A respected member of the Sonoma community for over 50 years, Phil was born in Portland, Oregon, went to high school in Toronto, Canada and earned a B.A. from Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri. A teaching fellowship brought her to Mills College in Oakland where she earned a Masters Degree.

She began a teaching career at San Mateo High School where she taught English and then moved to Sonoma High School where she taught P.E. for four years. She met Bob Severance of Sonoma and they were married in 1955. She was an active member of the Philanthropic Educational Organization (PEO) and active in the Pink Ladies at the Sonoma Valley Hospital and the Cancer Walk for Life. She continued a friendship with her students for many years and was always thrilled to be invited to their reunions.

A sportswoman, she was an avid fan of all sports and a bowler for over 45 years which led to numerous leadership positions in the local Napa-Sonoma Women's Bowling association (President for 12 years), California Women's bowling Association (1st Vice President and a Member Emerita.) She was a Life Member and Hall of Fame member of both associations. Among her passions was the California Senior Women's Tournament which she chaired for a record 23 years.

Chuck Mogavero Wins WCST Ebonite Singles At Riverside Casino Lanes Vaughn Doody Captures Super Senior Division

LAUGHLIN, NV — Chuck Mogavero (Kingman, AZ), bowled in his first West Coast Senior Tour tournament, and it will be a memorable one, as he won it in very fine fashion at Riverside Casino Lanes.

Chuck led the qualifying of the senior division on Saturday with 2357 for the 10-games, then on Sunday, in a very tough 8-man finals, rolled 2029 for the eight games. Second place finisher, Mike Clemence, made up a lot of ground after game 2, falling 152 pins behind the leader. After game 6, both bowlers were tied for the lead. Mike rolled 2024 for the finals.

A crucial game for Mike was game 7, when he bowled a 249 game and was beaten by Terry

Leong's 269, dropping Mike back by 39 pins to Chuck going into the position round. Then Chuck beat Mike 256-247, and ended up winning by 78 pins, counting the 30 pin bonus for the win. Both of these players are new in the WCST, and they really put on a show of strikes all through the finals, as well as the position round match. Doug Talsma, who started in 7th finished 3rd rolling 1978 for the eight games.

CALIFORNIA USBC “UPDATES”

Our Annual Meeting was held in the Raincross Ballroom of the Riverside Convention Center, June 14, 2009. Following presentation of the United States Flag, The California State Flag, and the CAUSBC Flag. President Hoffmann called the Annual Meeting to order at 9:00 am.

The Memorial was given by Director Lynn Graves. Rosie Parker Sergeant-at-Arms, , led the Pledge of Allegiance, and the National Anthem was sung by Brianna Levy of San Gabriel.

Absent from Roll Call was Jeff Chin, Jim Decker, Gina Moura and Phyl Knoll (who was excused from the morning session).

President Hoffmann declared a quorum present. A motion to accept the Minutes of the 2008 Annual Meeting was approved.

President Hoffmann acknowledged guests present: Joan Feinblum, Past President California Women’s Bowling Association; Agnes Duffy; Past Present of CWBA, Mary Lynly, Past President of CWBA, Linda Johnson, Past President CWBA and currently 1st Vice President of CAUSBC; Phyllis Bourque, Past President CYABA and currently a Director of CAUSBC; Bob Schoeneman with the National Office of USBC; and Carol Mancini, Co-Publisher of the California Bowling News.

President Hoffmann seated Ruth Beigle as Recording Secretary and Kim Goldsworthy as Parliamentarian.

Written reports from the President, Association Manager, Directors and All Committees were provided in the Delegate’s Package and in the interest of time, would not be read.

In attendance were (5) Officers, (20) Directors, (78) Adult Delegates, (39) Youth Delegates - a total of (142) eligible to vote.

A motion was presented from the Legislative Committee to accept their proposed Amendment to the CAUSBC By-Laws. In Article X, “Amendments”; Section A, “Procedure”, #2. Change to read: “Submitted by September 1 of the calendar year prior to the meeting when the association is considering the proposal; to Become effective August 1, 2009”. Reason: This will give new members on the Local Association Board of Directors the opportunity to submit all proposals. The motion was approved.

Association Manager, Larry Peppers referred to the Budget Report and noted significant information on the Balance Sheet and Income Statement for year ending July 31, 2008. There were no questions.

California Youth Committee reported changes in the State Scratch Tournament and the Scholarship Program , all will be posted on our Website and included in all mailings. Doug Lauer, current CAUSBC 3rd Vice President was introduced. He has “aged out” in the youth position and is retiring.

Tournament Committee announced that the 2010 Youth

Championships will be hosted by North County USBC, who has received bids from two of their proprietors to host the tournament.

The Women’s Championship Tournament Committee is entertaining bids from associations for the 2010 tournament.

Current leaders of the Open Championship Tournament were reported: All Events Score was 2870, and the Singles All Events score was now 846. Two 300 games were rolled simultaneously by two former youth bowlers.

