Narcisco Wins \$12,235 in ABTA Open at South Point

LAS VEGAS — We returned to the South Point Hotel & Casino where we had a nice turnout of 449 entries across the 4 days of qualifying, and try to win \$16,750 possible with Bonuses. The shot was medium to semi-tough with cuts of Thursday the Men +89 and the Women was +87, Friday Men +73 and Women +57, then on Saturday the men were +85 and Women +67, Sunday Men 61 Women 53 and In the Re-Entry squad the Men were +79 and the Women +46. The Super Seniors added to the board MEN (3) Jim Smith, Ely Cruz and Mike Pizzaro and (2 female) were Esther Tambio, and Tessie Sanicolas. Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55.

Our top Qualifiers were Men, a HOT-Mike Nakunz + 230, and Ladies Beth Borci +111. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$3,425. Mike drew a 676. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. The pot will carry over and we will estimate the Match Series at \$4,750 at Oak Tree Saturday. The last bowler in the 3-6-9 roll off was John Gonzalez (back to back). He would miss on his 3rd shot and take home a \$ 100 consolation. Worth \$3,000 Saturday with a nice reserve pot in store also.

In our optional doubles, there were daily payoffs, and were listed in the Prize fund account. We are now ready and into the Semi Finals. All bowlers to cash from \$100 upward and in hopes of making the Exciting Top 32 Single Elimination Finals. After the

three game semi-finals, having a big 2nd game, Henry Narcisco topped the field at +140 and bowl in the Title Match. Finishing close behind was Bernie Navarro +136 to sit out the first round. Henry had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$1,120. He drew 138. Guess what Henry bowled? That score in his first Entry! Gil Justiane, Alex Manalo and Tom Mazzula also hit that score. They shared the pot and \$530 Each!! We will have an estimated pot of \$1,000 Saturday at Oak Tree.

This would bring us to our top 32 Match Play finals. In the first round, the 15 losers received checks of \$215 each. In the second round, eliminated were Fel Garcia, Steve Brode, Cezar Marcella, Sol Cericos, Giang Huynh, Mike Kristich, Marino Suos, and Andrew Lung. They get \$255 each. In the 3rd round, eliminated were Annaliza Angoncillo, Ken Pickett, Tomas Chavez, and Beth Borci. They got \$400 each. We were now down to the final five bowlers. In this round we saw Galindo Chavez and Bernie Navarro lose in tight matches to Jack Trongale and Ed Abarca. Both bowlers bowled well, and get \$750 each in 4th and 5th Places.

Now it's Jack Trongale vs Ed Abarca for the right to advance to the title. Ed won a Good 222-207 one and advanced to the title game with Jack in 3rd with nice bowling and \$1,750. Jack bowled very well!

The title game was set and it would be Ed Abarca vs top Seed Henry Narcisco. Henry elected to start on the left lane and spared Ed Strike and a spare and Henry

Three Major Tournaments Attract Bowling's Best And Their Fans To The City of Gardens

ARLINGTON, TX — Rockford, Ill., will be the center of the bowling world July 19-25, when the best women bowlers in the world compete in the BPAA Women's All Star Tournament and Bowling's Senior Women's U.S. Open presented by Storm at The Cherry Bowl, and parents and children team up to bowl for \$70,000 in scholarships in the 39th Annual International Family Tournament presented by QubicaAMF July 19-21, at Don Carter Lanes.

The entry deadline for both the All Star Tournament and Senior Women's U.S. Open has been extended until noon, July 17.

The BPAA Women's All Star Tournament is open to any USBC female member while the Senior Women's U.S. Open presented by Storm is open to all USBC female members age 50 and older. Bowlers in the All Star Tournament will be competing for a share of a \$75,000 prize fund with a \$15,000 first prize (based on 64 entries). The prize fund for the Senior Women's U.S. Open presented by Storm is \$10,000 (based on 32 entries).

"We are excited to have both women's tournaments at one location this year," said BPAA Tournament chairman John Losito, adding, "Bowling fans will have a lot to see when they step into The Cherry Bowl to watch the competition. These women are truly among the best in the country."

Among the stars registered to compete include Diandra Asbaty, Brittni Hamilton, Liz Johnson, Kelly Kulick, Danielle McEwan, Wendy Macpherson, Shannon O'Keefe and Shannon Pluhowsky.

The super-packed week kicks off with a Super Sweeper on Saturday, July 19 followed by a Pro-Am event in the evening. On Sunday, July 20, after a day of practice rounds, bowlers and fans will enjoy a Ladies and Legends welcome reception and dinner celebrating the history of women's professional bowling at Giovanni's, one of Rockford's finest restaurants. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday are set aside for three rounds of qualifying, followed by Round 1 of match play Thursday morning with Round 2 in the evening. In between, the Senior Women's Stepladder followed by Triple Crown matches in the afternoon.

