holds no grudges against the ABC or USBC. As a matter of fact, he has been—and still is—a Bowling Ambassador for the USBC.

He says, "I've gotten a lot more publicity because the ABC turned down my 900 than if they had approved it."

Here's an interesting statistic: In the past nine years, the ABC/USBC has approved 11 900 series. Yet, in the previous 111 years of organized bowling, there were none... zero...

zilch... nada. You'd think the USBC would give Allison credit for his 900 and put an asterisk next to it, at least.

You know what I'd pay to see? An old-fashioned home-andhome match between the 73year-old Glenn Allison and 17year-old Robert Mushtare.

My money would be on "Mr. 900." The original one, that is.

By the way, did you know that when Allison rolled his 900, the league ("Anchor Girl Trios") didn't even shoot its average that night? Allison also competed in an earlier league that same evening-and failed to shoot 600. So he went out to his car and got out his Columbia ball. And, as they say, the rest is his-

FINAL ITEM: Glenn Allison's skill with a bowling ball may have diminished some over the years, but you couldn't prove it by the way the talented septuagenarian performed in Corpus Christi last March. All he did was roll a splendid 1882 all-events score.

Allison rolled 569 in the team event, 673 in singles and 640 in doubles. It was his 55th ABC/ USBC tournament appearance. Absolutely amazing!

"I've joined many of my friends on the (100,000) pinfall list, and it's nice to be in such good company," Allison said.

They'd say the same thing about him.







In our first tournament, we had 8 left-handers and 20 righthanders. Two out of the 8 left-handers cashed and 5 out of the 20 right-handers cashed. That is a 1 out 4 ratio for both. The average entering average for left-handers was 208.375, while the average entering average for righters was 206.05. The left-handers did a little better in the tournament, average wise, as they averaged 218.55, while the right-handers averaged 213.79. So the left-handers improved about 10 pins over their entering average, while the righthanders improved about 8 pins over their entering average.

Overall, we think this was a very fair tournament. A righthander, George Lewis led the handicap qualitying, while a lefthander, Chris Sargent won the tournament. We think the bowlers would be happy to return to Brunswick Moreno Valley Bowl at some date in the future.

The next Better Bowlers Tournament is scheduled for July 23, 2006 at Classic Lanes in Norco. We believe, Jon Diso, the General Manager, will give both sides an equal shot. Jan Niblett of Luster-Cote, Inc. is adding \$200 to the prize money. We think there is a very good chance that 8 bowlers will make it to the finals in Better Bowlers Tournament No. 2.