Updates. To the Pepsi Youth Bowling Championships for 2010 was announced. The District Finals for 2010 will be held March 13-14 for Districts 2,4,6 and 7; March 20-21 for Districts 1,3,5, and 8. The committee is looking for bids from centers and those interested should contact their District Directors. If not, a contract can be signed. The State Finals will be May 1-2 at Fountain Bowl in Orange County.

BVL Committee advised donations to the BVL for 08-09 were \$237,451.87. In this was \$975 in memory of Joan Scharsch, a longtime supporter of BVL. Since 1950 California Bowlers have donated \$8,444,187.06 to The BVL. Top associations for 08-09: Citrus Belt USBC \$12,000; Orange County USBC \$11,000;San Gabriel Valley USBC \$9,200. BVL Bowling Ball Raffle winner Karen Tweed, Merced . Winners of Bowling Carpet Kits to be sent to an active Military, June Brown, of Modesto and Karen Tweed . The 2010 BVL Tournament will be at Yorba Linda Bowl in April. Some winners of 2009 tournament were recognized: Dexter Harrod, M- Div-B; Stephanie Loucks, W-Cl. and Jon Dukes, A-Div Youth.

The Senior Women’s Tournament Chairman, received 203 entries. The tournament will be held weekend of August 28-30 at Double Decker Lanes, Rohnert Park.

This year’s event of the Prince and Princess Tournament will be held at Bowlum Lanes in Montclair. Kerry Billings, 2008 Princess was introduced.

Entries increased this year for the Queens and Masters Tournament, but the committee is hoping for improvement.

The Youth State Scratch Tournament Committee announced that with the age rule change, former entrants will “age out”. We need to encourage new bowlers to participate. Entries will be in all the Centers by the end of August.

National Deaf Bowling News
Stogryn Replaces Hayse On Deaf Team USA

RIVERSIDE — Things moved fast! Right after my last week's article on the Deaf Team USA update was being printed, I got an e-mail from the newly appointed team coach Ed Abakumoff about another replacement. This is sad but necessary. USADSF removed William Hayse (TN) for failure to meet his fundraising obligations by the deadline date. Like what happened four years ago, former Deaflympics Masters Silver medalist Darrell Stogryn (CA) was again selected to replace Hayse.

While we regret to see Hayse lose his opportunity to bowl in the Deaflympics, each team bowlers was given a specific date to meet his or her fundraising total with only two months left for departure to Taiwan. For the second time in a row, Stogryn has to fall back on using his own money with little time to get donors to help out.

Four years ago in Stogryn's first Deaflympic debut in Australia, he came back from battling a weeklong flu to save the men's Team USA's prestige by winning the Masters Silver medal. most faithful member and he is most deserving to be sure. Great Bowling by definitely one of the “Good Guys” a very nice man. Congrats.

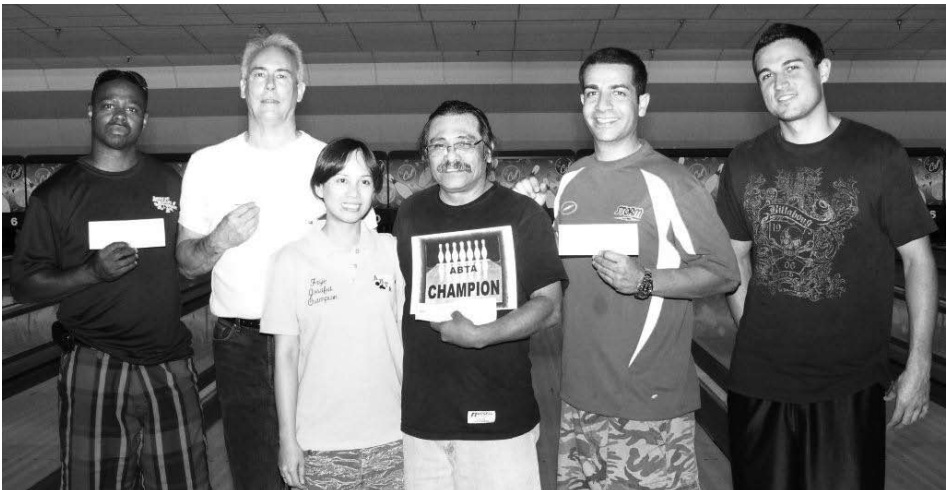

Bob was known as “Mr. Smooth” on the bowling circuit and was quoted at one time, “I laugh all the way to the bank!” He was a fierce competitor but always a gentleman on and off the lanes.

Bob leaves behind his devoted wife of 62 years, Connie, four daughters, eight grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren. Bob certainly was a champion bowler but most of all ...

Bob was a “champion” as a husband, daddy and Tata with a tremendous passion for his family, which resulted in a passionate love and respect for a man who was truly one of a kind and will be so tenderly missed, but forever loved.

Services were held July 8th at Hilgenfeld Mortuary in Anaheim. Condolences to the Ramiriz family; Bob will truly be missed by all who knew him.
