U.S. Women's Open Title

COLUMBUS — Paula Vidad of Sun City, Calif., defeated Lucy Sandelin of Tampa, Fla., 234-215, on Wednesday to win the 2013 Bowling's Senior U.S. Women's Open presented by BPAA and Storm.

Vidad stepped up in the final two frames and closed out the title match with four clutch strikes to lock up the victory at Seguoia Pro Bowl.

"It's amazing to win my second major title," said Vidad, who won the USBC Senior Queens in 2011. "We don't have a whole lot of tournaments for the senior women. so it's always special. There's nothing like winning a major and holding up that trophy."

Sandelin led the event throughout qualifying and match play leading up to the stepladder finals, but was unable to pick up the victory in the high-scoring finale. Sandelin also finished as the runner-up last year.

Vidad, who entered the stepladder as the second seed. won her semifinal match against Tish Johnson

of Colorado Springs, Colo., 238-177. Johnson took down Kristy Whitcher of Belfair, Wash., 178-147, in the opening match.

The Senior U.S. Women's Open was the second leg of the Senior Women's Triple Crown presented by The Orleans. The Triple Crown includes the National Golden Ladies Classic, won by Johnson in March, and the Senior Queens, which will take place at the International Bowling Campus from Oct.

Paula Vidad Wins Senior PBA Hall of Famer and Coaching Pioneer John Jowdy Dies at 93

EL CAJON — PBA Hall of Famer and pioneer bowling coach John Jowdy of El Cajon, Calif., died August 1 of natural causes. He was 93.

Jowdy, a native of San Antonio, Texas, was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1988 primarily for his coaching contributions but was also a prolific bowling writer and bowling industry advocate.

"John Jowdy was one of the greatest minds in the history of our sport," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark.

"He cared about bowling and its greatest players as much as anyone ever has. Anyone who had the chance to meet or know him is better for it, and will never forget him. his humor, his vast knowledge or his cigar."

Jowdy began his coaching career by instructing youth bowlers in San Antonio, Texas, in the 1940s and '50s. Since the late '60s he had coached more than 100 professional and amateur men and women bowlers.

He joined bowling ball manufacturer Columbia 300 in 1962 and worked for many years as the company's traveling salesman, public relations spokesman and PBA Tour

representative. He is credited with the development of Team Columbia, a forerunner of the "pro staff" concept now utilized by all major bowling ball manufacturers.

Most recently he was inducted into the Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame in 2010 in recognition of his coaching contributions to the sport.

He also was inducted into the Texas Bowling Hall of Fame, the San Antonio Bowling Hall of Fame, the Bowling Writers Association of America (IBMA) Hall of Fame, and the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame (2001). In 2006, he was chosen as the International Bowling Coach of the Year by the World Bowling Writers.

"John was an all-round pioneer in the sport," said fellow Hall of Famer and good friend Chuck Pezzano. "He was an expert in many areas of the sport and probably coached more professional bowlers than anybody.

I remember seeing him at tournaments where players would line up to get advice from him. He was an advocate for women's bowling and what a lot of people don't know is that he was also a very good

bowler."

Jowdy also was instrumental in starting the John Jowdy Scholarship for high school and college bowlers, which Columbia 300 continues to sponsor in his honor.

As a writer, Jowdy's columns appeared in dozens of bowling newspapers and magazines and he was the author of two books on the sport, Bowling Execution and Bowling Execution, Second Edition.

As a bowling writer he earned numerous awards. He served as BWAA President in 1996, and was the recipient of the sport's Flowers for the Living Award in 1985.

It's a great loss to the bowling world and the bowling industry," PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber said. "John was a

dear friend of our family. My father (the late bowling legend Dick Weber) and mother loved him. I had the utmost respect for John. He helped me a great deal throughout my career, with little tips here and there. It's a really sad, sad day for bowling.'

"John had made peace with his life and was ready to move on," said Hall of Famer Marshall Holman who had recently talked to Jowdy.

Jowdy is survived by his wife Brenda and his children John Jowdy Jr., Mary Ann Yamin , Steve Harris, Lori Millard and Andrew Harris; grandchildren Gina, Lisa, Stephen, Tera, Kelly, Ryan, Austin, Landon, Rivers & Robby and great grandchildren Pia, Addy, Hudson, Nicole and Ali.

TAVARES, FL - Tom Daugherty of Wesley Chapel, Fla., defeated Jason Sterner of McDonough, Ga., 219-209, to win the Professional Bowlers Association South Region's Regional Players Invitational title Sunday, concluding two days of live coverage from Break Point Alley on PBA's Xtra Frame online bowling

Daugherty, who earned \$6,000, a paid entry into the PBA World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in late October and a berth in a new PBA RPI Finals which will be televised on ESPN. Daugherty won his only PBA Tour title in the Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championship during the 2012 WSOB, ironically defeating Sterner, 199-177, in winning the first of his three matches en route to the Scorpion title. Sterner earned \$3,500 as the RPI runner-up.



