## Ibardoloza Wins \$11,100 in ABTA Las Vegas Open at the South Point Casino

LAS VEGAS—Oscar Ibardoloza put on a stupendous performance as he won the Initial South Point Las Vegas Open downing upstart Jeff Juckett. He claimed a sweet \$11,100 Top Prize and deservedly so.

This event was held over four days, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, with a total of 697 entries coming to the South Point to enjoy the fun and competition.

Each day had separate qualifying boards. Except for day #1 the lanes were dressed semi-tough, but fair, with the scoring near the same each day to make the cut. Special thanks to the South Point for a fair tournament condition.

The nice turnout of bowlers, advanced 133 bowlers to the semifinals, who had the chance to make the cut to the top 32 single elim finals. The cut to the finals was a +60 (men) also 7 guaranteed women +34.

Our finals field was now set at 32 players, 25 men and 7 women. Oscar Ibardoloza hit the lanes for a leading +118 to be the top seed, sit out, and bowl for the title. La Sandra Chaney was ohh so close only 3 pins back at +115 which gave her a first round bye in the single elims.

In the round of 30, losers

## U.S. Women's Open Qualifying to Serve as Trials for PBA Women's Series

SEATTLE—The U.S. Women's Open, a USBC event, will return this summer and will once again determine the field for the PBA Women's Series. The qualifying scores from the event, which features the world's best women bowlers, will also serve as the PBA Women's Tour Trials.

"The intensity of the trials for the PBA Women's Series adds a unique drama to the U.S. Women's Open qualifying rounds," said PBA Vice President and Chief Operating Officer Tom Clark. "Women professional bowlers have more opportunity this year than any in recent memory and we know the competition will be compelling."

The event will take place July 31-Aug. 6 in the Chicago suburb of Romeoville, Ill., at Brunswick Zone XL. All five telecasts will be taped Aug. 5-6 and will air for five consecutive weeks beginning Sunday, Sept. 7 on ESPN at 1 p.m. ET.

The first four telecasts will consist of the Round of 16 and quarterfinal matches. The final show, to air on Oct. 5, will feature the semifinals and championship match. In all, women continued on page 11

## Coverage Continues on ESPN of the GEICO PBA Team Shootout

SIX FLAGS—One of the Denny's PBA Tour's most unique events in its 50-year history will conclude coverage of its 5-week series on ESPN. The GEICO PBA Team Shootout hosted by Six Flags Great America, featured 18 of the greatest bowlers in the world drafted into a rare team event held outdoors June 6-8 on specially-constructed lanes surrounded by the roar of park's roller coasters.

The 18 bowlers (16 champions from the 2007-08 Denny's PBA Tour along with one additional player designated by the PBA, PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber, and another designated by major sponsor USBC, World Bowler of the Year Jason Belmonte from Australia) were divided into three teams with players being selected by three "captains" – PBA Hall of Famers Mark Roth, Carmen Salvino and Brian Voss.

After 11 complete matches, the overall standings find

Voss' Bosses at 2-6, Carmen's Cartel at 4-3 and Roth's Raiders in the lead at 5-2.

At the end of the 12 game round robin match play series, the top two teams advanced to the championship round, which consisted of one singles match, one doubles match and one Baker-style match, with the captains choosing the participants for each match.

## Young, Petravich Claim U.S. Junior Amateur Titles

STERLING HEIGHTS, Mich. - Kristie Petravich of West Palm Beach, Fla., and Geoffrey Young of Denton, Texas, beat a field of the best youth bowlers in the country Friday to win U.S. Junior Amateur titles at the 2008 United States Bowling Congress Junior Gold Championships.

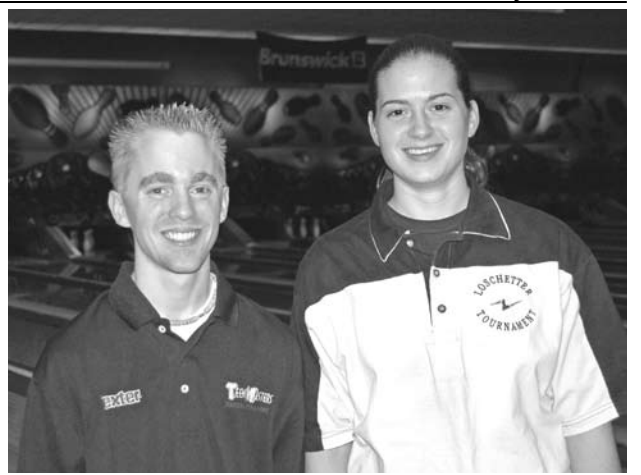
The championships featured nearly 1,500 bowlers from across the country competing for \$100,000 in scholarships, individual titles and spots on Junior Team USA.

Young, 18, who will attend Wichita State this fall, struck on the first ball of the final frame to lock up the title with 10,345 for 46 games, including 220 bonus pins for match-play victories. He defeated second-place finisher Daniel Spink of Florissant, Mo., 211-208 in the final game of match play.

