Norm Duke Wins Fifth ESPY Best Bowler Award

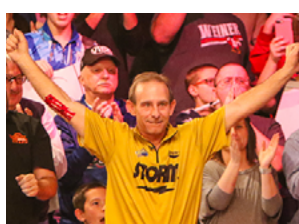
LOS ANGELES – PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, after winning two 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour titles in back-to-back tournaments at age 54, has been selected by PBA fans as the winner of the 2019 ESPY Best Bowler Award.

The announcement was made as part of the annual ESPYs telecast Wednesday from the Microsoft Theatre.

Duke, who became the third bowler ever to win 40 PBA Tour titles, won the ESPY fan vote for the fifth time, out-polling Australian two-handed star Jason Belmonte, 25-year-old Jakob Butturff and 22-year-old Anthony Simonsen.

Duke won his 39th and 40th titles in the Go Bowling! Indianapolis Open and the Go Bowling! Greater Jonesboro Open.

"Just to be acknowledged alongside all of the other athletes for superior performance is quite enough for me," Duke said.



"To win is over-the-top special."

With his fifth ESPY win, Duke moved into sole possession of second place on the all-time ESPY Best Bowler Award list, breaking a tie with Belmonte and Pete Weber who have both won the honor four times. Walter Ray Williams Jr. is the all-time ESPY award winner with seven.

LeClair Defeats Weber to Win PBA50 River City Extreme Open For Fourth Career PBA50 Tour Title

LeClair overcomes slow start in title match to beat Weber 225-200 for his first win of the season

MONTICELLO, Minn. – Wearing a brace to shore up his ailing left knee, Brian LeClair of Albany, New York recovered from a slow start to beat PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber 225-200 in the title match to win the PBA50 River City Extreme Open presented by Hammer Friday for his first win of the season and fourth of his career.

Leading by five pins in the ninth frame and finishing the title match first, LeClair threw two strikes and eight in the 10th frame which was enough to eliminate any chance for Weber to come back for the win. It was LeClair's first PBA50 Tour win since winning the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia Open in May of 2017 and it was later that season that he began wearing the brace.

"I never thought I'd be in this position again," said the 2017 PBA50 Player of the Year. "It's been a long road and a constant work in progress for the last year and a half to get to a point where I can trust my leg and be confident that I can be competitive again."

LeClair, who only needs to wear his brace when he bowls, started the title match with an open and a spare before striking on the next five of seven frames heading into the 10th frame.

"I was too amped up and just threw it too hard in the first frame and didn't get settled down until the third frame," the 54-year-old LeClair said. "I told myself to just slow down and throw it better like I had been doing the last two days."

LeClair earned the top qualifier position for the stepladder finals thanks to a 11-1 match play record earlier in the day at River City Extreme.

"I was fortunate in match play," said an emotional LeClair who dedicated the win to Eric Race, an employee at his pro shop continued on page 5

PBA League Set for Three Nights of Live Prime Time Coverage on FS1

Silver Lake Atom Splitters begin bid for fourth Elias Cup Tuesday at Bayside Bowl

PORTLAND, Maine – The three-time PBA League champion Go Bowling! Silver Lake Atom Splitters will look to defend the Elias Cup when the annual five-player team tournament airs live in prime time for the first time Tuesday through Thursday, July 16-18, on FOX Sports FS1 from Bayside Bowl.

The Atom Splitters are led by last year's Mark Roth MVP Chris Barnes and return three other star bowlers from last year's triumphant team: Jesper Svensson, Tom Daugherty and A.J. Johnson. PBA Tour veteran DJ Archer re-joins the squad after com-



peting for Silver Lake in 2017.

"The core of our group has been together for a while now and everyone

on our team has been a part of this squad before," said manager Mark Baker, who has guided Silver Lake to Elias Cup titles in 2014,

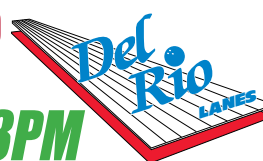

Go Bowling! PBA Tour's Top Performers Over Two Years Take Center Stage in Barbasol PBA Tour Finals presented by Red Rock Casino Resort & Spa

Jason Belmonte leads eight-player field in showcase event that will feature 9 hours of live coverage by the CBS Sports Network

LAS VEGAS – Eight of the Go Bowling! PBA Tour's top performers based on competition points earned over a two-year span – including defending champion Jason Belmonte – will take center stage July 20 and 21 for the Barbasol PBA Tour Finals presented by Red Rock Casino Resort & Spa which will be televised in its entirety live by the CBS Sports Network.

