

With a waiting list for franchises, we added two teams but the 18 team format did not fit our popular 33-week season so it was returned and frozen at

In those early days, we never bowled in the same center twice. After the first season with the new format and improving averages for many bowlers, the league has advanced through the years until it hit 675, and though it has been lowered a couple of times, it has returned to it's present

Most members of the league are veterans of 25 or more years, some left and returned, some new ones have oined which indicates this great leagu has withstood the test of time and so many changes in the bowling world This writer organized the league for a story I wanted to write and never dreamed it would last 48 years. In fact, we are the FIRST EVER sanctioned Las Vegas league

When we applied for league sanction, WIBC advised me we would have to change the league name to Holiday league, Vacation league, etc because Las Vegas was not acceptable (boy times sure did change later, eh?) but I would not accept their ruling and reminded them we were a traveling league and bowled sweepstakes at Dusty Springston's Las Vegas Bowl. Dusty was active in ABC and BPAA affairs and he added his support.

Through the years, countless Las Vegas leagues have bowled and enjoyed doing so. However, in our league, going to Vegas is optional and is the second part of our sweeps; team event is bowled on the local scene. Also, interesting to note that we chartered a plane out of Long Beach for half the

cost we must now pay for a bus.

I hope you enjoyed a flashback to the formation of our super league, thanks to Carol Mancini for the space, and also sponsoring my team this year. We have lost so many centers and, due to gas prices involved in long distance driving, limited the schedule to Cal Bowl, Cerritos Lanes, Del Rio, Keystone Bowl, Linbrook Bowl and Westminster Lanes

NDBA President Dennis Brady led his team with 641. Old Timers of West consisted of former NDBA President Connie Marchione and former NDBA Secretary-Treasurer Don Warnick

PLUNKETT WINS 2ND NATIONAL SENIORS TITLE, HESTON RUNER-UP 2ND IN ROW

The 14th annual NDBA National Deaf Seniors Championship drew 22 entries but three were no-shows due to illness and other reasons. Former champion (2002) Johnny Plunkett ., ARK led both Qualifying blocks of 4 games with handicap 868 and 843 for 1931. Deaf Team USA member Joe Ed Thompson, TX had the high scratch scores of both blocks 838 and 834 for 1672 but his 218 average gave him one pin handicap per game to place 11th with 1680.

With the field cut to 16 high qualifiers for first round match plays, Plunkett held on to first place with John Hesser TX, last year's runner-up Gerald Hester MN, Jose Ybarra, TX in order. Then the field was cut to top 8 for 2nd round of two games match plays and Plunkett held on to first, Heston moved to 2nd place, Hesser third and Ybarra 4th. At the end of 2nd round, Plunkett was seeded to first and Heston, Hesser and Ybarra were to go in a shoot-out on Saturday afternoon.

On Saturday afternoon top seed Plunkett resting and waiting for the winner of the shoot-out, Heston and Hesser were ready but Ybarra was not present. Because someone erred in telling him that the shootout as to start at 4 PM, Ybarra was contacted and told to come to Showplace Lanes right way. When Ybarra arrived, he was given time to

warm-up and the two games shoot-out started.

Ybarra led the first game with 218+31/249 with Heston 178+54/

232 and Hesser 170+36/206. In 2nd game Hesser hit 205+36/241, Heston 181+54/235 and Ybarro struggling to a 148+31/179. The final and Hesson 1617-94233 and Tolain Sudggming to a 14-6731/17/9. The liniar tally gave Hesson 467 total to go in championship finals against Plunkett and Hesser 3rd place with 447 and Ybarra 4th with 428.

In the two games title finals Heston could not match up with Plunkett and finished as runner up for 2nd time.

Plunkett scored 187 and 169 for 430 total with handicap and Heston 160 and 149 for 417 with handicap. Plunkett tied Lonnie Jones Jr. as the only two-time winner of the National Deaf Seniors

TOP SEED SPRINGER RALLIED TO BEAT SANFORD FOR DEAF WORLD TITLE

For the last 4 years, NDBA World Deaf Championship drew less than 100 bowlers and this year was the all time lowest with 43 bowlers. In Thursday's first 6 games block qualifying round former champion (1998) Ed Abakumoff, CA rolled games of 205-289-254-258-194-202 for a new first round record 1402 bettering by two pins the old record of 1400 by Phil Aronson, NY in 1995. Joe Ed Thompson, TX had all 200 games 1325.

In Friday's 2nd 6 games block Abakumoff continued with 226-257-201-237-205-238 for 1374 and a new 12 games record total of 2776 (231+ ave.), breaking the old record of 2716 set by Rich Alkire, CA in 2001. Thompson also rolled all 200s for 1311 in this block, setting a record for 12 straight 200 games and 2636 total (219+ ave.). With his 156 handicap Abakumoff led the qualifying round with

2932, two pins short of the record 2934 made in 1996. Thompson had only 12 handicap, which put his 2648 total in 19th place with the field cut to 24 top qualifiers for the match plays.

In the 3 one game match plays on Sunday morning Thompson rolled 229-216-212 to add to his string up to 15 but alas in this handicap tournament he won only two matches. With all his good bowling Thompson did not make the cut for 2nd round match play, ended up in

Meanwhile Abakumoff won only one match and with his 620, he fell to third place.

A 173 ave. bowler with 42 handicap, Mark Phillips, TX who qualified 2nd with 2877 won his all three matches to take over first with 3689 total. @@ years old Douglas Haley, TX rolled this round's high game of 268 in his 691 winning two matches moved up to 2nd as the

field cut to top 12 bowlers.

In the top 12 bowlers 2nd round 3 one game match plays, Phillips fell to third and 162 ave, Kurt Springer, TX who qualified in 8th place, leaped from 4th to first with 4557 total winning all three matches. Haley with his 671 also won 3 matches to retain 2nd place but later in next round lost all three and fell to 4th place.

In the cut to top 8 bowlers for the 3rd round match plays, Springer, again won all his three matches and his total of 5405 put him in the top seed position for the championship finals. Kenny Flick, 170 ave. Texan who qualified 7th won all three of his matches, moved up to 2nd with 5260. Another Texan with 169 ave. Robert Smith who qualified 5th, won two matches to move up to 3rd. A 188 ave. Texan George Sanford who qualified 12th rolled 648 to move up to 4th place, making the shoot-out an all Texan affair.

In this two games shoot-out, the winner faces Springer in the title finals. After first game Sanford took lead with his 232+28/260, Flick had 199+45/244 and Smith 193=45/238.

Sanford kept ahead with 211+28/239, Flick had 188+45/233 and Smith 168+45/213, Sanford with 499 total moved into title finals against Springer, Flick with 471 placed 3rd and Smith's 457 put him

In the finals Sanford grabbed a 3 pin lead with his 190+28/218 to Springer's 164+52/216. But Springer rallied back to win with his 192+52/ 244 fir 460 to Sanford's 182+28/210 for 428. Springer is the 2006 World Deaf Champion and may get about \$1,500 first place and Sanford is the runner-up. Next week will show the women's results.






