## Pro Shop Demo Day at Expo a HUGE success!

LAS VEGAS - On Tuesday June 28, The I.B.P.S.I.A (International Bowling Pro Shops and Instruction Association) put on a bowling demo day at Gold Coast Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, NV that took place the day before Bowl Expo began. Bowling ball Manufacturers such as Motiv, SPI, Brands of Brunswick, and the newcomer to the demo day SWAG Bowling, all had their bowling balls out on the lanes for demonstrations.

Attendees were treated to demonstrations by each of the brands PBA stars, such as Anthony Levery-Spahr (Swag), Belmo (SPI) and E.J. Tacket (Motiv).

Many patrons laced them up and got to throw some of the current and upcoming releases. One of the balls that drew great interest was a soon to be released ball from Swag

called the Buzzer Beater. The core was specifically designed for bowlers who do not use a thumb.

Besides the ball demo's companies such as I AM Bowling, Vise, and Spectre had mini booths set up to give the attendees a sneak peek at what they will see during the upcoming event at the Las Vegas Convention Center.

## KYLE TROUP THRILLS CROWD TO WIN PBA STRIKE DERBY

Kyle Troup captured the PBA Strike Derby presented by Pabst Blue Ribbon crown and the \$25,000 prize with a dazzling performance against Matt Ogle.

The greatest showman in bowling put on yet another magnificent performance in front of the exhilarated Portland, Maine crowd at Bayside Bowl. The Portland Lumberjack's twelfth and final strike sent the crowd into a euphoric frenzy.

"These are the moments that we bowl for and live for," Troup said. "To throw a strike there at the end and just yell at the crowd, I've got goosebumps thinking about it."



The six players who threw the most strikes during the Anthony Division and Carter Division qualifying, respectively, advanced to the Strike Derby. Ogle led the Carter Division with 49 strikes, while Packy Hanrahan paced the

Anthony Division with 45.

Troup escaped the opening round against fellow Lumberjack, Wes Malott, on a tiebreaker. He defeated Motown's Mitch Hupé in the second round, then another Lumberjack in Packy Hanrahan in the semifinal.

With this being Troup's third appearance in the Strike Derby, he said he's gained valuable experience that helped him win the matches. He rotated through an assortment of four balls per lane, while continued on page 4

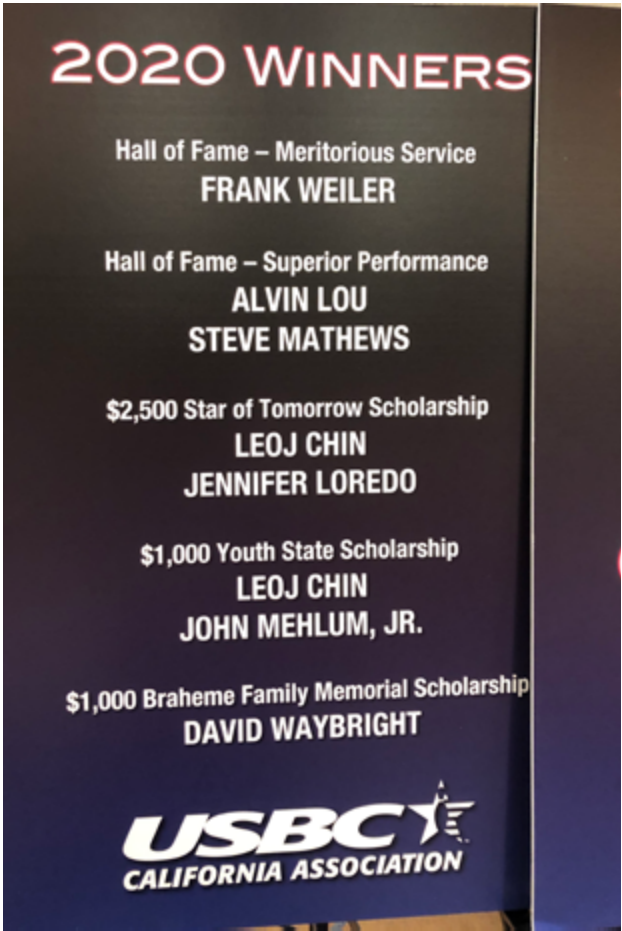

Joe Moreno is a GOOD BOWLER. Joe Moreno is a **BETTER MAN**.