Belmonte, a four-time PBA Player of the Year award winner who won the PBA World Championship for a record 11th career PBA Tour major this season, led qualifying for the 2019 event after he accumulated 46,770 points in PBA Tour competition over the 24-month span ending with the USBC Masters on April 1.

Belmonte won the 2018 PBA Tour Finals by defeating 2017 winner EJ Tackett 2-1 in the Race to Two Points title match at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit. After splitting the first two games, Belmonte won the 9th and 10th frame roll-off 40-26 for the title.

Also qualifying for the 2019 Tour Finals are 2019 USBC Masters champion Jakob Butturff (40,267 points); 2019 PBA Players Championship winner Anthony Simonsen (38,919); Tackett (37,692); 2019 PBA Playoffs winner Kris Prather (31,266); reigning PBA Player of the Year Andrew Anderson (30,983); Marshall Kent (29,447), and 2019 PBA Hall of Fame Classic champion Bill O'Neill (28,937).

In another PBA landmark televised event, CBS Sports Network will air four live

two-hour shows and the one-hour finale from the Red Rock Casino Resort & Spa (two shows on Saturday, July 20 and three on Sunday, July 21).

The Barbasol PBA Tour Finals will incorporate the same format as 2018 with the eight-player field divided into two four-player groups. The field will bowl four games of qualifying in their respective groups. The four-game pinfall totals for each player will be used to determine the seeding for a separate stepladder finals in each group. The final match of each group's stepladder will be a Race to Two Points match with each game worth one point and, if the two games are split, the final point is awarded via a 9th and 10th frame roll off. The two group winners will then meet in another "Race to Two Points" championship match that will also use a 9th and 10th frame roll-off should there be a tie after two games.

The four total pinfall matches will air July 20 at 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. ET and will determine the order for the Group 1 stepladder matches at 3 p.m. on July 21 and the Group 2 stepladder at 5 p.m. The winners of each group stepladder will the face off in the championship match at 7 p.m. **Here's a look at some of the highlights for the eight finalists:**

Jason Belmonte, Australia: The two-handed PBA Tour Finals defending champion won the 2019 PBA Tournament of Champions and PBA World Championship earlier this year for his 10th and 11th PBA Tour major victories to top the all-time majors list. He also won the Chameleon Championship and Japan Cup. In 2018 he won the PBA Tour Finals and Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship with Bill O'Neill. He also concluded the 2017 season by winning the PBA World Championship.

Jakob Butturff, Tempe, Arizona: The left-hander won the PBA Oklahoma Open, PBA Lubbock Sports Shootout and the USBC Masters this season for his first major title. He was runner-up in the 2019 PBA Hall of Fame Classic, the DHC PBA Japan Invitational and PBA World Championship. In 2018 he won two PBA Tour titles.

Anthony Simonsen, Little Elm, Texas: The 22-year-old two-hander won the 2019 PBA Players Championship to become the youngest player to win two majors. He had a runner-up finish in the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Jonesboro Open and won two titles in 2018.

EJ Tackett, Bluffton, Indiana: Was the 2018 season's only three-time winner. Finished second in the 2019 PBA Tournament of Champions, third in the Go Bowling! PBA Jonesboro Open and fifth in the PBA Players Championship. He won the inaugural PBA Tour Finals in 2017 and finished second to Belmonte in 2018.

Kris Prather, Plainfield, Illinois: Won the PBA Scorpion Championship in 2019 for his first Go Bowling! PBA Tour title, ending a streak of seven top-five and four third-place finishes over the past two seasons. Won the inaugural PBA Playoffs earlier in 2019.

Andrew Anderson, Holly, Michigan: Earned PBA Player of the Year honors in 2018 with the help of two wins including the USBC Masters. Finished third in the 2018 PBA Tournament of Champions.

Marshall Kent, Yakima, Washington: Finished third in the 2019 PBA Tournament of Champions. In 2018 had five championship round appearances including third in the PBA Players Championship and fifth in the U.S. Open. Also had two wins in the second half of the 2017 season.

Bill O'Neill, Langhorne, Pennsylvania: PBA Playoffs runner-up won the 2019 season-opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic for his 10th career tour win. Finished third in the PBA Scorpion Championship and fourth in the PBA World Championship. In 2018 he won the Roth-Holman Doubles Classic with Jason Belmonte and finished second in the Xtra Frame Parkside Lanes Open.

The Profanity Problem

Mind you, it’s not the bowlers who leave a split or miss a shot. It’s the pins who are undermining their game.
Thus, they have their reason for trashing their surroundings with assorted curses.