"The best part about it was this event was on a grueling lane condition and I had to bowl against the best 48 guys in our region, so it was definitely a good win," Daugherty

"(The new RPI program) gives players a reason to bowl a couple more regionals," he added. "Any time you've got a \$6,000 prize and other benefits, it's really an incentive. I've had this tournament circled on my calendar for a long time. I bowled a couple of additional regionals I probably wouldn't have bowled because of it.

"I bowled in the World Series last year and come away with my first (PBA Tour) title," Daugherty continued, "so I'm looking forward to going back."

The South Region RPI was the first in a series of six PBA Regional championship events. The PBA East, Central,

Midwest, Southwest and combined West/Northwest Regions also will host RPI events in the coming weeks, with each RPI winner advancing to the PBA RPI Finals that will be taped for delayed airing on ESPN as part of the World Series of Bowling V at South Point Casino, Hotel and Bowling Center, Oct. 26-Nov. 3. Each RPI is open to 48 players who have qualified through a seasonlong points competition in their respective regions, and each RPI will be covered live from start to finish on PBA's exclusive bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

Sterner started the tournament with a 300 game and had a chance to win it by throwing three strikes in the 10th frame of the title match, but only threw the first strike.

Sterner defeated Scott Newell of Deland, Fla., 185continued on page 8

We have \$1,665 in the back up that will carry over to Chaparral Lanes where it will be estimate at \$2,650. This week in the 3-6-9 Roll-off we saw Darren Garcia miss in the final round on his second shot. So he got \$50 and next week we will go for \$2,500 at Chaparral Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Stan Por and Mike Moore with a 1559 for \$120. Finishing in second place was Stan Por and Ben Bagaoisan, with a 1516 for \$100. There was a total of \$1,280 paid out in doubles and 24 paid spots with low to cash

The semi-finals took the floor and finishing in first was Freddie Catamisan with a big +160. In second was Mike Moore at a +154. 

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

DEAF TEAM USA RETURNS HOME EMPTY FROM SOFIA DEAFLYMPICS

For the first time since the sport of bowling was played in the 1997 World Games for the Deaf, our deaf Team USA came home from the Deaflympics in Sofia, Bulgaria without a single medal. Our teams were good and tried their best against the other countries' best deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers. They failed because they are not our country's best deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers.

Bowling originally was turned down as a new sport in 1981 World Games for the Deaf and again in the 1985 Los Angeles World Games. The officers of International Committee for Sports of the Deaf cited the reasons as not enough countries having deaf bowlers and USA deaf bowlers were semi-pros getting money from leagues and deaf classics.

Four years later in the 1989 World Games in New Zealand, ICSD finally accepted bowling as one of the sports but it was put in as one of the winter sports with curling for the 1991 Winter World Games at Calgary. Alberta. I was one of many who yowled that Winter Games sports are played on ice or snow and Bowling is not one of them.

At Calgary ICSD realized their mistake and asked the Sofia 1993 World Games Committee if they could possibly include bowling as one of the sports in spite of short time. Sofia Committee happily accepted. Then near end of 1992, the ICSD officers went to Sofia to inspect the sport venues and much to the dismay of the Sofia Committee, ICSD cancelled bowling out of the Games. The reason was not enough lanes.

In 1992 I directed the Deaf Team USA Tryouts in Fremont and got the bad news. Upon finding out that the center had 12 lanes, so I pleaded to ICSD to keep bowling in and offered my expertise in scheduling the events. ICSD rejected my letter and told USA Deaf Sports Federation to tell me that they only accept letters or complaints from National Deaf Sports Organizations.

To make this story short, World Games for the Deaf with Olympics' permission, changed its name to Deaflympics in 2001 at Italy.

SOME MODEST THOUGHTS

Bowling is an amazing sport, and an amazing business and should be proud of all the amazing people it has produced and continues to attract in its wide world of interests. But bowling never seems to gain the recognition it should. Bowling has long been one of the best friends of charity.

And the fabulous figures raised never have been fully counted, from the most pins over averages to donate some relatively small change that adds up to millions, from the grass roots bowlers to the executive suites.

I don't know of any bowling group or organization that doesn't have one or more charity affiliation, and been there in good economic times or bad, whether it was fashionable or not. If there was a need, some bowler would find a way to help fill that need.

The sport never has fully accounted for all that good it does and ways could be developed to give full charity association reports. So many sports, in a much easier atmosphere to raise funds, shout it from the rooftops. Bowling has created a cloud of love for all.

A bowler's life span can reach from competition starting at first steps of walking to fragile steps to the line some 90 years or more later. Bowlers cross all lines of age, size, professions and society. Bowlers can learn to love a two inch trophy as much as a two foot award. Not everyone can be a pro, but all can develop a pro attitude, as amateurish as they may be.

Volunteerism has suffered in recent decades in practically all areas, including bowling. We have done a poor job of keeping interest high among former bowlers and officials and they in turn have lessened theirs. There are many who would again volunteer genes if only someone would ask. The merger has not gone exactly according to the script visioned and the unrealistic attitudes when it comes to reality are caused by thoughts of a past no longer here and a future with too many question marks.

