Bowling Is Back In Crestline

CRESTLINE—After being closed for over 2 years, Jody and Joseph Glaviano have brought bowling back to the Crestline area. The majestic mountain scenery and nearby Lake Gregory is the back drop for the return of this 16 lane center.

Jody and Joseph own two Subway franchises in the Lake Arrowhead Village and Twin Peaks areas. They were originally looking for a third location when they came across the closed bowling center. Jody said, "I remember bowling here as a kid and it's a shame

that there isn't any indoor entertainment for the local kids." Unexpectedly, they became bowling center owners.

The remodel includes new Qubica scoring units, comfortable sofas in the bowlers area, a new game room, Perky's Pizza that serves beer and wine and an upstairs 800+ square foot meeting room that accommodates 72 people. The former coffee shop will be transformed into a Subway in 2009. So they'll have their third Subway location as planned, it just happens to have a bowling center attached to it.

BPA of Canada Agrees to 100% membership in BPAA Approximately 440 Canadian Bowling Centers to become BPAA Members

ARLINGTON, TX—In an unprecedented move, the Bowling Proprietors' Association of Canada (BPAC) has entered into a 3-year commitment with the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America (BPAA) to bring all of its approximately 440 bowling centers into BPAA membership effective August 1, 2008, according to BPAA and BPAC officials.

In addition to Canadian bowling centers having 100 percent membership in BPAA, they will also have a seat on BPAA's Board of Directors during that same 3-year period.

"This agreement augments the growing relationship be-

tween our organizations and offers Canadian proprietors added value for membership in BPAA-Canada," remarked Paul Oliveira, BPAC Executive Director.

"We are looking forward to a healthy and mutually beneficial partnership with BPAA and its members and partners across the United States."

This agreement signifies the first time in BPAA's history that an international organization or country has made such a commitment on behalf of its country's bowling centers. Canadian bowling centers with tenpin, 5 pin, candlepin and duckpin lanes are all represented in this arrangement.

Field set for Round of 16 at U.S. Women's Open

ROMEDEVILLE, Ill. - Tested by four tough lane conditions over four days, the field for the ESPN-televised Round of 16 was determined Monday at the 2008 U.S. Women's Open, a United States Bowling Congress event.

Carolyn Dorin-Ballard held onto the top qualifier spot after 32 games with 6,963, an average of 217.59, and leads the field of 16 players who advanced. Dorin-Ballard led for the third consecutive day at Brunswick Zone XL.

"Up until today, I hadn't missed an easy spare, and I missed four in my first four games today," Dorin-Ballard said. "To not miss any spares for three days is huge, and that was really the big difference for me."

The final 16 players will be placed into a one-game, single-elimination bracket, and all remaining rounds will be televised by ESPN for five consecutive Sundays beginning Sept. 7 at 1 p.m. Eastern.

Dorin-Ballard was joined at the top of the leader board by Trisha Reid of Columbus,

Ohio, who finished second with 6,840. Kristal Wilson of Lawrence, Kan., was third with 6,785, while Diandra Asbaty of Chicago was fourth with 6,780.

Other players advancing to the quarterfinals were: No. 5 seed Brenda Mack of Indianapolis; No. 6 Shalin Zulkifli of Malaysia; No. 7 Stefanie Nation of Miami; No. 8 Clara Guerrero of Colombia; No. 9 Amanda Burgoyne of Greenfield, Wis.; No. 10 Michelle Feldman of Skaneateles, N.Y.; No. 11 Tennifer Milligan of Costa Mesa, Calif.; No. 12 Kim Terrell of Dover, Del.; No. 13 Maxine Nable of Australia; No. 14 Jodi Woessner of Oregon, Ohio; No. 15 Jen Petrick of Canton, Ohio; No. 16 Adrienne Miller of Albuquerque, N.M.

"The talent out here this year is one of the best pools of talent I have seen in years at a women's event," Dorin-Ballard said. "Players are getting better coaching, competing collegiately and there are more opportunities to bowl in PBA

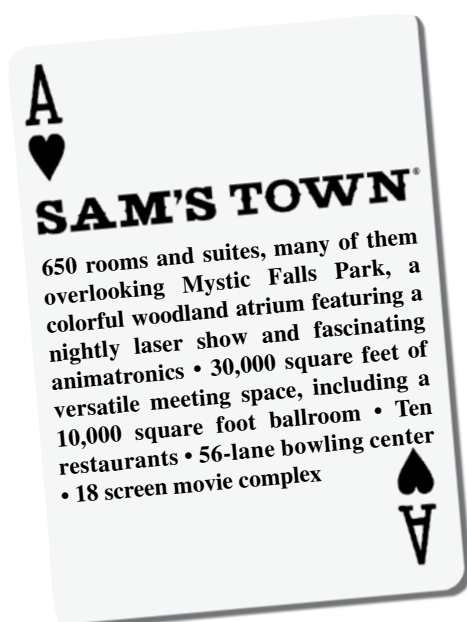

WESTMINSTER — Don Johnson Sr. has beEn a regular ABTA Member for 5 years and he is now our latest champion after a super display of bowling at Westminster Lanes. He won in an exciting match downing upstart Victor Fabian 239-237 in the title game getting the needed pins on the final ball for the win.. He won from the top seeded postion.