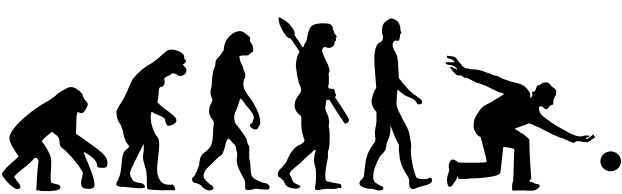

qualifying, he opted to use a Purple Hammer urethane for the All-Star Clash. His ball reaction faded as the rounds progressed, but he said changing balls wasn’t really an option.

“Urethane is not going to strike as much but it’ll put up a high number and give it a chance,” Peters said. “My plan was to hit the pocket and try to stay alive. You hope that you can get through a few rounds trying to get your feet under you.”

While the raucous BoPo crowd energized the players, they made it difficult for Peters to keep his ball speed down. “You love to get pumped up with them,” he said. “At the same time, it’s hard to slow down. Slow on that show is still fast.”

With five left-handers on the show, the southpaws saw as much transition as the right-handers. One of those left-handers was Jakob Butturff, who finished fourth.

Butturff replaced his L.A. X teammate Martin Larsen, who suffered a neck injury just before the PBA League. Larsen persevered through the Anthony Division Finals and Strike Derby, but said the pain was worse than ever on the morning of the All-Star Clash.

“I know how hard it is to beat those guys when you’re totally okay,” Larsen said. “To do it injured is just really hard. I wanted to have somebody from my team that is feeling okay to bowl for us.”

Hanrahan, the crowd favorite who had over a dozen family members and friends in attendance, observed the lanes transitioning a few rounds before the finals. He noted how Matt Russo and Jesper Svensson missed left and paid the price with splits.

“I did the same thing,” Hanrahan said of his final shot. “I made the bad miss of left and getting around (the ball) instead of missing in. If I miss in, I probably still hit the pocket, maybe I flat-7 or 7-10 but at least I would have hit the pocket.

After Hanrahan’s 2-4-7-8 leave, Peters only needed seven pins to lock up the win. His ball almost skidded through the breakpoint, but managed to knock over eight pins and claim the victory.

The 33-year old Peters was selected 15th overall in the PBA League Draft. Peters subbed for the Hitmen in 2019, but this marked his first selection to the PBA League since 2014. He took the responsibility of representing the Hitmen in the All-Star Clash to heart.

“Jason Couch took a chance on me,” Peters said. “I had a chance to sub a couple years ago and it just didn’t go well. I really wanted to do well and put on a show for the team. Going into today, I really wanted to win for the Hitmen more than anything.”