With the lower number of centers we have situations where too many associations consist of one or only a few, less than five centers, and is right next to another association on more than one side, in the same unenviable position. And though logic tells all that the way to go is to join forces, seemingly a fate worse than death to some of the local movers and shakers.

Compromises, giving and taking, weighing the plus and minus factors, are vital. Integers of the sport must hang together or they will all hang separately. The emphasis on big money prizes in local and state tournaments must give way to an almost lost pride in winning whether its a hundred or a thousand or the million dollar dream payoffs.

We must be stronger in our protests against sponsors who don't give back nearly enough in support of the sport that gives them so much and that a people's sport such as bowling has long staying power and a modest type of glamor all its own. The main point to always remember is that anyone who helps bowling anywhere helps bowling everywhere.

DID YOU KNOW?

Bowling boasts tournaments that have been around for more than a century and draw from some 5,000 teams to nearly 20,000, that adds up to as many as 100,000 individuals with family and friends who bring the sport and economic impact to all cities visited.

One of the prime destinations for birthday parties is a local bowling center, well prepared with bowling for all, help for beginners, food, and often a surprise or two.Bowling rules have changed since their establishment in 1895 by the American Bowling Congress, and continued by the Women's International Bowling Congress and the United States Bowling Congress, but only after extensive study and research.

Though bowling has had a presence in the Olympics it never has been accepted as a medal sport. It has however been fully accepted by many other all-sport competitions and more than 100 countries or federations make it one of the most organized sports in the world. Tournaments of all kinds in all places combined with many types of leagues and groups make it an all season sport. What is the number of tournaments? An educated guess might be 10.000 or more. The first televised bowling show hit the air in 1947 in New York City and it has been featured on most national and cable networks for more than 50 years.



Four Bowlers Take National Titles at Junior Gold



STERLING HEIGHTS, Mich. - Four youth bowlers rose to the occasion and captured national youth titles Friday as the 2013 North Pointe Junior Gold Championships presented by Track, Columbia 300, Ebonite and Hammer came to a close.

Wesley Low of Palmdale, Calif., Julia Bond of Aurora, Ill., Cortez Schenck of Phoenix and Taylor Russell of Tupelo, Miss., all came away with championships in their respective divisions at Sunnybrook Lanes. A record 2,078 athletes took part in the event and competed for more than \$275,000 in scholarships.

Low, 16, went undefeated in the double-elimination matchplay bracket with a 5-0 record to claim the 20-and-under boys title. The two-handed lefty knocked off Ryan Zagar of Kenosha, Wis., 456-425, in the two-game title match.

"It feels like I accomplished something really big today," said Low, a current Junior Team USA member. "All the hard work I put into my spare shooting and practicing on the patterns really paid off and helped me."

After leading 25 games of qualifying by more than six pins a game on the field, Bond, 17, also went undefeated in match play to win the U20 girls title.

She defeated current Junior Team USA member Sarah Lokker

of New Baltimore, Mich., 386-339.


"It's all overwhelming - the ceremony, the people, the awards," Bond said. "The fact that I made it this far and was so successful means a lot. To be on the same level as all of the other great bowlers is amazing."

The top two players in the U20 boys and girls divisions after 25 games of qualifying earned automatic spots on Junior Team USA in 2014. Those spots went to Nick Kruml of Downers Grove, Ill., Andrew Anderson of Holly, Mich., Liz Kuhlkin of Rotterdam, N.Y., and Bond.

In addition, the players who advanced to the U20 championship match also earned automatic spots on Junior Team USA with Low, Zagar and Lokker earning those spots. Since Bond had already earned a spot, an additional section went to the National Selection Committee.

The selections to Junior Team USA were Matt Farber of Plainview, N.Y., Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tenn., Natalie Goodman of O'Fallon, Ill., Elise Bolton of Merritt Island, Fla., and Breanna Clemmer of Clover, S.C. Clemmer is the first player to be selected from the U15 division onto Junior Team USA.

Schenck, 14, who lost in the U15 boys title match last year,

claimed the 2013 U15 boys title in dominating fashion. He lead qualifying and went undefeated in match play, taking the title with a 417-390 victory over Michael Martell of Brooklyn, N.Y.

"After finishing second last year, I just wanted to make sure I didn't choke, and I wanted to put on the best show that I could," Schenck said. "I just can't believe that I won Junior Gold. It's a great feeling and not every kid gets to do this."

In the U15 girls title match, Russell had to knock off previously unbeaten Ashley Channell of Morris Chapel, Tenn., in back-to-back matches. Russell, 15, won the first match 370-353 and took the deciding match 373-338.

"It's crazy because I never would have thought I would make it this far," Russell said. "It was a very challenging week, but I pushed myself through it."

Four U15 bowlers who were age eligible earned spots to compete in the Tournament of Americas in 2014 and to join the Team USA development team program. Those players were Schenck, Sean Wilcox of Altamonte Springs, Fla., Leah Glazer of Henderson, Nev., and Channell.