Our return to Westminster had 132 entrants and produced cut scores of Men +60 and the Ladies checking in at +40 to make the semifinals.

We had 44 bowlers advance to the semifinals. Leading the Semis was Don Johnson Sr. with a big +122 edging out Rico Cayton who had +104. Don would sit out to be able to bowl the title game. Rico to receive a first round bye in the single elims and enter in round two. It took a +31 for the men and +4 for the 3 guaranteed ladies to make the Sweet 16 Single Elim Finals.

The Bowlers took to the lanes, and in the first round single elims losing were Tony Rodriguez, Ray Grabinski, Steve Dagel, Oliver Esmejarda, Marilyn Yamasaki, Deb Sanders, and Belinda Thomas. They got checks of \$100 in 10-16th places.

Round three had Vic Fabian take out Darrow Tiongco in a big way 263-169. Mark Fisser struck late to edge David

TIME TO UPGRADE YOUR YOUTH PROGRAM

I think it is time we took a page from many of the other sports that are vying for increased youth participation. Does soccer ring a bell? It is only one of several youth sports that have had a huge impact on our declining numbers of youth league bowlers.
A key influence determining what sport a child takes up can be found in his or her parent(s). Parents look for many things in a youth program, some of which are:

- What is the cost (participation fee, travel to and from venue, uniform, equipment)?
- How convenient is it to the families existing scheduled activities?
- Will their child get an opportunity to play?
- Will it be fun?
- Competition level...introductory, recreation based, varsity club or team, select or elite?
- Social and self-esteem growth opportunities.
- Skill development.
- Coaching support.
- Scholarship opportunities.

Skill development in bowling is a key component and is easy to monitor with each weekly standing sheet. Improvement in skill is also tied in closely with other factors that may influence the parent and are included on the list above.

I am from the Pacific Northwest, and yes, we do get a fair amount of rain. We also have many bodies of water surrounding our cities and towns. Therefore, nearly every Northwest area parent enrolls their children in swim classes. When my daughter was about three we took her to the local pool for swimming lessons.

On the final day of the six week session I went to pick her up and she came over to me dripping wet and smiling. She held out something in her hand that she wanted me to see. I took it from her and there it was, her 'report card' for the past six weeks of swim lessons. And, to my great delight (and hers as well) according to this report, she was now a full fledged 'polliwog'. Wow! How cool was that?

On the paper there were several 'skills' that my daughter had mastered during her time in the pool. Things like BLOWING BUBBLES (she got two checks for that skill), HOLDING HER BREATH FOR FIVE SECONDS, JUMPING IN ON HER OWN, etc. She was very proud and so were her mother and I.

They were starting another six week session the following week, and guess what? We could hardly wait to sign her up for another session. If she did as well as her first session she would become a full fledged 'bullfrog'. At the end of that session, yep, you guessed it...she got another report card telling her and us what she had accomplished during that time frame. We continued to sign her up for more sessions. A year or so later we had a son, and guess what? As soon as he was old enough we had him taking swim lessons as well.

I believe we can take that same philosophy and transfer it to our youth bowling programs. By offering youth bowlers the opportunity to improve their skills (weekly instruction sessions by your coaching staff) and then periodically 'evaluating' them to see what they have mastered would create the same pride that my daughter, her mom and I got from those report cards in the swimming program.

Think about what a simple report card accomplishes.

- 1.The student knows what they did well AND also can see where they might need to work a little harder.
- 2.The parents feel a great sense of pride because of what their child has accomplished. With such a success, parents are eager to keep their kids involved in the program.
- 3.The parents can work with the child between sessions on those areas that need extra practice. This not only strengthens the bond between child and parent, but it puts bowling in a position of helping solidify that bond.
- 4.With several levels...polliwog, bullfrog, guppy, shark, etc. the kids have something to strive for. A great motivating factor to enhance skill development in any sport. Perhaps in bowling it might be: kegel king or queen; strike master; pin buster; lane master; bumper busters or alley cats.
- 5.It provides your coaching staff with direction and a sense of value to your program they may not have had before.
- 6.When appropriate, you might enlist the support of parents to help in the evaluation process. Most will be happy to help.

If your youth bowling program does not presently provide ongoing, organized coaching opportunities and skill evaluations for its kids, I believe you should. . Do not count the coaching that is done during league matches because it doesn't qualify as an 'organized coaching opportunity'.