The competition comes to an exciting end Friday with the All Star Stepladder Final beginning at 11:00 a.m. local time.

The Women's All Star Tournament and Senior Women's U.S. Open are made possible by sponsors like Storm, The City of Rockford, Dexter, Ebonite, Turbo, High 5 Gear, Kegel, United States Bowling Congress, Bowling Proprietors' Association of America and Miller High Life, the official beer of bowling.

While the women are bowling, families will be competing as well," Losito said, "The International Family Tournament presented by QubicaAMF at Don Carter Lanes is the only sporting event in the United States in which parents participate with children for a national championship and scholarships for a significant amount of money," adding, "Last year 39 parent/youth teams and 38 parent/teen teams enjoyed three days of fun and friendly competition to take home a share of \$70,000 in scholarship awards."

Parent/Youth and Parent/Teen teams qualify in local competitions held at participating BPAA member bowling centers and advance to state and regional finals to determine the teams that will compete in the national final.

As part of the weekend activities, contestants are treated to an opening and closing banquet, plus a Q&A and autograph session and special pro-am tournament with women professional bowlers.

PETER KACZMARCZYK'S WELCOME BACK DEBUT IN 2013 GLDBA IN DETROIT

This is an unfinished story, which this columnist reported last April about a former deaf Detroit Pro bowler Peter Kaczmarczyk who after nearly three decades as a member of Professional Bowlers Association, quit PBA and was welcomed back to bowl in Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association tournaments. Three decades ago Kaczmarczyk and other deaf PBA members were dominating the deaf tournaments and that resulted in almost all deaf bowling organizations like GLDBA setting rules barring deaf PBA members from entering.

Last April this column reported about Kaczmarczyk being welcomed back to bowl in the 77th annual GLDBA April 2013 tournament at SuperBowl at Detroit. On Friday morning he started bowling as one of 92 entrants in GLDBA's prestigious 31st annual Herman Cahen Deaf Masters. This is a one day event with morning's three games qualifying round and match plays in the afternoon.

In the Masters, Kaczmarczyk with zero handicap for his 237 entering average, qualified in third with 730, then moved up to first in next round and top seed after third round. He beat Rai Doblmeier (235 average from RI) for the Masters title and \$1,500 prize.

On Saturday as one of the 48 teams entry, a long time GLDBA bowler David Croll had Kaczmarczyk bowling anchor on his Detroit Association of Deaf team with Croll, Joel Spishak, Frank Presta and Craig Schlorff. Kaczmarczyk rolled (258) 736 in leading the team to games of 1019-998-842 for 11th place scratch 2859 and with 339 handicap for 7th place 3198 total, cashing only in the 7th place.

Dangerous Curves won the Team event with 2908 plus 396 handicap 3304 score and DJ Powell, IN (227 average) with team event high 754 led Pin Punishers to score 1130-1036-992 for top scratch 3158 plus 114 handicap for 2nd high 3272.

KACZMARCZYK HIT 300-745 IN DOUBLES BUT DIP IN 2ND GAME PUT IN 3RD PLACE

On Sunday in the doubles event Kaczmarczyk paired with Croll as one of 119 doubles entrants, rolled a 300 in his doubles event's high 745 and Croll 550 made games of 466-345-484 for 1295 to place 4th in scratch. Their 1295 plus Croll's (172 average) 114 handicap 1409 total put them in third place.

Cyrano Buckendahl (638) and Walter Grassi (703) hit 488-436-417 for 1391 plus 96 handicap 1437 won the doubles event. Jason Stepchuck (671) and Erik Oestreich (711) scored 455-501-426 for the high scratch total1382 and their 36 handicap 1418 put them in 2nd place.

KACZMARCZYK'S TOURNEY HIGH 757 WINS SINGLES & 2238 WINS ALL-EVENTS

In the singles event which had 238 entries, Kaczmarczyk did his best with the tournament high 757 series with games of 269-220-269, which won him the scratch title. Johnny McClean with 220 average and like Kaczmarczyk with zero handicap placed 2nd with his scratch 725 from games of 214-236-275. But the grand handicap title went to Michael Takacs, a 188 average Detroit bowler who shot 198-231-276 for 705 plus 75 handicap 780 by one pin over Robert Caron's 779. Caron has 187 average and hit 222-250-229 for 701plus 78 handicap.

In All-events no one came close to Kaczmarczyk's 736 in team event, 745 in doubles and 757 in singles total of 2238. So Kaczmarczyk took both actual scratch and with zero handicap the handicap title. DJ Powell, IN with 754(T)-655(D) 696(S) for 2105 was 2nd high scratch and Boguslaw Krzyzewski, 187 average bowler scored 638(T)-588(D)-678(S) for 1904 plus his 234 handicap 2138, 100 pins back in 2nd place.