"This win proves to me that I was able to make the team two years in a row," said Young, who finished tied for third at last year's Junior Gold, missing the title by just four pins. "After spending a year on the team working with the coaches and going to training camp, I just really wanted to experience that again."

On the girls side, Petravich led by more than 200 pins going into the last game and easily won the title with a 46-game total of 9,942, including 260 pins for match-play victories. Local bowler Christine Bator of Warren, Mich., finished second with 9,775, including 150 bonus pins.

"This means a lot because I didn't think I would ever win,"

said Petravich, 18, who plans to attend the University of Central Florida this fall. "I never thought I was good enough to win this tournament. This boosts my confidence and I'm definitely happy to win."

The top four finishers in each division earned automatic spots on Junior Team USA 2009 with the National Selection Committee picking two boys and two girls to join the team. Selections were made from the pool of athletes who advance to match play competition.

Joining Young and Spink on the boys squad was third-place finisher Tim Pfeifer of Cranberry Township, Pa., and fourth-place finisher Andrew Koff of Miami. Additional members of the girls team are Ricki Williams of Wichita, Kan., who finished third, and fourth-place finisher Kim Yioulos of Rochester, N.Y.

The National Selection Committee added Brent Bowers of Mulvane, Kan., Jarret Mizo of Honolulu, Brittini Hamilton of Webster, N.Y., and Jessica Earnest of Vandalia, Ill., to Junior Team USA 2009 as at-large members.

Four additional boys and four girls will be added to Junior Team USA at a later date. The top two boys and two girls at the USBC Team USA Trials (dates and location to be determined) who are under age 20 as of Jan. 1, 2009 will earn automatic spots. The National Selection Committee will then select two males and two females from a pool of athletes who made match play at the Junior Gold Championships or who competed in the Team USA Trials.

Athletes in both the boys and girls divisions of the Junior Gold Championships rolled 18 games of qualifying July 7-9 at Sunnybrook Lanes, Sterling Lanes and Century Bowl. The qualifying field was then trimmed to the top 107 boys and 57 girls who competed in 12 games of semifinals on July 10. The top 16 boys and 16 girls then took part in 16 games of round-robin match play Friday at Sunnybrook Lanes.

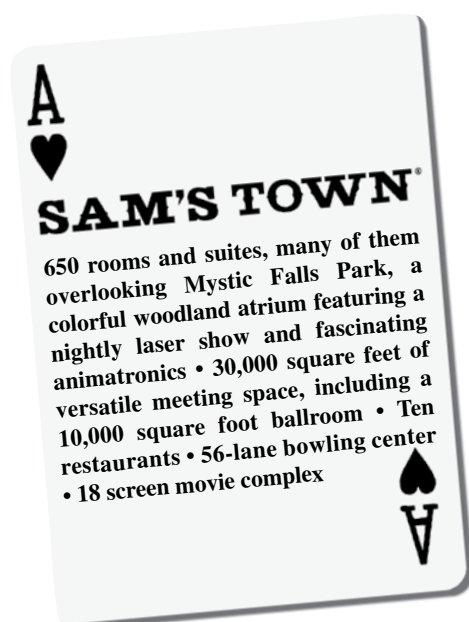

# New Coaches Hall of Fame Committee Gets It Right, Inducts Right Man in Dick Ritger For His World Wide Impact On Coaching Can Tom Kouros, Bill Taaylor, Fred Borden Be Far Behind?

The greatest honor that can be bestowed on any athlete is induction into a Hall of Fame. Virtually every sport honors its elite athletes.....baseball, football, basketball, golf, tennis, and other sports, including bowling.

Bowling’s greatest honor is induction into the USBC Hall of Fame. Bowling not only bestows this honor in the performance category but also reserves a place in the Meritorious Service category for those who have contributed in special ways to make the game better.

And now, by virtue of the incredible leadership of John Bergland, the Bowling Proprietors Association of America, through the work of Strike Ten Entertainment and new Skill’s Center, a newly formed Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame Committee has created a hall of fame for coaches who have made a significant impact on the game.

During the past eight or 10 years, bowling has stressed the importance of coaching and instruction to elevate the game to higher standards. From tots to teens, from grade school to high schools and well into colleges, coaching programs and seminars have increased steadily. Gold, Silver, and Bronze level coaches have sprung up all over the country. Additionally, training centers, led by the Kegel Company hire the BEST instructors in the world and stay busy year around. Many other bowling seminars are being conducted such as Bowling This Month’s Super School and Dick Ritger Bowling Camps. Susie Minchew, Fred Borden, Mark Baker, and other top rated coaches hold periodical seminars for bowlers who are eager to improve.

The first-ever 2008 inductee to the Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame is Dick Ritger who, in my estimation, was, and is, the most worthy selection among the greatest instructors the game has ever seen. Prior to his creation of the Dick Ritger Bowling Academy, Ritger was selected as one of the Top Twenty Bowlers of the 20th Century. He won 20 PBA titles and retired from the PBA tour while still capableof adding to his titles credit He embarked on a coaching career that covered 24 countries on five continents.