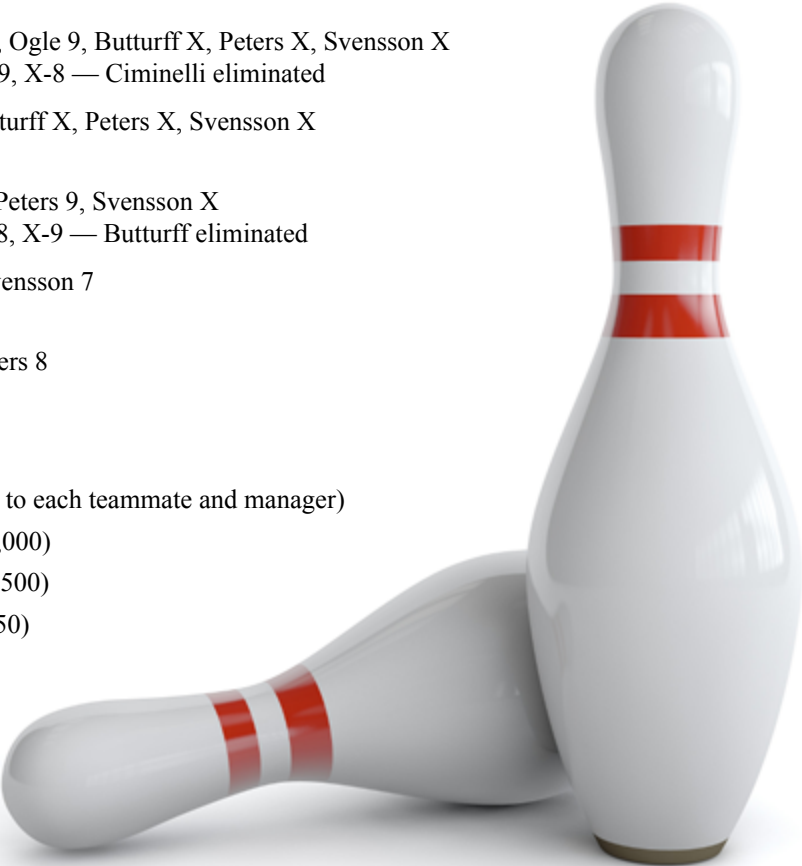

other competitors deployed more limited arsenals. Some of the players who use their thumb, including Matt Russo and Darren Tang, were limited to three balls.

A one-hander without such restrictions was defending champion Andrew Anderson, who made a valiant effort to reclaim his title. He defeated High Roller teammate François Lavoie in the first round and Dallas’ Santtu Tahvanainen in the second round.

In the Carter Division Final, dreadful pin carry plagued his two-minute binge against Ogle. Anderson said there isn’t time to watch pin action in this format, but could tell from the crowd’s reactions that his hits weren’t pretty.

He knew his eight-strike performance stood little chance, especially after Ogle delivered back-to-back messengers on his first two shots.

Ogle earned a first-round bye, then defeated Las Vegas’ Russo before taking down Anderson to reach the finals.

In the championship round, top-seeded Ogle opted to bowl second. He faced a tall order after an early six-bagger propelled Troup to a dozen strikes, but his confidence never wavered.

“I knew he was gonna have at least 10, 11 strikes — 12 was a lot,” Ogle said. “I knew I was gonna get more shots off than him. He takes a little bit more time on the approach. He slides; I plant. I can get off and go on the next one.”

Ogle rallied to reach 11 strikes with 20 seconds to go, but a miss right and a pesky 10-pin stifled his furious comeback attempt. Though he tied Troup with a twelfth strike on his final shot, he couldn’t match Troup’s longest string and lost via tiebreaker.

Troup said the win served as redemption following his three-strike, second-round exit in 2021.

He paraded around with the trophy as the Portland crowd put an eponymous spin on Tag Team’s iconic single “Whoomp! (There It Is).”

“I love this environment,” Troup said. “I thrive off of it. As soon as I hear those fans cheer for the first time in Bayside, I’ve gotta do my job and that’s to get the win for Portland.”

# Bowling Still A Way Of Life In Michigan

A recent email from Genie Franklin at [thebowlingnews.net](http://thebowlingnews.net) in the Dallas/Ft.Worth Metroplex got me thinking about how bowling still remains a way of life for residents in the state of Michigan. Genie announced that she and daughter Tori were headed for the Junior Gold Championships in Grand Rapids, Mich., where husband Tony would be joining them later in the week. Tori will be competing in the Girls U15 Division.

The event is HUGE and involves many of the larger bowling centers in Grand Rapids, Lansing and Muskegon. When I was stationed in Chicago while working for AMF, I made the three hour trip around the southern tip of Lake Michigan and into Grand Rapids and Muskegon many times.

One of the first visits was in the winter of 1978. After a complete day at AMF Muskegon Lanes, I was ready to hit the sack at my hotel room a few miles away. As I drew the curtains shut, I noticed a couple of snowflakes falling before collapsing on the bed for a good night's sleep. The next morning when I awakened, the snow had reached as high as 5 feet from the floor of the sliding glass door! At the time it was the largest snowfall to hit the area in recorded history, exceeded only by another blizzard 4 years later, in 1982.