In all for his welcome back bowling weekend in GLDBA, Kaczmarczyk hauled in a cool \$3,750.00 in prize money. He may have missed a lot in 3 decades if he did not join PBA.

Remember this above story is about Kaczmarczyk's bowling in last year's GLDBA tournament. This columnist does not have the results of this year's GLDBA's last April 10-13 78th annual tournament held at Grand Blanc Lanes in Flint, Mich. It would be interesting to know how Peter Kaczmarczyk did in that one.

PBA50 Player, Rookie of the Year Races Make Stretch Run As PBA50 Tour Makes First Visit to Fort Wayne

Top six in competition points earn berth for new PBA Champion's Challenge at World Series of Bowling VI

SEATTLE – With the 2014 PBA50 Tour season heading into the home stretch, PBA50 Tour rookie Norm Duke finds himself with a commanding lead in both the PBA50 Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year points races — at least for now.

As the lone two-time winner this season, Duke, with 48 points, holds a healthy 13-point lead over two-time defending PBA50 Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. in the POY race and a 22-point lead over Parker Bohn III in the ROY race with four tournaments remaining on the 2014 schedule. Williams has 35 points and Bohn 26 at this stage of the season.

Both the PBA50 Player and Rookie of the Year competitions are based on points earned for top four (or top five) finishes in match play elimination tournaments or top five finishes in stepladder events. Standard tournaments award 16 points for first place, 8 for second, 4 for third, 2 for fourth and 1 for fifth (stepladder format) while major tournaments award 24, 12, 8, 4 and 2 points, respectively.

In addition to POY/ROY races, PBA50 players are vying for six spots in the new PBA Champion's Challenge that will makes its debut at PBA World Series of Bowling VI Oct. 24-Nov. 2 at South Point in Las Vegas. The top six in PBA50 competition points (not POY points) will bowl a six-game match play round at the World Series to determine the top two players who will compete in a PBA50 Tour Finals match that will be part of a new two-hour four-match Champion's Challenge telecast on ESPN.

The race for PBA50 Tour Player of the Year honors resumes when the 50-and-older players' tour makes its first visit to Fort Wayne, Ind. July 20-23 for the PBA50 Pro Bowl West Fort Wayne Classic presented by Ebonite. Preceding the standard PBA50 Tour event, Pro Bowl West in Fort Wayne also will host the inaugural PBA50 Dick Weber Super Senior Classic presented by Storm July 18-20 for players 60 years of age and older.

All of the remaining 2014 PBA50 Tour tournaments will be streamed live via PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame. Subscription and schedule information is available by visiting www.xtraframetv.com.

In addition to his wins in the UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl in The Villages and the PBA Senior U.S. Open, Duke has a second-place finish in the season-opening Pasco County (Fla.) Open and an 11th in the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic bowling in his four tournaments appearances this season.

Williams, the winner of the USBC Senior Masters for his first PBA50 major title, has finished no worse than ninth and has finished third twice and fifth twice, including a fifth-place finish in the PBA Senior U.S. Open.

Trailing Duke and Williams in POY points are Hall of Famers Pete Weber and Tom Baker, tied for third with 28 points each, and Bohn and Amleto Monacelli, tied for fifth with 26 points each. Both have one win this season.

Should Duke win the Player of the Year points race, Rookie of the Year would be a foregone conclusion, and he would join Baker as only the second player to win PBA50 Player and Rookie of the Year in the same season. Baker recorded the feat in 2005, beginning an unprecedented streak of four consecutive PBA50 Player of the Year crowns.

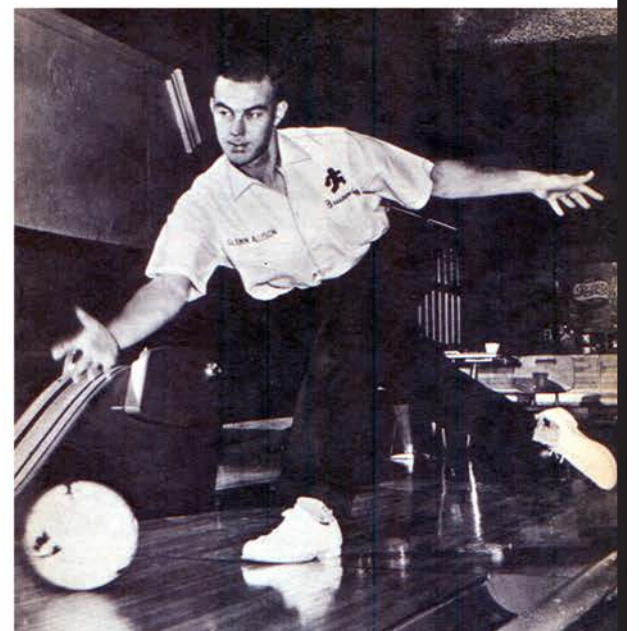
