NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

PETER KACZMARCZYK'S WELCOME BACK DEBUT IN 2013 GLDBA IN DETROIT

This is an unfinished story, which this columnist reported last April about a former deaf Detroit Pro bowler Peter Kaczmarczyk who after nearly three decades as a member of Professional Bowlers Association, quit PBA and was welcomed back to bowl in Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association tournaments. Three decades ago Kaczmarczyk and other deaf PBA members were dominating the deaf tournaments and that resulted in almost all deaf bowling organizations like GLDBA setting rules barring deaf PBA members from entering.

Last April this column reported about Kaczmarczyk being welcomed back to bowl in the 77th annual GLDBA April 2013 tournament at SuperBowl at Detroit. On Friday morning he started bowling as one of 92 entrants in GLDBA's prestigious 31st annual Herman Cahen Deaf Masters. This is a one day event with morning's three games qualifying round and match plays in the afternoon.

In the Masters, Kaczmarczyk with zero handicap for his 237 entering average, qualified in third with 730, then moved up to first in next round and top seed after third round. He beat Rai Doblmeier (235 average from RI) for the Masters title and \$1,500 prize.

On Saturday as one of the 48 teams entry, a long time GLDBA bowler David Croll had Kaczmarczyk bowling anchor on his Detroit Association of Deaf team with Croll, Joel Spishak, Frank Presta and Craig Schlorff. Kaczmarczyk rolled (258) 736 in leading the team to games of 1019-998-842 for 11th place scratch 2859 and with 339 handicap for 7th place 3198 total, cashing only in the 7th place.

Dangerous Curves won the Team event with 2908 plus 396 handicap 3304 score and DJ Powell, IN (227 average) with team event high 754 led Pin Punishers to score 1130-1036-992 for top scratch 3158 plus 114 handicap for 2nd high 3272.

KACZMARCZYK HIT 300-745 IN DOUBLES BUT DIP IN 2ND GAME PUT IN 3RD PLACE

On Sunday in the doubles event Kaczmarczyk paired with Croll as one of 119 doubles entrants, rolled a 300 in his doubles event's high 745 and Croll 550 made games of 466-345-484 for 1295 to place 4th in scratch. Their 1295 plus Croll's (172 average) 114 handicap 1409 total put them in third place.

Cyrano Buckendahl (638) and Walter Grassi (703) hit 488-436-417 for 1391 plus 96 handicap 1437 won the doubles event. Jason Stepchuck (671) and Erik Oestreich (711) scored 455-501-426 for the high scratch total 1382 and their 36 handicap 1418 put them in 2nd place.

KACZMARCZYK'S TOURNEY HIGH 757 WINS SINGLES & 2238 WINS ALL-EVENTS

In the singles event which had 238 entries, Kaczmarczyk did his best with the tournament high 757 series with games of 269-220-269, which won him the scratch title. Johnny McClean with 220 average and like Kaczmarczyk with zero handicap placed 2nd with his scratch 725 from games of 214-236-275. But the grand handicap title went to Michael Takacs, a 188 average Detroit bowler who shot 198-231-276 for 705 plus 75 handicap 780 by one pin over Robert Caron's 779. Caron has 187 average and hit 222-250-229 for 701plus 78 handicap.

In All-events no one came close to Kaczmarczyk's 736 in team event, 745 in doubles and 757 in singles total of 2238. So Kaczmarczyk took both actual scratch and with zero handicap the handicap title. DJ Powell, IN with 754(T)-655(D) 696(S) for 2105 was 2nd high scratch and Boguslaw Krzyzewski, 187 average bowler scored 638(T)-588(D)-678(S) for 1904 plus his 234 handicap 2138, 100 pins back in 2nd place.

In all for his welcome back bowling weekend in GLDBA, Kaczmarczyk hauled in a cool \$3,750.00 in prize money. He may have missed a lot in 3 decades if he did not join PBA.

Remember this above story is about Kaczmarczyk's bowling in last year's GLDBA tournament. This columnist does not have the results of this year's GLDBA's last April 10-13 78th annual tournament held at Grand Blanc Lanes in Flint, Mich. It would be interesting to know how Peter Kaczmarczyk did in that one.

PBA50 Player, Rookie of the Year Races Make Stretch Run As PBA50 Tour Makes First Visit to Fort Wayne

Top six in competition points earn berth for new PBA Champion's Challenge at World Series of Bowling VI

SEATTLE - With the 2014 PBA50 Tour season heading into the home stretch, PBA50 Tour rookie Norm Duke finds himself with a commanding lead in both the PBA50 Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year points races — at least for now.

As the lone two-time winner this season, Duke, with 48 points, holds a healthy 13-point lead over two-time defending PBA50 Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. in the POY race and a 22-point lead over Parker Bohn III in the ROY race with four tournaments remaining on the 2014 schedule. Williams has 35 points and Bohn 26 at this stage of the season.

Both the PBA50 Player and Rookie of the Year competitions are based on points earned for top four (or top five) finishes in match play elimination tournaments or top five finishes in stepladder events. Standard tournaments award 16 points for first place, 8 for second, 4 for third, 2 for fourth and 1 for fifth (stepladder format) while major tournaments award 24, 12, 8, 4 and 2 points, respec-

In addition to POY/ROY races, PBA50 players are vying for six spots in the new PBA Champion's Challenge that will makes its debut at PBA World Series of Bowling VI Oct. 24-Nov. 2 at South Point in Las Vegas. The top six in PBA50 competition points (not POY points) will bowl a six-game match play round at the World Series to determine the top two players who will compete in a PBA50 Tour Finals match that will be part of a new two-hour four-match Champion's Challenge telecast on ESPN

The race for PBA50 Tour Player of the Year honors resumes when the 50-and-older players' tour makes its first visit to Fort Wayne, Ind. July 20-23 for the PBA50 Pro Bowl West Fort Wayne Classic presented by Ebonite. In addition to his wins in the UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl in The Villages and the PBA Senior U.S. Open, Duke has a secondplace finish in the season-opening Pasco County (Fla.) Open and an 11th in the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic bowling in his four tournaments appearances this season.

Williams, the winner of the USBC Senior Masters for his first PBA50 major title, has finished no worse than ninth and has finished third twice and fifth twice, including a fifth-place finish in the PBA Senior U.S. Open.

Trailing Duke and Williams in POY points are Hall of Famers Pete Weber and Tom Baker, tied for third with 28 points each, and Bohn and Amleto Monacelli, tied for fifth with 26 points each. Both have one win this season.

Should Duke win the Player of the Year points race, Rookie of the Year would be a foregone conclusion, and he would join Baker as only the second player to win PBA50 Player and Rookie of the Year in the same season. Baker recorded the feat in 2005, beginning an unprecedented streak of four consecutive PBA50 Player of the Year crowns.