Dick Ritger is truly bowling’s World Ambassador. He is, unquestionably, the most influential person to have spread the bowling gospel throughout the world. He pioneered and paved the way for numerous coaches who now practice their craft all over the bowling universe.

Ritger shares his induction with a group of nine Traiblazers, also selected by the Hall of Fame Committee., trailblazers who were recognized as bowling visionaries who laid the foundation for all who followed. This list includes:

- Lou Bellissimo**, the first renown college bowling coach.
- Buddy Bomar**, one of bowling’s earliest prominent instructors, conducting bowling clinics nationwide.
- Bill Bunetta**, known for teaching coaches how to coach.
- Frank Clause**, the bowling professor, who authored books and instructional films for AMF.
- Ned Day**, one of the first to make extensive exhibition tours.
- Chief Halftown**, known as the “father of in-school bowling”
- “Doc” Hattstrum**, first to analyze some of the sport’s core principals.
- Floretta Mc Cutcheon**, the first known woman bowling coach.

**Andy Varipapa**, the first to make bowling movies and used them for instruction.

The Hall of Fame Committee must be commended for their recognition of all these great pioneers of the game. Their rewards have been LONG OVERDUE.

I feel certain that many of today’s top coaches will eventually be inducted to the Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame, particularly considering all the new measures being utilized. These new innovations include the CATS machine, Bowlers Map, and cameras that record every facet of bowling execution. Unfortunately for today’s new crop of coaches and instructors, longevity and results are of the utmost importance. It will take time. Nevertheless, three or four names are a DEFINITE MUST for consideration to the coaches sanctuary. No Coaches Hall of Fame can ever be completely fulfilled without the addition of such coaches as Tom Kouros, Bill Taylor, and Fred Borden.

Tom Kouros penned the greatest selling instructional book ever, Par Bowling. He also aided many professional bowlers as well as countless amateurs. He coached throughout the world and was honored by the World Bowling Writers when they instituted the Tom Kouros Outstanding International Coach Award. Kouros is a current instructional writer for the International Bowlers Journal.

Bill Taylor was an extraordinary coach, an innovator in measuring bowling devises, and wrote some of the greatest manuals in the game, including drilling procedures and Target Lines, a book depicting various methods for attacking lanes. His “parallel lines” concepts are still the prime methods of execution in professional ranks.

Fred Borden is partially responsible for the current growth of bowling coaches. Prior to his being named Team USA coach, Borden wrote several bowling books and worked with a number of professional bowlers. He was very instrumental in the career of Don Johnson and several other top professional players. He penned the first manuals for Gold, Silver, and Bronze Level coaches and has been a stalwart in recruiting new blood for the USBC coaching program.

I feel certain Kouros, Taylor, and Borden weill be recognized by the Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame Committee.

Some people think I belong to this elite group. My bosom buddy, Dick Evans, spoke to me about his original story this year that inspired John Berglund, Executive-Secretary of thre BPAA to form a Coaches Committee. Evans felt I would be one of the favorites. But, after all, he and my other adopted brother, Chuck Pezzano, have spent a lifetime promoting me and, although I sincerely appreciate Evan’s suggestion, I do not consider myself ahead of Kouros, Taylor, and Borden. I have learned a great deal about the game from Tom Kouros and Bill Taylor.

The Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame Committee is comprised of chairman Jim Sturm, BPAA President, Dave Garber, USBC co-director of coaching, Susie Minshew, past-president of IBP-SIA, Bob Rea, bowling coach/instructor (Bob Rea & Associates) Kelly Bednar, ddirector of STE Skills Center, and bowling writers Dick Evans and Jim Goodwin.

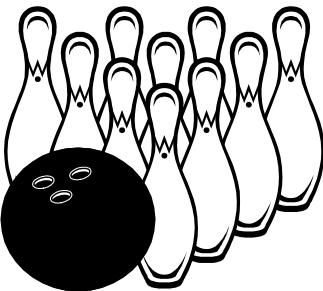

en's bowling will be featured on ESPN for at least 12 weeks with both the U.S. Women's Open and PBA Women's Series events.

The U.S. Women's Open, which was won in 2007 by Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., will follow a similar format from last year. Players will compete in four eight-game blocks of qualifying over four days beginning Aug. 1 before the field is cut to the top 16 who will appear on television.

The PBA Women's Series, presented by USBC, will also return for the 2008-09 Denny's PBA Tour season with at least seven events. It will again be featured alongside PBA Tour events, and most of the Women's Series stops will consist of a field of 16 players.

The 16-player field is made up of the four winners of last year's PBA Women's Series events (Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Shannon Pluhowsky, Joy Esterson and Diandra Asbaty) as well as 12 players from the PBA Women's Tour Trials. One Women's Series event will showcase 32 players with the additional 16 spots coming from the final standings of the Women's Tour Trials.

The U.S. Women's Open has an entry fee of \$250 and is open to any USBC female member. It features the world's best professional and amateur bowlers and was a major on the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour until that organization folded in 2003.