Muskegon Lanes was also the first AMF location in which I incorporated world famous bowling champion Dick Weber into what we would eventually call the "I Beat Dick Weber... Once!" contest. I've told the story so many times in recent years, but I can't resist telling it again! I will try to make it brief:

*Our first engagement was in Muskegon, Michigan, and I arranged to meet Dick at the Grand Rapids airport for the drive to AMF Muskegon Lanes. You can imagine the excitement I felt as we drove to Muskegon — just me and the most famous bowler of all time alone in the car for almost an hour.*

*My attempts to talk about anything must have made Mr. Weber wonder if I was a sane person as I babbled on about the weather, bowling, etc. About this time Dick pointed up to a road sign and said, "Wasn't that the exit for Muskegon?" Oh no, we have a way to go yet, I replied. As we approached the Indiana border I had to admit that I missed the turnoff as I was babbling my head off, and we turned around and headed for Muskegon, where we arrived at about 2 a.m.*

*The next day we went to a 7 a.m. breakfast with about 200 screaming kids, followed by five consecutive squads of bowling starting a 9 a.m. and wrapping up at about midnight. Weber never complained, bowled every squad, and was the perfect gentleman to all. He was really at his best when interacting with people.*

*Upon returning to the AMF Headquarters on Monday, Woody Woodruff called me into his office and said, "I've got Dick Weber on the phone." I thought, boy am I in trouble now. Between getting him lost, and bowling all those squads without so much as a lunch break... oh well, it was a fun job while it lasted! Woody put Dick on the speaker phone and he said inquisitively, "Dave, do you have a road map?"*

*Dick never let me forget that day! Whenever I would call or greet him he would always ask if I had my road map. I always considered it an honor just to know the man, but when he remembered my name, and the reference to Muskegon (... "got your road map?"), well that just made my day.*

Muskegon Lanes appears to have closed for good around 2011, when the last reviews on Yelp and TripAdvisor were published. It was a 42 lane center that shared an entrance off of Whitehall Road with a drive-in theatre. A map search on the internet reveals that the building is still there today, but both the drive-in and bowling center remain vacant.

Two other large 50 lane bowling centers that are still around in Muskegon are hosting functions of the 2022 Junior Gold Championships. They are Northway Lanes and Sherman Lanes. I first met woman superstar bowler Marion Ladewig at Sherman Lanes, where she must have been a co-owner. She was only 5'1" tall, but had a powerful handshake.

Along with Northway Lanes and Sherman Lanes in Muskegon, the following Grand Rapids locations will be involved in the Junior Gold Championships: AMF Eastbrook Lanes (40 lanes), Spectrum Lanes (40 lanes), Westgate Bowl (60 lanes) and Fairlanes Bowling Center (44 lanes). Lansing will be represented by Royal Scot Golf and Bowl (60 lanes) and Spare Time Entertainment (31 lanes), making a total of eight venues in the three cities.

More than 4,000 of the country's top youth bowlers have qualified for the 2022 Junior Gold Championships. In addition, a pair of companion youth tournaments will be taking place in Grand Rapids. The USA Bowling National Championships will be contested at AMF Eastbrook Lanes and Fairlanes Bowling Center, while the Youth Open Championships will be contested at Spectrum Lanes.

I remember whenever AMF sent me out to investigate a new or existing property, the general rule of thumb by the bowling products sales staff was not to look at an area that had a ratio of less than one lane bed for every 3,000 residents. Anything under that was considered to be overbuilt and not worthy of acquisition or new construction. The town of Muskegon, home to Brunswick Bowling and Manufacturing, was less than one-fourth of that total.

A quick review of the internet finds that although the number of bowling centers have been reduced in Muskegon County, the overall population has also been on a gradual decline since 1950. The population to lane ratio today is a bit healthier at 850 residents per lane, but still tremendously overbuilt.