Most of the time, you can’t get away from it. It’s here and it’s been here for a long time.

Reporters can write about how ugly it is, how offending it is, how it besmirches the sport of bowling.

Nothing will change.
Bowling secretaries can chew out offending players and hold meetings condemning the ugliness of obscenities.

It might help for a day, for a week, for two weeks.
But nothing will change.

So, what can be done?
The sad answer, in this reporter’s opinion, is nothing.

Profanity is here to stay. It’s unfortunate, but bowlers – just off work or needing to vent – will find the friendly environs of the bowling center as the perfect place to pollute the air.

And all we can do is live with it.
So, what’s the purpose of this story? If there’s nothing we can do about it, why write about it?

This story is not meant to sledge-hammer the bowlers who let their tongues slip or fingers wag. We all get an urge to utter something we know is not a polite utterance.

This story is just a gentle reminder to bowlers that obscenities are not good for the game and sometimes mar the

joyful experience of fellow bowlers.
So, when you think it’s a big deal when your pin doesn’t fall, remember this:

It’s a bigger deal when the pins don’t go down for some reason and you take it all in stride. And you smile. You smile because you know the breaks will even out in the end – or at least they may come close to evening out.

This way when people see you shake off that “robbery” and refrain from cursing, they’ll look up to you and respect you.

So, the next time you leave that wobbling 10 pin that wobbles and wobbles and wobbles and just won’t go down, take it with a grain of salt.

Know that there will be another chance, another game. And perhaps next time, the pin will fall.

And there’s no need to kick the ball return either!
The near-misses will even out – even though on some days it seems like they never will.

Once you smile when you’ve been “robbed,” you’ll see opponents and players smile along with you.

Your true friends will remain friends – bad breaks or not and even if it costs your team a game or two.

I swear it’s true.

Antonio Palangio Wins Forest Lanes 8-gamer for \$1000

LAKE FOREST—The long-awaited return of the Forest Lanes scratch tournament was this past Saturday, July 13th, approximately two years since the center last hosted such an event. 51 bowlers shoed up, and after the dust settled (and there was A LOT of dust), Antonio Palangio from Torrance emerged as the victor, pocketing a cool \$1000 for his efforts. The tournament was contested on the 37' PWBA Fountain Valley Open pattern, and it was immediately apparent that good shot making and spare shooting would be the keys to victory. With the lanes transitioning throughout the day and each pair seemingly playing different pair-to-pair, Antonio was that guy, putting together games of 196-213-211-169-195-205-247-214 to finish at +50 (the only bowler in the field to average over 200). It took less than a 185 average to cash in the main prize fund!!!

Finishing in second was the last person to enter the tournament, Jeremy Glover. Missing most of practice and starting with two open frames for an opening 161 game, he was not deterred. He got back on track with scores of 195-185-221-204-206-203-225 to finish at even for the day, netting \$500. With a couple of seconds in two sidepots (including cashing in both super pots in games 4 and 8), second in the last 4-game block, and bracket winnings, Jeremy's take-home money was close to \$1200.

Bobby Campagnale holds residency when it comes to cashing at these scratch events. On this day, he finished 3rd for \$350. He was the leader at the halfway point at +43, but a few bad breaks in the second block kept him from getting any momentum going when he seemed to have figured them out. He settled for -17.

Special kudos to the three ladies who went toe-to-toe with all the guys. As an incentive to draw more ladies to the event, the high woman out of the cash was guaranteed her \$100 entry fee back. Stephanie Zavala, fresh off her recent 859 series at Del Rio Lanes, finished 5th at -38 for \$240. Virginia Young came out firing out of the gates with 230 and 221, and she was able to hold on to a cashing spot in 7th place for \$170. Both these ladies were pretty locked in to cashing spots the entire day, which meant that Sandy Rosenblum took the last cash despite not finishing near the cash line.



- Jeanette Robinson, house pro at the **Showboat** put together "The National Golden Ladies Classic." We'll have lots more on the ladies as the years roll by. Jeanette wouldn't take a NO from anyone, always wanted free ads and free results in the paper.
- The **Santa Fe** (60 lanes) was under construction. Maybe a Christmas grand opening. Another Vegas fun spot.
- The ABC held the top spot as the worlds largest membership organization in sports. BUT WE STILL COULDN'T GET INTO THE OLYMPICS!
- Question? Were the many tournament clubs sanctioned? Did you need a sanction card to bowl? Could you win ABC/WIBC awards? Did clubs actually pay out the money they advertised? Hey! Just asking!
- Remember "Shur Slide" shoe protectors? They slipped over the soles of your bowling shoe. Personally I used a shower cap that was free at every hotel/motel!
- Billy Myers Jr. won a High Roller Win-A-Spot worth \$1000 on games of 280-278-246. Still a senior in high school, he got special permission to go to Vegas and compete.