Start today and revise your old format...what a great way to give your youth program a long overdue UPGRADE.

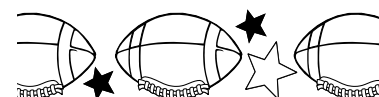

National Deaf Bowling News

After 36 Years Deaf Frank Gallo Wins A PBA Tournament

Perseverance paid off for Frank Gallo, Jr of Newport News, VA who kept on paying his Professional Bowling Association dues for 36 years and entered in countless PBA Tour, Regional and Seniors tournaments.

He placed in the money in some of them and never had won one. But presently retired and as a super senior member (age of 60 and over), Frank persisted on entering them.

Then finally last July 13, Frank won the PBA East Regional Forest Hill Open at Forest Hills Lanes in Forest Hill, MD. The prize was \$5,000 the largest he ever won and an elegant crystal bowling pin trophy. It was well deserved as Frank had the best 7 win and 1 loss in match plays and beat Pro exempt player Joe Ciccone Buffalo, NY ,196 - 170 in the one game title finals.

In Forest Hill Open, Frank entered as one of 164 entrants and qualified for the top 16 match play by placing 9th with 1700 (212.5 ave.) for 8 games. One of 7 exempt PBA players qualified in this event, Bill O'Neill, Southampton, PA topped the 16 qualifiers with 1881 (235 ave.), followed by another exempt player Parker Bohn, III. Jackson, NJ with 1832 and Ciccone #3 with 1786.

Frank was matched with # 8 qualifier one of PBA top exempt Pros Patrick Allen, Wesley chapel, FL and Frank surprisingly beat Allen 3-0 in best 3 of 5 games match (192-143, 195-179, 187-185). With the win, Frank advanced to round of 8, matched against #16 qualifier William Ray Barlow, Edgewood, MD who defeated the #1 qualifier O'Neill, 3-1 after losing the first match.

In the round of 8 best 2 of 3 games match against Barlow, Frank lost the first match 175-216 and managed to win next two, 245-239, 243-195 to move to round of 4 against #12 Ray J. Edwards, Middle Island, NY. In the one game match Frank defeated Edwards 223-173 and moved into the title finals in which he beat Ciccone. Ciccone got \$2,500 for 2nd and Edwards in tie for 3rd with #15 Terry L. Miller, York, PA who lost to Ciccone 181-221, for \$1,500 each.

Frank's wife Angela who was there watching him win it, said, "It was so wonderful and so very emotional excitement for us... Frank is so happier than a happy puppy". For him it was a real big thing off his back.

It was quite a tale when Frank Gallo Jr. joined Professional Bowlers Association in 1972, he did not mention in his application or to PBA officers that he is deaf. It was because of his fears of being rejected as like to most employers, hiring a deaf person means added burdens and more responsibilities than a normal person.

Before that this writer knew Frank aspired to be a PBA member and told him that he must have two seasons of 190 average in order to join. Then when Frank met this writer at Rockford, Ill July 1972 Frank said that he finally joined PBA and bowled in one tournament and did not cash. I said, that's great and he is the first deaf to join. He replied that he did not tell them about being a deaf person for fear of being rejected. I told him that it was not fair for him to hide his deafness and they could not reject an ABC member because of being deaf, also it was not in PBA rules saying so.

Then I wrote a letter to the legendary bowling writer Chuck Pezzano who at that time was the players secretary in PBA Public Relations mentioning that Frank Gallo, Jr. being a deaf member of PBA and to welcome him as a deaf member. In the 1974 edition of PBA Press, Radio & Television Guide book, Pezzano made it clear inside on the 1973 membership roster, Frank Gallo, Jr., Deer Creek, NY, First Deaf member to join PBA, 2 (PBA tournaments participated in 1973) \$180 (amount cashed in 1973).

So in Gallo, Jr's PBA milestone, it is first joined a deaf member in 1972, First cashed in one of two tournaments in 1973 for \$180. In between 1974 to June 2008 cashed here and there, a few as high as \$3000. Then 36 years later on July 13, 2008 finally won PBA Regional tournament for \$5,000.

Since Frank joined PBA, he was followed by other inspiring deaf and hearing impaired bowlers Bob Brame, Gerald Buckingham, Darrell Stogryn, Pete Kaczmarczyk, James Lombardi, Gerald Blankley, Robert Stock, Mark Fisser, Jay Hosselle, Jeffery Reese, Glenn Simpson, John Wukasch, Jr., and 3 others whose names slipped my mind. Besides Gallo, Jr. only Brame, Stogryn and Kaczmarczyk stayed longer as most others dropped out one year, two or three after finding the tour too hard for them to cash in. Now there are only three, Gallo, Kaczmarczyk and Wukasch, Jr.