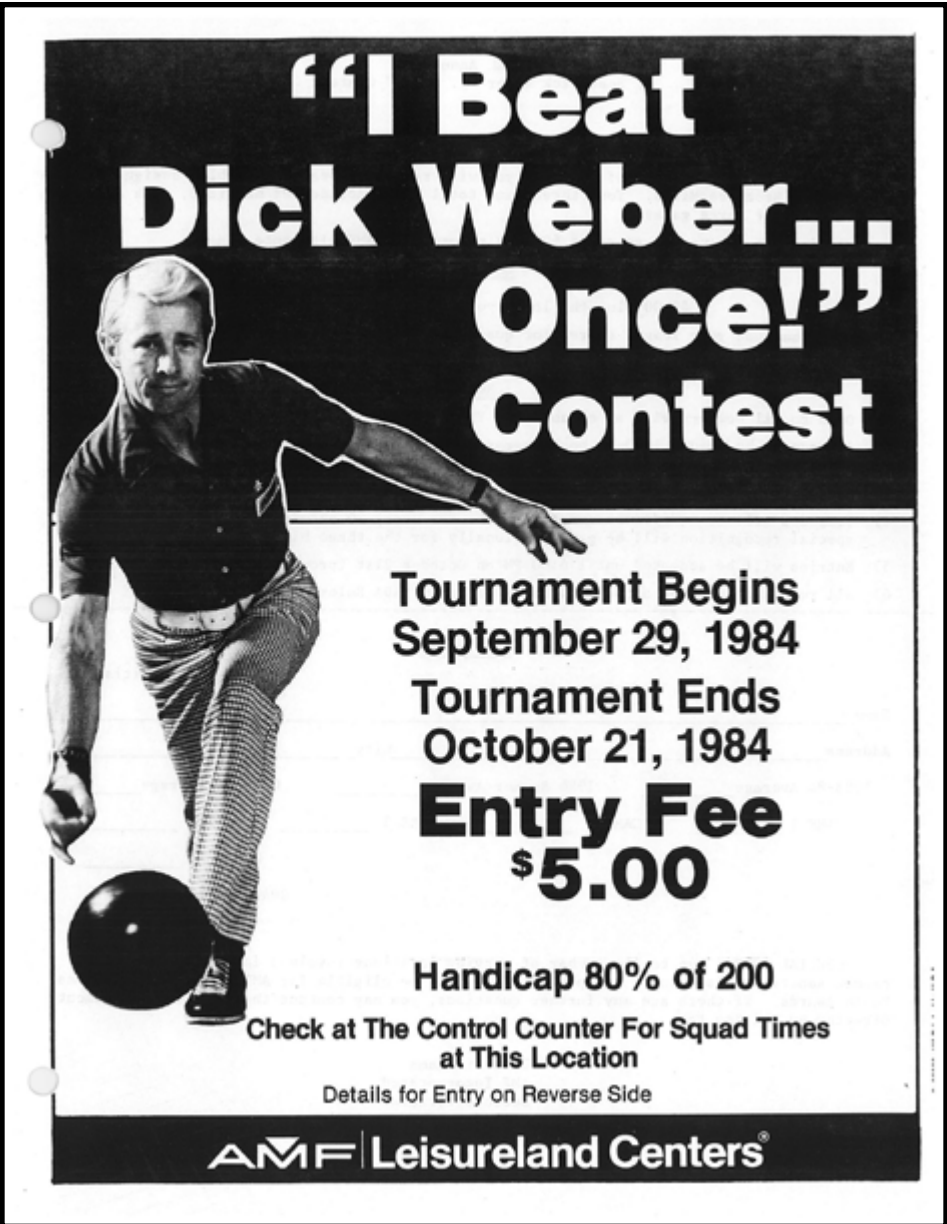
By contrast, Grand Rapids, voted one of the 100 most livable cities in the USA, has a much better population to lane ratio of one lane for every 2,588 residents, according to statistics provided by the West Michigan USBC. This total takes into account the closing of three large AMF owned bowling centers — Comet Lanes and Miracle Lanes in 2008, and Lincoln Lanes in 2021.

It looks as if the U15 Girls Division is being conducted at Spectrum Lanes in Grand Rapids. Let's all wish Tori "good bowling," and bring home the gold!