- Christmas Club Leagues were very popular. Start in January, end around December 1, Prize money was sweet and shopping easier.
- Adele Rollins was the queen of **Westbrook Bowl** the night she rolled her 300. The awards rolled in from W.I.B.C. Cal State and local.
- Page 24, November 9, 1990- Pictured was Glenn Ford receiving NABI bucks from Director "Crazy" Horewitz.
- Between 1976 and 1990, bowling lost over 2 MILLION sanctioned members. Associations needed volunteers (no more free rides). Centers needed people who loved the game. The tide was turning.
- Mike Fowler and Bill Talbott both rolled "The Big One" at **Del Rio Lanes** in the Whitlock League. All those turkeys the week before Thanksgiving.
- Rolf Gauger was a welcome "Pot Stirrer" with his weekly column. Some advice was good. And then there was just "stuff". Who cared about "Why do you drop the ball?" and "What is a dynamic resistance?"
- **Plaza Bowl** in Long Beach had one last party and closed the doors forever. The 16 lanes were owned by Duane Haldt.
- Local shooter= Cliff LaPointe traveled to Cincinnati to compete in the Hoinke Classic. His advice? "Come early, roll lots of practice games, learn the lanes, and maybe even get new equipment." "Ohio weather isn't like California weather."
- Close your eyes and say "Kow A Bunga Dude!" **Rocket Bowl** used the quote to advertise their "bicycle" league. Every bowler got a bike! BMX, Jazz or Columbia.
- Mike Calvillo was Mr. Cool at **Bowling Square**. SED was his "boards of bowling education." Has he improved over the years?? Just ask him! Has the game changed? You couldn't get much better.
- Question raised yearly...."How much does it cost a professional bowler to compete every week?" Consider travel, hotel, food, uniforms, equipment, entry fee, car, gas, insurance, phone calls etc. How many Pros got Sponsor help? Married? Why would a guy do it?? Or a gal?
- Tori Romeo and Michelle Silver teamed up and won the W.W.P.B. at the **Showboat**. (2019 Michelle still challenges any field!)
- Wendy Macpherson, San Diego, age 22 was the youngest winner of the **Sam's Town** invitational. \$20,000 into the socks.
- Many celebs had lanes installed in their homes; Aaron Spelling, Harold Lloyd, Hugh Hefner, the White House, etc. Locally, in 2019, over 3,000 homes have lanes! Traveling mechanics wanted!
- Mary Jo Light was Center Manager at **Bowl-O-Drome**. Jason Altman controlled the reigns at **Palm Springs Lanes**. Dick Steinbough headed the BPASC. Pasquale family still at **Arena Bowl**. Bob Smith, ABTA Founder, still at it.
- The Ladies "Have Ball Will Travel" traveling league was 30 years on the road (And still going in 2019. Any original members?)
- Dick Weber rolled a game on the Oprah Winfrey show against a terminally ill fan.
- Bill Lipps (LABA Director) had a natural muticolor beard; black and white. Great for black and white photos.
- 26 centers in So. Cal. had weekly GOLD STAMP squads. Lots of lickin' and stickin' going on.
- The "Xmas Special Ball" this year was the "Boss" Phoenix. \$105.95. I never heard of it! Then or now. Anybody have one?
- Ed Bournaise, Fresno, was the P.R. man for the WSBT.
- Alex Hernandez was top dog on the final day of the 38th Grant Classic. He credits his win to Chuck Reese for great ball drilling plus practice and timing.
- The BPASC owned a bowling lane on a flat bed. They set up at fairs, gave out thousands of free games to local venders and let people roll a few. Better than being on TV.
- **Menifee Valley Bowl** hosted the last PCB of the year. First Mike Fowler, 2 and 3 tie Joe Staton and Lee Taylor. One pin could have been a \$2000 difference.
- Former Manager of **Koni Lanes** Dick Stoeffler tossed out weekly comments in his Mountain Time column. He was in favor of smoke-less centers, smiled at Marshall Holman's three gutter balls on TV and was ticked because Glenn Allison got the shaft.
- Tish Johnson and Amleto Monacelli repeated their Doubles Victory (PBA/LPBT) in Reno at **Bally's**.
- Tom and Kathy Tehee, bowlers at **Del Rio Lanes** won \$45.3 million on one quick pick. The Calif Lottery had machines in every center. New Cadillacs for everyone!
- Joe Mandell was manager at **Santa Anita Lanes** and hosted PBA. Ted Hoffman was a PBA Director. Local Marv Sargent (Very young) managed a fifth place.
- You guessed it! Female pros were pictured, produced and packed. Their 62 pic-packs sold for \$12.95. 2 Californians featured were Helen Duval and Vesma Grinfield.
- End of 1990 and time to celebrate New Years Eve. Best Deal?? **Pinky's Bowl** special. for \$32.50 each, Prime Rib and Lobster dinner, champagne, Moonlite bowling, party favors, snacks and prizes. Sign up now!

Motown Muscle Earns No. 1 Seed as PBA League Play Begins Tuesday on FS1

Silver Lake Atom Splitters begin bid for fourth Elias Cup as No. 5 seeded team

PORTLAND, Maine (July 15, 2019) – The Motown Muscle averaged 241.63 during Monday’s eight-game Baker format seeding tournament at Bayside Bowl to earn the No. 1 seed for the quarterfinal elimination round of the seventh annual PBA League Elias Cup competition that begins Tuesday at 7 p.m. ET live on FS1.

The Motown team, managed by PBA Hall of Famer Del Ballard Jr., outscored the No. 2 Brooklyn Styles by 85 pins to open its bid for its first PBA League title. Monday’s seeding round also gave Ballard an opportunity to move players around in his lineup for the Baker format competition, which requires each of the five players to bowl two frames in each game, and he decided his lineup for the opening match against No. 8 New York City KingPins will include PBA Tour veteran Josh Blanchard bowling leadoff followed by AJ Chapman, rookie Mykel Holliman, two-hander Anthony Simonsen and former PBA Player of the Year EJ Tackett.

The three-time Elias Cup winning Go Bowling! Silver Lake Atom Splitters will open their bid to defend their title from the No. 5 seeding position against the No. 4 L.A. X when the annual five-player team tournament gets underway Tuesday.

The Atom Splitters, led by two-time Mark Roth MVP Chris Barnes, will try to become the first four-time Elias Cup champions. Barnes’ teammates will include Sweden’s Jesper Svensson, Tom Daugherty, AJ Johnson and DJ Archer.

In the first six years of PBA League competition, the Atom Splitters (three titles), Dallas Strikers (two titles) and New York City KingPins are the only teams to hoist the Elias Cup. That means the hometown favorite Portland Lumberjacks along with L.A. X, the Philadelphia Hitmen, Brooklyn Styles and Motown Muscle all will be trying to win the event for the first time.

In an unfortunate first for the PBA League, the Philadelphia Hitmen’s Shawn Maldonado was forced to withdraw due to injury. The team bowled the seeding round with four players, taking “nine-spare” in Maldonado’s slot in the lineup, while PBA Tour titlist Jake Peters of Henderson, Nevada, was flying to Portland to replace Maldonado for the start of competition Tuesday.

The PBA League, for the first time, will air live for three consecutive nights in prime time on FS1 as part of the PBA’s inaugural season of FOX Sports coverage. PBAL coverage begins on Tuesday with coverage of all four quarterfinal round matches, beginning at 7 p.m. ET. Tuesday’s winners will advance to the semifinal round on Wednesday at 9 p.m., with the two finalists bowling for the Elias Cup Thursday at 9 p.m.

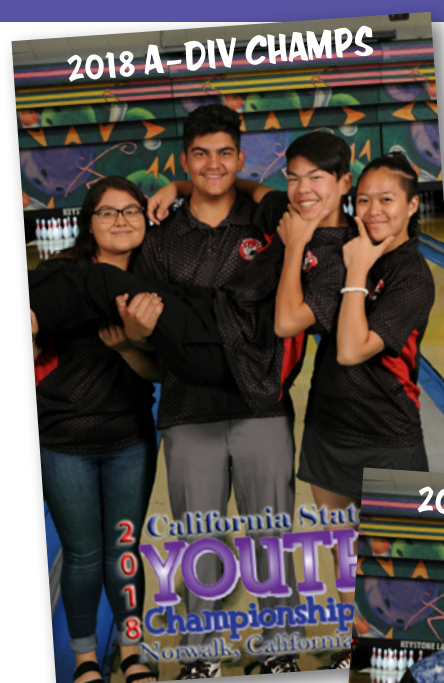
